This summer I exhibited a sample of fescue seed at both the Ozark Empire Fair and Missouri State Fair. I received the reserve grand champion ribbon at the Ozark Empire Fair which was exciting. This year I applied for a beef proficiency award, area star farmer, and my state degree all at once. My combined SAE and FFA points totaled nearly 2,100 points so we knew going in that I could be potentially pretty competitive for beef proficiency and star farmer. Though I didn't get either star farmer or beef proficiency I was runner up in both at the area level which I am very proud of knowing that I had accomplished and closed out my high school records with much gained knowledge while racking up a good amount of points. I was still able to earn my state degree and will apply for my American Degree after one year prior to my graduation. 

Activities at this institute were very intriguing and useful. There were skits throughout the day where members




