

Highway 60 through Miami, Claypool and Globe is justifiably famous for the bright Mexican goldpoppies alongside the road. Even in dry years robust patches of this photogenic flower bloom through the sidewalk cracks in Claypool (near mileposts 244-246). They are most vibrant of all near the Rod Plant just east of Miami. For those who want a breathtakingly immersive and unforgettable poppy experience, Peridot Mesa is about a 10-minute drive east of Apache Gold Casino on Highway 70. The mesa is luring photographers from across the United States to a 'super-bloom' of more than 1,000 acres of Mexican goldpoppies and lesquerella. Color should remain at peak April 3-10. Make sure to buy your San Carlos Apache Tribe daily recreation permit – Peridot Mesa is on Apache land, and permits are required. They're just \$10 for adults (or a family with minor children), sold at the tribe's Recreation and Wildlife Department office. The office is about a five-minute drive past Peridot Mesa on Highway 70; hours are Monday-Saturday 8 – 4:30 and Sunday from 8 – noon. Also, during this first week of April look on the hillsides above Highway 60 for tall wallflower (stalks topped with orbs of lemon-yellow) and other primary colors; red penstemons, blue lupine and phacelia.

Night-scented stock

What's the name of the purple flower covering hillsides behind Fry's, throughout Central Heights and in Globe's Round Mountain Park? The flower that releases that sweet, candy-perfume smell in the evening? A native of Eurasia that has spread across our communities, night-scented stock (Matthiola longipetala) colors entire hillsides now — even beautifying the road up to Russell Gulch Landfill. With colors ranging from pink to purple, these flowers are as fragrant as they are prolific. Opening as evening approaches, they release a strong, sweet and spicy fragrance that perfumes the surrounding air.

Round Mountain Park

The single best place for hikers and photographers to see and enjoy wildflowers is Globe's Round Mountain Park. An evening walk during April brings your chance to see the soft glow of greenish-yellow hillsides gilt with yellow bladderpod, complemented by evening primrose (Oenothera primiveris) and wallflower blooming right along the relaxing dirt paths of this popular park. Round Mountain Park offers miles of hiking trails, is easy to find and admission is free. To get there, turn north at Denny's Restaurant; the park is just a short drive up the dirt road on the west side of the Samaritan Veterinary clinic. Other flowers that are usually easy to find at Round Mountain include false garlic, scorpionweed, blue phacelia and fragrant berberis shrubs. Robust penstemons can be distinguished by their color: 'firecracker' penstemons are red, while the taller Parry's penstemon is hot pink. Striking sky-blue delphinium (also called larkspur) blooms in April, along with the showy strawberry hedgehog cactus. The University of Arizona seeks adult volunteers, ages 18 – 80 with chronic insomnia for a research study. **The purpose of the study is to learn which type of treatment is most effective at treating chronic insomnia**; 1) Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT-i), 2) Medication (Zolpidem or Trazadone), or 3) Combination of both, CBT-I + Medication.

Study involves filling out online questionnaires, sleep diaries, and follow up assessments AFTER 9 weeks, 6 months, and 12 months and surveys at 1 and 9 months, after taking medication and completing internet based cognitive behavioral therapy, or both. All visits/questionnaires are completed online. There are no in-person clinic visits

Cognitive Behavioral Therapy is provided free of charge. Participant's insurance company will be billed for medication.



He organized local legal representatives to establish the first San Carlos Apache bar association.

Lang Attorney worked within the system to improve positive outcomes for defendants rather than just the terms of indefinite incarceration. He attributed his interest in the law to his mother, who raised four children on her own after his father suddenly died. He often said that it was his mom who instilled in him a "fighting spirit." Friends said Attorney Lang carried warrior remembering him as an ardent advocate for the Apache People until his final days. Attorney Lang was honorably veteran, discharged from the United States Army. He is survived by his wife, son, daughter and a new grandson. memorial service Phoenix. held in






