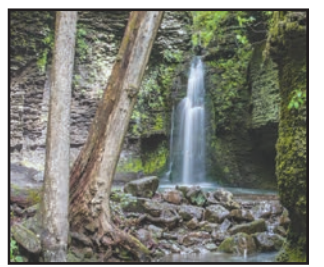

Council hears comments on DG proposal

Harrison City Council met for their regular monthly meeting on Thursday, June 27. One item on the agenda that drew a great deal of attention from community members was the proposed rezoning of 807 and 809 S. Pine Street - a proposal that would change the lots' zoning from C-2 to C-3.

The rezone request was made to allow for a Dollar General store at the location where residential structures are now standing. C-2 and C-3 are both commercial zoning but C-3 is less restrictive. Examples cited at the meeting were things like offices and convenience stores being C-2, while things like Wal-mart or hotels would be considered C-3.

The rezoning request had already passed through the city's planning commission in May and the council discussed it at their meeting of committees on June 13. Thursday's meeting was well-attended and several citizens signed in to have a turn to speak on the topic during the allotted discussion period. Community comments on agenda items - such as this proposed ordinance to rezone the lots, are limited to three minutes duration. However, the speakers managed to share a variety of perspectives throughout those minutes.

Mary Hickman, who has spoken at previous meetings on the matter, reiterated her opinion that South Pine is a Historic street that will be harmed by the addition of Dollar General. Hickman predicts an "erosion" to the irreplaceable character of the neighborhood as developments like these take hold.

Dr. Caroline Burton is the owner of 607 and 611 (Kirby Manor) on South Pine. Like others, she expressed an emotional investment, as well as a financial investment, in the character of the neighborhood. Kirby Manor was the former home of

Scott Tennyson welcomed guests to the event, followed by 2011 Women of Distinction honoree, Cathy Brandt, giving

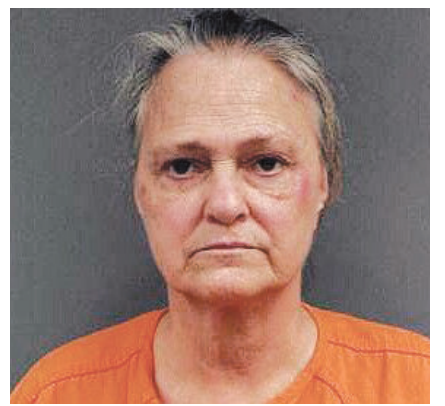

Charges filed in Sanders bomb threat

LITTLE ROCK - 66-year-old Susan Scott, of Fort Smith, has been charged with making threats against Governor Sarah Huckabee Sanders. The threats included killing the governor and bombing her office. The charges arose from a phone call Scott made on June 14, during which she allegedly expressed her intentions to construct and detonate a bomb at the governor's office, according to KHBS news.

The charges filed in Sebastian County Circuit Court are listed as "threatening to cause a catastrophe" and "battery in the second degree - officer." Court documents indicate the battery was committed against Arkansas State Police officer James Hamilton.

Genealogy Department

Everton, Arkansas Incorporated 1913

The Missouri & North Arkansas Railroad was built through Boone County at the beginning of the twentieth century. Everton was one of many new communities that sprung to life during the railroad era. The railroad depot and post office were both established in 1902.

By 1915, the town had four general stores, a bank, hardware store, drugstore, two flour mills, and two hotels. A corn cob pipe factory opened in 1923, by the end of the 1930's the factory was producing 6,000 pipes per day. The factory paid farmers thirty cents per pound for shelled corn cobs and twenty five cents per pound for the corn. The Works Progress Administration (WPA) constructed a new school for students in 1939.

The 1940's was a difficult decade for the small town. In December 1942 a fire originated in Pete Dahlman Grocery Store destroying a garage, barbershop, produce & feed store, and two unoccupied buildings. A second fire in 1944 started in a room attached to the post office thus

destroying a grocery store, restaurant, general store, barbershop, and feed store. By the end of the decade the school was consolidated with Valley Springs and Bellefonte school districts. The local Methodist congregation purchased the school building.

As of the 2020 U.S. Federal Census 104 residents call Everton, Arkansas home. In 2005 a new community center was built in a design to resemble a railroad depot.

The Best Medicine

You might have heard that for members of our military, adjusting back to civilian life can be difficult. Every veteran's military experience is different, so the challenges of fitting back into society range from quick, minor tweaks to a lifetime struggle. The same holds true for their families and friends who wait impatiently to welcome their veteran home, only to find a stranger at their door. The hugs seem less, the conversations strained, and their smiles forced.

The sweet kid who answered their country's call to duty no longer exists.

Those who have seen combat up close and personal are probably changed the most, but just experiencing boot-camp and military life for a few years is enough to forever alter personalities and skew one's view of themselves and the world. This is exactly what the training is designed to do. Eliminate individualism and replace it with putting the team and mission first. Don't think — just follow orders. Remove the human instinct of not wanting to harm others and learn how to become an effective killer. You become desensitized to blood and violence. This may sound harsh, but this attitude is necessary to win and survive.

Then one day there are suddenly no more orders. The daily routine you lived by for years has vanished. The band of brothers and sisters, the mission and the purpose that gave your life balance and meaning are nowhere to be found. You are surrounded only by civilians who could never understand. You go from job to job never really fitting in. As you become more and more lost in this unfamiliar world, healthy relationships become near impossible. Or, you might be married with a good job and a couple of kids, but deep down a part of you still feels confused, lost and alone. For some, in addition to all this comes the crippling effects of having PTSD.

The best way I know how to describe it is the Thoreau quote about men (and women) leading lives of quiet desperation. Most don't complain and go about life the best they can knowing something is missing. The worst part is often they can't quite put their finger on what.

At Camp Jack we hear veterans of all generations talk about this issue most every day. It usually takes a while for them trust their new band of brothers and sisters enough to open up, but when they do the healing begins. Sometimes we can get them to see a professional counselor which is the best course, but just being around others who have been there, done that, helps a lot. This is why it is important to encourage your veteran to drop by Camp Jack and say hi. Being around other's with shared experiences is often the best medicine.

NHTSA reminds drivers: drive sober or get pulled over

On this Independence Day, honor the ideals of America by making a conscious choice to drive sober or get a sober ride home.

Local law enforcement will partner with the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) for the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over campaign. The goal is to deter impaired driving, and prevent the tragedies seen in previous Fourth of July holidays from happening again.

Every year, the Fourth of July holiday stands out as one of the deadliest times on the nation's roads. From 2018 to 2022, there were 1,414 drivers killed in traffic crashes during the holiday. Thirty-nine percent (545) of those drivers were drunk. Of the 1,414 drivers killed, the 21-34 age group had the highest percent (50%) of drunk drivers.

"We want to make it clear that on this Fourth of July holiday, we will have a zero-tolerance policy against drinking and driving," said a Harrison Police Department representative. "There will be no leniency shown. We are well-trained to identify signs of drunk driving on the road. Driving under the influence is a violation of the law, and a reckless act that puts the lives of drivers, their passengers, and others on the road at extreme risk. We urge everyone to keep road safety in mind as they prepare for the celebrations. Make responsible choices to help us ensure a safe and enjoyable holiday for all." Drivers should be

safe during this Independence Day holiday by planning ahead if they intend to drink. They shouldn't wait until after drinking to plan how to get somewhere. Impairment clouds a person's judgment. Drivers should secure a designated sober driver or call a taxi or rideshare for a sober ride home.

If a driver finds they are unable to drive, they should give their keys to a sober driver so that person can get them home safely. When a friend has been drinking and is considering driving, friends should be proactive — take away the keys and help them get a sober ride home. If anyone spots a drunk driver, contact local law enforcement.

NO MORE "BALANCE BILLS" FOR AMBULANCE SERVICES

Some time ago, I read that Arkansas passed a law against "balance billing" for ambulance services. What is "balance billing"?

"Balance billing" means that when there is a difference between what a health-insurance policy would cover and what a medical-service provider charges, the person needing the service would have to pay the difference, the balance due.

The new Arkansas law forbidding that practice, when applied to ambulance services, is a significant development. Before the law, insurance for people needing an ambulance could fall well short of hundreds of dollars or more that the provider would bill for. "Balance-billed" ambulance charges could cause even insured Arkansans to suffer unmanageable medical debt and other serious financial and health repercussions.

The federal government had already outlawed "balance billing" for air-ambulance services, in 2022, under the "No Surprises Act." A similar rule extends to ground services as well here in Arkansas, effective as of last August. Now, neither air nor ground ambulance providers are allowed to demand "balance" payment from the insured. Now insureds pay no more than a deductible, copayment, or coinsurance required under a health benefit plan. This is a welcome development.

Podiatrist sentenced for \$4M foot bath fraud scheme

A Tennessee podiatrist was sentenced this week to four years in prison for a scheme to defraud Medicare and TennCare, a Medicaid program administered by the State of Tennessee, by prescribing and dispensing medically unnecessary foot bath medications and obtaining millions of dollars in reimbursements.

According to court documents and evidence presented at trial, Nathan Lucas, D.P.M., 59, of Memphis, owned and operated a podiatry clinic and two pharmacies. Lucas regularly prescribed antibiotic and antifungal drugs to be mixed into a tub of water for patients to soak their feet. These drug cocktails included capsules, creams, and powders that were not indicated to be dissolved in water and some of which were not even water soluble.

Lucas chose these medications to prescribe and dispense based on their anticipated reimbursement amount, rather than medical necessity. From October 2018 through September 2021, Lucas caused his pharmacies to submit nearly \$4 million in claims to Medicare and TennCare for dispensing expensive foot bath medications that were not medically necessary and not eligible for reimbursement, for which Lucas's pharmacies were reimbursed over \$3 million.

A federal jury convicted Lucas on March 18 of five counts of health care fraud.

The Fraud Section leads the Criminal Division's efforts to combat health care fraud through the Health Care Fraud Strike Force Program. Since March 2007, this program, currently comprised of nine strike forces operating in 27 federal districts, has charged more than 5,400 defendants who collectively have billed federal health care programs and private insurers more than \$27 billion.

In addition, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, working in conjunction with HHS-OIG, are taking steps to hold providers accountable for their involvement in health care fraud schemes. More information can be found at www.justice.gov/criminal-fraud/health-care-fraud-unit.

Air tankers attack Arizona wildfire that has forced evacuations outside of Scottsdale

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz.—Nearly 200 firefighters on Friday battled a wildfire northeast of Phoenix where air tankers were dropping retardant on the flames that forced dozens of residents to flee their homes overnight.

Arizona fire officials said there have been no immediate reports of any injuries or homes damaged by the human-caused fire that broke out at about 2:30 p.m. Thursday near the Boulder Heights subdivision, just outside of Scottsdale.

Elsewhere, crews continued to make progress on large wildfires that broke out earlier this week, including one south of Bend, Oregon, and another about 60 miles (97 km) east of Fresno, California.

In Arizona, an estimated 60 people had left their homes by Friday morning after Maricopa County emergency person-

nel ordered evacuations for the subdivision on the edge of the Tonto National Forest. The blaze dubbed the Boulder View Fire had burned about 5 square miles (13 square kilometers) with zero containment, authorities said.

"The southeast side of the fire remained active throughout the night producing 20-40 foot (6-12 meter) flame lengths in areas," Tiffany Davila, a spokesperson for the Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management, said Friday.

"Additional resources were redirected to that side of the fire last night to begin structure protection and help crews start firing operations to tie the fire into nearby roads," she said.

The Red Cross set up an evacuation center at a high school in Scottsdale and evacuation shelters for horses and other large animals were established at several locations, including the rodeo grounds at

nearby Cave Creek. The National Interagency Fire Center said large wildfires also were burning Friday in Alaska, Oregon, California, New Mexico and Washington.

In central California, about 200 firefighters were battling the entirely uncontained Basin fire that has burned an estimated 9 square miles (23 square km) about 60 miles (97 km) east of Fresno. It was the only one still burning among 18 fires sparked by lightning along the western edge of the Sierra when a storm moved through earlier this week, the fire center said.

In Oregon's high desert, firefighters said Friday they had dug fire lines around nearly half of the Darlene 3 fire that had forced hundreds of evacuations earlier in the week south of Bend, near La Pine. That fire has now burned an estimated 6 square miles (15 square km) and was listed at 42% containment.

Pair of giant pandas from China arrive safely at San Diego Zoo

SAN DIEGO—Two giant pandas from China have safely arrived in Southern California, where they will be cared for as part of an ongoing conservation partnership, the San Diego Zoo Wildlife Alliance said Friday.

The pandas, Yun Chuan and Xin Bao, will spend the next sever-

al weeks acclimating to their new home in a private habitat at the San Diego Zoo and will not be viewable by the public, the alliance said in a brief statement.

"They are being monitored closely by expert wildlife health and care teams who will determine when the pair are ready to meet the public," the alliance said.

A farewell ceremony was held earlier this week before the pandas departed from China.

Yun Chuan, a mild-mannered male who's nearly 5 years old, has connections to California, the wildlife alliance said previously. His mother, Zhen Zhen, was born at the San Diego Zoo in 2007 to parents Bai Yun and Gao Gao.

Xin Bao is a nearly 4-year-old female described as "a gentle and witty introvert with a sweet round face and big ears."

The San Diego Zoo Wildlife Alliance has a nearly 30-year partnership with leading conservation institutions in China focused on protecting and recovering giant pandas and the bamboo forests they depend on.

State capitol week in review

LITTLE ROCK – Arkansas families and businesses will save more than \$483 million in income taxes next year, thanks to a tax cut passed by the legislature during a three-day special session.

Also, Arkansas homeowners will see their property taxes go down by about \$46 million because the legislature increased the homestead property tax credit from \$425 to \$500.

Senate Bill 1 had the major income tax reduction. It lowers individual income taxes for about 1.1 million Arkansas taxpayers by reducing the top rate from 4.4 percent to 3.9 percent. That will save taxpayers \$384.2 million next year and \$256.1 million in following years. The savings are higher next year because they actually include 18 months of savings, from January 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025.

After that, in a typical 12-month fiscal year the savings will be \$256.1 million. Numerous lawmakers said that income taxes need to be lowered, even eliminated, in order for Arkansas to remain competitive with neighboring states. Every tax reduction makes it easier for the state to recruit industry.

The Senate bill also lowers corporate income taxes by changing the top rate from 4.8 percent to 4.3 percent. In the first 18 months it is in effect it will save Arkansas businesses about \$99.3 million and then the savings will be about \$66.2 million every fiscal year.

An estimated 7,800 corporations will get a tax cut, according to a fiscal impact statement by the state Department of Finance and Administration.

Property taxes will go down for assessment years beginning January 1, 2024, because of the increase in the homestead property tax credit. The second full year it is in effect it will save homeowners about \$47

million.

The legislature met in special session to finalize a budget for the state Game and Fish Commission. It had to be done before June 30, the final day of the current fiscal year. If the legislature had not approved a budget, the agency would not have had authority to spend any of its funding on July 1.

The special session was scheduled to coincide with the week when the Legislative Council and its subcommittees hold their regular monthly meetings. That helped to hold down the costs of the session because so many lawmakers were scheduled to be at the Capitol anyway.

The legislature has always written very conservative budgets to keep down spending levels for state agencies. For example, state spending will grow by only 1.76 percent next year.

Even after accounting for the loss of revenue due to the income tax reductions, the estimated budget surplus next year will be \$280.3 million.

Since 2013 the legislature, the current governor and the previous governor have approved a series of tax cuts that lowered state revenue by about \$1.5 billion a year. For perspective, this year's total general revenue fund will be \$6.2 billion.

Arkansas operates under a balanced budget law, known as the Revenue Stabilization Act. If an economic downturn causes tax revenue to go down, state agencies must reduce spending by a proportionate amount.

However, the Public School Fund is protected from cuts because the state Constitution mandates that the state provide all children with an education. Other state services do not have similar constitutional protection from budget cuts.

Oklahoma state superintendent orders schools to teach the Bible

OKLAHOMA CITY—Oklahoma's top education official ordered public schools Thursday to incorporate the Bible into lessons for grades 5 through 12, the latest effort by conservatives to incorporate religion into classrooms.

The directive drew immediate condemnation from civil rights groups and supporters of the separation of church and state, with some calling it an abuse of power and a violation of the U.S. Constitution.

The order sent to districts across the state by Republican State Superintendent Ryan Walters says adherence to the mandate is compulsory and "immediate and strict compliance is expected."

"The Bible is an indispensable historical and cultural touchstone," Walters said in a statement. "Without basic knowledge of it, Oklahoma students are unable to properly contextualize the foundation of our nation which is why Oklahoma educational standards provide for its instruction."

Oklahoma law already explicitly allows Bibles in the classroom and lets teachers use them in instruction, said Phil Bacharach, a spokesman for state Attorney General Gentner Drummond.

But it's not clear if Walters has the authority to mandate that schools teach it. State law says individual school districts have the exclusive authority to decide on instruction, curriculum, reading lists, instructional materials and textbooks.

The head of the Oklahoma chapter of the Council on American-Islamic Relations criticized the directive as a clear violation of the Constitu-

tion's Establishment Clause, which prohibits the government from "establishing" a religion.

"We adamantly oppose any requirements that religion be forcefully taught or required as a part of lesson plans in public schools, in Oklahoma, or anywhere else in the country," Adam Soltani said in a statement.

"Public schools are not Sunday schools," said Rachel Laser, president and CEO of Americans United for Separation of Church and State, in a statement. "This is textbook Christian Nationalism: Walters is abusing the power of his public office to impose his religious beliefs on everyone else's children. Not on our watch."

The directive is the latest salvo in an effort by conservative-led states to target public schools: Louisiana has required them to post the Ten Commandments in classrooms, while others are under pressure to teach the Bible and ban books and lessons about race, sexual orientation and gender identity. Earlier this week the Oklahoma Supreme Court blocked an attempt by the state to have the first publicly funded religious charter school in the country.

A former public school teacher who was elected to his post in 2022, Walters ran on a platform of fighting "woke ideology," banning books from school libraries and getting rid of "radical leftists" who he claims are indoctrinating children in classrooms.

He has clashed with leaders in both parties for his focus on culture-war issues including transgender rights and banning books, and in January he faced criticism for appointing a right-wing social media influencer from New York to a state library committee.

The film, which debuts Friday, June 28, on Apple TV+, is about Jax (Gladstone), who, with her niece Roki (Isabel Deroy-Olson), searches for her missing sister. “Fancy Dance,” rich in both cultural detail and genre plotting, marks Tremblay’s directorial debut.

•The life and style of fashion icon Diane von Furstenberg is chronicled in directors Sharmeen Obaid-Chinoy and Trish Dalton’s documentary “Diane von Furstenberg: Woman in Charge,” streaming Tuesday, June 25, on Hulu. The film, which kicked off the recent Tribeca Festival, profiles the Belgian designer whose huge influence on 20th century fashion is most notable for bringing the wrap dress to prominence in 1974.

NEW SHOWS TO STREAM

•After four years, the acclaimed and award-winning German series “Babylon Berlin” has a new season available in the United States. The show is set in the 1930s as the Nazis rose to power. The first three seasons of “Babylon Berlin” originally streamed on Netflix, but now those episodes plus a new fourth season will be available exclusively in North America on the MHz Choice streaming service beginning Tuesday.

•In “Land of Women,” Eva

Longoria plays Gala, a New Yorker who is living the good life one day, and the next is left with her husband’s massive debt after he disappears. She flees to northern Spain with her mother and teenage daughter. The fish-out-of-water series is based on a popular novel and was created for TV by the prolific Spanish TV producer Ramón Campos. The dialogue is a combo of English, Spanish and Catalan — a language spoken in northeastern Spain. “One of the big sources of comedy is miscommunication and this is ripe for that,” Longoria told TV critics earlier this year. The “Land of Women” debuts Wednesday on Apple TV+.

•Shows like “CSI” prompted an interest in forensics, not to mention crime-solving. Now, the franchise creator is behind a non-scripted version called “The Real CSI: Miami.” The show looks at how science was used to solve true crime cases. It premieres Wednesday on CBS and will stream on Paramount+.

•Much like Hulu’s take on Catherine the Great in “The Great,” a new Prime Video series called “My Lady Jane” is an irreverent telling of the story of Lady Jane Grey. At 17, Grey became Queen for nine days before her half-sister Mary stole her support and her crown. She was then sent to the Tower of London where she was executed. “My Lady Jane” debuts Thursday.

•Hello again, Wisconsin! The second season of “That 90’s Show” debuts on Netflix on Thursday. Season one saw Mila Kunis, Ashton Kutcher, Wilmer Valderrama, Laura Prepon and Topher Grace reprise their roles. (Danny Masterson was written out of the show as he prepared for a rape trial that ended with his conviction and a 30 year prison sentence.) For season two, Prepon is the only one from the core group who will be back. The sequel series stars Callie Haverda as Leia Forman, the daughter of Grace’s Eric and Prepon’s Donna, who is visiting her grandparents, Red and Kitty, played by Kurtwood Smith and Debora Jo Rupp.

•Ryan Serhant of Bravo’s

“Million Dollar Listing” is now fronting his own show on Netflix called “Owning Manhattan.” Cameras follow some of his Serhant real estate employees as they compete for expensive listings in New York. Where Serhant pounded the pavement in “Million Dollar Listing,” the pressure is now on his staff instead. Serhant appears in more of a mentor role.

•Marvel star Anthony Mackie swam with sharks in the Gulf of Mexico for National Geographic’s “Shark Beach with Anthony Mackie,” to kick off its SharkFest lineup. The actor is a boating enthusiast who has swam with sharks around the world. He’s also passionate about that region of the country because New Orleans is his hometown. “Shark Beach with Anthony Mackie: Gulf Coast” debuts Sunday, June 30 on National Geographic and July 1 on Disney+ and Hulu.

NEW MUSIC TO STREAM

•The Grammy-award winning R&B singer Lucky Daye is preparing to release a new album on Friday, June 28, titled “Algorithm.” (Think of the name as a creative reversal — he aims to make soulful music that extends beyond the predictability of machine learning.) His single “Soft” is a celebration of the vulnerabilities inherent in a new relationship — atop big drum fills and heart-fluttering harmonies. “HERicane” slows it down, funky riffs making for a flirty track somewhere at the intersection of love and lust.

•On her fourth solo album, “C,XOXO,” Camila Cabello aims to reinvent herself. The lead single “I LUV IT,” featuring rapper Playboi Carti, is what happens when mainstream pop performers pay attention to the hyperpop underground — amplified by its elated, anxiety-inducing repetition of “I love it/I love it/I love it/I love it” in the song’s chorus. Her second single was another detour: The lackadaisical club-y “He Knows,” featuring Lil Nas X, samples Ojerman’s “Give Up 2 Me,” and moves leisurely like smoke dissipating in the air. So, what other surprises will appear

on “C,XOXO”? That will be revealed on Friday, June 28.

•“Megan” is Megan Thee Stallion’s third full-length album and the first to be self-released under her own label, Hot Girl Productions, promises to continue her reign as the sovereign of hot girl summers. Independence looks good on her: From the rap-rock “COBRA,” with its fearless lyricism on everything from infidelity to depression, to the Gwen Stefani-sampling “BOA” — an imaginative take on 2004’s “What You Waiting For?” — it’s clear Megan is enjoying her creative autonomy. But don’t take it from us — a quick listen to “HISS,” an aggressive reclamation of her public image, makes it clear from the spoken-word intro.

•Available on video-on-demand starting Friday, June 28, “Revival69: The Concert That Rocked the World” documents the 1969 Toronto Rock and Roll Revival, a famous festival which featured the debut of The Plastic Ono Band — including video footage of John Lennon’s first major performance outside the Beatles, what many credit as a trigger for Lennon’s decision to leave the band. This doc offers a behind-the-scenes look at the event and footage from its grounds, featuring talking head interviews with some of the musicians who were there. And with a lineup bosting of Lennon, Yoko Ono, Chuck Berry, Little Richard, the Doors, Alice Cooper and beyond — there’s a lot to celebrate.

NEW VIDEO GAMES TO PLAY

•Games don’t get much sillier than Super Monkey Ball Banana Rumble, the latest version of Sega’s most adorable franchise. The premise is simple enough: You control a monkey in a ball, and you zip around 3D mazes while collecting fruit and other goodies. You can compete against up to 15 other simians in a variety of multiplayer games like “Ba-Boom!” — an explosive version of hot potato. Or you can take on adventure mode, with more than 200 levels that you can explore solo or with up to three friends. Peel out Tuesday, June 25, on Nintendo Switch.

Monroe’s former LA home declared a historic monument

LOS ANGELES—Fans of Marilyn Monroe have won a battle to preserve her mark on Los Angeles and are a step closer to seeing a towering statue of the silver screen icon remain in Palm Springs.

The Los Angeles home where Monroe briefly lived and died has been declared a historic cultural monument, while a Palm Springs planning commission decision boosted chances that a

26-foot (8-meter) statue called “Forever Marilyn” will stay in place.

The Los Angeles City Council voted for the historic designation Wednesday after a lengthy battle over whether the home in the tony Brentwood neighborhood would be demolished, the Los Angeles Times reported.

The current owners live next door and wanted to raze the house in order to expand their estate. The council, however, was unani-

mous in moving to save it.

“There’s no other person or place in the city of Los Angeles as iconic as Marilyn Monroe and her Brentwood home,” Traci Park, the area’s council representative, said before the vote.

Monroe bought the house for \$75,000 and died there just months later on Aug. 4, 1962, from an apparent overdose. The current owners, Brinah Milstein and Roy Bank, bought the house for \$8.35 million

and obtained a demolition permit but ran into opposition.

They contend the house has been changed so much over the years that it no longer is historic, and that it has become a neighborhood nuisance due to tourist traffic.

The process that led to the designation was “biased, unconstitutional and rigged,” Peter C. Sheridan, an attorney for Milstein and Bank, said in a statement to The Associated Press.

Sheridan asserted that Park and her staff were not responsive to the owners’ efforts to find a solution and ignored opposition by civic and homeowners’ groups.

The attorney also said the city had “granted dozens of permits to over 14 different prior owners to change the home through numerous remodels, resulting in there being nothing left reflecting Ms. Monroe’s brief time there 60 years ago.”

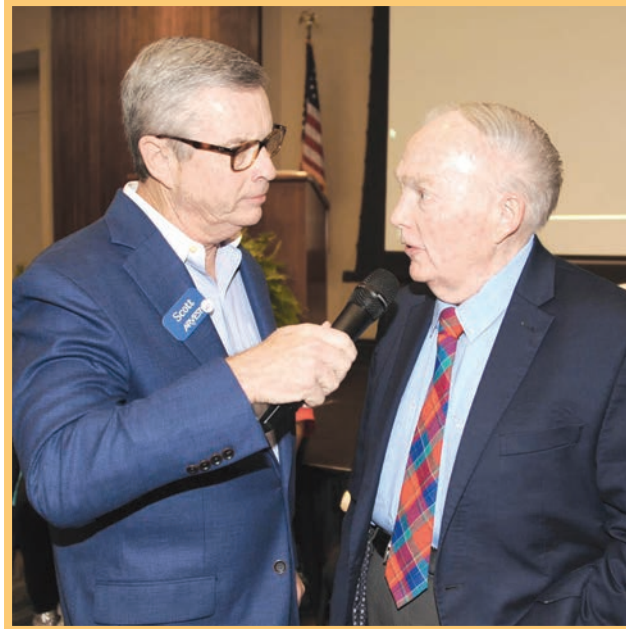

Dr. Franklin Beverly Kirby — the great-grandfather of Dr. Caroline Burton. While Burton grew up in Newport, she spent her Summers in Harrison — her mother's hometown, and describes those times as "magical."

"I cannot tell you what those summers meant to me," Burton shared, "to learn how to swim in Crooked Creek, to learn how to canoe on the Buffalo, to learn how to drive on the Bypass when it was just a gravel road and to sit on the front porch of my great-grandparents' house and hear the stories my great grandfather who practiced medicine here from 1905 until his death in 1934."

Donna Holcomb, who lives across the street from the area where the store location has been proposed, shared concerns about the possibility of rats and other animals being attracted to the dumpsters at the store. Holcomb stated at a previous meeting that traffic was already too dangerous on the street and would get worse. Her own home had been wrecked into in December.

Paivi Armstrong, another resident of Pine Street also expressed concern about an increase in trash to the neighborhood and light pollution as well as noise during construction of the store.

Not all who spoke up about the proposal spoke against it, however. Franklin Harp, who owns the properties that are at the heart of the discussions with his brother, Paul — 807 and 809 S. Pine, explained that the properties have been zoned as commercial lots for a long time.

Harp stated that the lots were designated for business use now and that it was based on a decision the city made years ago. He pointed out that the area has been part of a plan to increase commerce in that part of the city for some time — with talks of all of the new business the Creekside facility could bring, having been frequent during its development. "We either want to bring commerce or we don't," said Harp.

Architect Dan Bartlett also spoke at the meeting. Bartlett stated that the proposal met the city's requirements for landscaping and design and he revealed that the store will be a Dollar General Market — a type of Dollar General that includes an ex-

panded grocery section which carries fresh produce as well as a wider selection of refrigerated and frozen food items.

Council members responded to the community comments and expressed their own concerns in the council's discussion period that followed the comments. The council had the city's engineer, Wade Phillips, clarify the zoning of the neighborhood and what kinds of businesses could be permitted on the lots. Phillips answered that the existing C-2 designation would allow for smaller retail businesses, small doctor's offices, attorney's offices and other businesses of that type to exist there.

Property owner, Harp, said that the property that is vacant had been vacant for quite some time and that while he would love to have a doctor's office go in there, that is not something they have received any proposals for, while Dollar General has shown interest and that "The devil you know is sometimes better than the

devil you don't."

Councilman Reed Petty responded to Harp, "I have a bit of empathy...you have an opportunity here that you'd like to see not fall away, but on the other hand we have an obligation to listen closely to the citizens that we serve."

After listening to the citizens, the council voted to place the ordinance on first read, by title only. The motion to do so passed with only one council member in opposition — Wayne Cone. The council will now have further opportunity to receive feedback from the community and discuss the ordinance at upcoming meetings before making any final decision on the matter.

Regular city council committee meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month at 6:00 p.m. and regular council meetings are held on the fourth Thursday each month at 6:00 p.m. Meetings are held at the City Hall on Industrial Drive. The public is invited to attend these meetings.

Scott appeared in Sebastian County Circuit Court on Wednesday, June 26, where she entered a plea of not guilty to the charges. Bond conditions set forth by the court will prohibit Scott from making any contact with the office of the governor — in person, by phone, by text, or by e-mail. She is also not to attempt contact with the governor directly or with any of Sanders' family and associates. Scott will also be prohibited from possessing any weapons, explosives or components of explosives.

Scott is currently scheduled for a jury trial on the week of November 18. The case may not go to trial if a plea is agreed upon before October 28. Scott's current defense is listed as the public defender.

Governor Sanders has not publicly commented on the incident.

Panel awards Cherokee Nation license to build casino

LITTLE ROCK — The Arkansas Racing Commission on Thursday awarded Cherokee Nation Entertainment a license to build a casino in the state that's been held up for several years by ongoing legal fights.

The panel voted unanimously to award the license for the casino in Pope County, the fourth and final casino allowed under a constitutional amendment voters approved in 2018.

Pope County was one of four sites where casinos were allowed to be built under a constitutional amendment that voters approved in 2018. Casinos have already been set up in the other three locations: Hot Springs, Pine Bluff and West Memphis

Cherokee Nation Entertainment has said it plans to build a 50,000-square-foot casino northeast of Russellville, 60 miles (97 kilometers) northwest of Little Rock. Plans also call for a 200-room hotel, a conference center and outdoor music venue.

"With the license in hand, we are prepared to finalize the remaining permitting and administrative processes so we can commence construction," Chuck Garrett, CEO of Cherokee Nation Entertainment, said in a statement.

The application process for the casino was reopened last year when the state Supreme Court upheld a judge's ruling voiding the license previously awarded to Cherokee Nation.

The Cherokee Nation's application was the only one considered by the Racing Commission. The panel ruled earlier this month that a competing proposal was incomplete since it didn't have support from the county judge or the quorum court, as required.

The planned casino could still face another obstacle. A group backed by the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma is trying to put a measure on the November ballot that, if approved by voters, could lead to the repeal of the Pope County license. The group faces a July 5 deadline to submit petitions to the state and needs at least 90,704 valid signatures from registered voters to qualify.

Man dies after car plunges into lake

A 31-year-old Gamaliel man died after his car ran off a causeway and submerged into the Pigeon Creek arm of Norfolk Lake on Thursday afternoon.

According to a news release from Baxter County Sheriff John Montgomery, the man was identified as Darren M. Martin.

Montgomery said 9-1-1 operators received a call at 12:43 p.m., reporting "that her son phoned her saying that his car had gone off into the lake. He was inside the car and he needed help."

The sheriff noted a precise location was not given and authorities searched several areas for a silver Toyota passenger car as Martin resided near another access point and vehicle could not be seen from the

roadway.

"Patrol boats from the BCSO and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers re-

sponded and numerous numerous bridges and access points on Norfolk Lake were searched, as well as

continuing the search in the Pigeon Creek area," Montgomery said.

Shortly before 2 p.m., a park ranger located vehicle parts or debris on or near the causeway, that could match the missing vehicle. Patrol boats arrived shortly thereafter and confirmed a vehicle in the water, approximately 10 feet under, at that location.

A Sheriff's Office diver then arrived and made a dive on the vehicle, recovering Martin's body.

The sheriff said 13 deputies and the department's helicopter took part in the rescue effort, as well as multiple park rangers, volunteer firefighters and other rescue personnel. The Sheriff's Office Patrol Division will prepare the final accident report.

Supreme Court rules on homelessness

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court decided on Friday that cities can enforce bans on homeless people sleeping outdoors, even in West Coast areas where shelter space is lacking.

The case is the most significant to come before the high court in decades on the issue and comes as a rising number of people in the U.S. are without a permanent place to live.

In a 6-3 decision along ideological lines, the high court reversed a ruling by a San Francisco-based appeals court that found outdoor sleeping bans amount to cruel and unusual punishment.

The majority found that the 8th Amendment prohibition does not extend to bans on outdoor sleeping bans.

"Homelessness is complex. Its causes are many. So may be the public policy

responses required to address it," Justice Neil Gorsuch wrote for the majority. "A handful of federal judges cannot begin to 'match' the collective wisdom the American people possess in deciding 'how best to handle' a pressing social question like homelessness."

He suggested that people who have no choice but to sleep outdoors could raise that as a "necessity defense," if they are ticketed or otherwise punished for violating a camping ban.

A bipartisan group of leaders had argued the ruling against the bans made it harder to manage outdoor encampments encroaching on sidewalks and other public spaces in nine Western states. That includes California, which is home to one-third of the country's homeless population.

"Cities across the West report that the 9th Circuit's involuntary test has crated intolerable uncertainty for them," Gorsuch wrote.

Homeless advocates, on the other hand, said that allowing cities to punish people who need a place to sleep would criminalize homelessness and ultimately make the crisis worse. Cities had been allowed to regulate encampments but couldn't bar people from sleeping outdoors.

"Sleep is a biological necessity, not a crime," Justice Sonia Sotomayor said, reading from the bench a dissent joined by her liberal colleagues.

"Punishing people for their status is 'cruel and unusual' under the Eighth Amendment," she wrote in the dissent. "It is quite possible, indeed likely, that these and similar ordinances will face more days in court."

The case came from the rural Oregon town of Grants Pass, which appealed a ruling striking down local ordinances that fined people \$295 for sleeping outside after tents be-

gan crowding public parks. The U.S. 9th Circuit Court of Appeals, which has jurisdiction over the nine Western states, has held since 2018 that such bans violate the Eighth Amendment in areas where there aren't enough shelter beds.

Friday's ruling comes after homelessness in the United States grew a dramatic 12% last year to its highest reported level, as soaring rents and a decline in coronavirus pandemic assistance combined to put housing out of reach for more people.

More than 650,000 people are estimated to be homeless, the most since the country began using a yearly point-in-time survey in 2007. Nearly half of them sleep outside. Older adults, LGBTQ+ people and people of color are disproportionately affected, advocates said. In Oregon, a lack of mental health and addiction resources has also helped fuel the crisis.

RICHLAND — The Ozarks are known for having some colorful names. Perhaps none is as unforgettable as Fuzzy Butt. Fuzzy Butt is a trail that leads to a waterfall and swimming hole at the end of the hike. As an isolated area, Fuzzy Butt got its name from the swimmers that didn't wear clothing while enjoying the pool of water after the hike into the area. During the spring or after heavy rains, the waterfall offers a strong current com-

ing over the 16-foot drop into the pool. On the recent visit, the water was coming out of a hole in the bluff. There were several areas where water was dropping from the ferns and the bluffs that surround the swimming hole. The hike into the falls is a simple but long one. It is a horse trail, so hikers must pay attention to the path while observing the surroundings. To begin the hike, visitors will start on the west side of the 1205 bridge. The entrance to the path is about 50 feet from the bridge and is hidden while walking up

the county road 1205. There are two ways to get to this bridge. The first way is to take 1205 from the Ben Hur area. This road is about a mile past Ben Hur when traveling east on Highway 16. There are no real street markers for 1205, but it has a tall, small squared white street sign on the left hand side of the road. On the right hand side of the road there is a sign promoting a horse camp. Take this road 5.2 miles to find the bridge. If using Highway 65, visitors should take the Snowball exit. After reaching Snowball on Highway 74, turn left to

travel to Witts Spring. Joining Highway 16 in Witts Spring, visitors will travel about 2 miles to Richland Creek Road on the right hand side of the highway. Take this dirt road about 4.0 miles until it intersects with 1205. Take a left and travel a half of a mile to the bridge. Parking for the hike is located on the east side of the bridge. There are two areas to place a car.

The beginning of the trail is smooth. A third of a mile into the adventure, there is a creek that travels over a set of rocks and makes a 10-foot waterfall. Turning left at this small creek can lead hikers to two more waterfalls. Time can be taken here to view the Falling Water Creek. There is a path to the right that leads to the creek.

Van Horn talks Razorbacks season; future

FAYETTEVILLE—Arkansas' Dave Van Horn held media session on Wednesday to discuss various topics and put a wrap on the 44-16 season. Van Horn and the Hogs were eliminated at the Fayetteville Regional for the second year in a row. Van Horn said following the season he was intent on getting his team more reliant on speed and athleticism in the future instead of such reliance on power. While Van Horn can't name specific recruits he was asked if recruiting is going in the direction of changing the team to more what he envisions? "A few guys," Van Horn said. "It's just a couple. It's not like you're going to have a lineup of really good runners that are more run scorers than producers. You've seen it just watching the games through the tournament. You've got to be able to hit it over their heads, you've got to hit some home runs, you've got to have some power. "But you need some athletes in there that can steal a bag and steal a bag when everybody knows you're going to steal. We're working on that so it's definitely something like we feel we're addressing. Again, we've got to get these kids to show up

and then we've got to deal with, in some cases, the draft, because some of these kids are older. For the most part it looks like we're going to get these new guys and some of these young guys and a couple of juco guys." Van Horn and other coaches are still adjusting to the transfer portal and other aspects of building a team. Formerly baseball coaches had to worry about losing players to the MLB Draft, but now the transfer portal is a factor. Van Horn talked about how he's adjusting. While players leave via the transfer portal it's also a great opportunity for a school to add proven players to its roster. "I do," Van Horn said. "I mean college baseball is super popular right now and I truly believe that. It gets better. The teams are better. The players are bigger, stronger, they're older. And it's because of being able to jump around. Teams have been able to go through a little free agency in the summer and fill in some spots. Obviously once the season starts or school starts that is what it is. You can't dip into the minor leagues. But you have this window right now where you can fill in. "It's not apples to apples because there are some teams that have a lot more NIL money to dish out than other teams. Frank-

ly, those teams that have it, they're doing very well. We have to deal with that. But we want to bring in the player that it's not all about the money. Yeah it would be nice to pluck one here or there. But we've got to get the right ones and frankly you have a budget. It is what it is. I think we've done a good job navigating and getting better and figuring out how to handle it. You know, you have to almost over-recruit some of these older guys that are in the portal if you're getting some guys that are draft eligible because basically they might say one thing but realistically if somebody offers them they're probably going to sign." It's known that Arkansas has eight transfers. Van Horn was asked what that number might look like in the end? "Well, we're still pretty active, honestly, but I can't put a number on it because there's getting ready to be a lot more movement," Van Horn said. "You're going to see some movement from a couple teams in Texas, and some of them might jump from one team to the other. Or, maybe this is their time to get out and do something else. There will be some big names, but you're talking a lot of money for some of these kids that are going to be

Smith named D1Baseball All-American

FAYETTEVILLE—Arkansas ace Hagen Smith has been named an All-American by D1Baseball, picking up his fifth first-team All-America nod of the postseason.

Smith, crowned the National Pitcher of the Year by the American Baseball Coaches Association/Rawlings, College Baseball Foundation and Perfect Game, has now earned first-team All-America praise from ABCA/Rawlings, Baseball America, D1Baseball, National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and Perfect Game this postseason in addition to finishing as a finalist for the prestigious Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy.

The Razorback junior left-hander is the sixth two-time All-American in school history, joining program greats Kevin McReynolds, Jeff King, Phillip

Stidham, David Walling and Nick Schmidt in select company.

Smith proved to be the best pitcher in all of college baseball in 2024, completing the campaign with a 9-2 record, 2.04 ERA and 161 strikeouts in 84.0 innings over 16 starts. Named the Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Year after going 7-0 with a 1.35 ERA and 110 strikeouts in 60.0 innings over 10 SEC starts on the mound, Smith led the country with an NCAA-record 17.25 strikeouts per nine innings on the season and finished ranked first nationally in hits allowed per nine innings (4.4), second in strikeouts (161), fourth in ERA (2.04) and seventh in WHIP (0.89).

The Bullard, Texas, native posted a team-leading 11 quality starts and logged a program-record 11 double-digit strikeout games on the year, becoming the program's all-time career

strikeout king and single-season strikeout leader during his historic 2024 campaign. Smith, who raised his career strikeout total to 360, overtook Schmidt (345) for sole possession of Arkansas' career strikeout mark in addition to surpassing Walling's single-season strikeout record of 155 set in 1999 to move atop the program's single-season strikeout leaderboard (161).

In one of the greatest pitching performances in program history, Smith tied Arkansas' single-game record with his 17-strikeout gem on 78 pitches over six shutout innings against Oregon State on Feb. 23 in the Kubota College Baseball Series at Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas. Smith matched Razorback great Jess Todd's single-game strikeout record (17), doing so in 40 fewer pitches than Todd threw against South Carolina on May 24, 2007, in the SEC Tournament.

Jury orders NFL to pay nearly \$4.8 billion

LOS ANGELES — A jury in U.S. District Court ordered the NFL to pay nearly \$4.8 billion in damages Thursday after ruling that the league violated antitrust laws in distributing out-of-market Sunday afternoon games on a premium subscription service.

The jury awarded \$4.7 billion in damages to the residential class and \$96 million in damages to the commercial class. Since damages can be tripled

under federal antitrust laws, the NFL could end up being liable for \$14.39 billion.

The lawsuit covered 2.4 million residential subscribers and 48,000 businesses in the United States who paid for the package of out-of-market games from the 2011 through 2022 seasons on DirecTV. The lawsuit claimed the league broke antitrust laws by selling its package of Sunday games at an inflated price. The subscribers also say the league re-

stricted competition by offering "Sunday Ticket" only on a satellite provider.

The NFL said it would appeal the verdict. That appeal would go to the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals and then possibly the Supreme Court.

Should the NFL end up paying damages, it could cost each of the 32 teams approximately \$449.6 million.

"We are disappointed with the jury's verdict today in the NFL Sunday Ticket class action

lawsuit," the league said in a statement. "We continue to believe that our media distribution strategy, which features all NFL games broadcast on free over-the-air television in the markets of the participating teams and national distribution of our most popular games, supplemented by many additional choices including RedZone, Sunday Ticket and NFL+, is by far the most fan friendly distribution model in all of sports and entertainment."

Hawks make Risacher second straight Frenchman taken No. 1 in NBA draft

NEW YORK — First, Victor Wembanyama, now Zaccharie Risacher.

These days, American college players have to wait their turn in the NBA draft. It's someone else's time at the top.

Vive la France!
The Atlanta Hawks took Risacher with the No. 1 pick Wednesday night and France landed three players in the top six in a historic night for the country.

"That's amazing," Risacher said. "We try to represent our country and so, glad to be a part of it. You know there is more players coming in."

Risacher doesn't come with the enormous height or hype of Wembanyama, the towering center who went to San Antonio last year and went on to win the Rookie of the Year award.

But the Hawks saw him as the best choice in what has been viewed as a draft absent of elite talent.

The 19-year-old forward was the winner of the best young player award in the French League last season and beat out

fellow Frenchman Alex Sarr in the race to be the top pick.

When he did, it made NBA draft history. This is the first time that the draft has gone consecutive years without the No. 1 pick being someone who played at an American college.

"Shows the amount of talent we have in France," Sarr said. "Really excited for Zach. I think our national team is going to be really good."

Sarr went second to the Washington Wizards after playing last year with Perth in Australia's National Basketball League.

The Hawks had only a 3% chance of winning the lottery to earn the No. 1 pick, and there was no obvious choice waiting once they did. Most mock drafts were split between Risacher and Sarr, and Atlanta also worked out UConn center Donovan Clingan.

Houston made Kentucky freshman Reed Sheppard the No. 3 pick. A one-and-done college player had topped the draft for 13 straight years from 2010-22 before Wembanyama ended that streak.

Now the draft is under French rule.

Stephon Castle of the two-time

reigning national champion Huskies made it two straight college freshmen when San Antonio took him at No. 4, the Spurs' first of two picks in the top 10. They also held the No. 8 selection — though they dealt the rights to that pick, Kentucky guard Rob Dillingham, to Minnesota.

But the Spurs are holding onto Castle, who had a phone call with Wembanyama and can now throw passes to him to ease his transition from Dan Hurley in his old home to Gregg Popovich in his new one.

"I was just playing for the best coach in college basketball and now flipping to the NBA and going to play for a legendary coach like Coach Pop, it's a blessing," Castle said.

The Detroit Pistons took Ron Holland of the G League Ignite with the fifth pick before the Hornets took Tidjane Salaun, who played last year for Cholet Basket in France.

"I think the basketball in France is improved that's why we are here in this draft," Saluan said.

Clingan, who won titles in both seasons in Storrs, finally went to Portland at No. 7.

out, and I mean a lot (of money). I don't think people realize what's going on in the NIL scene in college baseball when you're talking two, three, \$450,000 to get a player. Again, there's some that can do it a lot, some that can do it a little. It's never over because of that draft that should have been last week, or the week before, which would have been nice. Because it affects everybody. It trickles down all the way to the incoming high school senior that's coming to school."

Former Arkansas assistant Tony Vitello is now the head coach at Tennessee. The Vols won the national championship defeating Texas A&M in the finals. A&M not only lost the game, but the next day lost its coach to the University of Texas. Vitello was very complimentary of Van Horn after winning the title.

"I didn't see it," Van Horn said. "Yesterday probably mid-day I got a screenshot of what was said. So I pulled it up and tried to find it, just wanted to hear what he had to say. I really appreciate it. It's bittersweet because they won it and we didn't. People are happy there and people are not happy here. Really for what we do here, we're trying to develop people. We're trying to develop our players into men and good people. On the coaching side, have these guys go out and be successful and have a career. Even Andy Sawyers at SEMO, coached him, he coached with me a little bit. I coached him hard and he mentioned it that I was kind of tough on him, because I thought he could be better than he was. I think he appreciates it not. But yeah, I appreciate that a lot, I really do."

One player who didn't have the season at the plate expected of him was Kendall Diggs. On Wednesday, Van Horn explained why.

"I was wondering when somebody was going to ask me about Kendall," Van Horn said. "You look at Kendall's year, the first 14 or 15 games of the year, he was hitting upper 300s. .380, .370. When he slid headfirst on a wet field or an over-watered field — whatever you want to call it. It was early in the game — and he kind of got stuck and he hurt

that shoulder. We all kind of groaned in the dugout. We didn't know it at the time. He shook it off. Well, it's a complete tear in his labrum. I think it's like front and back. He is right now in the process of getting lined up to have surgery to get that fixed. He could still sign and be drafted. I think somebody might draft him. We'd love to have him back. He would have to miss all of Fall. It's his non-throwing shoulder. It's his left shoulder. You've got to give him credit. How tough was he to play all year long with that injury? He hurt it a couple of more times throughout the season. He ran into the wall at Kentucky. There was another time he hurt it. He made diving catches. He just played through it. Hats off to him.

"It really hurt his offense. It altered his swing, it took away a little quickness. I know it probably had to hurt when he swung at certain pitches in certain areas. In a way, he disguised it. I've got to give credit to him with how tough he was. I hope we have an opportunity to coach him next year. Because he can get back and play. (Matt) Goodheart had the same injury, (Trevor) Ezell had the same injury. Those guys did nothing but hit here. Ezell's was on his throwing arm and he hurt before he got to Arkansas when he was at SEMO. We took him in anyway and he learned how to throw side-armed. He played first base for us. Goodheart, it was pretty bad. He got through it and did a good job for us."

"Kendall, if he comes back, will have an opportunity to play outfield. Honestly, obviously he could DH, play outfield. Who's to say he didn't play in the infield for us as well because that's what he came here as so we'll see. I've been in contact with him a lot, when I say a lot, a few times since season ended. Through texting recently, couple of phone calls. I will talk to him in the next day or two about some things. He was invited to the combine to go do some conversations. I don't know how many he had, if any. Appreciate him trying because he was hurt."

There is a great area for kids to play in the creek or for visitors to sit and enjoy the sounds of the rushing water.

When getting back on the trail, there are some rocks that can be used to make it a dry pass over the brook.

There are two small ascensions in the trail. These climbs are about 20 foot each. One final push up another ascent completes the total climbs. In the hike there is a total of .07 of ascents.

Just before reaching Fuzzy Butt, there is a path that leads visitors to the creek one more time. The view here is from the west side of the famous Six Fingers Waterfalls. There are six areas that create waterfalls in this stretch of the creek.

At the one mile mark of the hike, alpinists will see that the trail becomes very overgrown. That is the point when they should turn left.

Fuzzy Butt is only steps away.

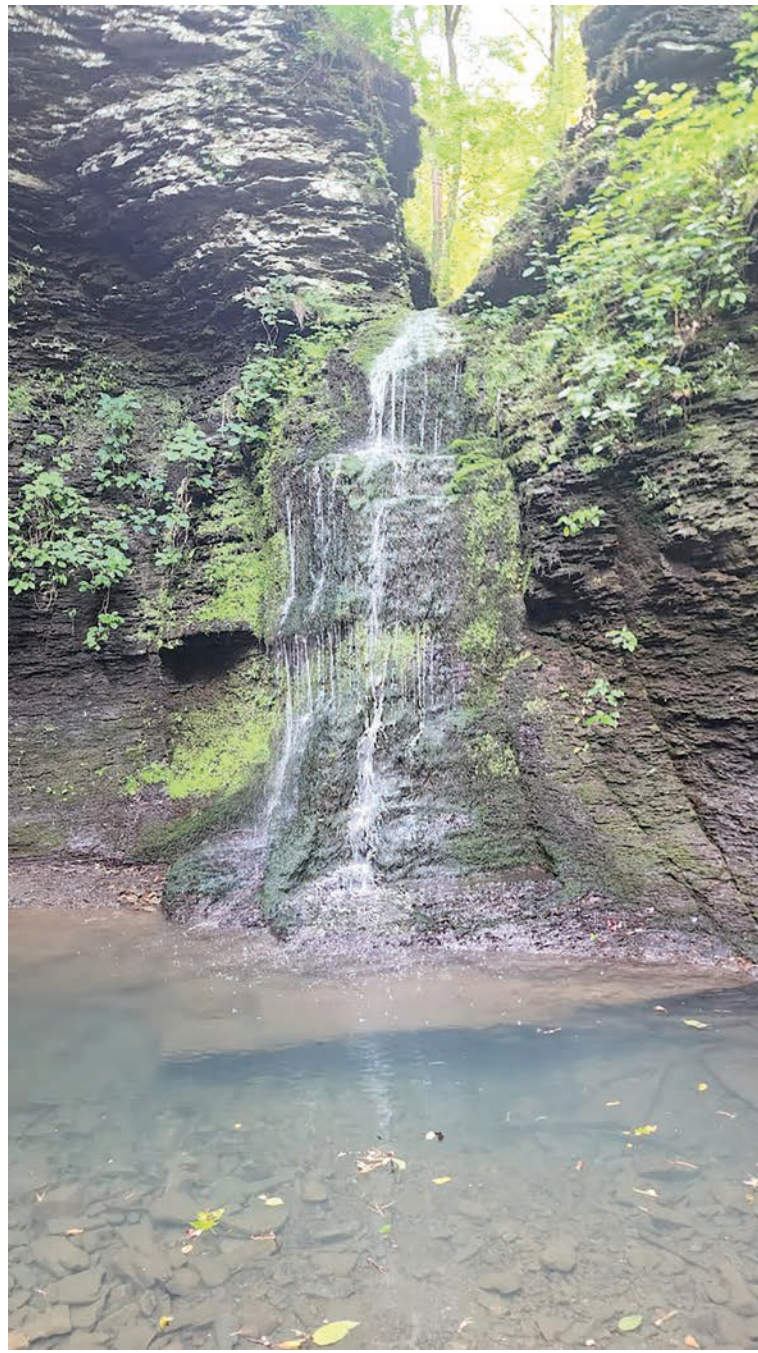
The trail is an easy hike. During the summer months, it would be best to be the second person on the trail. The first person will have opportunities to battle many spider webs.

Walking in the forest, cragsmen will notice a big temperature drop. The path is completely covered with a canopy of mature Arkansas hardwoods. The only area of sun that will be spotted will be where the forest has been cut for the highlines.

The land under the highlines is the most grown up of the hike. Luckily, it is only a 50-foot clearing.

Fuzzy Butt is not as isolated as residents may think.

North of the parking area for the Six Fingers Waterfalls is another small park-

Lightning bugs: summer's tiny fireworks show

LITTLE ROCK — A little chemistry, a little coding and a whole lot of mating are just part of the story behind summer's tiny fireworks show: the lightning bug.

"The vast majority of this communication is in order to find a date," Jones said.

Too much light

Fireflies thrive in areas where there is damp or boggy soils, tall grasses and forbs, tree canopy cover and leaf litter.

Males do most of the communicating, and Jones said it is proba-

bly "because the flashes can also attract would be predators, and bottom line, males are just more expendable than females are."

In their language

Lightning bug signals can vary from species to species or location to location, differentiated by color, length of flash, brightness, frequency and grouping of flashes...

"Bioluminescence is the light produced by living things via chemical reactions," Jones said.

The light is created from a chemical reaction within a clear portion of the exoskeleton. These chemicals include the light-emitting compound luciferin...

"The on/off switch for the reactions is thought to be exposure to oxygen via the insect respiratory system, which is an intricate network of air passageways that exist throughout insect bodies," Jones said.

Other examples of bioluminescence, Jones added, include fungus gnats, click beetles that have glowing eyespots, and some centipedes and millipedes.

A family of beetles, Phengodidae, known as glow worms, have larvae and larviform females, which don't metamorphosize into winged beetles.

2. Avoid CO poisoning.

Generators give boaters the creature comforts they want.

However, don't run the generator if there are swimmers in the water at the back of the boat - a common place for guests to congregate on floats and pool toys.

3. Don't stress it.

It's a long day on the water. Be careful with stressors including noise, vibration,

sun, wind, waves and other motion. U.S. Coast Guard research shows that four hours of exposure to these can produce a kind of fatigue, or "boater's hypnosis," which slows reaction time almost as much as if you were legally drunk.

For your boat, don't stress the battery playing music all day. TowBoatUS reports calls to its 24-hour dispatch for battery jump services surge - as if on cue - just after the firework shows end when boaters want to head home.

4. Get home safely.

Before departing an anchorage, wait to turn on the engine until everyone is back aboard and ladder is up. If leaving a fireworks show, proceed with utmost caution.

High class crime: 'Beverly Hills Cop: Axel F' continues Detroit cop's hijinks in Los Angeles

One of film's most beloved and unorthodox police detectives is back on his beat, 30 years since audiences last saw him take down crime in Los Angeles' most famous ZIP code. Eddie Murphy ("You People," 2023) stars in the brand new action-comedy "Beverly Hills Cop: Axel F," premiering Wednesday, July 3, on Netflix.

Murphy reprises his role as Detective Axel Foley — who first made his iconic appearance in 1984's "Beverly Hills Cop," which was followed up by sequels in 1987 and 1994 — a Detroit police officer whose work often takes him to sunny California and the glamorous, storied suburb of Beverly Hills to chase down drug lords, weapons kingpins and counterfeiting rings.

Joining Axel yet again is his trusty partner, Lt. Billy Rosewood, portrayed by Judge Reinhold ("Fast Times at Ridgemont High," 1982). Joseph Gordon-Levitt ("Mr. Corman") is Bobby Abbott, a detective with the Beverly Hills Police Department and ex-boyfriend of Axel's estranged daughter, Jane (Taylor Paige, "Zola," 2020).

So, what brings Axel back to the 90210 from his home in the Motor City this time, four decades since his first mayhem-filled assignment? Axel's daughter Jane, a crimi-

nal defense attorney, receives a threat to her life, prompting her father to team up with old and new partners and pin down the danger.

In an official trailer for the film, Axel, Billy and Bobby drive chaos all over Beverly Hills, from crash landing a helicopter on a golf course, to chasing down bad guys in a snow plow and steering a cargo truck through a palatial home's sitting room. The crime-fighting crew will get to the bottom of this case at any cost.

Reprising their roles from previous Beverly Hills Cop franchise films are Paul Reiser ("Mad About You") as Police Chief Jeffrey Friedman; John Ashton ("Gone Baby Gone," 2007) as Sgt. John Taggart; and Bronson Pinchot ("Chilling Adventures of Sabrina") as former foe, Serge.

Joining the cast in this installment is Kevin Bacon ("Leave the World Behind," 2023) as Capt. Grant, who welcomes Axel back to the force — but can he be trusted? Axel has dealt with crooked cops before, so it wouldn't be the first time he found corruption went all the way to the top.

In a recent appearance on "The Daily Show," Bacon told Jordan Klepper, "I'm not afraid of being a bad guy in the movie," summing up his philosophy on being hated on screen by saying, "to me, it's just great parts and I just want to be them. And I'm exorcising some demons."

A newcomer to the Beverly Hills Cop

franchise, Gordon-Levitt talked to Empire about his role in the upcoming film, saying, "this character is a bit straight-laced — I am an actual Beverly Hills cop, whereas Axel Foley is a cop from Detroit who finds himself in Beverly Hills — but he's not a simple straight man."

Anyone going toe-to-toe with Murphy is the straight man by default, but Gordon-Levitt shared that his character isn't just there to question Axel's hijinks. "I also get my licks in. I wouldn't be living up to this crazy opportunity if I wasn't going to have a few myself. We

got to do some really fun stuff."

Murphy's TV and film career has spanned over 40 years, with memorable performances across nearly every genre in entertainment — not to mention his music career's peak at number two on the Billboard Hot 100 chart with his 1985 single, "Party All the Time." Murphy was an instant star, credited with revitalizing the sketch-comedy staple "Saturday Night Live" during his four season tenure on the show from 1980 to 1984.

Murphy's success on TV and in wildly popular stand-up comedy specials "Deliri-

ous" (1983) and "Eddie Murphy Raw" (1987) led to a blockbuster film career in the 1980s. Beyond the Beverly Hills Cop films, Murphy starred in hits like 1983's "Trading Places" and "Coming to America" in 1988, before courting a younger audience in the following decades with the Nutty Professor film series and his voice acting work as the sidekick in animated film classics like "Mulan" in 1999 and the Shrek films.

After making a succession of light-hearted family films in the new millennium, Murphy experienced a career renaissance with a best actor nomination at the Golden Globe Awards for his portrayal of blaxploitation film star Rudy Ray Moore in 2019's "Dolemite Is My Name." Now, Murphy is reintroducing his comedy blockbuster work to the fans he made in the last 20 years of his career by reviving his past work in sequels like the upcoming "Beverly Hills Cop: Axel F" and 2021's "Coming 2 America."

Speaking to Vanity Fair in 2020 about his perspective now on choosing new projects, Murphy said, "I had a little crossroads where it was like, it's time to back off, and sit on the couch and just be Dad. Now, I just want to do stuff where there's an emotional hook, and it's something that I'm really into, and not just doing it because, you know, somebody flashed a big dollar sign in front of you."

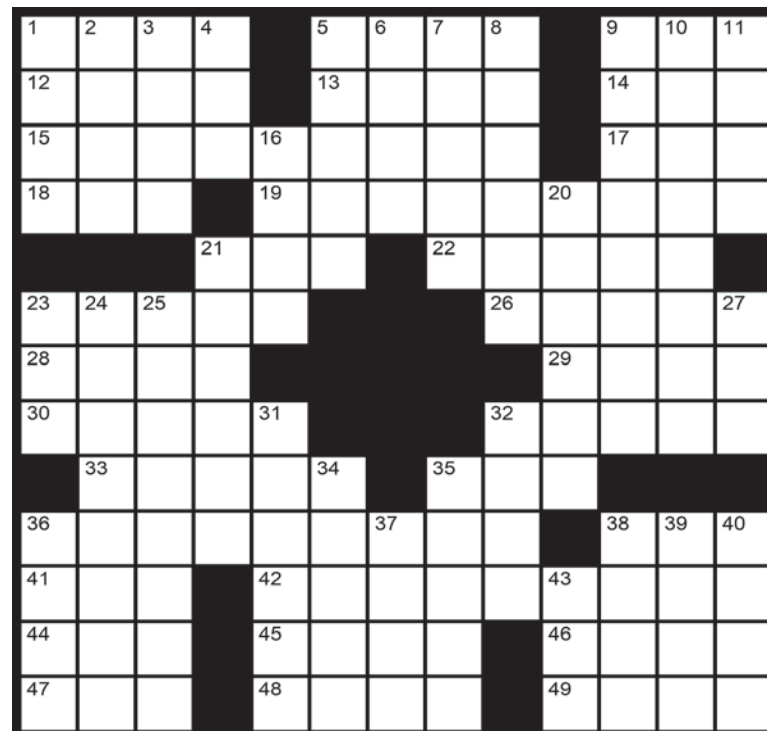

Levine returning to 'The Voice'

Back in the chair: It's been five years since Maroon 5 frontman Adam Levine ("Sugar") vacated his red swivel chair in "The Voice." If you've missed seeing him in the NBC talent competition, here's some good news: Levine will officially be back as a coach in Season 27, which is set to premiere in spring 2025.

Levine himself confirmed the news in a video posted on Instagram, in which he declared "Team Adam is back, and I feel bad for the other teams." He also joked, "I'm well rested. I'm ready to go. I'm a little nervous ... I'm not nervous, but I'm so excited, and it's going to be great. I can't wait. It's going to be awesome."

Joining Levine in Season 27 are crooner John Legend ("All Of Me"), marking his 10th turn in the red swivel chair, and Michael Bublé ("Home"), who is set to make his coaching debut in the upcoming fall 2024 edition alongside fellow newcomer Snoop Dogg ("Drop It Like It's Hot") and fan favorites Reba McEntire ("Fancy") and Gwen Stefani ("Hollaback Girl").

So that's Levine, Legend and Bublé ... who will complete the show's four-person coaching panel? That honor goes to country singer Kelsea Ballerini, who is making her full-time coaching debut in Season 27. The "Love Me Like You Mean

It" songstress has previously appeared in "The Voice," having served as a battle adviser in Season 16 and as a fill-in coach for Kelly Clarkson ("Stronger") in Season 20.

Since initially stepping away from "The Voice," Levine and his band released a seventh studio album in 2021. They kicked off "M5LV The Residency" last year at Dolby Live at the Park MGM in Las Vegas, and just last month they announced an extra 16-show run that will now conclude in October, which still leaves plenty of time for Levine to prep for his return to "The Voice."

The Marion Show: With the exception of a recent spot in the Apple TV+ anthology series "Extrapolations," you don't often see Oscar winner Marion Cotillard ("La Vie en Rose," 2007) in a TV series, but that's precisely where she's headed next.

The French film star is set to join the Season 4 ensemble cast of Apple TV+'s "The Morning Show," alongside executive producers Jennifer Aniston ("Friends") and Reese Witherspoon ("Big Little Lies").

Season 3 ended on another cliffhanger as Bradley (Witherspoon) resigned and now faces a possible felony charge, while Alex (Aniston) sabotaged her tech billionaire boyfriend, Paul Mark's (Jon Hamm, "Mad Men"), attempt to acquire UBA Network.

With (spoilers) UBA now poised to merge with a rival news brand instead, that opens the door to some new faces, as confirmed by showrunner/executive producer Charlotte Stoult ("Homeland") in an interview with The Hollywood Reporter. "Because there was a merger, an intended merger, there are new characters," explained Stoult. "I think they will be really fun and challenging, for different points of view."

One of those "different points of view" may come from Cotillard's character, Celine Dumont, who has been described as "a savvy operator from a storied European family."

No premiere date for Season 4 has been announced yet. As for the fate of tech billionaire Paul Marks, Hamm doesn't think his character's arc is complete yet. "For want of a better phrase, I don't think the relationship has run its course yet," said Hamm, when speaking to The Hollywood Reporter at a recent Emmys For Your Consideration event. "It's unfinished business for sure."
