




20 young adults pass Arizona Game and Fish Hunter Safety class



Tonto National Monument presents Heritage Days

Roosevelt, AZ - Celebrate Heritage Days with Tonto National Monument in recognition of Arizona Archaeology and Heritage Awareness Month on March 4 and 5 from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. This event is free and open to the public. The Lower Cliff Dwelling will be open for self-guided hikes from 8 a.m. - 4 p.m., with rangers available to answer questions. Visitors will also have the opportunity to hike to the entrance of the Upper Cliff Dwelling from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. Please note

that no entrance will be allowed into the Upper Cliff Dwelling but rangers will be available to give programs about the site. Please plan to bring sturdy shoes, sunscreen, water and snacks. Parking will be extremely limited, especially for RVs and over-sized vehicles, so we encourage carpooling. An additional walk may be required to reach the visitor center when the main parking lot is full. Tonto National Monument protects two cliff dwellings built by the Salado people over

700 years ago. Established as a national monument in 1907 by President Teddy Roosevelt, the cliff dwellings were part of the early archaeological preservation movement in America. No camping is available at Tonto National Monument. The nearest available camping is at Windy Hill Campground in Tonto National Forest, For more information on camping visit http://www.fs.usda. gov/tonto/.

Stella Spaich Colbert

Stella Spaich Colbert, age 94, Miami, Az.-born and a graduate of the Miami High School class of 1946, passed away peacefully Jan. 13, 2023 surrounded by her family and friends.

Stella was born Feb. 17. 1928 at the home of her parents, Mike and Bessie Spaich, in Davis Canyon, Miami, Arizona; a home built by her Serbian immigrant father and Polish immigrant mother. She was the youngest of six children, and was preceded in death by her parents and siblings Angie, Kate, Sam, Roscoe and Bessie Spaich. It was her parents, siblings and two children that Stella lovingly and unselfishly made her top priority her entire life, always placing herself after those she loved. Her 'gift' to her entire family was being 'a woman born ahead of her time' in so many ways.

As a proud first-generation American, Stella cherished and respected her European roots, always crediting her parents' Slavic heritage for her integrity, strong work ethic and personal fortitude; virtues she exemplified with everyone she ever knew or loved. As a young girl, Stella regu-



larly attended Divine Grace Presbyterian Church, winning a number of Perfect Attendance Awards, and was a member of the Girl Scouts. The Miles family of Miles Mortuary-Miami were dear friends, and it was Mrs. Miles who offered to instruct young Stella in piano. However, it soon became evident that Stella's talent for music came naturally. She never learned to read music, but could play any song perfectly by ear on the piano and served as a drum major for her grade school, "never missing a beat," which her band instructor often said was amazing, given she could not read music.

Stella's natural talents soon developed further as an athlete when she entered Miami High School. She lettered all four years in badminton, played tennis all four years (with Helen Saban and Bill McDermott, two of her best buddies since grade school), was a lifelong swimmer, having worked as a lifeguard at Hostetler Pool, and eventually won the Arizona State 1946 Women's Singles Badminton Championship. She was honored to be included in the Miami Arizona Memorial Library Sports Hall of Fame, which remains a point of pride for her family today. Her Miami High School coach endorsed and recognized Stella's innate athleticism and secured a full-ride tennis scholarship for her to Arizona State University.

Services for our beloved mother were held privately and conducted precisely as she requested. To honor her, her parents and all immigrant families of the Miami/Globe area who stood by the Spaich family and our community (making life here - and in America - such a phenomenal place to live), her children Lynae Cole and Roger Dean Moses, request memorial remembrances be made to either the Statue of Liberty-Ellis Island Foundation or The Serbian Cemetery, Central Heights, Gila County, Az.



Webster defines revival as: 1. Six months later we had completed our move from the small town of San Diego, California to the metropolis of Morenci, Arizona. All of the

secular world in Morenci certainly was still basking in the man landing on the moon achievement and missed another earthshaking event that broke out on a beach in California and a college located in the small town of Wilmore, Kentucky.

The landing on the moon got its start with President John F. Kennedy. The year was 1963. Six years and millions of dollars were spent on the planning, execution and success of the project. The two spiritual events, which I missed, were spontaneous, with no church deacons and leadership meetings, no announcement from the pulpits, just the Holy Spirit showing up and filling thousands of young hearts with His Spirit.

Fast forward to Feb. 24, 2023, the release of the movie "The Jesus Revolution" featuring the life of Greg and Catherine Laurie. Their spiritual journey started out on a California beach in 1970. You don't want to miss this great movie, which has the potential of emulating the event of February 8.

I won't miss this one.
