




Vitalant supplies and donates blood to

62 hospitals in Arizona and urges Globe-Miami donors to help offset a statewide critical blood shortage. Donors with Type O blood are especially needed because that universal type of blood is used to treat emergencies and trauma. Questions about giving blood, or a Power Red donation? Read more at vitalant.org.

How often can you give blood? According to the Red Cross, "Wait at least eight weeks (56 days) between donations of whole blood, or 16 weeks (112 days) between Power Red donations. Whole blood donors can donate up to 6 times a year."

Globe-Miami has become a destination for those fascinated with the paranormal. Famous local "haunts" range from the historic Gila County Jail built in 1910 to the courthouse (which now houses the Cobre Valley Center for the Arts), Bullion Plaza Museum in Miami, the old depot train station, Broad Street buildings that once housed brothels and the massive YMCA building in Miami. Guided ghost hunts and more intense "fivehour lock-down"' midnight paranormal investigations have proven so popular, they've become monthly

events - and helpful fundraisers for these historic buildings.

Saturday, April 22 brings a full day of paranormal adventures with the Ghosts of Globe "ParaCon" in downtown Globe at the depot - with guest speakers, authors, psychics, paranormal teams and workshops. Want to have your tarot cards read? Buy crystals or anime? Bring the kiddos on a familyfriendly ghost hunt? Admission to the vendor area is free; speakers and daytime guided tours are \$10 - or buy a day-long allaccess pass for \$50. Tickets

Bullion Plaza or YMCA - or your choice between special four-hour 7 - 11 p.m. "VIP intense paranormal investigation with celebrity guests" in a former brothel, in the courthouse, or from 9 p.m. - 1 a.m. in the jail, depot, YMCA or Bullion Plaza. Experiencing inner peace

Remembering that God's in control is the key to a calm heart.

Have you ever fallen asleep on a long trip? Jesus did. Luke tells us that one time Jesus and the disciples got on a boat to reach the other side of a lake, and Jesus fell asleep. The next thing the disciples knew, they were engulfed in a storm, and the one person powerful enough to protect them was blissfully unaware. The disciples panicked and woke Him.

Jesus has promised to give us His peace (John 14:27)—this is the very same peace that enabled Him to sleep through a storm. Without His tranquility, we feel helpless and afraid like the disciples. But with it, we can experience inner calm in the midst of hardship.

Believing in God's sovereignty is the key to a peaceful heart. In their panic, the disciples believed that a sleeping Jesus wasn't in control of their circumstances. But we must remember that He is always in control—even in times of difficulty. When we rest in the knowledge that God is in charge, we can exchange anxiety for peace.

Jesus doesn't want us to be weighed down by fear. He wants to share His peace with us. Are you trusting in His control?

A peaceful heart

Entrusting our worries to God removes their power to cause anxiety.

Sometimes circumstances trigger our anxiety, but other times it's an inner turmoil we wrestle. Regardless of the source, our angst is no match for God's peace, "which surpasses all comprehension" (Phil. 4:7). When you're feeling anxious, remember ...

God made you on purpose. Our Father chose the time and place we each would be born (Acts 17:26), and He gave us our personality, talents and spiritual gifts. So consider what God has chosen specifically for you and give thanks.

God has a plan for your life. Scripture promises that embracing the Father's specific path for your life will bring satisfaction and peace (Proverbs 3:5-6).

God adopts believers into His family. Once you belong to Him, nothing can

change the fact that you are His (John 10:28).

God forgives when you confess. Some feelings of inner turmoil come from guilt or shame over wrongdoing. But when you confess your sin and change direction, God forgives you. Then your conscience can become clear (1 John 1:9).

Peace is within reach when you remember your identity in Christ. Next time you're feeling anxious, pause for a moment to pray and meditate over these four truths. Taking your eyes off yourself and fixing them on Jesus should help, even if it's necessary to repeat the process periodically.

Presence

Early in 1954 I was working at the fire station in Scottsdale, Arizona. My assignment at that time was to be part of the crew for the ambulance. This was before EMTs and paramedics, and our training was basically first aid taught by the American Red Cross.

One call was to transport

a patient from the Pima Reservation at Salt River to the Indian Hospital in Phoenix. The patient was a young girl about sixteen. Her injuries were not life-threatening, but all of this was new to her and she was frightened. I was riding in the back with her. At one point she extended her hand and asked me to hold it. I did and could feel the anxiety disappear. Conversation was

minimal, but the holding of her hand was the best "treatment." When we arrived at the hospital, it was difficult for her to let go.

Years later, as Chaplain for Canyon Fire in Globe, Arizona, I arrived at the home of a friend who was suffering from severe complications. We greeted each other and he asked me to sit on his bed. He, too, extended his hand for me

to shake. He wouldn't let go. The medics arrived, did their assessment and prepared to transport to Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center. He very reluctantly let go. He passed two days later.

In my years of experience with people in traumatic situations, having a friend present can mean so much. Can you extend a hand?


