## Heart disease remains leading cause of death in Missouri

Heart disease remains the leading cause of death in Missouri, according to a recent report published by the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services.

"There are many misconceptions about heart disease," said board certified cardiologist, Haris Riaz, M.D., in practice at Citizens Memorial Hospital Heart Institute Clinic, in a CMH news release. "Many think that heart disease only affects the elderly, men or unhealthy people. The truth is cardiovascular disease can impact younger people, women and healthy individuals, especially if they have a family history."

Research presented by The American College of Cardiology, the release stated, shows individuals who suffer a heart attack at a young age, one in five were 40 or younger and that number has risen 2% each

year for the past decade.

The release stated studies confirm the leading causes of cardiovascular disease include unhealthy diet, high blood pressure, obesity, high cholesterol, high glucose, smoking and physical inactivity.

Over time, these risk factors cause changes in the heart and blood vessels that can lead to heart attacks, heart failure and strokes, the release stated.

"It's extremely important to address risk factors early in life to prevent these devastating events and other potential complications of chronic cardiovascular disease," Riaz said. "Lifestyle changes can help you achieve ideal cardiovascular health."

### Diet

When you eat and serve heart-healthy meals, you improve the overall health of yourself and your family, the release

stated.

Make smart choices, watch calories, eat smaller portions and cook at home. Increase your servings of vegetables, fruit and lean protein. For more information on creating better eating habits, contact the dietitians at CMH at 417-328-7957.

### Manage blood pressure

The release stated high blood pressure is a major risk factor for heart disease and stroke.

When your blood pressure stays within healthy ranges you reduce the strain on your heart, arteries and kidneys, which keeps you healthier longer, the release stated.

Track your blood pressure and ask your health care team how to understand what the levels mean. A normal blood pressure reading is systolic less than 120 mm Hg and diastolic less than 80 mm Hg, per the release.

### Obesity

When you lose unnecessary pounds, you reduce the burden on your heart, lungs, blood vessels and skeleton, the release stated.

To lose weight, you need to burn more

## Mville man indicted in theft case

A man from Morrisville faces a felony stealing charge in Polk County Circuit Court after he was indicted by a grand jury last week.

Steven Carl Keithley, born in 1965, is charged with class C felony stealing by deceit — \$25,000 or more



after the Polk County grand jury passed down an indictment Friday, Feb. 18, per online court records.

According to the redacted indictment, Stevens stole at least \$25,000 from another person.

He asked the individual to invest "in a marijuana facility that would provide great returns," the indictment states.

However, the indictment states Stevens' "representations were false."

If convicted, Stevens faces three to 10 years in prison, up to \$10,000 in fines, or a combination of time served and fines, according to the indictment.

The court filed a criminal summons for Stevens. He's due in court for an initial arraignment on Monday, March 7.

The City of Bolivar plans to host a public forum at 6 p.m. Tuesday, March 8, regarding the proceeds from its recent utilities sale to Liberty Utilities, as well as American Rescue Plan funds and previous lease dollars.

The public meeting comes after the Bolivar board of aldermen held recent financial workshops with the city's department leaders to hear proposals for the funds.

"The city is on the dawn of a new day as far as fund(ing) goes, and the board of aldermen, myself and city staff want to hear from you," Warwick said. "We look forward to the days ahead and (the) opportunity to serve our community."

calories than you eat. Sit less and move more. If you aren't able to lose weight successfully on your own, talk to your health care provider, the release stated.

### High cholesterol

High cholesterol contributes to plaque, which can clog arteries and lead to heart disease and stroke, the release stated.

When you control your cholesterol, you are giving your arteries their best chance to remain clear of blockages, per the release.

Track your cholesterol levels. If your doctor has prescribed statins or other medications to control your cholesterol, take your medication as directed.

### High glucose

Most of the food we eat is turned into glucose, or blood sugar, that our bodies use for energy, per the release.

Over time, high levels of blood sugar can damage your heart, kidneys, eyes and nerves, the release stated. Track your levels and follow health care provider recommendations.

Looking for help managing your blood sugar levels? Visit with Heather Corn, M.D., in practice at CMH Endocrinology Center in Bolivar by calling 417-328-7000. Dr. Corn is board certified in Endocrinology, Diabetes, Metabolism and Internal Medicine, the release stated.

### Smoking

Cigarette smokers have a higher risk of developing cardiovascular disease, the release stated.

ed. If you smoke, quitting is the best thing you can do for your health. Within one year of quitting, your risk of heart disease goes down by half, per the release.

### Physical inactivity

Daily physical activity increases your length and quality of life, the release stated. Adults should get a weekly total of at least 150 minutes of moderate aerobic activity or 75 minutes of vigorous aerobic activity. Children and teens need at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day.

### Cardiac care at CMH

The CMH Heart Institute Clinic and CMH Cath Lab include three board-certified cardiologists, John F. Best, M.D., FACP, FACC, FSCAI, Stephen Davis, M.D., Haris Riaz, M.D., and nurse practitioner, Kyla Inman, NP-C.

Cardiovascular services at CMH include an accredited Level II STEMI program with 24/7 cardiology availability, the release stated.

Last year, CMH received the American College of Cardiology's NCDR Chest Pain Registry Platinum Achievement Award. CMH is one of only 212 hospitals nationwide to receive the honor, the release stated.

The CMH cardiac and pulmonary rehabilitation program is nationally recognized and is designed to help heart and lung patients recover quickly from a heart-related surgery, a heart attack or diagnosis of heart or pulmonary disease, per the release.

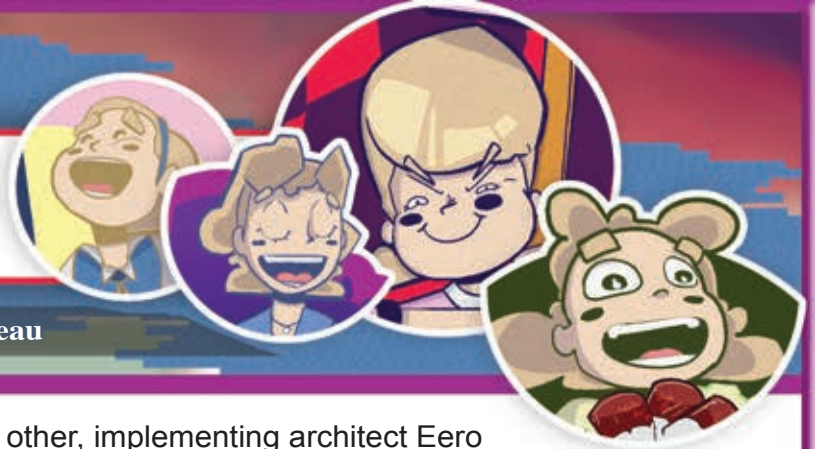

## Generations of Missouri

### St. Louis Arch Chapter Seven

Dorothy, age 45 & Barbara, age 18 | 1964

Barbara watched men scaling the construction ladder. They climbed high above the Mississippi River. Only halfway built, the Gateway Arch's legs stood 300 feet above the ground. She clutched her homemade protest sign which read NO JOBS, NO ARCH.

Barbara had lived in St. Louis for her entire life. But it was at St. Louis University that she learned about the city's history of racial inequality. While attending SLU, she'd seen historically black neighborhoods fall into disrepair. White friends and neighbors were moving west to the suburbs. She had been attending meetings of a group that was acting on some of these issues, the Congress of Racial Equality or CORE.

Today's protest was taking place on the construction grounds of the Gateway Arch to address issues of

racial inequality surrounding its construction. For most of Barbara's life, people had talked about the plans for the Arch, a monument dedicated to the westward expansion of the United States. The Arch would be a feature of the St. Louis skyline. It was fascinating to watch workers stack shiny blocks of steel, one atop the

other, implementing architect Eero Saarinen's elegant design. This massive project employed many people, yet very few were Black. CORE's protest centered around this issue. She and friends marched through the construction grounds carrying their signs and chanting, "Skilled jobs now! Skilled jobs now!"

Suddenly two of CORE's leaders, Percy Green and Richard Daly, began climbing the Arch's construction ladder! Barbara held her breath in the July heat as they made their way skyward. The protest was taking place at noon while the construction workers were on their lunch breaks. This gave Percy and Richard access to the ladder. Police officers gathered at the base of the construction elevator while deciding what to do.

"Will they stay up there all day," Barbara asked. "What's their plan?"

"They're making a point, they'll come down in a few hours," someone answered.

Three sweltering hours later, the men did come down. When they reached the ground, the two men lay down. This passive resistance move made it necessary for police officers to carry them.

"I read in the newspaper that Richard got 30 days in jail and Percy is out on bond," Barbara told her roommate, Molly, the next day.

"I can't believe you saw them climbing the Arch. That's crazy!" Molly answered.

Barbara was proud of witnessing and making history. "Sometimes you've got to do something crazy to get things done." She nodded at the poster board and paint.

"Percy's protesting tomorrow at the Old Court House," Barbara said. "Care to join?"

Molly smiled and the two women began to paint.

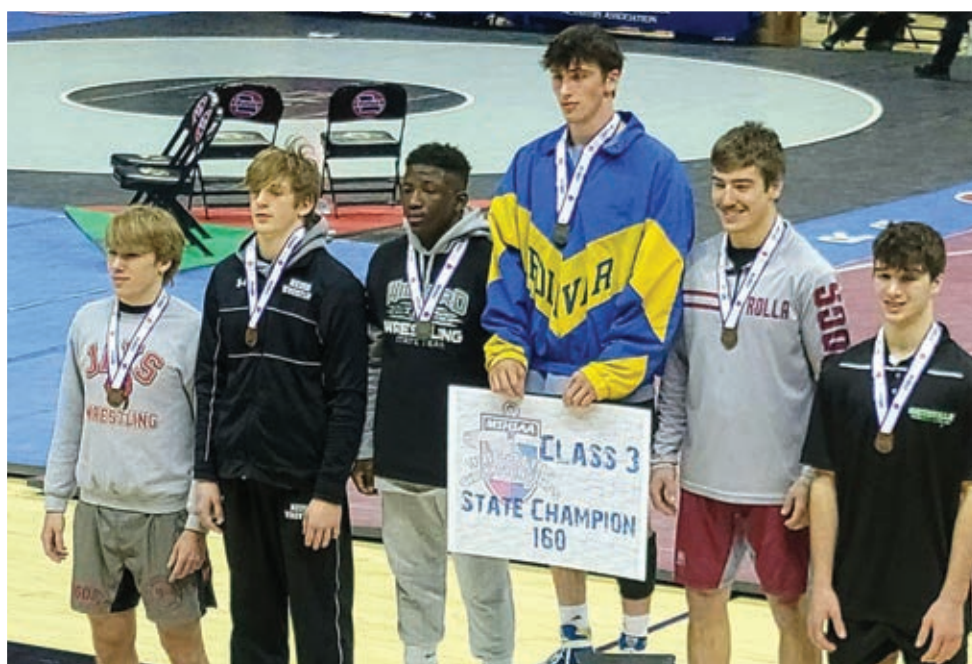
At 160 pounds, senior Tyson Moore was named state champion in a tie breaker match over Gary Walker of Willard on Saturday.

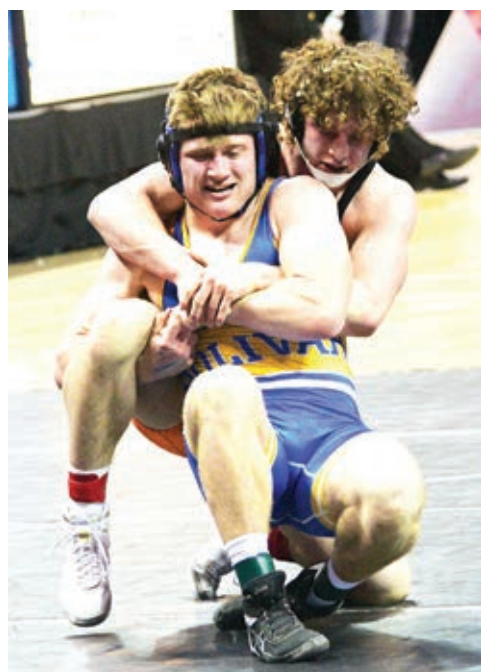

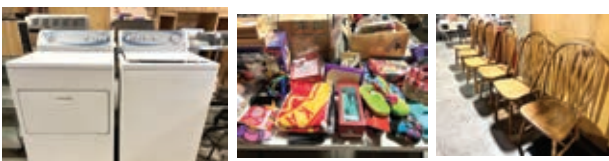
