4. Review of Purposes of the District and the Board

Mr. Jason Akers and colleague Mr. Hardy Andrews, Foley & Judell LLP, congratulated the Directors on their appointment and agreeing to serve. Mr. Jason Akers reviewed the purposes of the District and the Board.

The Educational Facilities Improvement District was created by statute. There is one in each parish, but most parishes don't utilize them. It has to be utilized by the creation and formation of the Board of Directors. With this meeting tonight, the EFID Board activated the EFID in Livingston Parish, referred to as Livingston Parish Public Schools EFID.

The purpose of the District by statute can be very broad, but for our purposes here, for your purposes, the intent is to really draw that acceptable boundary a lot tighter than the statute allows. The statute sets the acceptable range. We are gonna draw it a lot closer and a lot tighter.

The purpose of the District, will instead, will become not withstanding, but the Facilities Improvement name will become to provide funding for increases of salaries and benefits for School Board employees. With the approval of this Board at a later date, you will authorize an election to be held within Livingston Parish. That election will have a proposition that sets a purpose for the use of the proceeds for the proposed tax. If it is approved by the voters, that purpose contained within the proposition carries the force of law. You, as a Board, are not allowed by statute to go outside the authorized purposes of the tax proposition.

Secondly, we would anticipate that there will be an agreement, a contract between this District Board and the School Board that will provide that as funds are received by the District Board, which if it's a sales tax, that would be on a monthly basis. They would immediately be paid over to the School Board for the purpose set forth in the proposition. Again, salaries and benefits of School Board employees. You, as a Board, don't have any employees. The School Board has the employees. So there is no point in you having funds available when you can't use them for the authorized purpose. By contract we would provide that those would be paid over as received by the School Board and used for that purpose.

Finally, in the bylaws we actually restrict the purpose even to that of salaries and

benefits of the School Board employees. So not withstanding the nomenclature of it being a Facilities Improvement District. We are going to draw those reins in a lot tighter through those three mechanisms.

Just to be clear, while this is a new construct within Livingston Parish, this has actually been used in other surrounding parishes for very similar purposes. We are on call for you throughout and you can get in touch with us through Mr. Murphy and his office, or Ms. Tina, or any other way if you have questions that come up anytime within the next several weeks to months as we lead into a possible election. We certainly want you to know we are available.

LIVINGSTON PARISH PUBLIC SCHOOLS EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT BY-LAWS

Article I. DEFINITIONS

Section 1.01 For the purposes of these By-Laws, the following terms shall have the meanings herein specified.

- (a) "Act" means La R.S. 33:2740.37, as heretofore or hereafter amended.
(b) "Board" means the Board of Directors of the District.
(c) "Director" means members of the Board of the District.
(d) "District" means the Livingston Parish Public Schools Educational Facilities

Improvement District.
(e) "School Board" means the Livingston Parish School Board

Article II. PURPOSE AND POWERS

Section 2.01 The object and purpose of the District is and shall be to provide a source of revenue and funding to assist the School Board in paying for salaries and benefits of School Board employees within the parishwide jurisdiction of the District.

Article III. OFFICES

Section 3.01 The principal office of the District is:

Article IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 4.01 The Board shall be composed of nine (9) Directors appointed by the School Board as may be determined by the School Board.

Section 4.02 Once appointed, each Director shall serve a six (6) year term on the Board provided, however, that pursuant to Section 422 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, a Director shall continue to discharge the duties of that office until a successor is induced into office. Directors shall serve in accordance with the resolution of the School Board adopted on October 6, 2021, as amended from time to time.

Section 4.03 The Board shall hold its meetings and keep the books of the District at the principal office of the District, or at such other place as they may determine. The Board shall keep minutes of all meetings and shall make them available for inspection at reasonable hours through the Secretary.

Section 4.04 The property and business of the District shall be managed by the Board, which may exercise all such powers of the District and do all such lawful acts and things as are not by the Act or by these By-Laws directed or required to be exercised or done by other parties.

Article V. COMPENSATION OF COMMISSIONERS

Section 5.01 All Directors shall serve without compensation, either through salary or per diem, but the District may reimburse such members for reasonable, actual, and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties at a rate not to exceed that allowed to state employees and pursuant to majority approval of the Board.

Article VI. MEETINGS OF THE BOARD

Section 6.01 All meetings of the Board shall be subject to the public meetings law in Louisiana.

Section 6.02 The Board shall hold at least one regular meeting annually prior to July 1 of each year. The time and place of any regular meeting shall be decided by the Board. The President of the Board may reschedule any regular meeting if there is a conflict with the ability to have a quorum present.

Section 6.03 Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President of the Board or by any four (4) members of the Board upon twenty-four (24) hours' notice given to each member of the Board. Such special meetings shall be held at the same place provided for regular meetings of the Board, or at such other place as shall be designated in the notice of special meeting given in accordance with Section 6.02 hereof.

Section 6.04 At all meetings of the Board, the presence of a majority of Directors shall be necessary and sufficient to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Except as otherwise required by the Act, the vote of a majority of the Directors present at the time and place of any meeting may adjourn such meeting from time to time, without notice other than announcement at the meeting, until a quorum shall be present. The affirmative vote of a majority of the Directors present at a meeting shall be necessary to decide any question.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, no action of the Board shall be effective unless approved by a majority of the members of the School Board.

Section 6.05 All meetings of the Board shall, unless contrary to these By-Laws, be held in accordance with Robert's Rules of Parliamentary Procedure.

Article VII. NOTICES

Section 7.01 Whenever under the provision of the Act or these By-Laws notice is to be given to any Director, it shall not be construed to necessarily mean personal notice, but such notice may be given in writing by mail by depositing the same in a post office or letter box in a postpaid sealed wrapper, addressed to such Director at such address as appears in the records of the District, and such notice shall be deemed to be given at the time when the same shall thus be mailed.

Section 7.02 Notices of special meetings may be given by mail or e-mail or by

posting a copy of the notice at the principal office of the District and shall comply with the provisions of the public meetings law in Louisiana.

Article VIII. TERM

Section 8.01 Unless sooner dissolved in accordance with law, the District shall exist in perpetuity.

Article IX. OPERATION OF THE DISTRICT

Section 9.01 The District shall be subject to the Public Records Law, the Code of Ethics and such other laws applicable to public entities.

Article X. OFFICERS

Section 10.01 The officers of the District shall be a President, a Vice President, a Secretary and a Treasurer. At the option of the Board and upon a favorable vote, the officers of Secretary and Treasurer may be held by one person.

Section 10.02 The Board shall elect or appoint the officers of the District at a regular or special meeting each year and shall fix their respective terms.

Article XI. THE PRESIDENT

Section 11.01 The President shall be the chief executive officer of the District. Such person shall preside at all meetings of the Board at which he or she is present. Such person shall, in general, perform all duties and have all powers incident to the office of president and shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as from time to time may be assigned to him by these By-Laws or by the Board. The President shall at all times be a Director.

Article XII. THE VICE PRESIDENT

Section 12.01 At the request of the President or in the event of the President's absence or disability, the Vice President shall perform all the duties of the President, and when so acting shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President. The Vice President shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as from time to time may be assigned to him by these By-Laws or by the Board or by the President. The Vice President shall at all times be a Director.

Article XIII. THE SECRETARY

Section 13.01 The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the proceedings of the Board in one or more books to be kept for such purpose. The Secretary shall have custody of the seal of the District and shall have authority to cause such seal to be affixed to or impressed or otherwise reproduced upon all documents, the execution and delivery of which on behalf of the District shall have been duly authorized. The Secretary may be a Director or a non-Director appointed by the Board. Such person shall, in general, perform all duties and have all powers incident to the office of secretary and shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as may from time to time be assigned to him by these By-Laws, by the Board or by the President.

Article XIV. THE TREASURER

Section 14.01 The Treasurer shall keep full and accurate accounts of receipts and disbursements of corporate funds in books belonging to the District. The Treasurer shall cause all moneys and other valuable effects to be deposited in the name and to the credit of the District in such depositories as may be designated by the Board. The Treasurer may be a Director or a non-Director appointed by the Board. Such person shall cause the funds of the District to be disbursed when such disbursements have been duly authorized, taking proper vouchers for such disbursements, and shall render to the President and the Board, whenever requested, an account of all his transactions as Treasurer and of the financial condition of the District. The Treasurer shall, in general, perform all duties and have all powers incident to the office of treasurer and shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as may from time to time be assigned to him by these By-Laws, by the Board or by the President.

Article XV. EXECUTION OF INSTRUMENTS

Section 15.01 All documents, instruments or writings of any nature shall be signed, executed, verified, acknowledged and delivered by such other officer or officers or such agent or agents of the District and in such manner as the Board from time to time may determine.

Section 15.02 All notes, drafts, acceptances, checks, endorsements, and all evidences of indebtedness of the District whatsoever shall be signed by such officer or officers or such agent or agents of the District and in such manner as the Board from time to time may determine. Endorsements for deposit to the credit of the District in any of its duly authorized depositories shall be made in such manner as the Board from time to time may determine.

Article XVI. AMENDMENTS

Section 16.01 These By-Laws shall only be amended, restated or repealed upon the approval of the School Board by a majority vote of the entire School Board. Once said approval has been received, the Board shall approve the amendment, restatement, or repeal by a majority vote of the entire Board at a regular or special meeting of the Board.

Article XVII. SEAL

Section 17.01 The official seal of the District shall be as follows:

Around the outside edge the words "Livingston Parish Public Schools Educational Facilities Improvement District" and in the center the word "SEAL".

Article XVIII. OFFICIAL JOURNAL

Section 18.01 The official journal of the District is hereby designated as the Livingston Parish News, a weekly newspaper published in the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana; however, it is expressly provided that the official journal of the District shall be the official journal of the School Board, and should the official journal of the School Board change, regardless of reason, the official journal of the District shall adjust accordingly.
