

#### Jo Ellen Davis

Jo Ellen Davis (Jones) passed away on Wednesday, Nov. 15, 2023, at age 91. She spent her last day surrounded by family whom she dearly loved and who dearly loved her.

Jo Ellen was born in Grant, Oklahoma, on Jan. 15, 1932. She was the middle child of Jewell and Garlin Jones. In 1942, Jo Ellen's family moved to Coolidge, Arizona, where she was valedictorian of both her junior high school and high school classes, receiving a scholarship to attend Arizona State College (now ASU). This was the beginning of a lifelong focus on learning.

Jo Ellen met James Gibson Davis Jr. (Jim) at a First Baptist Church social function. On March 15, 1951, Jo Ellen and James were married, shortly before Jim shipped out to fight in the Korean War. They had three children: Barbara, Joanne and Jamie (James).

In the 1960s, Jo Ellen went back to ASU and got her undergraduate degree and master's degree in art education. After earning her art education degree, Jo Ellen worked as the Coolidge High School art teacher and then as the Coolidge Elementary



art teacher and as a 5th grade teacher. During this time, Jim also got his undergraduate degree and master's degree in industrial arts education.

They moved to Tempe, Arizona, after Jim got a teaching job and Jo Ellen worked at a Phoenix law firm. She returned to teaching when both of them got teaching jobs with the Nogales School District.

In 1976, their teaching jobs brought them to Globe, where Jo Ellen taught in the Globe School District and at Holy Angels Catholic School. In the 1980s, she returned to ASU for a second master's in social welfare and worked in Globe for Arizona Long Term Care System (ALTCS) as a case manager until retirement. She was instrumental in getting hospice care for Globe.

After retirement, Jo

Ellen took on volunteer work with the Friends of the Globe Public Library, setting up senior services, delivering meals to the elderly and being active in IOOF. Jo Ellen is preceded in death by her parents and two brothers, Raygene and Fred Jr.

She is survived by her husband Jim and three children, Barbara (Gino Zappia), Joanne (Jay Slotkin) and Jamie (Elaine Davis), eight grandchildren, and 11 great-grandchildren.

A Celebration of Life service was held Saturday, Nov. 25, 2023, at Lamont Mortuary, 328 S. Hill St., Globe, Arizona, with a reception following.



## **Ask God**

At the age of 17, I enrolled in Arizona State University and had absolutely no idea of "what I wanted to be when I grew up." The "menu" of courses was fascinating, and the choices were up to me. One course that seemed foundational was Business Law. and I enrolled.

Enrolled, bought the book, noted the time and was seated in class. The professor handed out the syllabus and was explaining he would assign a topic to develop for a 30-minute talk before the class. Being shy, I panicked and made a hasty decision. I went to Registration and withdrew from that class. Other classes were all papers, and I would not be in front of

the class.

Business forced me to make presentations, and I enrolled in the Dale Carnegie Course in public speaking. The course was taught by two men who were great, and the class was finished without a problem.

My boss was teaching at the college and asked if I would teach his class the two nights he had to be out of town. I did so, felt more assured, and taught there for 23 years.

The call into the ministry came. I accepted, earned two advanced degrees and have been publicly speaking since. If I had asked God about what He wanted me to do, it could have been easier.

Proverbs 3:6: "In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make straight your paths."

#### A life without lack

## The longer we follow Jesus, the more we discover that He is all we truly need.

"How much is enough?" a reporter once asked John D. Rockefeller, founder of Standard Oil and the first American billionaire, "Just a little bit more," Rockefeller said. While few of us have the resources of the super wealthy, we face the same question. Our world is obsessed with getting more. spending more, doing more. But at the root of an answer like Rockefeller's is a misunderstanding about who provides for us.

David understood that God was his provider. "I will not be in need," he wrote in verse 1 of Psalm 23. In other words, because he belonged to the Lord, he was able to experience a life without lack.

We can think about this in two ways. First, we can expect God to give us everything we think we need. And when we don't get it, we look for someone—or Someone—to blame. Or, as Jesus and His followers laid out, there's a second and better approach: Gratefully receive what God has provided and allow Him to change our heart. In that way, even our

needs are governed by our submission to Him.

Reading the first verse of Psalm 23 should immediately remind us of John 10:11, where Jesus says, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down His life for the sheep." The transforming truth of the gospel is that we have more than enough because Jesus gave us Himself.






