



David Felix





The Good Neighbor Agreement is based on novel, binding agreements that have been created between some mining companies and local/regional community groups. This highly effective model is designed to meet the needs and interests of the community and the mining company, avoiding legal disputes, and helps maintain an open dialogue.

Monthly meetings of the group are now held at the Town of Superior Offices, Library Room at 199 N. Lobb Ave. The public is welcome and encouraged to attend these meetings. About the Community Working Group

The CWG focuses on potential environmental impact issues, science and policy, economic development and growth, and the pros and cons of the proposed development of the Resolution Copper mine, which could be-


come one of the world's largest copper mining ventures. Members include residents and stakeholders from the Town of Superior, Queen Valley, and nearby communities.

About Resolution Copper

The Resolution Copper project is a proposed under-

ground mine 60 miles east of Phoenix, Arizona, near the town of Superior. The project is a joint venture owned by Rio Tinto (55%) and BHP (45%). The ore deposit lies nearly 7,000 feet below the earth's surface. It represents one of the most significant untapped copper deposits today.

A baker's dozen

Tradition teaches us that an old law set forth the weight of baked goods and although twelve of something constituted a dozen, the total weight might not be up to the legal requirement. Laws were strictly enforced, and shortages caused dire penalties to be imposed. To be on the "safe side," an extra item was added.

Several years ago, we received a call from the food bank asking if we had any available freezer space. We did, gladly driving over to help in their crisis. A local food outlet had not placed advertising of a planned sale and had a semi-truck load of frozen chicken waiting to be unloaded. Along with other organizations, we assisted in the unloading of 28,000 pounds of chicken soon safely stored under proper conditions, awaiting those in need.

God knew what He was doing and an error on someone's part became a "Godsend" as the precious food provided many meals to the hungry people. Prayers were answered even before expressed. Prayers of thanksgiving were heard from many.

While working at The Salvation Army in Tucson, Arizona, one of my assigned duties was to go to a local bakery at six o'clock each morning and pick up "day old" doughnuts. Perfectly good and very tasty, these were always welcomed by those staying at the shelters.

Luke 3:11, "Anyone who has two shirts should share with the one who has none and anyone who has food should do the same."

God's ways: Ordinary or miraculous?

The Lord is always working for our good, but not always in ways we understand.

In Isaiah 55, God declares, "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways" (Isaiah 55:8). In fact, that's one of the biggest frustrations of the Christian life—a lack of understanding about God's ways. There are times when we could really use a miracle, and He doesn't come through for us, which can lead to confusion, disappointment, and anger. Why did God let me down?

God works in both supernatural and ordinary ways, and He determines the method. For example, Elijah ate food miraculously delivered by ravens but his water supply from a brook was completely natural. When it dried up, the

Lord could have made more water spring from the ground, but He didn't.

Sometimes God uses ordinary means to move us in a new direction. The curtailment of his water supply opened the door for Elijah's next assignment. When the Lord withholds miraculous intervention and lets your brook dry up, then He has something else planned for you.

The work of God in the commonplace aspects of life is just as miraculous as His supernatural intervention. Look for His "fingerprint" in the day's mundane activities. He is there, opening and closing doors, drying up one opportunity but initiating another.


