

Economic Development Partnership CEO/President announces retirement

Gail Noggle, President/ CEO of the Economic Development Partnership of Bolivar and Polk County, is announcing her retirement. She has more than 25 years of experience in community and economic development, as well as chamber of commerce and convention and visitor's bureau leadership in Springfield. Noggle also owned a financial investment firm in the past.

Noggle presented her formal retirement notice to the Board of Directors for the Economic Development Partnership on Feb. 23 and to the City of Bolivar's board of aldermen on March 28, 2023. Her anticipated last day is June 16.

In her letter, Noggle stated the following:

"I wanted to take this opportunity to thank you for all your support and leadership. Bolivar and Polk County has been my home away from home these past seven years and will always hold a special place in my heart. I have genuinely enjoyed my employment in this great community and will miss you all when my retirement day arrives."

Noggle served as the Economic Development force development. Some

Alliance for Bolivar and Polk County from 2016 to June 2022 when her efforts to establish a standalone economic development organization in Polk County came to fruition. The newly recognized nonprofit, the Economic Development Partnership of Bolivar and Polk County (EDP), received its Certificate of Incorporation June 23, 2022, and its 501(c)(3) status on Jan. 5, 2023.

Over the last seven years, Noggle has worked closely with companies in the planning and development stages prior to opening their respective facilities in Bolivar and Polk County.

She has offered assistance in qualifying companies for state and local incentives, in addition Executive Director of the to assistance with work-

of the businesses assisted were Phoenix Décor, Missouri Prime Beef. Tracker/White River Marine, Mercy Clinic, Citizens Memorial Hospital, RevHoney, and Creator Designs. Most recent recruitment efforts resulted in the opening of Flat Creek Restaurant.

In 2017, Noggle recruited Tractor Supply Co. to Bolivar Business Park, which was named a Missouri Certified Site that year under her leadership. The industrial park was re-certified in 2020.

The following year, she was also instrumental in getting two of Bolivar's Census tracts qualified as an Opportunity Zone, a funding mechanism for developers.

In July 2020, Noggle was selected by regional peers to serve as a district director for the Missouri Economic Development Council (MEDC). MEDC is a statewide, nonprofit association of economic development professionals and community leaders.

Throughout COVID-19 pandemic, Noggle stayed abreast of national and state legislation and policies that established financial resources

Head-on crash results in death of Brighton man

A man from Brighton died in a two-car crash on M96, seven miles east of Carthage, on Saturday, April 8.

According to a Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Joseph N. Raylyanu, 24, was westbound in a 2019 Toyota Yaris on M96 at around 8:50 p.m. when he attempted to pass a vehicle on a two-lane road and traveled into the path of an eastbound 2018 Chevrolet 2500, driven by Broc E. Ratliff, 20, of Avilla.

Neither of the drivers were wearing a seatbelt, per the report.

Raylyanu was airlifted to Mercy Hospital in Springfield, where he was pronounced dead at 12:23 a.m. on Monday, April 10 by Dr. Brian Draper, the report said.

No injuries were listed for Ratliff.

The report stated Ratliff's vehicle had extensive damage, and Raylyanu's vehicle was totaled. Both vehicles were towed by Schrader's Towing.

Raylyanu's death was Troop D's 22nd fatality of 2023, the report stated. Next of kin has been

notified. Tpr. J.D. Fischer investigated the wreck.

Smith was pronounced dead at 11:23 p.m. at Mercy Hospital in Springfield by Dr. Kenneth Larson and Dr. Scott Henke.

Lenox, who the report stated was not wearing a seatbelt, had moderate injuries. Both vehicles were totaled and towed by

Temple Grandin to headline trio of presentations slated for MO Beef Days

In addition to the family-friendly celebrations and recognition that are central to Polk County's signature tribute to the beef industry, Missouri Beef Days 2023 will also include three special presentations designed to educate the public about beef and other ag-related

Headlining the presentations will be Dr. Temple Grandin, who spoke at the event in 2022. Temple was the subject of a 2010 HBO biopic starring Claire Danes. She is a proponent for humane treatment in livestock handling and is the author of numerous scientific papers. She is also a vocal advocate for persons with autism, a group she personally identifies with. Her presentation last year provided personal insight into the different learning styles employed by autistic individuals such as herself.

Grandin's appearance will be bookended with presentations by Ray Archuleta on Monday, May 8, and the NextGen Beef Economics Team on Wednesday, May 10. All presentations will take place at 7:00 p.m. each night in Mabee Chapel on the campus of Southwest Baptist University in Bolivar.

Archuleta is a Certified Professional Soil Scientist from Seymour, Missouri, with over 30 years of experience as a Soil Conservationist, Water Quality Specialist, and **Conservation Agronomist** with the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). He also served in the Peace Corps for two years as a Livestock Specialist in Guatemala. Since his retirement from the NRCS in 2017, Ray founded Understanding Ag, LLC, and Soil Health Academy, LLC, to teach Biomimicry strategies and Agroecology principles for improving soil function on a national scale.





for individuals, businesses and governments to withstand the crisis felt throughout the pandemic.

She alerted the city to its possible housing shortage and has worked tirelessly recruiting local and regional developers over the last few years. She recruited and assisted Morelock Builders in its bid to receive the Missouri Housing Development Commission's approval to build workforce housing in Bolivar, which occurred in December 2022. Recently, Noggle has been working with the EDP and the City of Bolivar in pursuing a formal housing study analysis.

Noggle has served on many professional boards over the years, in-

Chevrolet dealership. Having been somewhat acquainted with the Roberts family through his work at the gas station, he says that it was actually Bill Roberts Sr.'s wife who invited Reggie to discuss the available job as a car salesman, leading her to hire him

that same day. "As far as selling cars when I first started, that wasn't really what I thought was going to be my lifetime dream, but it turned out that it was, I guess, because I was with them for 48 years," Reggie Taylor says.

In 1981, Lindsay Taylor was also invited to work

at the dealership. With no prior experience in sales and no formal training, the brothers jumped in feet first and learned the job by watching other salesmen's interactions with

the customers.

"Every day was a new adventure," remarks Lindsay, who says that the job is all about "taking care of your customer" and listening to them. "There was a reason they were there. You had to kind of listen and help them through some of the other departments if they

chose to come to you." Not only were their customers great, but working together as siblings turned out to be a beneficial experience for the Taylor men.

"We've always got along fine. It was one of those things, you know, that he had his kind of clientele of people, and I had my clientele of people. And people would come in and know both of us. And sometimes they'd go to Lindsay, and sometimes they'd come to me. But we never had a falling out that I can recall. We never had a falling out," says Reggie.

Lindsay agrees, explaining that working together actually allowed them to look after each other and fill in for their brother as necessary.

According to the brothers, attitude is everything when selling a car, as salesmen must maintain a positive experience for the customer.

"Have a smile. When people walk in, treat them with a smile. [Like it's] always good to see them. Because they are the one who's helping you. Put the customers first. You want to make them feel comfortable," states Reggie, noting that "a smile can go a long

way." "Be friendly. Don't be too personal; just listen

to them," Lindsay adds. Before the Internet came along, both Reggie and Lindsay Taylor would each sell about 30 to 40

cars per month. "Back years ago, they would send people to us, and those people would wait. It was nothing for us to work three or four people at the same time. And today it would be hard to do," Lindsay says.

As time passed, car sales began to change. The emergence of the Internet caused a change in the way customers shopped for and bought

On the positive side of this change, the Taylor brothers noticed that the customers were more educated about cars. The Internet also made the shopping process more convenient for customers, as drivers could find what they needed without leaving their homes.

There's something to be said, though, for the experience of buying a new car, looking in the car lots, test driving, and taking in the new car smell.

Reggie says that, in today's world, the car dealers have to adapt, allowing the customers to purchase online and delivering the cars to them.

"That's changed so much since the early days, I should say, of us selling cars, and so we had to change with it," Reggie said.

While most of the changes that came with the Internet were positive, the Taylors said that they missed the one-onone, personal experience with the customer, and due to that relational aspect of the job, their passion became about the people they served.

"We had good customers. We took care of them, and they took care

of us," says Reggie. However, their long-standing careers as car salesmen finally came to an end, and the two men are looking toward a future of possibility.

"I didn't know what I was going to retire to. And I still don't know what I'm going to do, to be honest with you. I want to take some time for myself. It was time. After 48 years, it's time," Reggie says.

While Reggie retired only a few months ago, Lindsay has already grown well-accustomed to life away from working at the dealership, having retired two years ago in the midst of the pandemic. In his retirement, Lindsay says he enjoys spending his extra time with family and hopes to travel more.

As salesmen, the brothers were never bored, but now that they aren't working six days a week,

they have gotten used to the change of pace.

"We always had something to do, and then we would always be prospecting for customers in our minds who we could sell a car to. Now you don't think that once you

retire," says Reggie.

However, because the pair have spent most of their lives seeking prospects of car shoppers, they still find it difficult at times to "just shut it off after all these years,' and they still find themselves filled with joy after seeing a car that they sold to someone they

know. "If we didn't have good customers, we wouldn't have been there. Friends...good friends and customers," says

Lindsay. Reggie and Lindsay say that they tip their hats to the employees at the dealership for putting in the work to make the car ready to sell and to deliv-

er it to the customer. "The dealership itself, the employees at the dealership, have been very good to us," Reggie explains. "We sell a car, but there's a lot behindthe-scenes...somebody's got to service the car, clean the car, get the car ready for us to sell, because we as salespeople didn't do that."

Overall, the brothers are grateful to Bolivar and the surrounding community for supporting them through the decades during their work at Bill Roberts Chevrolet.





"The Super Mario Bros. Movie"

wrote in my review of "Dungeons & Dragons: Honor Among Thieves" that I wasn't really familiar with the "Dungeons & Dragons" game, and that may have affected my enjoyment of the movie. There will be no such disclaimer for "The Super Mario Bros. Movie." My brother and I were introduced to video games through "Super Mario Bros." and "Donkey Kong Country." I even tried playing the games myself sometimes, in between watching my brother play and actually win. So, while I'm not saying that I picked up on every Nintendo Easter Egg in this movie, there wasn't much that caught me off-guard. And that's kind of the problem, nothing here

surprised me. Brothers Mario (Chris Pratt) and Luigi (Charlie Day) aren't having much luck with their plumbing business in Brooklyn, but their fortunes could change if they can stop a massive flood. They follow the sewer system to a mysterious pipe, which they enter, only to be whisked away to the world of the Mushroom Kingdom, where they get split up. On top of being lost, stranded, and separated from his brother. Mario is trapped in a world that centers around his least-favorite pizza top-

ping. Mario makes fast friends with scrappy Mushroom Kingdom resident Toad (Keegan-Michael Key), who suggests they go to get help from Princess Peach (Anya Taylor-Joy). She's dealing with a problem of her own: an impending invasion by the evil Bowser (Jack Black) and his army of Koopas. Bowser has taken Luigi hostage, so Mario and Peach have a shared interest in his defeat. Mario and Toad accompany Peach on a mission to recruit the Kong army to combat the Koopas. King Cranky Kong (Fred Armisen) agrees to loan Peach his army if Mario can defeat his son Donkey Kong (Seth Rogen) in an arena battle. An alliance is soon formed, but Bowser

isn't far off. Bowser, for his part, is probably the funniest character in the movie, thanks to three words: Jack Black singing. He has a diabolical plan to marry Peach, which he plans to do by force, but he also wants to do it the right way, with romance and attentiveness. "Adventure Time" had a storyline like this, and arguably, so did "Beauty and the Beast." But this is the first one to throw

in a Jack Black piano

Black's performance is one of the few memorable things about this movie, the rest is pretty much disposable. Every time the movie gives us a funny joke or action beat, a lame one will come along to even it out, and vice versa. Very little falls above (or below, to be fair) the level of "middling." I'll say this: it was a good idea to make this movie animated. You just don't get this brand of bright colors and bouncy movements in real life. Plus, I've seen portions of the yucky 1993 live-action movie. I haven't seen it all the way through, but I think it's safe to say that this is better.

By the time you read this, "The Super Mario Bros. Movie" will probably be the #1 movie of the year at the domestic box office, after a killer opening over Easter weekend. I'm glad that something is taking down the MCU mush that was "Ant-Man and the Wasp: Quantumania," especially given the whole MODOK fiasco. But I'd also like to see this movie taken down by something that I can actually recommend. This movie comes close to breaking the streak of the world never getting a single decent video game movie, it really does, but the jokes and action, not to mention some stiff voice performances (Taylor-Joy could have used a few more takes, so could Black when he's delivering straight lines) just barely make this movie an underwater level.

"The Super Mario Bros. Movie" is rated PG for action and mild violence. Its running time is 92 minutes.

CONSERVING THOUGHTS

The success story of wood ducks

or many waterfowl hunters and nature viewers, the wood duck is Missouri's - and, to a larger extent, North America's forgotten conservation success story.

Much media attention has been given to the comeback of this region's deer and turkey populations from near extinction to their present levels of abundance. In non-hunting circles, the population resurgences of eye-catching creatures like bald eagles and bluebirds have garnered many headlines. Granted, this attention has been well-deserved because these events are examples of great conservation successes. The wood duck's comeback is a lesser-known conservation success story. This bird's return to prosperity is well-documented, but over the decades, it has gradually slipped into the realm of obscurity.

Wood ducks are North America's most attractive duck species - hands down. The green-headed male mallard may be the most familiar wild duck to most people, but you would get little argument from biologists and nature viewers if you said the male wood duck is the prettiest duck. As with most bird species, males are more colorful than females. The head of a male wood duck in spring courtship colors is iridescent green, blue and purple. Two white lines run parallel to each other from the base of the bill to the back of the head. The male's strikingly colored head is complemented by a white chin and throat, red eyes, red at the base of the bill, a deep, rust-colored chest, bronze sides and a black back and tail. Some of these colorful body feathers are accentuated by additional white striping.

From a population standpoint, it's easy to understand why the wood duck's comeback

story has slipped out of the spotlight. Wood ducks are common nesters throughout the state. Wood ducks are year-round residents of Missouri, but in winter, visiting ducks from colder areas in the north swell southern Missouri's wood duck numbers to greater abundance. Wood ducks aren't just doing well in Missouri: This creature's population is considered to be secure throughout much of its range in the eastern and central U.S.

Because of this abundance, wood ducks are classified as a gamebird and are one of the species included in Missouri's waterfowl seasons. In duck hunting circles, wood ducks are known for providing tasty table fare. Their colorful feathers are also valued by fly-fishing enthusiasts who like to tie their own lures.

The wood duck's story hasn't always been a tale of abundance. At the outset of the 20th century, a number of the country's bird experts were alarmed at the bird's dwindling numbers. In 1901, the U.S. Biological Survey stated that the wood duck was facing extinction. Noted turn-of-the-century naturalist W.W. Cooke wrote:

"... The wood duck is constantly diminishing in numbers and soon is likely to be known only from books or by tradition."

Another well-known nature name from this era, historian and naturalist George Bird Grinnell, also was pessimistic. He wrote:

"They (wood ducks) are becoming scarce and are likely to be exterminated before too long."

Unregulated hunting was partly to blame. Not only were wood ducks relentlessly pursued by market hunters for meat; plume hunters killed wood ducks for their colorful feathers which were used in women's hats and for a variety of other decorative clothing purposes.

Over-hunting wasn't the only culprit in the wood duck's decline, though. Changing habitat conditions were also a factor. The disappearance of bottomland forests and timbered areas along streams deprived wood ducks of nesting habitat. Unlike most other ducks, wood ducks nest in cavities in tree trunks. That's where they get their name, because their nests are in the wood of trees. (They're also called "tree ducks," another appropriate moniker.) It's presumed the disappearance of this nesting habitat had as much to do with sending North America's wood duck population into a tailspin as unregulated hunting did.

The creation of federal laws to regulate the hunting of migratory bird species in the early 1900s helped the plight of wood ducks and other migratory birds. Better forestry management practices improved habitat for wood ducks and other birds.

In addition to these broad-stroke measures, another effort focused specifically on wood ducks has helped to bring this colorful waterfowl species back from the brink of extinction - the installation of wood duck nesting boxes. Studies showed that wood ducks would readily nest and raise broods in man-made nesting boxes that are built to specifications preferred by nesting females and located at habitat-appropriate sites. As early as 1912, mention is made of nesting boxes being a cure for the wood duck's woes. It's thought the installation and monitoring of wood duck nesting boxes by government wildlife agencies and citizen conservation groups throughout the eastern and central U.S. over the past century has played a major role in the resurgence of the wood duck population.

The wood duck's comeback is another example of what can happen when citizens care about conservation.

The availability of good nesting habitat is just as important today as it was 100 years ago, which means wood duck nesting boxes still play an important role in maintaining this species' population. Message to current **Bolivar United Methodist Members**

Important General Council changes are coming. Congregations as close as Springfield, Missouri have filed to leave, the UMC, as well as other large congregations in Oklahoma, Arkansas, North Carolina, Georgia, Texas, etc. Many are leaving monthly. Why?

For the most part, these congregations are not desiring to disaffiliate, but, feel that the United Methodist Church is leaving them, by departing from traditional values. At least 2000 congregations are electing to leave the United Methodist Church (founded in 1968). The denomination has allowed those who are anticipating the probable official changes in church doctrine and policy a window to exit this year,

just prior to the General Council's convening in May of 2024. The two issues which are likely to be overturned are as follows:

Regarding the ministry of the ordained 304.3: The practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching. Therefore self-avowed practicing homosexuals are not to be certified as candidates, ordained as ministers, or appointed to serve in The United Methodist Church. 341.6: Ceremonies that celebrate homosexual unions shall not be conducted by our ministers and shall not be conducted in our churches. (UMC Book of Discipline which is church policy).

While proposed General Council changes would not initially effect the Bolivar church, the trend is not going to return to the past.




Beef Cattle






