RESOLUTION

A Resolution ordering and calling a special election to be held in Recreation District No. 2 of Livingston Parish, Louisiana (the "District") on Saturday, October 14, 2023, for the purpose of authorizing the renewal of a fifteen (15) mill tax on assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in the District, for a period of ten (10) years for the purpose of constructing, improving, maintaining and operating the recreational facilities governed by the District; and further making application to the State Bond Commission for consent and authorization to hold the aforesaid election; and further providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Recreation District No. 2 of Livingston Parish, Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of Recreation District No. 2 of Livingston Parish, Louisiana (the "District"), desires to order and call a special election to be held in the District on SATURDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2023, to authorize the renewal of the levy and collection of a fifteen (15) mills ad valorem tax for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2025 and ending with the year 2034, for the purpose of constructing, improving, maintaining and operating the recreational facilities governed by the District (the "Tax"); and

BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Authority, that:

SECTION 1. **Election Call.** Subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission and under the authority conferred by Article VI, Section 30 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, as amended (the "Constitution"), La. R.S. 33:4566 and the applicable provisions of Chapter 6 and Chapter 6-A of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (the "Election Code"), particularly Chapters 5 and 6-A thereof, and by other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, a special proposition election (the "Election") is hereby called and ordered to be held in the District on SATURDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2023, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. in compliance with the provisions of Section 541 of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (La. R.S. 18:541), and that at the Election there will be submitted to all registered voters residing in the District, qualified and entitled to vote at the Election under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana and the Constitution of the United States, the following proposition, to wit:

**PROPOSITION  
(TAX RENEWAL)**

Shall Recreation District No. 2 of Livingston Parish, Louisiana (the "District"), be authorized to renew the levy and collection of a tax of fifteen (15) mills on all property subject to taxation within the District (an estimated \$1,100,000.00 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year) (the "Tax"), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2025 and ending with the year 2034, for the purpose of constructing, improving, maintaining and operating the recreational facilities governed by the District?

SECTION 2. **Publication of Notice of Special Election.** Pursuant to La. R.S. 18:1285, a Notice of Special Election concerning the Election will be published in the *Livingston Parish News*, a newspaper of general circulation within the District, and is the official journal of the District, once a week for four (4) consecutive weeks, with the first publication to be made not less than forty-five (45) days nor more than ninety (90) days prior to the date fixed for the Election, which notice will be substantially in accordance with the Notice of Special Election annexed hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference, to the same extent as if it were set forth in full.

SECTION 3. **Canvass of Election Returns.** This Governing Authority will meet on Wednesday, November 8, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. at 36965 LA Highway 16, Watson, Louisiana, and will then and there in open and public session proceed to examine and canvass the official election returns and declare the results of the said Election, pursuant to Section 1292 of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended.

SECTION 4. **Polling Places, Commissioners.** The polling places set forth in the attached Notice of Special Election, and situated within the corporate limits of the District, be and the same are hereby designated as the polling places at which the Election will be held. Pursuant to the provisions of La. R.S. 18:1286(B), the Commissioners-in-Charge and the Commissioners authorized to be selected by the Board of Election Supervisors to serve at the Election on Saturday, October 14, 2023, are hereby designated as the Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners to serve at the polling places designated for this Election.

SECTION 5. **Designation of Commissioners and Commissioners-in-Charge.** As required in La. R.S. 18:1286(B), the officers designated to serve as Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners pursuant to Section 4 hereof, will hold the Election as herein provided solely in compliance with the provisions of Parts II and V of the Election Code, as amended, and will make due returns of said Election in accordance with the aforesaid provisions of the Election Code. The compensation of said officers be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum prescribed by law. All registered voters in each precinct and residing in the District are entitled to vote at the Election.

SECTION 6. **Authorization of Chairman.** The Chairman of the Governing Authority be and he is hereby empowered, authorized and directed to arrange for and to furnish the election officers, in ample time for the holding of said Election, all equipment, forms and other items which may be required in order to hold said Election. The Chairman of the Governing Authority is further authorized, empowered and directed to take any and all further action required by State and/or Federal law to arrange for the Election.

SECTION 7. **Furnishing Election Call.** In accordance with La. R.S. 18:1285(B)(1), certified copies of this Resolution will be forwarded promptly to the Secretary of State, the Clerk of Court and Ex-Officio Custodian of Voting Machines in and for the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana and the Registrar of Voters in and for said Parish, as notification of the call for the Election in order that each may prepare for said Election and perform their respective functions as required by law.

SECTION 8. **Estimated Collections.** Pursuant to La. R.S. 18:1284(c), an estimated \$1,100,000.00 is reasonably anticipated at this time to be collected from the levy of the Tax for an entire year.

SECTION 9. **Application to State Bond Commission.** Application be and the same is hereby formally made to the State Bond Commission for consent and authorization to hold the special proposition Election in the District, as previously specified herein, said Election to be held within the District on Saturday, October 14, 2023, and in the event the aforesaid proposition is carried for consent and authorization to levy and collect the Tax provided for by said proposition in the amount, for the purpose and for the number of years herein specified; and that a certified copy of this Resolution will be forwarded to the State Bond Commission on behalf of the Governing Authority, together with a letter requesting the prompt consideration and approval of such application.

SECTION 10. **Approval of Parish Council.** Pursuant to Section 1415 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, application is hereby formally authorized to be made for the approval of the Parish Council of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana, as the governing authority of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana.

SECTION 11. **Additional Notice Requirement.** This Governing Authority made the announcement with respect to this Resolution required by La. R.S. 42:191, at its public meeting on Wednesday, April 12, 2023 and published said announcement in the Official Journal on Thursday, April 13, 2023. D. Introduce the following proposed ordinance amending the Code of Ordinance of the Town of Livingston by adding thereto Part 7 – Municipal Utilities Chapter 1 – Water and Sewer, Article D – Sewerage Regulation Section 7-1053 -Sewer charge exemption for water used in filling swimming pools.

Mr. **Jimmy Nesom** introduced the following proposed ordinance amending the Code of Ordinance of the Town of Livingston by adding thereto Part 7 – Municipal Utilities Chapter 1 – Water and Sewer, Article D – Sewerage Regulation Section 7-1053 -Sewer charge exemption for water used in filling swimming pools.

(a) Defined. For the purpose of this section, the term "swimming pool" means any receptacle of water owned by a Town of Livingston water and/or wastewater customer, that is used or intended to be used for the purpose of immersion or partial immersion of human beings for swimming, bathing or diving and is capable of being filled, at any point, to the depth of 24 or more inches.

(b) Sewer charge adjustment applies when filling pools. A resident may fill the pool by using water hoses, using the resident's tap. Property owners shall be exempt from sewer charges when installing and filling a new pool, cleaning, or when replacing liner that requires complete filling of the pool from the tap. Such adjustment shall be made only once during a calendar year. Adjustments/rebates shall be made only for amounts of 10,000 gallons or greater.

(c) Notice to town required. The property owner must notify the town hall prior to filling the pool.

(d) Documentation and application of exemption. Upon notification, customer shall document his water meter reading by photo before and after filling of pool. Photos of the water meter reading before and after filling, as well as a photograph of the pool, shall be provided to the town to be attached to utility customer's file.

(e) This exemption from sewer charges shall not apply to "topping off" pools, or for leaks.

(f) Town not responsible for discolored water. The town shall not be held responsible for any discolored (rusty) water discharged into the pool.

(g) Using hydrants to fill pools. The town does not allow swimming pools to be filled from fire hydrants.

(h) Town personnel prohibited to fill pools. All town personnel are hereby prohibited from filling privately owned swimming pools while on duty or using unmettered water.
