

# Harrison adds another tate itle to trophy case

HOT SPRINGS — Saturday morning, March 20, the Harrison Lady Goblins once again were crowned the queens of Class 4A basketball as they defeated Farmington to earn the Class 4A State Basketball Championship.

Harrison led from the first score until the game ended. The final score was 68-54.

The Lady Goblins started with a 7-0 lead and led at all of the breaks.

Farmington used a 14-2 run to cut the Harrison lead to five points, but the Lady Goblins made a living at the free throw line to finish with the big win.

This is the fourth time that the Lady Goblins and Farmington met this season. Harrison has now won two of the meetings.

The championship game was at the Hot Springs Convention Arena.

This marks the fifth time in Harrison basketball history that the Lady Goblins have won a title. The squad has been to the state championship game seven times winning five of those games.

Harrison was runner-ups in 1996 and 2005. The Lady Goblins had a good 10-year run during the previous trips to the state title game.

Harrison started the season playing some quality teams. The Lady Goblins played six teams in classifications larger than their own. They defeated several playoff teams in larger classifications.

The Lady Goblins were 3-0 against Class 6A playoff teams and 1-0 against Class 5A teams.

Against playoff schools in Class 4A, Harrison finished the season 6-3.

Due to COVID-19, the Lady Goblins had to cancel three games this season. The complexion of the entire season changed. No tournaments were allowed to be played by Arkansas schools.

Harrison didn't cross the state line to play Missouri schools and in the Willard (Mo.) Four-State Classic. This marks the second time since the inception of the Lendel Thomas Classic that the event wasn't held.

The Lady Goblins started the season with a win over Bentonville West. A scrimmage game with Greenbrier turned into a real game and Harrison left with an eightpoint win.

Cedarville's game with the Lady Goblins was canceled before Harrison played Springdale Har-Ber. Harrison left with a seven point win on Nov. 17.

Two games were canceled because of the virus and the Lady Goblins had a three week layoff before taking the court against Mammoth Spring. Harrison defeated the Lady Bears and then sent Rogers Heritage home with a loss.

In the last non-conference game of the season, the Lady Goblins traveled to Baxter County to face arch-rival Mountain Home. The Lady Goblins left town with a 17-point win.

Harrison ended the non-conference portion of the season with a 6-0 mark.

After Harrison started in 4A-1 play, the Lady Goblins found ways to win. Harrison had large wins over Prairie Grove and Gentry.

Looming in front of the Lady Goblins was defending Class 4A State Champions — Farmington.

# Tady Goblins never give up lead in over Farmington

HOT SPRINGS — Defense and free throws are key factors in winning a basketball game.

Saturday morning in Hot Springs, the Lady Goblins of Harrison put on a clinic in posting a Class 4A State Basketball Tournament victory. Harrison defeated Farmington, 68-54.

This was the fourth meeting between the two schools with Harrison winning two which included the state title contest.

Harrison won the regular season conference game between the two teams, but lost the district tournament and regional tournament pairings between the two squads.

The Lady Goblins started the second period with a bucket from Mariah Hudson. That was answered by Farmington to cut the Harrison lead to 22-18.

Then the Lady Goblins shot off with an 11-0 run.

Alex Hill started the run and then dished to an open Clare Barger who hit an inside shot. Just 25 seconds

later Barger scored again after the Lady Goblins had crashed the offensive glass. Barger picked off the second offensive rebound and converted it to points.

Continuing to crash the offensive glass, freshman Reese Ricketts picked off a rebound and scored.

Maggie Salmon finished up the run with a trey to make it a 33-18 contest.

Farmington closed the run with a bucket, but Madison Bell saw Ricketts in the paint and hit the post player for another inside score.

Harrison finished at halftime leading, 37-25.

Hill started the third period with a 6-2 run. Bell hit Hill inside the paint that resulted in a two-shot foul. Hill made one of the those and then a minute later, made a basket and was fouled. Hudson hit Hill on the win and the senior drained a 3-pointer to push Harrison ahead, 43-27.

Farmington warmed up and scored on three possessions in 25 seconds to cut the Harrison lead to 43-33.

Ricketts stopped the mini-run, and started one for Harrison. Her bucket was answered by two Farmington free throws, but she scored once

## Lady Goblins FINISH 105 OVERALL

NORTH LITTLE ROCK — Leading into the postseason, the Lady Goblins of Harrison were leading the Class 4A polls and were No. 8 in the Overall Poll.

After finishing with a 22-3 record and a 68-54 win in the state championship over Farmington, Harrison proved their top ranking in Class 4A and moved up to No. 5 in the Overall Poll according to the Arkansas Sports Media High School Girls Basketball Poll.

Bergman's Lady Panthers finished second in Class 3A and received two votes in the Overall Poll. Valley Springs held their ranking at No. 4 in Class 3A. Kingston's Lady Yellow Jackets earned two votes in Class 1A.

In the Overall Poll, Melbourne's 32-1 record along with a Class 2A championship earned them the No. 1 ranking. Fort Smith Northside won Class 6A and sits at No. 2. Third is the winner of Class 6A in Jonesboro. Fayetteville's second-place finish in Class 6A put them in the poll at No. 4. Harrison moved from eighth to fifth after winning the Class 4A title. Bentonville is No. 6 and Conway takes No. 7. Batesville ended the season at No. 8 while North Little Rock and Mayflower tied for the 10th position.

In Class 6A, FS Northside won the state title and leads the group while Fayetteville takes No. 2. Bentonville is third followed by Conway and then North Little Rock.

Jonesboro went from previously unranked to the No. 1 spot in Class 5A after a state finals win. Batesville held its spot at No. 2 and Greenwood fell from first to third. Vilonia stayed at No. 4 and West Memphis entered the poll at fifth.

Harrison held its spot atop Class 4A with a win over No. 2 Farmington. Morrilton and Pulaski Academy tied for third after both were previously unranked. Star City fell to fifth from second after being defeated by the Lady Goblins in the quarterfinals.

Mayflower defeated Centerpoint in the finals of Class 3A and take the No. 1 position in the classification. Bergman's semifinal

loss put the Lady Panthers at No. 2 in the ranking. Centerpoint finishes at third. Valley Springs finished their season at No. 4 and Mountain View is fifth.

Class 2A is led by Melbourne. Salem is second followed by Bigelow, Fordyce and then Marmaduke.

Rural Special won Class 1A and is followed by Norfork and then Viola. West Side Greers Ferry enters the poll at No. 4 and Mount Vernon-Enola is fifth.

more after getting two offensive rebounds before dropping the shot in.

Hudson scored the next point after being fouled after collecting an offensive rebound. Barger then pushed Harrison back to a 50-35 lead after Sydney Shrum hit her with a pass.

Farmington scored the last six points of the period to end the third with a 50-41 game in favor of Harrison.

The Lady Cardinals, who have been known to make late runs, continued to score while Harrison managed only two points in a 7:03 streak.

Hill's two points were the only two in a Farmington 14-2 streak. The Lady Cardinals had pulled with 52-47 with 3:02 left.

Then Harrison took over the ballgame.

Hill, who took three charges in the game, took one and then was fouled by the Lady Cardinals. She hit both charity tosses.

Those free throws started a streak by Harrison that resulted in the Lady Goblins hitting 14-of-18 opportunities.

Ricketts was the only player to score a field goal for Harrison in the final 2:33 of the game. Hill hit 11 free throws in that stretch of the game, Hudson nailed two and Shrum one.

After sprinting to a 7-0 lead which included five points from Alex Hill and a bucket by Barger to begin the

first period, the Lady Goblins ended the first quarter with a trey from Shrum to put the team ahead, 20-15.

Harrison's largest lead of the first quarter was nine points when Hudson had a steal and a layup.

The largest lead in the second period with at 33-18 on three occasions.

In the third period, Harrison led by 16 points and in the final frame the largest lead of the game was 17 points.

Harrison had a pair of double double players with one being a senior and one a freshman. Hill, the senior, had 30 points which included 13 from the free throw line. She also had 10 rebounds.

Ricketts ended the game with 10 rebounds and 10 points.

Clare Barger added 12 points in the game. Mariah Hudson pitched in seven points, Salmon five points and Shrum four.

Harrison finished the game with nine turnovers while Farmington had 10. Three of the Farmington turnovers came on Harrison steals.

The Lady Goblins spanked Farmington by 14 points and then beat Berryville by 22 points.

The next opponent came into the game getting recognition at the time on the state level. Harrison left Springdale and Shiloh Christian with a one-point win.

Another one-point win was on the schedule as Harrison left Gravette after sliding by 47-46.

Huntsville was what the doctor ordered for the Lady Goblins. The team had an opportunity to flex its muscles and relax by downing Huntsville by 43 points.

Back to the grind, Harrison then defeated the future district tournament winner Pea Ridge by five points before leaving Berryville with an eight-point win.

Feb. 9 was the Lady Goblins' last regular season game. Harrison defeated Shiloh Christian by 10 points in Goblin Arena.

After an easy winter, Mother Nature stepped in to create problems in the high school basketball world. The conclusion of the regular season was ended without finishing the last games. Some schools lacked two conference games while most still had one left to play. Some teams had completed the entire league schedule.

Teams were seeded into the event and Harrison was the top seed from the 4A-1 east side. The team earned a trip to the regional tournament and a trip to the semifinals of the district event.

The begin date of the district tournament was moved ahead to get it started before more weather occurred. After the second round of weather, the tournament was to be played to the semifinals and the four teams in the semifinals would be the conference representatives. The conference would seed the teams backed upon the regular season league finish.

With that information, the Lady Goblins would be the No. 1 seed from the conference.

Things changed.

The Arkansas Activities Association pushed the regional, state and finals back one week. This move allowed the 4A-1 to play its district event.

After taking its second extended break of the season, Harrison was back on the court two weeks later. The Lady Goblins fell to Farmington in the semifinals before defeating Berryville in the consolation game.

Harrison was now the No. 3 seed from the league into the Class 4A North Region Tournament that was held in Ozark.

Drawing the host in the first game, Harrison doubled up the Lady Hillbillies to assure themselves of a trip to the state tournament.

After facing Ozark, the Lady Goblins had fourth quarter struggles. The team had a large lead against Pea Ridge in the regional semifinals before losing it. The team led Farmington in the fourth quarter in the consolation game before losing that game.

Harrison had dropped three of its last five games heading into the state tournament.

As the No. 4 seed from the North, the Lady Goblins drew No. 3 Brookland from the East. Harrison won, 49-41, to move to the quarterfinals.

With the win, the Lady Goblins were facing the other Class 4A State Champion from last year. (Last season the final games in Class 3A, 4A, 5A and 6A were not held because of COVID-19. The AAA declared the two teams in the final game as state champions.) Star City was on the agenda.

The Lady Bulldogs were ahead of Harrison in the fourth period, but the Lady Goblins came back and secured the win.

Harrison found itself in the semifinals of the state tournament and for the second tournament in a row, it was to play the host team. Harrison took an early lead against Morrilton and never gave it up as the Lady Goblins were headed to the championship game in Hot Springs.
