TOMAH

In Tomah, Downtown Thursday Nights kicks off June 30. The weekly concert series, ran by the Tomah Area Chamber of Commerce runs for six weeks. Outdoor recreational activities are all around

In Ontario, ‘the canoe capital of the Kickapoo’, you can find many canoe rental businesses to make a trip down the Kickapoo river. There are many sand bars and places to exit the river when you’re done.

In Sparta, you can canoe the La Crosse River. Amundson Park or the Angelo dam are good starting points to canoe the La Crosse River. There is a canoe rental business located near Rockland.

Near Union Center, you can hop on the Baraboo River and travel all the way past Baraboo. The River is 120 miles long and starts near Kendall and ends near Portage. From Union Center to La Valle is a 7-10 hour trip, a total of 19 miles. You can hop on the river at the 400 Bike trail parking lot or Spring Valley golf course in Union Center.

From Sparta, you can travel east or west on the bike trail. The La Crosse River State Trail runs west of Sparta and goes all the way to La Crosse. Or you can head east and go through three scenic tunnels on your way to Elroy on the Elroy-Sparta State trail. Once in Elroy, you can hop on the 400 State trail, which crisscrosses the Baraboo River on the way to Reedsburg.

DNR to host 12th annual Landing Blitz this weekend

Summer is well underway, and as more residents and visitors head out to enjoy the multitude of outdoor recreational opportunities Wisconsin has to offer, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is asking those taking to Wisconsin waterways to help combat the spread of invasive species this summer.

During the upcoming Fourth of July weekend, the DNR will have both staff and volunteers with

the Clean Boats, Clean Waters (CBCW) project stationed at boat launches throughout the state as part of their 2022 Landing Blitz campaign.

The Landing Blitz campaign is an effort to help provide boaters in Wisconsin with the knowledge and skills necessary to help prevent giving a ride to any unintended hitchhikers. State law prohibits the transport of aquatic invasive species, which makes programs like the Landing Blitz rather useful.

Invasive species are defined as “nonnative plants, animals, and

diseases that cause great ecological, environmental, or economic harm.” Wisconsin is already no stranger to invasive species, such as zebra mussels and multiple types of carp, but the posed threat level can vary between different invasive species.

In order to comply with state law, and to protect our state’s water resources, boaters are asked to thoroughly inspect their boats, trailers, and equipment. If any plants or animals are found hitching a ride, be sure to remove them

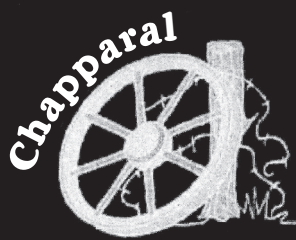

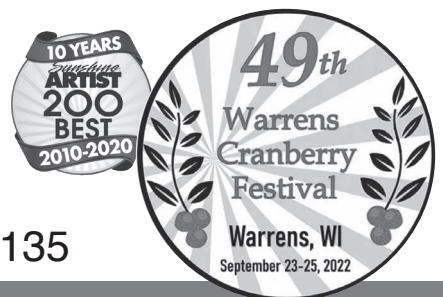

Vernon County announces National Night Out 2022

The Vernon County National Night Out planning committee has announced that the annual National Night Out event is set to take place on Tuesday, August 2, beginning at 5:00P.M. This event will be held at the Vernon County Fairgrounds in Viroqua, and will feature multiple law enforcement, fire, and EMS departments from all over Vernon County.

Vernon County held their first National Night Out in August of 2019, with COVID-19 putting a halt on the event's return in 2020. However, organizers were able to bring the event back in 2021, and are excited to continue the tradition this summer.

As part of the evening, guests will be able to get up close and personal with a variety of emergency response vehicles, include the fan favorite fire trucks and ambulances, as well as police squad car and tactical rescue vehicles.

Over forty local and county organizations and businesses will have displays at the event, building off of the theme of safety, health, and wellness. Free food will be available

Demonstrations are scheduled to take place throughout the evening, ranging from safety procedures to K-9 units showing off their skills. A demonstration and visit from the Gundersen Air team is also set for this event, and Vernon County's mounted deputy, Jay Vosseteig, and his

horse Leon will be making their rounds through the fairgrounds.

Organizers have stated their hope that these events will help build and develop a positive relationship between the community and the first responders who serve them. Be sure to mark your calendars for Tuesday, August 2, from 5:00P.M. until 9:00P.M., and stop by the Viroqua Fairgrounds for a fun night out with Vernon County's first responders.

before departing. Make sure to drain all water from boats, motors, livewells, and any other equipment you've brought with you.

The DNR advises boaters to never transport live fish away from a waterbody, and to dispose of any unwanted or unused bait in the trash. If you purchase minnows, be sure to do so from a Wisconsin bait dealer. If any minnows are left over, only use them on the same waterbody—or if no lake or river water, or other fish, were added to the same container.

Thousands of Wisconsin residents and visitors flock to Wisconsin's waterways every Fourth of July weekend, which is hands down the state's busiest boating holiday. Volunteers stationed at landings throughout Wisconsin will be providing demonstrations on the prevention steps boaters can take to boat responsibly and help protect the waterbodies they enjoy.
