things looking for future Educators. So, not only is she doing what she needs to in a classroom, she's trying to mold this profession and to have more people. It's funny, when I heard Ms. Payton and I heard Ms. Phoenix talking about them both graduating from Denham Springs High School, which is Livingston Parish. Also, hearing them talk about different people in the room, which were their Principals and Assistant Principals, just brings back home what we talked about in the Spring. We do more with less. There are examples that continue, repeatedly, and I'm so proud of what they've done and what they mean. To have the top three and to have an overall winner out of nine for the entire state is just amazing. I also wanted to mention Mr. St. Pierre, so proud of him. In my book, he's the number one Principal. He deserved that and just looking around at everybody here, there are a ton of former finalists, semi-finalists that were Principals, teachers, different things in the room. It just speaks volumes to our parish and what we continue to do. So, I'm just so proud of the parish, so proud of these ladies and Mr. St. Pierre.

When I took over the position of Child Welfare and Attendance, one of the tasks that was kind of presented to me, was that truancy, especially through COVID at times, was really a problem. I'm so thankful that we were able to get the help and support from Sheriff Ard and the staff, and particularly Lieutenant Duet. This year they visited over 360 students, multiple times. We set up a truancy court, they served papers and they helped work that. Lieutenant Duet and I probably had more conversations after hours on weekends and going over situations, but of the 360 students that we visited those parents, 57% of those kids became non-truant from the time they were visited. That's outstanding! We also had 19% of whom either didn't live in our District, they weren't here, or they ended up dropping. So, 76% of the students that they worked to contact either weren't on our Cohort anymore or they became non-truant. That wouldn't have happened without their work. Our average daily attendance rate was at 94.1 for 2018-2019, the last year before COVID. My goal coming in, was to get us back there. Because of the work with the Sheriff's Department, this job the schools did in promoting attendance, we jumped to 94.8, which is our highest daily attendance rate in 10 years. I think that it's incredible and I can't overstate the financial support, the time, the effort, and everything that the Sheriff's Department provided. The hours of work that Lieutenant Duet and her staff provided is what made that possible Tonight, I have a couple of plaques I want to recognize them for. I would like to ask Lieutenant Duet and Captain Paul Brignac is here in Sheriff Ard's absence. It says with our greatest appreciation Sheriff Jason Ard and Lieutenant Duet, we hereby present you with this award in recognition of your support of Livingston Parish Public Schools in the ongoing fight against truancy. the public we are rapidly approaching the start of our school year. Our teachers come back on August 8th and our children return on August 11th. We are looking forward to welcoming back approximately 27,000 children into our District and I want to thank all the employees for making the start of school possible. It is quite an undertaking to start up 46 schools and welcome back 27,000 children. Secondly, and probably as you are aware, the Legislature approved a \$2000/\$1000 dollars stipend for our employees. I found out today we just got some guidance on how these \$2000/\$1000 dollars will be administered to

Livingston Parish Public Schools so that we may put that in the form of a stipend for our employees this fall. We also got some compensation for differentiated compensation and that is a discussion that we're going to have to have with the board and bring that to the board for some kind of approval on how this will be distributed and when it will be distributed to our employees this fall. I do have a meeting scheduled with Ms. Stewart, Ms. Aime, Mr. Purvis and Mr. Chaffin next Tuesday to begin this discussion. We hope that we'll have a lot more concrete information to present on this subject on August 17th, the next board meeting.

Yesterday, I had the opportunity to attend a press conference in Bossier City where Livingston Parish Public Schools was one of the Top 10 Districts in the state for students scoring Mastery, only grades 3 through 12 on the LEAP assessments. I really enjoyed that opportunity, it was a pleasure to be there. Board members, we sent you an email today regarding a press release on this and a little bit more information. Please, if you have any questions about that, we're certainly willing to answer them. I would remind everybody that the information that was released yesterday is only a portion of our accountability, and we'll probably not get those final metrics to see where Livingston Parish ranked in the state until September or October, more than likely by the time everything is put together. When we sent out that information regarding our LEAP results, we're very proud that we were able to maintain our consistency, proud that we are in the top 10, but we also understand that we have some areas that we need to grow in and we're already addressing those from a curriculum staff standpoint. We have a curriculum staff meeting. I think Monday at 9:00, if I'm right, Ms. McRae, is that correct? To discuss some new processes and how we can better support our schools in the attempt to raise our children's test scores and our children's achievements across that.
