
The brothers, who grew up in central Wisconsin decided it was time to come back home where their family is. Dan said, "we both love the Sparta area and always have."

City loan program to help repair homes

Low to moderate income families can receive no interest loans for home repairs

Common council for the city of Sparta approved a new resolution on August 16th to establish a loan program offering to help rehabilitate owner occupied homes within the city limits, the Community Home Rehabilitation Loan Program (CHRLP). The CHRLP will provide qualified homeowners with no-interest, deferred payment home repair loans up to \$20,000.

The program will be run by a committee appointed by the mayor and overseen by the City Administrator and the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Coordinator. CHRLP will meet the second Wednesday of every month in city hall and the meetings will comply with the Wisconsin Open Meetings Law. A designated program administrator will be selected, with duties including publicizing, receiving applications, verifying loan request eligibility, maintaining records at meetings, loan applications and maintaining individual loan files. They will be responsible for the disbursements of funds and maintaining proper ledgers on the city's CHRLP funds and for all individual loans.

Loans through the program will be limited to improvements making the

property habitable, safer, or sanitary. Some examples are roof, siding, furnaces, adding handicap accessibility, new water heater, or updates to existing central air conditioning. Ineligible improvements would be new appliances, unfinished spaces, or landscaping. A unit is also ineligible for a loan if the rehabilitation cost is more than 50% of the value, after the rehabilitation. Funds cannot be used to reimburse for work previously done.

All loans will be zero interest and will not exceed \$20,000. A mortgage and note will be issued with the Register of Deeds against the borrower's property in the amount of the loan, with the office fee deducted from the loan amount. Repayment will be due in full when the occupant leaves the residence. The repaid funds are returned to the CHRLP balance and used to fund other rehabilitation loans.

To be eligible to apply for a loan, there are a few requirements for the existing

home loan and occupant's income. Homes cannot have an existing loan that exceeds 100% of fair market value based on the recent tax bill. There can be no delinquent taxes nor judgements against the property. The total income of all occupants, 18 and older, cannot exceed the annual low- or moderate-income levels set by the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The committee can approve or deny any applications based on their own discretions. The program has a complaint procedure where applicants can appeal by submitting a request for reconsideration and giving a reason. If the committee still denies the application, the municipal board will hear the appeal and decide. Written authorization by the city of Sparta building inspector will also be required prior to funds being distributed.

A kitchen is often the most utilized room in a house. 6. Create continuity in the room. Many open concept homes will have kitchens open up to another room in the home. Mirror the design scheme from elsewhere in the house, and make sure that the flow between spaces is not obstructed.

7. Create a beverage station.

A beverage station can minimize the time needed to make a cup of tea or coffee or for the kids to grab juice or chocolate milk.

8. Have a workspace in the

kitchen. Whether paying bills, making a grocery list or leaving notes for the family, a dedicated workspace can add more function to the room. Be sure there is task lighting nearby and ample overhead lighting to ensure that all kitchen needs are illuminated properly.

1. Garage Door Replacement: 93.3 percent recouped of \$4,041 cost

2. Manufactured Stone Veneer: 91.4 percent recouped of \$11,066 cost

3. Siding replacement (Fiber Cement): 68.3 percent recouped of \$22,093 cost

4. Window replacement (Vinyl): 67.5 percent recouped of \$20,482 cost

5. Siding replacement (Vinyl): 67.2 percent recouped of \$18,662 cost

6. Window replacement (Wood): 66.3 percent recouped of \$24,388 cost

7. Deck addition (Wood): 64.8 percent recouped of \$19,248 cost

8. Entry Door Replacement (Steel): 63.8 percent recouped of \$2,206 cost

The majority of renovations on Remodeling magazine's list of the best investments are exterior renovations, making this area of a home a particular point of interest for homeowners. The only interior project that cracked the Top 10 ROI for projects was a minor midrange kitchen remodel.

Exterior renovations perhaps add the most bang for your buck because they're not only functional, but also because they add immediate curb appeal. 


your tiling against water, oil and grease. It'll also help your floors retain their original beauty for longer. To waterproof your tiles, use a tile-friendly product like linseed oil.



How to prepare a fireplace for the winter

As hours of daylight shorten and fall gives way to winter, thoughts shift from fall foliage to spending time cuddling under warm blankets and being cozy indoors. A fireplace can improve the ambiance of any room and help to create a warm and welcoming gathering spot.

Home fireplaces typically are wood-burning or gas. Though maintenance for these fireplaces differs, certain preparatory steps must be taken to prepare a fireplace for winter.

Clear the clutter

Items can accumulate in areas that are not in use, and a fireplace is no exception. Take a few hours to remove any belongings from in front of the fireplace and clean the mantle thoroughly.

Have the chimney cleaned

Hire a professional chimney cleaning company to inspect the chimney and clean it thoroughly before winter. According to



BobVila.com, a chimney should be cleaned once a year, or after about every 80 fires. The National Fire Protection Association says failure to properly clean chimneys is one of the leading contributors to home fires. That's due to creosote, a highly flammable residue that builds up in the flue that lines the chimney.

Inspect the interior

The interior of a wood-burning fireplace is likely lined with fire bricks. Check for cracks and loose joints. Hire a professional mason to make any repairs, as special materials are needed to withstand the heat of fires.

Install a chimney cap and screen

According to Family Handyman, a chimney cap is a protective covering that goes over the top of the chimney. It is made of steel or copper mesh with a cap on top. This protects the chimney from rain and downdrafts and keeps animals and debris from getting into the chimney.

Prune overhanging branches

If there are trees close to the home and the chimney, cut them back, as they can be a fire hazard. Branches and leaves also can restrict the proper draft of the chimney.

Assess the outdoor vent

Gas fireplaces typically emit exhaust through a vent in the home. Remove any blockages from the vent, including leaves, cobwebs and debris.

Check glass or other coverings

The glass or face of the fireplace helps regulate carbon monoxide exposure and protects people from the flames. Be sure the glass covering is intact.

Clean ceramic logs

Gas fireplaces use ceramic logs, rocks or beads that can become dusty. Clean them prior to use. Dirty ceramic logs can be a fire hazard and produce an unpleasant burning smell.

Check the blower and pilot

If the fireplace has an electric blower, clean and dust it so it doesn't become clogged. Inspect the pilot light for any wear and tear that includes wiring or structural issues.

The program administrator will help applicants apply and provide them with all information necessary. Completed submissions will include at minimum: a completed application, copy of most recent property tax bill, two bids by licensed/certified contractors for the work, a copy of the previous tax return and most recent pay stub of every household member over 18, and a copy of the property's homeowner's insurance. All information will be verified by the project administrator and will be kept confidential. More information may be needed if deemed necessary by the project administrator. The committee will communicate their decision in writing to the applicant, and if approved, the project administrator will continue helping the approved applicants.

The project manager will next require a completed draw request form. Projects totaling \$5,000 or less are limited to one draw at the completion of the project. Once the draw request is submitted the building inspector will be notified of the request. The inspector will view the property and approve. Then funds will be issued, to the contractor or to the homeowner. The disbursement will be accompanied by a lien waiver to be signed by the contractor. There can be only two draws on any project and records will be on each property owner's file. Emergency loans can be requested up the amount of \$10,000 and will be at the discretion of the city administrator and CDBG coordinator. Conditions of eligibility and administrative procedures would still be required.

Contracts can be terminated. Contractors can request to be removed from a contract if no funds have been disbursed and the request is made 30 days prior to their notice to proceed. City can terminate contracts based on work performance, causing additional damage to property, or irreconcilable differences between the homeowner and contractor. If work performance is an issue, there will be a meeting with the property owner, contractor and building inspector to negotiate the problem. Then, contractors will be given a reasonable amount of time to fix the problem before termination.

The cost to repair any poor craftmanship will be deducted from all amounts owed to the contractor. The homeowner is responsible for filing an insurance claim against the contractor.
