Remembering JFK assassination at Bullion Plaza's Second Friday

Second Friday, Nov. 10, at Bullion Plaza Cultural Center & Museum will be the place for remembering the 60th anniversary of the assassination of one of our most beloved presidents, John F. Kennedy. Doors open at 6 p.m.

Where were you on the day President Kennedy was assassinated in Dallas, Texas, Nov. 22, 1963? Local historian Rick Powers remembers! He has done extensive research on the history, read many books, watched and reviewed many hours of testimony, visited with experts, and visited the places in Dallas where it happened.

He will begin with a review of what was going on in the world in 1963, summarize the events of the last two days, and the arrest and subsequent murder of Lee Harvey Oswald. He will review the Warren Report, the Select Committee on Assassinations, case anomalies, strange stories and a few of the conspiracy viewpoints.


OBITUARIES

Blood drive coming to Globe Friday


Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood — and this Friday, Nov. 3, the Red Cross needs donors right here in Globe-Miami.

'Old school'

A term we don't hear much anymore is "old school." When we do, it is usually in reference to the building rather than the instruction that took place in the classrooms. But the term is not limited only to education, as it includes the ethics associated with every workplace.

I remember nurses at Cobre Valley Hospital who may have started at Inspiration, or the old Gila General, and continued working at the "new" hospital. The medical field especially has seen such "improvements" that education is never finished. Some pioneers still refer to the "good old days" and are thinking how

problems were handled.

In family life, "extended families" would include "aunts," "uncles," "brothers" and "sisters" who were no blood relation but were perhaps closer to us than those who were. We could count on them for a ride if our car was in the shop or if we had a pressing need. There was no cash payment, but a dozen cookies or mowing of the lawn settled indebtedness.

While the old ways faded out slowly, there is nothing to keep them from fading back in. Manners, little kindnesses, thoughtfulness, are always welcome. If an acquaintance remarks that they have a dentist appointment next week, there is an opportunity to offer a ride, babysitting, or an easy-to-chew dinner you could bring by. Let's take a new look at the old school.

Faith to leave

Have you decided to follow Jesus whenever and wherever He leads?

When Jesus met Simon and Andrew, the brothers weren't extraordinary saints. The same was true of James and John. They were all just fishermen — men who, along with many others, listened to the Lord's teaching. What set them apart was their faith to leave behind their old life for a new way of living.

Mark is fond of using the word immediately. In his gospel, he writes that the brothers "immediately" left their nets and followed Jesus. We might miss the enormity of this decision. The men left their businesses – their source of income – but that was only the beginning. More than three years of discipleship

took them far from family, home, comfort and safety. They answered Jesus' call with faith, not only to believe but also to leave.

We may not receive so radical a call. Yet we aren't all that different from the disciples. When Jesus invites us to follow Him, we must set aside everything that competes for our trust in Him. In other words, we must be willing to leave our own "nets" – jobs and homes, or perhaps comfort and success – when the Lord calls us to do so. What would it take for you to have that kind of faith?


