### LIVINGSTON PARISH SCHOOL BOARD Resolution

**BE IT FOREVER KNOWN**, that by official action taken at its meeting of August 15, 2024, the Livingston Parish School Board (sometimes referred to as the "Board") adopted the following resolution:

**WHEREAS**, Gator Millworks, Inc. (hereafter referred to as "Company") entered into a Contract for Exemption of Ad Valorem Taxes (hereafter referred to as the "Agreement", which is attached hereto as Exhibit A), with the Louisiana Department of Economic Development (hereafter referred to as "LED") for the Industrial Tax Exemption Program ("ITEP") allowing Company to obtain an exemption from ad valorem taxes in Livingston Parish;

**WHEREAS**, the Company, in exchange for the noted exemption from ad valorem taxes, agreed to, in addition to other Company Objectives as prescribed in the Agreement, the creation of five (5) new jobs with an Annual Payroll of at least \$250,000;

**WHEREAS**, the Agreement required timely Annual Certification of Compliance to be submitted to LED each Project Year outlining Company Objectives, which would include certification of the job creation and payroll requirements outlined above and in the Agreement;

**WHEREAS**, the Agreement among and between the parties noted herein and above was consummated in April of 2019, and the Annual Certification of Compliance requirements began with the 2020 Project Year;

**WHEREAS**, the Company failed to satisfy the requirements of the agreement in the 2022 and 2023 Project Years, as no Annual Certification of Compliance was received by the LED from the Company, and the LED found no evidence of the five (5) newly created jobs or any payroll associated therewith;

**WHEREAS**, the Board is entitled to and relies upon ad valorem taxes and other sources of revenue for its day-to-day operations, and the Board has a continuing interest in ITEP compliance;

**WHEREAS**, the Board, as a Local Governmental Entity, in accordance with Section 6.01(B)(4) of the Agreement, is empowered to make a recommendation to the Louisiana Board of Commerce and Industry on the consequence for the Company's non-compliance;

**WHEREAS**, the Board recommends that Company forfeits and/or loses one year of exemption benefits for each year of non-compliance, as documented by LED; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board recommends that Company shall continue to forfeit and/or lose a corresponding exemption benefit for any future years of non-compliance, until such time as this Board resolves to act in a different manner.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that by the vote reflected hereinbelow, the Livingston Parish School Board does hereby resolve that Gator Millworks, Inc. failed to satisfy the requirements of its ITEP Agreement with the Louisiana Department of Economic Development, and as such, shall forfeit exemption benefits for each year it is and remains non-compliant. The Livingston Parish School Board does hereby recommend the Louisiana Board of Commerce and Industry reduce by one (1) year for 2022 and by one (1) year for 2023 the terms of the tax exemptions previously granted to Gator Millworks, Inc. from the current five (5) year term to three (3) year term.

The floor was opened for public comment for discussion of the 2024 millages.

Business Manager Kim Stewart read the following statement:

#### District Bond Millages

The administration of the Livingston Parish School Board recommends lowering district property taxes in the various school districts where district millages have been passed by the voters to fund specific projects such as a school, athletic facility, etc. These millages are set each year to cover the cost of the bond principal and interest. The school system is able to make the cost-savings recommendation to those millages due to the increased property values within each district.

The proposed changes for 2024 are as follows:

\* Taxpayers in Walker 4-1 have been paying both Walker 4-1 and Walker 4 millages. Since Walker 4 district's bond has been paid down, this millage will be 0. So, although there is an increase of .50 mills for Walker 4-1, these taxpayers will see a total decrease of 7.19 mills.

#### Parish-Wide Millages

The administration recommends rolling forward those parish-wide millages that are dedicated to construction and general operational costs. The "roll forward" is necessary in those budget areas in an attempt to keep up with increased costs.

In the Construction Fund, we are recommending to roll forward the adjusted millage rate of 3.77 to the voter approved rate of 5.00 mills. This would be an increase of 1.23 mills and \$1,141,493. Revenues from ad valorem taxes amount to 35% of the fund's \$13.1 million budget. (Max = \$4,640,214; Adj = \$3,498,722)

In the 7 Mill Maintenance Fund, we are recommending to roll forward the adjusted millage rate of 5.27 to the voter approved rate of 7.00 mills. This would be an increase of 1.73 mills and \$1,605,514 in taxes. Revenues from ad valorem taxes amount to 66% of the fund's \$9.8 million budget. (Max = \$6,496,300; Adj = \$4,890,786)

These two funds are used for maintenance on buildings, equipment, vehicles, and for the upkeep of grounds at 45 plus sites. They are used for new construction and capitalized building improvements as well as land acquisition. With inflation and student growth of over 1,000 students since the flood of 2016, rolling forward to the voter approved millages will allow the administration to continue to provide adequate and safe facilities for the Livingston Parish Public School's students and employees.

The General Fund has two parish-wide ad valorem taxes. The constitutional tax's adjusted millage rate is at 2.48 and the administration is recommending rolling it forward to 3.29 mills. The adjusted millage rate for the renewable tax is 5.41 and we are recommending rolling it forward to the voter approved rate of 7.18 mills. This would be a total increase of 2.58 mills and \$2,394,351. Revenues from the two parish-wide property taxes amount to approximately 5% of the fund's \$198.7 million budget. (Max = \$9,716,609; Adj = \$7,322,258)

The school system's major fund is the General Fund which is used for general operating purposes such as salaries, employee benefits, transportation costs, technology, and textbooks. With the Livingston Parish School Board being the largest employer in Livingston Parish, salary and employee benefits make up 90% of the General Fund expenditures. Since 2021, our school system has seen an increase in annual salary and benefits of \$33.3 million (16%). Fuel cost for Transportation has seen an increase from \$680,000 to \$1.3 million from fiscal year 2021 to 2024 (91%). The recent approval to equip buses with air conditioning is expected to cost the school system approximately \$11 million over the next few years.

The administration of the Livingston Parish School Board wants to do the fiscally responsible thing and give back where we can. Obviously, we have to maintain the status quo tax rate on those revenues that pay for items subject to high inflationary costs, such as maintenance and mandated employee benefits, along with maintaining our bus fleet and technology development and upgrades. But in those areas of the budget where we can continue to manage without increasing rates, we are opting to do so.

The people of Livingston Parish have entrusted us for many years to do the right thing. We will continue to be good stewards of what we have been given - we will continue to provide our children with a high quality education, and we will do so at a reasonable cost to our taxpayers.
