The following ordinance which was previously introduced in written form required for adoption at a regular meeting of the Livingston Parish Council on March 13, 2025 a summary thereof having been published in the Official Journal together with a notice of public hearing which was held in accordance with said public notice, was brought up for final passage March 27, 2025 on Motion of Erin Sandefur and seconded by Ryan Chavers:

L.P. ORDINANCE NO. 25-04

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXTENSION OF A TWELVE (12) MONTH PARISH-WIDE SOLAR PANEL FARMS MORATORIUM THAT WAS PREVIOUSLY ADOPTED ON MAY 23, 2024, BEING L.P. ORDINANCE NO. 24-11, BY EXTENDING SAID MORATORIUM FOR AN ADDITIONAL TWELVE (12) MONTHS THAT WILL PROHIBIT THE CONSIDERATION, SUBMITTAL, OR APPROVAL OF ALL SOLAR PANEL FARMS OR COMMERCIAL SOLAR POWER PLANTS WITHIN LIVINGSTON PARISH UNTIL SUCH TIME AS PENDING STUDIES AND ORDINANCES ARE COMPLETE.

WHEREAS, on May 23, 2025, the Livingston Parish Council, as the governing body of the Parish of Livingston, adopted an ordinance establishing a Parishwide moratorium prohibiting the consideration, submittal, or approval of all solar panel farms or commercial solar power plants within Livingston Parish for a period of twelve (12) months; and

WHEREAS, the twelve (12) month moratorium will be expiring on May 23, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Livingston Parish Council now desires to extend this moratorium for an additional twelve (12) months that will now expire on May 23, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Livingston Parish Council seeks to protect the health, safety, and welfare of all citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Livingston Parish Council has the authority and responsibility to provide for safe and effective disposal of any potentially harmful or dangerous pollutants; and

WHEREAS, the Parish of Livingston is currently undertaking a study and considering new development rules, policies and ordinances concerning the innovative technology of commercial solar power and solar panel farms; and

BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS that there is hereby enacted an extension of the Parish-wide moratorium prohibiting the consideration, submittal, or approval of all solar panel farms or commercial solar power plants within Livingston Parish for a period of twelve (12) months; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Livingston Parish Council, governing authority of the Parish of Livingston, that if any provision of this ordinance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items, or applications of this ordinance, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Livingston Parish Council that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

The effective date of this ordinance shall be as prescribed by law.

The Livingston Parish Council met in a regular session duly called, advertised, and convened at its regular meeting place, at the Governmental Building in the Parish Council Chambers, located on 20355 Government Boulevard, Livingston, Louisiana, on Thursday, March 27, 2025, at the hour of six o'clock (6:00) p.m. with the following Livingston Parish Council members present:

The chair called the meeting to order.

The chair asked the public to please mute or turn off their cell phones.

The chair announced that Public Input would be accepted from any member of the audience wishing to address an agenda item and explained the procedure to be called upon.

The chair addressed agenda item number 8, "Presentations:". Having none, the chair advised that he had been asked to move agenda item number 15, "Update on Causey Lane and Legacy Lane from DPW – Ryan Chavers", up to the top, if no one objected. Councilman Chavers advised that this item had been previously handled.

The chair moved to the next agenda item.

The chair addressed agenda item number 9a, "Parish President's Report: Adopt a resolution authorizing the application to amend and restate the Articles of Incorporation of the Industrial Development Board of the Parish of Livingston, Louisiana, Inc., in addition to appointing and designating the acting chair and acting secretary of the Board, and the election of the nominated Board of Directors for the reinstatement of the Industrial Development Board of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana – Melody Lockwood, President and CEO of the Livingston Economic Development Council (LEDC)" and requested that this agenda item be deferred until the next regular meeting of the Council on Thursday, April 10, 2025 at six o'clock (6:00) p.m.

Councilwoman Erin Sandefur stated that she wished to make the motion to defer this agenda item and Councilman Dean Coates seconded her motion.

The chair asked if there were anyone present who wished to speak on this agenda item that would be deferred until the next Council meeting? Having none, he called for the vote.

L.P.R NO. 25-088

MOTION was made by Erin Sandefur and duly seconded by Dean Coates to defer agenda item number 9a, "Parish President's Report: Adopt a resolution authorizing the application to amend and restate the Articles of Incorporation of the Industrial Development Board of the Parish of Livingston, Louisiana, Inc., in addition to appointing and designating the acting chair and acting secretary of the Board, and the election of the nominated Board of Directors for the reinstatement of the Industrial Development Board of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana – Melody Lockwood, President and CEO of the Livingston Economic Development Council (LEDC)" and to place this item on the agenda for the next regular meeting of the Livingston Parish Council scheduled on Thursday, April 10, 2025 at six o'clock (6:00) p.m.

Thereupon the chair declared that the Motion had carried and was adopted on March 27, 2025.

The chair addressed agenda item number 10a, "Livingston Parish Grants Department: Adopt a resolution authorizing the Parish President to enter a contract agreement with Marrero, Couvillon & Associates, LLC (MCA) to perform engineering services for the Livingston Parish Gravity Drainage District 2 (GDD2) Emergency Generator Project funded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) – Disaster 4611 (Hurricane Ida) – Heather Crain", and called upon Mr. Mickey Morris, Chief Administrative Officer.

Mr. McMorris advised that Ms. Heather Crain, Grants Manager, was unable to attend that evening's meeting. He explained that this grant required that the Parish obtain an engineer to design the generators.

Councilman Ryan Chavers stated that he would like to make a motion to authorize and to do that. Councilman John Mangus made the second to that motion.

The chair asked if there was anyone present who wished to speak on this agenda item?

Councilman John Mangus asked why the generators had to be designed and couldn't just be ordered?

Mr. McMorris explained that this is one of the funding requirements of the grant. These generators will be used in emergencies for Gravity Drainage District No. 2. One (1) being located in the main office and the other will be placed in the shop in the back.

Councilman Mangus questioned if Gravity Drainage District No. 1 and No. 5 have similar generators?

Mr. McMorris stated that he was unaware of that and these generators are a replacement for Gravity Drainage District No. 2's that were damaged during Hurricane Ida.

Councilman Ryan Chavers stated that he had a question. He asked just for clarification, in order for the Parish to apply for this grant, the requirement was that you had to have an engineer?

Mr. McMorris answered in the affirmative and stated that was correct.

Councilman Joe Erdey asked if there was a cap or an amount of money involved in this?

Mr. McMorris advised that there was a cap on this, however, he did not know the amount at that time. The engineers will be making the determination for what type of generators need to be provided and hopefully that will be within the budget.

Councilwoman Sandefur stated that she had some questions about the contract, because she didn't have a copy of the contract. She asked if this was to enter into a contract agreement? He stated that was true.

Councilwoman Sandefur questioned if Mr. Moody had reviewed the contract? Mr. McMorris advised that there was not a contract yet, approval was needed first, and then the council approved will provide a contract. She asked if it came back to the Council for their approval?

Mr. McMorris indicated that it will be sent to Mr. Moody for his review.

Mr. Chris Moody, Parish Legal Advisor, stated that there was not a current rule that the Council approves generic contracts beyond the public bid law contracts. He further stated that the Council is given an authority to execute and enter into a contract by the action that is taken that evening.

Councilwoman Sandefur stated that she was not understanding and asked Mr. Moody to help her to know if the Council was entering into a contract that evening? And if so, she has not seen, and questioned if Mr. Moody had seen it?

Mr. Moody stated he had not. Mr. McMorris interjected and advised that there was not a contract at that point. He explained that a procurement had been advertised and the list of applicants was included in their meeting packets. He briefly explained the grading process of the applicants which then leads to their recommendation for approval from the Council. He stated that upon approval, it is at that time that a contract will be entered into.

Councilwoman Sandefur asked Mr. McMorris if the Council members would receive the contract to approve before it is a legal document?

Mr. McMorris advised that he did not think that was the process. Mr. Moody further added that it was not under the Council's rules to do so.

Councilwoman Sandefur questioned if the Council would then be entering into a contract that they have not seen?

Mr. Moody stated that this was the way that every process begins, the Council gives the authority to Administration to spend the funds for the proposed project, then Administration negotiates a contract, Mr. Moody then reviews the contract, then it is completed. He advised that if it would be the wish of the Council, it may be appropriate to include in the resolution for approval to require a budget amount.

Mr. McMorris explained that the company who is approved would prepare what the budget would be and if it falls within the parameters of the award, then the Council could be presented with bids based on the recommendations of the engineer that will be approved.

Councilman John Mangus posed the question that it's not like the Parish could go over budget because it is a grant from FEMA.

Mr. McMorris advised that if it goes over the award then the Parish will have to rebegin the process.

Councilman Ryan Chavers asked if the contract could come back to the Council at the next Council meeting or whenever it is ready?

Mr. Moody advised that would be up to the Parish President because under the Council's current rules and state law, he has the ability to enter into contracts.

Councilman Chavers stated that he was not doubting the Parish President's authority, but wished to confirm that the Council would eventually have a copy of the contract. Mr. Moody and Mr. McMorris both verified this. Mr. McMorris explained the contract will be presented to Mr. Moody, who then sends it here, and then it is distributed to the Council.

Mr. McMorris advised that this matter is a little bit unusual because it is requiring an engineer to design it.

The chair asked if there was anyone who wished to speak on this agenda item. Having none, the chair called for the vote.

Thereupon the chair declared that the Motion had carried and was adopted on March 27, 2025.

The chair addressed agenda item number 11, "Adopt a resolution granting approval to Recreation District No. 3 of Livingston Parish, Louisiana to call and hold an election on Saturday, October 11, 2025 to authorize the renewal of a fifteen (15) mill tax on assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in the District, for a period of ten (10) years for the purpose of operating and maintaining said District – Jim Ryan".

Mr. Brandon Browning, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer from the Parish President's Office, requested that the chair allow his interjection to address an important item under "Presentations". The chair obliged his request. Mr. Browning advised that Administration wished to turn that privilege over to Councilman Ricky Goff.

Councilman Goff thanked Mr. Browning and explained that he was addressing this item because Parish President Delatte was not able to attend the meeting that night. He advised that the Parish President had a proclamation recognizing Mr. Donald Burgess.

Councilman Goff requested that Mr. Burgess come forward from the audience to be recognized for his dedication to the Parish of Livingston and the many accomplishments contributed to in his lifetime. He asked if Mr. Burgess could attend the next Council meeting so that he may be presented with the proclamation honoring his many achievements.

Councilman Goff shared that the first meeting of the Infrastructure committee was held and described their discussion in regard to a very courageous road project that they were about take on, being Juban Extension to Lockhart, and from Lockhart to Burgess. He explained that they would be getting into the power lines to allow for an expressway that would possibly go to Cane Market Road and also Springfield Road that would be crossing Mr. Burgess's property. He explained that Mr. Burgess was donating this access of his property and their intentions were to name that expressway after his father, R.W. Burgess. He advised that this was a contingency part as well, for the Parish to have access to Mr. Burgess's property.

Councilman Goff stated that he wished to echo the Parish President's, as well as his own, gratitude and appreciation of doing what was good for the Parish of Livingston. He then invited everyone to stand for a round of applause for Mr. Donald Burgess.

Councilman Goff encouraged Mr. Burgess to speak and conveyed how proud and appreciative that everyone was of his work in the Parish of Livingston.

Mr. Burgess spoke briefly and thanked Councilman Goff and the other Council members for their consideration.

The chair thanked Mr. Burgess and then addressed agenda item number 11, "Adopt a resolution granting approval to Recreation District No. 3 of Livingston Parish, Louisiana to call and hold an election on Saturday, October 11, 2025 to authorize the renewal of a fifteen (15) mill tax on assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in the District, for a period of ten (10) years for the purpose of operating and maintaining said District – Jim Ryan".

The chair advised that Mr. Ryan was not able to attend the meeting that evening, but there were representatives from Recreation District No. 3 who were present in the audience who wished to give a presentation.

The chair acknowledged that he had visited the Recreation District earlier that week, along with Councilman Ricky Goff, and had received a lot of good information from them. He invited their representatives to introduce themselves and begin their presentation.

Public input: Gary Templeton, Superintendent of Recreation District No. 3: advised of his many years with the District, their growth and numerous accomplishments
Sharon Elliot, vice-president of the board for PARDS: Submitted a lengthy, in depth, informative presentation regarding their funding and the previous failed election and their plans to educate the voters for the upcoming election

The chair allowed Ms. Elliot to answer questions from the Council members.

Public input: Rebecca Roberts, resident of Denham Springs: questioned how advertising for the new election would be funded

Councilman Ryan Chavers stated that he wished it to go on record that the chair timed Ms. Roberts but he did not time the people from the park. The chair acknowledged his request.

Public input: Mr. Mickey McMorris, Chief Administrative Officer: wished to assert to the Council members that the park has a 6.8 million dollar (\$6,800,000.00) bond and without funding, the Council will be responsible for their mortgage

Councilman Ricky Goff wished to provide clarification of Mr. McMorris's statement. He advised that the Livingston Parish Council is basically a co-signer of Recreation District No. 3's bond, and if they are unable to pay their debt on the bond, then the Council will be responsible for their financial obligations.

Mr. McMorris further explained that all of the Recreation District's assets would also be marketed. He conveyed that this loan must be paid, the Parish cannot let it default.

Public input: Trey Cowell, resident of Kinchen Road: he opined that the Recreation District should lower their millage

The chair asked if there were any further public input. Having none, the chair closed public input and called for a motion to the resolution presented to call for an election.

Councilman John Wascom stated that he wished to make the motion to authorize putting the renewal of the tax on the ballot for the October 11, 2025 election. Councilman Lonnie Watts advised that he wished to second that motion.

The chair called for the vote of the resolution as follows:

L.P. RESOLUTION NO. 25-090

A Resolution granting approval to Recreation District No. 3 of Livingston Parish, Louisiana to call and hold an election on Saturday, October 11, 2025 to authorize the renewal of a fifteen (15) mill tax on assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in the District, for a period of ten (10) years for the purpose of operating and maintaining said District; and further providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, Recreation District No. 3 of Livingston Parish, Louisiana (the "***District***") adopted a Resolution on March 10, 2025 (the "***District Resolution***") ordering and calling a special election to be held in the District on Saturday, October 11, 2025, for the purpose of renewing the levy and collection of a fifteen (15) mill tax on assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in the District, for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2026 and ending with the year 2035, for the purpose of operating and maintaining said District (the "***Tax***"), all in the manner conferred by Article VI, Section 30 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, as amended, La. R.S. 33:4566 and the applicable provisions of Chapter 6 and Chapter 6-A of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority, a copy of which is on file with the Parish Council of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana, as governing authority of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana (the "***Parish Council***").

WHEREAS, the District has made application to the Parish Council for approval to call and hold such election on Saturday, October 11, 2025, as more fully set forth in the District Resolution.

WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 15 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, as amended, and Section 1415 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, grant power to the Parish Council to approve any proposal submitted by the District to levy a tax.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Parish Council, as the governing authority of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana, that:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to a request submitted to this Parish Council by the District and in accordance with Article VI, Section 15 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, as amended and La. R.S. 33:1415, approval is hereby granted to the District to call and hold an election on Saturday, October 11, 2025, for the purpose of authorizing the renewal of the levy and collection of a fifteen (15) mill tax on assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in the District, for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2026 and ending with the year 2035, for the purpose of operating and maintaining said District (the "***Tax***"), in the manner conferred by Article VI, Section 30 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, as amended, La. R.S. 33:4566 and the applicable provisions of Chapter 6 and Chapter 6-A of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority and as more fully set forth in the District Resolution.

SECTION 2. In the event the foregoing proposition passes, approval, consent and authority are hereby granted to the District to levy and collect the Tax described in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 3. This approval is granted in compliance with the provisions of Article VI, Section 15 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, as amended, and Section 1415 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended.





The chair addressed agenda item number 12, "Public Hearing and Adoption of L.P. Ordinance No. 25-04 – An Ordinance to provide for a twelve (12) month extension of L.P. Ordinance 24-11 Prohibiting the consideration, submittal, or approval of all Solar Panel Farms or Commercial Solar Power Plants within Livingston Parish – Erin Sandefur", and called upon the Council clerk to read the proposed ordinance by title as follows:

The chair opened the public hearing and asked if there were any one who wished to speak for or against this proposed ordinance.

The chair called upon Louisiana State Representative Shane Mack. He greeted the Council members and wished to state his support to extend the twelve (12) month moratorium for solar panel development. He advised that he serves on the Natural Resource Committee in the House of Representatives and that there was legislation being written that day that will be introduced at the next upcoming session in regard to solar farms. He stated that if it becomes law, then local governments will have to comply with the new legislation. He conveyed that he was not against solar farm development and that Louisiana relies heavily on natural gas as its primary source of energy, but there will come a time that they will need to look at renewable energy sources to supplement natural gas supply.

He briefly discussed the solar farm that is located in his district and the different problems and complaints that have been raised.

The chair asked if there were any one that was present who also wished to have input on this proposed ordinance? Having none, the chair closed the public hearing.

Councilman John Wascom wished to commend and thank Louisiana Representative Shane Mack for the hard work and good legislation that he has accomplished for the state of Louisiana.
