A Resolution authorizing Ward Two Water District, Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana to proceed with the issuance of its not to exceed Twenty-Four Million Dollars (\$24,000,000) of Water Revenue and Refunding Bonds, in one or more series; providing certain terms of said Bonds; making application to the State Bond Commission for approval of said Bonds; appointing Bond Counsel, Independent Registered Municipal Advisor and Underwriter, and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, Ward Two Water District, Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana (the "District") own a complete waterworks system, including water wells, waterlines, elevated water tanks and other propities, as a revenue-producing work of public improvement (the "System"); and

WHEREAS, the District has heretofore issued its (i) \$3,000,000 Taxable Water Revenue Bonds, Series 2020 (the "Series 2020 Bonds"), and (ii) \$12,150,000 Water Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2021 (the "Series 2021 Bonds"), and

WHEREAS, in addition to financing the costs of the Project, the Issuer desires to refund all or a portion of the Series 2021 Bonds (the "Refunded Bonds") to restructure debt service in future years; and

WHEREAS, the District, acting through its governing authority, the Board of Commissioners of Ward Two Water District, Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), is authorized to and believes it to be in its best interest to issue bonds and incur debt pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 14 and 14-d of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (the "Refunding Act") and Section 1430 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (the "New Money Act" and together with the Refunding Act, the "Act") and other constitutional and statutory authority, through the issuance of its bonds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, and subject to the approval of the Parish Council, Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana (the "Parish Council") and the Louisiana State Bond Commission, the District desires to issue not to exceed \$24,000,000 of its Water Revenue and Refunding Bonds, in one or more series, (the "Bonds"), to be secured by and payable from an irrevocable pledge and dedication of the income and revenues derived from the operation of the District's waterworks system (the "System"), after payment of reasonable and necessary expenses of operating and maintaining the System, as now existing or as may be hereafter improved, extended or supplemented from any source whatsoever (the "Net Revenues"); and

WHEREAS, the Bonds will be secured by Net Revenues on a parity with the Series 2020 Bonds and the Series 2021 Bonds not refunded with the proceeds of the Bonds (collectively, the "Outstanding Parity Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, it is now the desire of the District to adopt this Resolution giving preliminary approval for the issuance of the Bonds for the purpose of (i) constructing the Project; (ii) refunding the Refunded Bonds; (iii) finding a debt service reserve fund, if required; and (iv) paying costs of issuance of the Bonds, including the cost of a municipal bond insurance policy, if required; and WHEREAS, the District desires to authorize the filing of an application with the Louisiana State Bondsion (the "Commission") requesting that the Commission grant approval for the issuance of the Bonds in

cordance with the Act; and

DW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Ward Two Water Dis

SECTION 1. <u>Authorization.</u> Pursuant to the provisions of the Act, the District does hereby authorize the issuance of not to exceed \$24,000,000 of its Water Revenue and Refunding Bonds, in one or more series. The Bonds will be issued on a taxable or tax-exempt basis. The form and details of the Bonds, the exact principal amounts and interest rates thereof shall be established pursuant to a subsequent resolution of the District, provided that the interest rate on the Bonds will not exceed five percent (7,09%) per annum on a tax-exempt basis and seven and one-half percent (7,59%) per annum on a taxable basis, with the final maturity date not to exceed thirty-one (31) years from the date of issuance. The Bonds will be issued only as fully registered bonds, in minimum denominations of no less than \$5,000. The Bonds will be sold at private sale in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

SECTION 2. Employment of Bond Counsel. A real necessity is hereby found for the employment of special counsel in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, and accordingly Burler Snow LLP, Bond Counsel, is hereby employed and requested to do and perform comprehensive legal and coordinate professional work with respect to the issuance of the aforesaid bonds of the District for the purposes stated hereinabove. Said Bond Counsel shall prepare and submit to this Governing Authority for adoption all of the proceedings incidental to the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of the bonds, shall counsel and advise this Governing Authority as to the issuance and sale of the bonds, and shall furnish their opinion covering the legality of the issuance thereof. The fee of special bond counsel in connection with the issuance of the aforesaid bonds of the District is hereby fixed at a sum not to exceed the maximum fee allowed by the Attomey General's fee guidelines for comprehensive legal and coordinate professional services in the issuance of bonds, based on the amount of said bonds actually issued, sold, delivered and paid for, plus "out-of-pocket" expenses. Bond Counsel fees may be paid from the proceeds of the Bonds and shall be contingent upon the issuance, sale and delivery of said bonds. A certified copy of this Resolution shall be submitted to the Attomey General of the State of Louissants for his written approval of said employment and of the fee herein designated. No compensation will be due unless and until the Bonds are delivered.

SECTION 3. <u>Employment of Independent Registered Municipal Advisor</u>.
