Help build a greenhouse at High Desert Middle School

Four months ago Bethany Gray was in the spotlight after winning acclaim as Gila County's Teacher of the Year. Now, here's an opportunity where we can each help this inspiring educator achieve a goal for her students in grades 6-8 at High Desert Middle School.

Last year the gardening club proved successful enough to join other vendors selling at the very first farmers market. September marks the start of fall, and earlier this month Mrs. Gray launched a fundraiser through DonorsChoose in order to add a greenhouse to the raised-bed gardens she and her students tend in a sunny courtyard at the school.

"Our town has a storied history with miners, cowboys and even outlaws passing through or establishing roots," wrote Mrs. Gray on donorschoose.org, where you can support this project. "Today it has a large income gap, and we have many families in need of food, shelter and the stability of a regular income to sustain themselves. Many of my most amazing students come from these families as well. The school garden and outdoor classroom project here at High Desert Middle School has been slowly working with other stakeholders and we have been asked to participate in a local community service program that combats hunger called ACE (for All Children Eat). In order to commit to this goal, we are building a greenhouse in order to expand our ability to grow different kinds of vegetables in a year-round capacity."

Donating is convenient at donorschoose.org; just search for this project using the keywords "let-them-eat-vegetables" or by project number 7817572. As of press time, \$1,072 more will meet the fundraiser's goal – and donations are being matched by support from The Allstate Foundation. Adding a greenhouse will allow the middle school gardeners to weather seasonal changes with a protected environment,



providing fresh greens and other vegetables on a vear-round basis for these families.

"We also build ties to the community for our students that result in a true sense of connection to community through the experience," wrote Mrs. Gray. "Middle school students today face serious challenges in integrating into our current society, and it is a top priority for us to teach them how to

reach out to others in a way that provides positive and fulfilling results. By showing them how to care for their community we hope that all will benefit as knowledge is gained, people are fed, and our school becomes part of a larger network of community service-oriented groups that work together to give Globe a better present and a brighter future."

This award-wining teacher and her students already have 60 lettuce starts waiting to go into their garden

along with bok chov and other greens, with kale, chard and other leafy greens to follow. High Desert Middle School serves 362 students in grades 6-8 with a student/teacher ratio of 25.9:1. HDMS teachers have had 25 projects funded on DonorsChoose. 





HOME INTERNET ACCESS IS IMPORTANT FOR EVERY STUDENT'S SUCCESS.

The Affordable Connectivity Program provides eligible households with up to a \$30 discount off their monthly internet bill or a \$75/month discount on Tribal lands. It also provides one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider when the eligible household contributes at least \$10 but less than \$50 toward the purchase.

You may qualify if your student receives free or reduced school lunch or breakfast!

Does your student participate in the Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision?

If the answer is Yes, your household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program.

You may also qualify if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or a member of the household participates in certain federal assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, SSI or WIC, or Tribal assistance programs.

Lifeline program participants also automatically qualify for the Affordable Connectivity Program.

Two Steps to Enroll

- **Go to GetInternet.gov** to submit an application or print a mail-in application.
- 2 **Contact your preferred participating provider** to select an eligible plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete Eligible households must <u>both</u> apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan.
