## **Missouri Press Association** announces 2022 Hall of Fame inductees

Three newspaper people joined the Missouri Newspaper Hall of Fame as the 2022 class. Their induction took place on Friday, Sept. 16, during the 156th Annual Convention and Trade Show in

Established by MPA in 1991, the 2022 Hall of Fame class is the 32nd group to be inducted. This year's inductees are the late Joe Gravely, former publisher of the Bolivar Free Press; Dana Raker, former editor of the Holden Image; and Jon K. Rust, president of Rust Communications and publisher of the Southeast Missourian, Cape Girardeau.

Hall of Fame inductees or their families receive Pinnacle Awards in honor of the inductees' service to the Missouri newspaper industry and their communities. Inductees' plaques will join the permanent display of inductees in the MPA office in Columbia and in the student lounge in Lee Hills Hall at the Missouri School of Journalism.

The late Joe Gravely published his first edition of the Bolivar Free Press on March 5, 1891, when he was just 25, and he would continue at the helm of the publication for the next 43 years, until his death from a heart attack in his sleep in 1934. While tenures of ownership before him seemed impermanent, Gravely's efforts resulted in his sons, Ralph and Marshall, guiding the publication for another 31 years after his death and ensured the preservation of Polk County's oldest continuous business.

Gravely's first association with the Free Press, which had been started in 1868, came when he left school at age 13 to learn the newspaper business. He started at the Free Press, learning the mechanical side of the business before moving to Springfield to learn more about the trade.

When he returned to the Free Press as a young man, Gravely had a partner in his early years but

The hospital opened its doors on Sept. 28, 1982, as a 53-bed notfor-profit hospital district with three physicians on staff and 90 employees.

Today, CMH is licensed for 86 beds and is a Level III Trauma Center, Level II STEMI Center and Level III Stroke Center.

More than 2,000 CMH and CMH Foundation employees and nearly 200 physicians and mid-level medical providers provide care for patients and residents in eight counties, including southern Benton, Cedar, Dade, Dallas, northern Greene, Hickory, Polk and St. Clair.

A \$77 million building project to upgrade and expand the hospital will position the hospital to provide exceptional care for the next 40 years.

"The hospital expansion is going to really show people all across our service

area that we're more than a small rural hospital," Calhoun said. "We provide a large breadth of services at CMH."



mostly ran the newspaper on his own, facing immense competition over the years with only one other publication, the Bolivar Herald, remaining sustained in its opposition. Competition between the Republican-affiliated Free Press and the Democratic rival Herald was fierce but fair, an attitude that was nurtured and encouraged by Gravely's approach to publishing.

That stance between the newspapers would remain even after Gravely's death in 1934. The mutual respect Gravely helped engender in the community and between the publications was perhaps best demonstrated in 1951 when the Free Press staff assisted the Herald in publishing their newspaper the week that the latter publication's publisher died. His induction will mark the fifth publisher from the Bolivar Free Press and Herald and their merged successor newspaper to be named to the Hall of Fame.



## **Bringing Bowling Back to Bolivar**

K & D Lanes is opening a new bowling alley in Bolivar, hoping to open on Saturday, Oct. 1.

Giving a fresh face to the location, the new business will be at the site of the former bowling alleys, Speedway Lanes and The Bolivar Bowling Company.

K & D Lanes will feature an arcade room along with Skee-Ball, pool tables and other games. Nachos, hotdogs, French fries, and other food will be served, along with Pepsi products. The owners are also in the process of getting a liquor license.

In addition, they will also have a party room for birthdays, corporate events, and other special occasions.

Named after the owners Kody and Dee Crawford, K & D Lanes is opening its doors with the motivation of bringing something fun to the residents of Bolivar and nearby communities.

As a mother, Crawford says the lack of recreational activities in Bolivar was a detriment to her four sons.

"To be honest with you, hanging out at the parking lot and stuff like that wasn't okay with me. Them going all the way to Springfield to do something and being such young drivers, that wasn't okay," Crawford

Having an interest in bowling, Crawford and her husband were both in bowling leagues, and she says it is a fun activity that their whole family enjoys.

"My kids love it. They just love it, and that was another thing. I wanted to leave them something, a legacy," adds Crawford.

Right now, Crawford is working with mechanics and electricians to work on some of the challenges of starting a bowling alley business.

Earlier this month, the owners learned that the scoring system had been stripped of some essential parts. Since the company with the original parts went out of business, they've been trying to get the parts from other sellers to keep from having to purchase an en-

tirely new scoring system. Crawford also explained that they were working on getting a new triggering system to get the bowling balls to return.

They've also been in close contact with bowling companies to ensure that all requirements are met for the pinsetters and lanes.

"We are going to plan on upgrading the lanes. If we get the community support, we will put more upgrades as we get more interest," Crawford notes.

She says that these upgrades come with computer-generated improvements to make the bowling



experience easier and more helpful for the bowler. The computers will give tips on bowling techniques in order to get a strike.

While Crawford says that the unexpected issues and added expenses have been stressful, she and her husband are hard at work trying to get everything squared away in time for their opening.

Since Crawford says she only recently moved to Bolivar and never actually went to the previous two bowling alleys while they were in operation, she doesn't know how her business will be viewed in comparison.

She does, however, have big plans of coordinating special events and garnering community involvement at K & D Lanes.

"We're planning on having a singles night. We're having a college night, where all the college kids from around can come for a discount," Crawford explains. "We've got the Shriners club coming in. We've got Boys Scouts coming in from Springfield. I want to work with the court system when they need some place for families to go for family therapy night. They need activities to do.'

Crawford also has plans to host theme nights, mentioning the possibility of having an '80s theme. She is also looking forward to getting everything ready for glow bowling, which she says is set to start on Hal-

"We're just going to try to make it a really fun environment," she says. "Our target audience, honestly, is college kids and juniors/ seniors in high school."

Hoping to bring in kids of all ages, Crawford says that she would like to work with local schools and other places to teach kids about how the bowling system works and to get them interested in the game.

While K & D Lanes is gearing their business toward younger generations, they are working on getting all ages involved, already drawing interest from seniors in high school to senior citizens.

The owners are also plan-

ning to give a discount and free coffee to police officers and firefighters.

While they are still figuring out some of their prices, they will consider offering other group discounts, and they plan on setting the limit to six people per lane.

Crawford says that her kids will also be involved in the process of running and promoting the business. noting how important it was that she gives her son with special needs a job opportunity at the bowling alley.

Not only were her kids an influential part of the decision to purchase the bowling alley, but she also calls this her and her husband's "retirement adventure." Since her husband has been a truck driver for 27 years, she hopes that he can retire, allowing them to devote more time to the

"We thought why not just do something like this, knowing 'no guts, no glory,' she remarks. "I have heard from people 'Hey, it didn't succeed.' Well, you know what, you don't know unless you try."

Back in late 2021, Crawford opened a boutique called Unique for You across from C&C Farm and Home, saying that the business ended up closing due to less than ideal location and the arrival of other boutiques in town.

However, with the support of the community and the connections she has with local organizations, Crawford remains positive that K & D Lanes will be a success.

"I am nervous, because I have heard that the other two (bowling alleys) went out. I haven't really heard why, so I haven't really been able to figure out where I can go a different route," she says.

Crawford also says that she is open to suggestions and ideas from the public, saying that she wants people to feel invested in the bowling alley.


"I want to make sure that everybody knows that this is not mine. This is ours. I want it to be ours," Crawford states.



I'm not sure when she first sent me a few coins. I think it was after Grandma Daly spurred my interest in coin collecting with a few Indian head pennies. After I shared my interest in a letter to Aunt Kathleen, I soon received a letter with several United States and Canadian coins, including a couple of large, copper penny bank tokens dating to the mid-1800s.

Though the coins Aunt Kathleen ultimately sent me never amounted to a genuine treasure, they were priceless to me, and I still have them all, safely kept in a bank box.

More valuable than the coins, though, was that unwavering love between us boys and two aunts we had never even met. Of course, our mother had, and two of my uncles had lived with them for a time in the 1930s.

In the early 1970s my mom, her brother Albert, and my brother David, traveled to Ontario for a final visit with Kathleen (I don't recall if Annie was still living). On the loop home they stopped for a couple of days to stay with us outside my USAF base in North Carolina.

I wish I could have made the trip with them. Nonetheless I have the enduring memory of two greataunts in Canada, tangible ties to our Irish ancestry — both sweet, single ladies in a faraway land.

ersimmons have long been associated with forecasting winter weather, but the facts and history associated with these fruits and the trees they grow on are as interesting as the folklore.

Persimmon fruit and persimmon wood are well-known products in Missouri. Persimmon wood, which is considered to be among the hardest of any North American tree species, was a popular material for wooden textile shuttles, golf club heads, pool cues and other products before being replaced (in some products) by manufactured materials. The pinkish-orange fruit the tree produces in the fall has long been the main ingredient of jams, pudding, breads and other food items.

Interestingly enough, the origins of both the scientific and common names of the persimmon tree sum up the taste extremes of its fruit. The taxonomic name of the tree - Diospyros virginiana - provides a description of the sweet taste of fruit when fully ripe: "Diospyros" is a Greek word meaning "fruit of the gods." On the other end of the fruit's palatability spectrum is its common name, "persimmon," which is likely a derivative of a Native American word that sounded something like "putchimon" or "pushemin." This word meant "choke fruit" and was, no doubt, a reference to the sour, mouth-puckering taste of unripe persimmons.

Persimmon trees are dioecious, which means there are male and female persimmon trees. (The alternative to this is monoecious, where one tree has both male and female parts.) Male persimmon trees have small clusters of small whitish or green-whitish flowers. Females have a single flower. Bees are the primary pollinating agents.

It's unclear how winter forecasts became associated with persimmon fruit, but here are the details: Splitting a persimmon seed will reveal a fork, spoon, or knife on the seed's interior. According to lore, the image of a spoon indicates that the upcoming winter will feature an abundance of heavy, wet snow; a fork predicts light and powdery snow, and a knife

forecasts a winter with bitter, icy winds. As is the case with any type of folklore, forecasting by persimmon seed has both supporters and nay-sayers.

Regardless of what side you take in this weather debate, everyone can agree that this tree has had an interesting history in North America. The earliest mention of persimmons is found in the journals of Hernando de Soto's expedition through parts of what is now the southeastern and south-central U.S. The Spanish explorer references them as a tasty fruit and the source of a bread made by Native Americans. In the 17th and 18th centuries, persimmon trees were introduced to parts of Europe and their propagation was encouraged.

The food value of persimmons was quickly adapted by pioneers as America became settled and a number of food items made from persimmons developed. Two of the more interesting products of persimmon fruit were persimmon wine and persimmon beer. In 1773 Finnish naturalist Pehr Kalm wrote that "(Persimmon beer) is reckoned much preferable to other beer." A century later, persimmon beer was common enough that it had developed a nickname - "possum toddy." This was a reference to a place that opossums are commonly found in the fall – in persimmon trees eating the fruit.

Many claimed this tree and its fruit also had a curative aspect. The medicinal value of persimmon bark and/or fruit was touted in a number 19th-century cures. Dysentery, diphtheria, thrush and hemorrhoids were among the maladies that had home remedies that included persimmon parts.

Moving from food to function brings us to another former value of persimmons. Persimmon seeds were used as buttons – particularly in the South – during the Civil War. In 1863 a writer for Atlanta's Daily Intelligencer wrote "If you use them (persimmon seeds) for buttons, the washer woman will hardly break them with her batting stick."

If you lived in the South during

the Civil War and didn't need persimmon seeds for buttons, you could make coffee with them. Because of the Union blockade of Confederate port cities, coffee was among the food items that were in short supply in the South. Persimmon seeds were one of several alternatives Southern coffee drinkers turned to. An 1863 edition of the Montgomery (Ala.) Advertiser reports "... the seeds of the persimmon when roasted and ground produces a beverage which cannot, even by old and experienced coffee drinkers, be distinguished from genuine coffee."

On top of all these uses, green persimmons could be used to make ink.

It should be noted that these references pertain to the persimmon tree native to North America - Diospyros virginiana - which had a native range consisting of the eastern and central U.S. When Commodore Matthew Perry established formal relations between the U.S. and Japan in the 1850s, one of the items he brought back to the U.S. was what's become known as the "Japanese" or "Oriental" persimmon, Diospyros kaki. This persimmon variety became established in the western U.S. - most notably in California. It produces a larger fruit than our native persimmon tree and today is the source of much of the persimmon fruit sold commercially in the U.S.

Moving back to our native persimmon tree, much of its former prominence has gone by the wayside. Today, it's most common location is old fields, pasture edges and other out-of-the-way places of the rural landscape. If you're interested in adding these trees to your property, persimmon is one of many trees that can be ordered through the Missouri Department of Conservation's annual tree seedling sales program, which is currently underway. The ordering period will run through April 15. Tree seedling ordering information can be found online at mdc. mo.gov/seedlings. Order forms are also available at most MDC offices.






### Jack Glendenning




cause there were no wiry kids filling a spot and no 300-pound lineman relying on the weight to play. These were strong physical athletes who knew how to play the game.
