Technological help from Globe Public Library

If you need help getting library apps to work on your device, bring it in charged and the staff can try to help you figure out your issue.

We are offering wireless printing. You can print from your phone, laptop, or desktop computer from home. You need to download the "Princh" app from the App Store or Google Play or open your browser and type: print.princh.com in the address line. Open your document and select "Print." Be sure to choose the Globe Public Library Printer #103148. The costs are the same, \$0.25 per page. You can choose to pay by credit card or select pay at the desk. Then just come to the library to pick up your prints. We can show you how this works

Hotspots are available at the Globe Public

Library. You need to be an adult with a library account in good standing. Only one hotspot per household. Checkout will be for three weeks. You can renew if there is no waiting list. All hotspots must be returned inside the library at the circulation desk.

You can check out laptops for home use at the Globe Public Library. You need to be an adult with a library account in good standing. Only one laptop per household. Checkout will be for three weeks. You can renew if there is no waiting list. All laptops must be returned inside the library at the circulation desk.

A library account in good standing is a library account that has a history of at least two months with no outstanding fines, no lost items, and no recent late fees with frequent use.

The soundtrack of complaint

Are you enduring a dark night of the soul? Hang on – a beautiful morning is coming.

Many of us have a quiet soundtrack running through our mind, and the volume is turned down so low we can barely hear it. Gratitude doesn't mean plastering a big smile on your face and pretending that an aggravating situation is no big deal. Instead, our thankfulness reconnects us with God in the midst of the everyday challenges of life and teaches us to sing a new song – one that will continue for all of eternity.

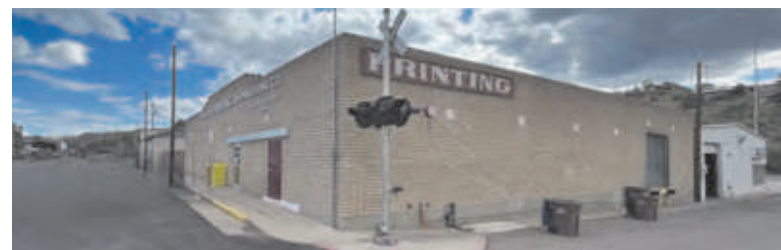

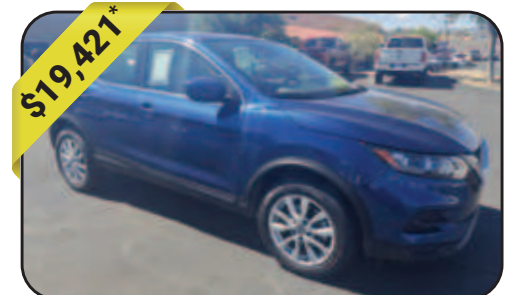
