RESOLUTION
A Resolution ordering and calling a special election to be held in the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), on Saturday, December 10, 2022, for the purpose of authorizing the renewal of a five (5) mill tax on assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in the Parish, for a period of ten (10) years, for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining roads and bridges within the Parish; and further making application to the State Bond Commission for consent and authorization to hold the aforesaid election; and further providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, the Parish Council of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), desires to order and call a special election to be held in the Parish on SATURDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2022, to authorize the renewal of the levy and collection of a five (5) mill ad valorem tax for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2023 and ending with the year 2032 for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining roads and bridges within the Parish; and shall the Parish be further authorized to fund the proceeds of the Tax into bonds from time to time for any of said capital improvements, to the extent and in the manner permitted by the laws of Louisiana (the "Tax"); and

BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Authority, that:
SECTION 1. Election Call Subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission and under the authority conferred by Article VI, Section 26(B) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, by Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (the "Election Code"), particularly Chapters 5 and 6-A thereof, and by other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, a special proposition election (the "Election") is hereby called and ordered to be held in the Parish, on SATURDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2022, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. in compliance with the provisions of Section 541 of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (La. R.S. 18:541), and that at the Election there will be submitted to all registered voters residing in the Parish, qualified and entitled to vote at the Election under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana and the Constitution of the United States, the following proposition, to wit:

PROPOSITION (TAX RENEWAL)
Shall the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), under the provisions of Article VI, Section 26(B) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, and other constitutional and statutory authority, be authorized to renew the levy and collection of a five (5) mill ad valorem tax (an estimated \$3,230,509.00 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year) (the "Tax"), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2023 and ending with the year 2032 for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining roads and bridges within the Parish; and shall the Parish be further authorized to fund the proceeds of the Tax into bonds from time to time for any of said capital improvements, to the extent and in the manner permitted by the laws of Louisiana?

SECTION 2. Publication of Notice of Special Election Pursuant to La. R.S. 18:1285, a Notice of Special Election concerning the Election will be published in the Livingston Parish News, a newspaper of general circulation within the Parish, and is the official journal of the Parish, once a week for four (4) consecutive weeks, with the first publication to be made not less than forty-five (45) days nor more than ninety (90) days prior to the date fixed for the Election, which notice will be substantially in accordance with the Notice of Special Election annexed hereto as Exhibit A, and incorporated herein by reference, to the same extent as if it were set forth in full.

SECTION 3. Canvass of Election Returns This Governing Authority will meet on Thursday, January 12, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers in the Governmental Building, 20355 Government Blvd., Livingston, Louisiana, and will then in open public session proceed to examine and canvass the official election returns and declare the results of the said Election, pursuant to Section 1292 of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended.

SECTION 4. Polling Places, Commissioners The polling places set forth in the attached Notice of Special Election, and situated within the corporate limits of the Parish, be and the same are hereby designated as the polling places at which the Election will be held. Pursuant to the provisions of La. R.S. 18:1286(B), the Commissioners-in-Charge and the Commissioners authorized to be selected by the Board of Election Supervisors to serve at the Election on SATURDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2022, are hereby designated as the Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners to serve at the polling places designated for this Election.

SECTION 5. Designation of Commissioners and Commissioners-in-Charge As required in La. R.S. 18:1286(B), the officers designated to serve as Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners pursuant to Section 4 hereof, will hold the Election as herein provided solely in compliance with the provisions of Parts II and V of the Election Code, as amended, and will make due return of said Election in accordance with the aforesaid provisions of the Election Code. The expenses of said officers be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum prescribed by law. All registered voters in each precinct and residing in the Parish are entitled to vote at the Election.

SECTION 6. Authorization of Clerk The Council Clerk of the Governing Authority, be and she is hereby empowered, authorized and directed to arrange for and to furnish the election officers, in ample time for the holding of said Election, all equipment, forms and other items which may be required in order to hold said Election. The Council Clerk of the Governing Authority is further authorized, empowered and directed to take any and all further action required by State and/or Federal law to arrange for the Election.

SECTION 7. Furnishing Election Call In accordance with La. R.S. 18:1285(B)(1), certified copies of this Resolution will be forwarded promptly to the Secretary of State, the Clerk of Court and Ex-Officio Custodian of Voting Machines in and for the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana and the Registrar of Voters in and for the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana, as notification of the call for the Election in order that each may prepare for said Election and perform their respective functions as required by law.

SECTION 8. Estimated Collections Pursuant La. R.S. 18:1284(c), an estimated \$3,230,509.00 is reasonably anticipated at this time to be collected from the levy of the Tax for an entire year.

SECTION 9. Application to State Bond Commission Application be and the same is hereby formally made to the State Bond Commission for consent and authorization to hold a special proposition election in the Parish, as previously specified herein, said Election to be held within the Parish on SATURDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2022, and in the event the aforesaid proposition is carried for consent and authorization to levy and collect the Tax provided for by said proposition in the amount, for the purpose and for the number of years herein specified, and that a certified copy of this Resolution will be forwarded to the State Bond Commission on behalf of the Governing Authority, together with a letter requesting the prompt consideration and approval of such application.

SECTION 10. Additional Notice Requirement This Governing Authority made the announcement with respect to this Resolution required by La. R.S. 42:191, at its public meeting on Thursday, September 8, 2022 and published said announcement in the official journal on Thursday, September 15, 2022. MORATORIUM – COMMERCIAL

AN ORDINANCE TO PLACE A MORATORIUM ON THE CONSIDERATION AND/OR PRELIMINARY APPROVAL THROUGH THE MAYOR AND THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF ANY NEW COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENTS FOR A PERIOD OF 180 DAYS WITHIN THE TOWN OF KILLIAN.

WHEREAS, the Killian Board of Aldermen seeks to protect the health and welfare of all citizens; and,
WHEREAS, the Killian Board of Aldermen has the authority and responsibility to provide for the orderly and safe development of commercial business in the Town of Killian; and,

WHEREAS, the Town of Killian in some critical regions, have been devastated by flooding and hurricanes that seems to be worsening; and,

WHEREAS, the Killian Board of Aldermen and Mayor desires to establish further regulations so as to ensure that these types of developments are well regulated, safe and properly maintained; and,

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen, the governing authority of the Town of Killian, in Livingston parish located in the State of Louisiana, that a moratorium be placed on the consideration and/or preliminary approval through the Town Council for any new commercial developments within the borders of the Town of Killian for a period of 180 days; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this moratorium shall expire in 180 days from the adoption of this ordinance unless extended or rescinded by Resolution of the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen.

The regular meeting of the Walker Mayor and City Council was held at the Walker City Hall on Monday, October 10, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jimmy Watson. Councilman Gary Griffin led the meeting with prayer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Municipal Clerk, Tammy Payton, conducted the roll call of the council.

Finance Director, Mike Cotten, addressed the council with the August 2022 financial report. The net profit (loss) before transfer was \$1,278,538. Gas sales revenue decreased 3.2% and sales tax revenue decreased by 8.5%.
Mr. Clark introduced an ordinance to adopt Title 14 as Amended Related to Criminal Matters. This proposed ordinance will be discussed and voted on at the next city council meeting.

Mr. Eberidge presented before the council a Resolution Authorizing Submission of the Loan Application ID#A for DHH Emerging Contaminants Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund proposing that the Chief of Operations will be the official project authority who will: 1) implement, maintain, and renew all information for said project; 2) furnish information to DHH regarding the revolving loan fund; 3) have full regulatory authority. Kreston Brown (Forte and Tablada) was asked to provide additional details on the revolving loan fund.

Kreston informed the council that DHH advertised a subset of the emerging contaminant drinking water fund. He is confident that the City of Walker will meet the emerging contaminant criteria that could result in up to 100% principal loan forgiveness. The city would still be financially responsible for the interest that will be assessed on the loan amount of \$2.25 million. The new filtration system will primarily deal with manganese found in water that causes brown water. The funding will allow the city to replace the current well system and provide critical upgrades.

Section 7-1003 Theft of utility services.

1. Theft of utility service shall mean the misappropriation, taking, or use of natural gas, water or sewage disposal service sold, distributed or provided for or on behalf of the Town of Livingston, without the consent of the town, by means of fraudulent conduct, practices, or representations. A taking, misappropriation, or use includes the diversion, by any means or device of any quantity of natural gas or water or any volume of sewage disposal from the pipes, conduit, mains, or any other means of transmission, or by directly or indirectly preventing a metering device from properly registering the quantity of natural gas, water or sewage service actually used, consumed or transmitted.

2. An inference of intent to misappropriate, take or use utility service without the consent of the town, or that there was fraudulent conduct, practices or representations shall be drawn when:
a. There is on or about any pipe, conduit, main or any other means of transportation of natural gas, water or sewage disposal or any meter of any such utility service or on any equipment to which any such pipe, conduit, main or any other means of transportation or any meter of any such utility service is affixed or attached, any device or any other mechanism or means diverting or designed or intended to divert natural gas, water or sewage service or preventing or designed or intended to prevent the proper action or accurate registration or interference with the proper action or accurate registration of the meter or meters used to measure the quantity of natural gas, water or sewage disposal actually used, consumed or transmitted;

b. The customer has custody or control of the room, structure, place or location where such device, other means, or any pipe, conduit, main or any other means of transportation or any meter of any such utility service or equipment affixed or attached thereto was located; or

c. The customer or a person acting for, or on behalf of such customer, with customer's knowledge, supplied or provided false information to the town in applying such utility service; and

d. The customer benefited from the misappropriation of such utility service.

3. Any person found guilty of theft of utility service shall be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisoned for not more than sixty (60) days, or both.

4. Upon any second or subsequent charges of theft of utility service, such person shall be charged and sentenced in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 14:67.

Section 7-1052 - New Development Requirements

(a) The town council finds, determines, and declares that:

(1) The Town of Livingston utility department is tasked with maintaining and improving its wastewater facilities in order to maintain current standards of public health if new development is to be accommodated without decreasing its existing conditions.

(2) The creation of an impact fee is a preferred method to ensure new development bears a proportionate share of the cost for any necessary improvements generated by new connections to the existing wastewater system.

(3) The fees established in section 7-1052 are derived from and based upon the cost to provide additional wastewater facilities necessitated by connections to the existing sewerage system.

Section 7-1053 - New or modified connections to the wastewater system

(a) After the effective date of the ordinance from which this section is derived any person in either the incorporated or unincorporated areas served by the town's wastewater system who:

(1) Has or constructs subdivision improvements which are to be connected to the wastewater system and are accepted for maintenance by the town;

(2) Connects to the wastewater system; or

(3) Changes that modify, alter, or expand the use of an existing connection to the existing wastewater system is hereby required to pay a wastewater facilities impact fee in the manner and amount set forth in this article

Section 7-1054 - [Wastewater facilities impact fee.]

(a) The amount of the wastewater facilities impact fee shall be determined by the following:

Table with 3 columns: SEWER IMPACT FEES, IN-TOWN LIMIT FEES, OUTSIDE-TOWN LIMIT FEES. Rows for Residential & Commercial, Subdivision, Industrial.

(b) In the case of change, modification, or expansion of use of an existing connection to the wastewater system, the impact fee shall be determined by the town based upon the net increase in the size of the meter for the new connection over the size of the meter for the previous connection.

(c) For development projects involving new lots, industrial, the town may enter a cooperative endeavor agreement, at their discretion, with the developer to provide an impact fee equivalent, proposed by the town and approved by the town council, to offset the impact fee. This price will be quoted by the town and may act in lieu of the impact fee at the town's discretion.

(d) Effective October 2022 with the billing of cycle 1 and each succeeding fiscal year thereafter effective January 1 with the billing of cycle 2, the town shall determine the impact fee based upon the net increase in the size of the meter for the new connection over the size of the meter for the previous connection. The rate modification shall be determined by comparing the current month of October with the prior month of October index for all items. The CPI index change is converted to a percentage by dividing the index change by the prior October CPI index. This is the percentage increase (rounded to two (2) decimal places)

Section 7-1055 - Payment and use of wastewater facilities impact fee

(a) The fee payer shall pay the wastewater facilities impact fee required by this article to the town as follows:

(1) The wastewater facilities impact fee shall be paid by the developer of any new development prior to the approval of the final plat.

(2) All funds collected shall be properly identified by and promptly transferred for deposit in the wastewater facilities impact fee fund to be held separately and used solely for the purposes maintain, repairing, and improving the existing wastewater system.

(b) Exemptions and Credits

(1) Wastewater facilities impact fees shall not be required on the following: (EXEMPTIONS)

a. Alterations or expansion of an existing building where a larger meter is not installed.

b. The replacement of a destroyed, condemned or removed building or structure within three years of its destruction, condemnation or removal with a new building or structure where a larger meter is installed.

c. The installation of a replacement mobile home on a lot or other such site when a wastewater facilities impact fee for such mobile home site has previously been paid in full.

d. Structure on lots in subdivisions which have been connected to the wastewater facilities prior to the adoption of this ordinance.

(2) Credits:

a. Wastewater facilities improvements may be offered by the fee payer as total or partial payment of the impact fee. If the city accepts such offer, whether the acceptance is before or after the effective date of this ordinance, the credit shall be determined in the following manner:

1. Credit for the dedication of land shall be valued

a. 100 percent of the most recent assessed value by the Livingston Parish Assessor's Office;

b. By fair market value established by private appraisers acceptable to the town. Credit for the dedication of wastewater facilities shall be provided when the property has been conveyed at no charge to, and accepted by, the town in a manner satisfactory to the town council.

2. Applicants for credit for construction of wastewater facilities improvements shall submit acceptable engineering drawings and specifications, and construction cost estimates to the town engineer. The town engineer shall determine credit for construction based upon either these cost estimates or alternative engineering criteria and construction cost estimates if the city engineer determines that such estimates submitted by the applicant are either unreliable or inaccurate. The town engineer shall provide the applicant with a letter or certificate setting forth the dollar amount of the credit, the reasons for the credit, and the legal description or other adequate description of the project or development to which the credit may be applied. The applicant must sign and date a duplicate copy of such letter or certificate indicating his agreement to the terms of the letter or certificate and return such signed duplicate copy of such letter or certificate to the town engineer within the time specified on the date, and return such document within 60 days shall nullify the credit.

3. Except as provided in (4.) below, credit against impact fees otherwise due will not be provided until:

a. The construction is completed and accepted by the town; and

b. A suitable maintenance and warranty bond is received and approved in accordance with the subdivision ordinance for the town, when applicable.

4. Credit may be provided before completion of specified wastewater facilities improvements if such improvements are approved by the applicant that the standards set out in subsection (3.) above will be met and if the fee payer posts security as provided below for the costs of such construction. Security in the form of a performance bond or escrow agreement shall be posted with, and approved by, the town in an amount determined by the town engineer. If the wastewater facilities improvements are not completed within the time specified on the date of acceptance of the offer by the town engineer, the amount of the security shall be increased by ten percent compound, for each year of the life of the security. The security shall be reviewed and approved by the town attorney's office prior to acceptance of the security by the town engineer. The wastewater facilities construction project may be completed within five years of the date of the fee payer's offer, the town council must approve the wastewater facilities construction project above the completion date prior to the acceptance of the offer by the town engineer.

5. Any claim for credit must be made no later than the time of application for connection. Any claim not so made shall be deemed waived.

6. Credits shall be transferable from one project or development to another.

7. Determinations made by the town engineer pursuant to the credit provisions of this section may be appealed to the town council by filing a written request with the town engineer within ten days of the city engineer's determination.

This Repeals Section 7-1049 Connection Fees.

This ordinance is not intended to alter or supersede any other provisions in the Town of Livingston Code of Ordinances.

Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to amend Article I, Section 10 of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:

§10. Right to Vote; Disqualification from Seeking or Holding an Elective Office

Section 10 (A) Right to Vote. (1) Every person who is both a citizen of the state and of the United States, upon reaching eighteen years of age, shall have the right to register and vote, except that this right may be suspended white for a person who is interdicted and judicially declared mentally incompetent or who is under an order of imprisonment for conviction of a felony.

(2) No person who is not a citizen of the United States shall be allowed to register and vote in this state.

Section 2. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on December 10, 2022.

Section 3. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at the election, there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as follows:
