





Growing mentally and physically strong at Globe Public Library


Globe Public Library is starting new programs aimed at helping our community grow mentally and physically strong. We are currently offering three programs with more to come.



I am amazed when I see Dick Van Dyke perform physical stunts I could never do at any age! This is a value that seems timeless. What are your true talents?



Sometimes comparing ourselves to others leaves us feeling insecure, but other times it stirs up false pride. When we see others being mean, selfish, or lazy, we might think we're better—and deserving of a place in heaven. In reality, we can always find someone "lesser" to make ourselves feel more holy. But compared to God's perfect holiness, every person is

The truth is, whether or not we go to heaven has little to do with us-and everything to do with our heavenly Father. He was the one who made a way for our righteousness, and it wasn't in response to our behavior. In fact, God decided long before we were born-before we had the chance to do anything good or bad-that He would offer the gift of salvation. Paul wrote to the Ephesians that God "chose us in Him be-

fore the foundation of the world, that we would be holy and blameless before Him" (Ephesians 1:4).

If you find yourself trying to compare your holiness to that of others, or trying to prove to God that you're worthy, remember what Paul wrote to the Romans: "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). That's how you know salvation can only be received.


