The chair called the meeting to order.

The chair announced that Public Input would be accepted from any member of the audience wishing to address an agenda item and explained the procedure to be called upon.

The chair asked the public to please mute or turn off their cell phones.

The chair addressed agenda item number 15, "Adoption of L.P. Ordinance 24-30; An ordinance to amend L.P. "Grants Department: Adopt a Resolution authorizing the Parish President to execute an amendment to the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between the Livingston Parish Council and the Livingston Parish Sewer District to add an additional \$1,500,000.00 in ARPA funding for various sever projects as notated in LPR No. 24-242 adopted on June 27, 2024 undertaken by the Livingston Parish Sewer Districts.

uncilman Ryan Chavers asked if they knew what they were going to use the money for specifically? Heather Crain, Livingston Parish Grants Manager, came to the podium to address Councilman Chavers' question. She referred to the resolution in their meeting packet that had a list of projects and it would be any of those projects that they were going to put the money toward.

Councilman Chavers stated that it was from his understanding they had to have a contract. He asked Ms. Crain advised that the Parish's Cooperative Endeavor Agreement is with the Livingston Parish Sewer District and they themselves entered into construction contracts with various contractors and

Councilman Chavers asked do they know what the remainder of the money is going to be used for? called upon Mr. Eddie Aydell, of Alvin Fairburn and Ass

Mr. Aydell addressed the Council members and advised of the deadline approaching to use ARPA funding. He explained that it had been agreed upon to dedicate these funds toward projects that were already completed. He advised that the balance of the funds were going toward the Dunn Road force main project and the Buddy Ellis Regional Plant force main project. He gave a brief history of sewer projects that the Sewer District had taken a bond out to complete within the district.

He advised that this is money that the District is recouping for projects that they alree monies dedicated for. He gave a very detailed summary of the various projects and the

Councilman Chavers advised that he had spoken with Councilwoman Erin Sandefur about it in reference to the ARPA money, and from what he is told, she has shovel ready projects that could use some funding in her district. He asked if Councilwoman Sandefur wished to elaborate.

Councilman Chavers questioned Finance Director, Mr. Mickey McMorris, what the remainder of the ARPA funds would be used for if they have a deadline?

cMorris advised Councilman Chavers that the remainder of the ARPA money, which had been ted to the Council members before, was being about 1.9 million.

Councilwoman Sandefur advised that she had spoken with some of their state legislators, and her understanding that two million was needed to complete the Cook Road project and it was man

Mr. McMorris stated that the money that the Parish is using comes out of DPW money, which they have used Transportation trust funds for that in the past. He advised that the Parish was okay on that match for Cook Road. Councilwoman Sandefur asked Mr. McMorris if the Parish had the two million to meet it and complete it? Mr. McMorris advised that they have already paid that.

Mr. McMorris advised that a lot of the match came from the bridge and explained that the Parish has was going to be their match and that is where they are at this point, being on the bridge portion

Councilwoman Sandefur wished to reiterate that the Parish was not short on Cook Road's

The Parish President wished to address the chairman and stated that the agenda item that they were discussing was listed as the next agenda item and they had deviated from agenda item number 11a.

Councilwoman Sandefur responded that she did not know that

Councilman Chavers advised that for him, he had to ask these questions so that the could have an educated vote on what he was voting for so that he knew where the remaining money was going, what it was being used for and specifically for that agenda item.

Councilwoman Sandefur stated that this stayed true to the agenda, she was looking at reallocating this money or making an amendment to the motion to dedicate it to Cook Road. She advised that it was

The Parish President addressed Councilwoman Sandefur and contended that it was not, because the Council did not have the authority to make an amendment to the budget. He explained that it had to be a surplus certified. He maintained that the Council had already voted on the budget and already had their opportunity, and they were going to have another opportunity when they make an amendment to the budget, but that amendment was not on that agenda. He asserted that the Council could not amend the budget when they wanted to, the budget can be amended when he certifies a surplus, and referred to the Home Rule Charter, page 20, Section 5-04.

Having no further discussion, the chair requested a motion to authorize the Parish President to enter into the proposed Cooperative Endeavor Agreement.

The chair called upon Ms. Heather Crain who explained that this was to just to administer grant funding for an application that the Parish is submitting for the Amite River Sediment Removal project which is going to be funded by the Office of Community Development and is essentially HUD funding. She conveyed that as a requirement to obtain this federal funding when submitting their application, a resolution was needed which gives the Parish President the authority to sign any and all documents related to the grant. This would include Cooperative Endeavor Agreements, signing off on environmentals, procurement and would allow the Parish President to do the administration of the grant. Ms. Crain further wished to apprise the Council members that Administration always comes before them with procurement as a practice. This resolution would allow the Parish President to do the administration of the grant.

Councilman Dean Coates asked for clarification on this because it seemed like they were giving away a lot of authority and he wanted to make sure that if they were, or were not doing that when it states, "the Parish President has the power and authority to all things necessary to implement, maintain, amend and or renew said documents, etc.". He questioned the statement made previously that Administration always comes back to the Council with these things, but with the Council giving this authority, it appeared to him, that they would be giving a tremendous amount of authority without having to come back to the Council. The Parish President asked specifically what Councilman Coates was asking clarification about

Councilman Coates questioned if the Parish currently had this grant? He inquired if what the Parish President was asking for was permission to seek this grant?

The Parish President stated that this grant was promised to Livingston Parish and you have to administrate the grant, you do not have to legislate it. He advised that to administrate it, he would have to sign documents. He further explained that the grant came through Ms. Cindy O'Neal, as well as a coalition working with Ascension Parish President Clint Continuent, East Baton Rouge Transportation Director Fred Raiford, John from Iberia Parish and Pete from St. James. Livingston Parish would be receiving twenty million out of the remaining seventy million that is left.

The Parish President advised that the Parish would need forty five million (\$45,000,000.00) dollars to complete the project, however, twenty million would make the biggest significance in Livingston Parish drainage ever in its history. He further advised that they would still be applying for the other forty five million, but needed the twenty million to sign the paperwork. He explained that HUD has certain rules that must be adhered to and they are constantly changing, which meant that additional documentation would be needed. He conveyed that all of this was time sensitive. Councilwoman Sandefur questioned if LWI had approved this grant? The Parish President advised that this came from the Amite River Basin and was not an LWI grant. Councilwoman Sandefur countered that LWI had to give their permission to do this and stated that they had to sign off on this.

Ms. Heather Crain stated that the Parish was making application to the LWI at that time. She advised that this was one step that they had to submit for them to approve it, being the requirement of a board

Councilwoman Sandefur thanked Ms. Crain and requested to amend the motion and make it subject to

Council approval once the Parish has been granted that The chair asked if she wished to authorize the Parish President to do it subject to Council approval?

Councilwoman Sandefur advised that she was not really comfortable because they did not even know if they had it and yet they would be giving all of the Council authority away to be able to deal with it.

Councilwoman Sandefur stated that she would retract it. She further advised that her concern was that

Ms. Crain advised that when the Parish is cleared to start procurement, she will come back to the

The chair professed that he did not understand her amendment to the motion
