## Globe Rotary welcomes new members | Gila County tax lien auction Feb. 22

Gila County will hold its 2023 tax lien sale on Wednesday, Feb. 22 at the Gila County Courthouse, 1400 E. Ash St., Globe. Doors open at 8 a.m. and bidders may register in person until 8:45 a.m. The auction will begin promptly at 9 a.m.

The sale takes about three hours, which includes time to answer questions as well as for bidders to complete various forms. Each bidder is required to complete and sign a 2023 W-9 form prior to the sale and a bidder form, which can be found on the Treasurer's Office

page of the county website, gilacountyaz.gov/government/treasurer. Click on "Tax Lien Information/ FAO" on the lefthand side of the page. Bidders may also pre-register by returning the completed forms to Vise Palmer at vpalmer@ gilacountyaz.gov.



ews.com. With about 800 parcels, a higher number is listed this year as, normally, by the auction date there are about 500 to offer. Parcels on the block can be found across the county and run the gamut from \$15.14 to \$12,320, which is the highest tax lien on the list. Please keep in mind that bidders bid on an interest rate—not on the amount of taxes on the property. The successful bid-



der becomes a silent lien holder, not the owner of the parcel and may not contact the owners or go onto the property. Successful bidders for a tax lien will need to pay cash or a cashier's check at the time of the sale. Transactions are handled by the county Treasurer's Office. Successful bidders will need to pay a nonrefundable \$10 fee for each tax lien, as well as a \$10 nonrefundable taxpaver information fee and a nonrefundable \$30 recording fee on each certificate purchased. During this annual tax lien sale. Treasurer's Office staff will adhere to social distancing and health guidelines. Due to limited seating, serious bidders only please.

## **Biochar kiln demonstration at Young Public Library**

A biochar kiln demonstration to raise awareness about making and using biochar is scheduled for Tuesday, Feb. 21, 2023 from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. at the Young Public Library, weather and fire restrictions permitting. This inperson demonstration. which will also demonstrate biochar production using a flame-cap kiln, is free and open to the public.

Biochar are charcoal particles mixed with soil. Participants will learn about building and using a portable flame-cap kiln for making biochar. Uses for biochar include: Hazardous fuels reduction in forests and wildland urban interface communities, and yard waste; a soil amendment for improving water retention and nutrient availability: contaminant adsorption for dairies. landfills or mining: production of bio-energy fuels including syngas and bio-oil; and direct carbon sequestration (the halflife of a biochar molecule is 1,000 years). Benefits and challenges of using biochar include: Raising awareness about biochar: creating markets: feedstock properties and vari-

ability; and matching biochar qualities to specific applications.

Details such as burn permits, fire safety, water source, and lighting and quenching the fire will be discussed.

The demonstration will be led by University of Arizona Gila County Cooperative Extension Agent Chris Jones, and is presented by the Extension in partnership with the Young Public Library and Pleasant Valley Fire Department, For more information, contact Jones at (928) 402-8586 or ckiones@email.arizona.edu.

## Apache Leap Mining Festival celebrates a slice of Superior's history

The 34th Annual Apache Leap Mining Festival takes place March 10-12, 2023 in the historic mining town of Superior, Arizona. This event is a chance to celebrate the town's rich mining history, with a focus on the past, present and future of mining in the area. Named after the red escarpment on the east side of town, this event is a favorite among locals and visitors from across the state.

One of the most popular events at the festival is the mining competition. The mining competition includes jack leg drilling, mucking, sawing and spiking. It is a competition of

brawn, skill and strategy. While the spiking, sawing and jack leg drilling are individual competitions, mucking is a team sport. Participants are timed to see how quickly they can fill an ore cart. move to one end of the course and back, and dump it. Spectators will get a glimpse of the work by miners past and present that is often unseen, and will gain a new appreciation for the miners who work to bring critical minerals to the surface. This year's competition will take place on Saturday, March 11, following the chihuahua races.


The Mining Festival includes historical presentations on the town's mining past, along with booths from local mines educating the public on their projects and the importance of mining and mineral extraction.

### Copper Country News COMMUNITY COMMUNITY Community Working Group meeting planned in Superior, February 21

The next Community Working Group (CWG) meeting for the Resolution Copper mining project. located near Superior. Arizona, will be Tuesday, Feb. 21, 2023 at 6 p.m. This is a change from the normal Wednesday meeting schedule. An update from BHP, which holds 45% ownership of the Resolution mine, will be the main focus of the meeting. Currently, BHP is working with the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) on the Superior Voluntary Remediation Program (VRP) to determine the level of soil remediation required for certain properties in the area. Also, ongoing discussions to reach accord on a Good Neighbor Agreement between the Community Working Group and Resolution Copper will continue. Monthly meetings of the group have been moved from the Superior Chamber of Commerce to Town of Superior Offices, Library Room at 199 N. Lobb Ave.

About the Community Working Group

The CWG focuses on

potential environmental impact issues, science and policy, economic development and growth, and the pros and cons of the proposed development of the Resolution Copper mine, which could become one of the world's largest copper mining ventures. Members include residents and stakeholders from the Town of Superior, Queen Valley and nearby communities. Monthly meetings of the group are now held in the Town of Superior office complex library at 199 N. Lobb Ave. Topics include environmental stewardship. transportation. education, health, safety, natural resource issues, air quality, community investments, recreational changes and other related subjects. 



## Today in History: Feb. 15, Jury finds Jeffrey Dahmer sane

Today is Wednesday, Feb. 15, the 46th day of 2023. There are 319 days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History:

On Feb. 15, 1879, President Rutherford B. Hayes signed a bill allowing female attorneys to argue cases before the Supreme Court.

On this date:

In 1764, the site of present-day St. Louis was established by Pierre Laclede and Auguste Chouteau.

In 1898, the U.S. battleship Maine mysteriously blew up in Havana Harbor, killing more than 260 crew members and bringing the United States closer to war with Spain.

In 1933, President-elect Franklin D. Roosevelt escaped an assassination attempt in Miami that mortally wounded Chicago Mayor Anton J. Cermak; gunman Giuseppe Zangara was executed more than four weeks later.

In 1944, Allied bombers destroyed the monastery atop Monte Cassino in Italy.

In 1950, Walt Disney's animated film "Cinderella" premiered in Boston.

In 1961, 73 people, including an 18-member U.S. figure skating team en route to the World Championships in Czechoslovakia, were killed in the crash of a Sabena Airlines Boeing 707 in Belgium.

In 1965, singer Nat King

Cole, 45, died in Santa Monica, California.

In 1967, the rock band Chicago was founded by Walter Parazaider, Terry Kath, Danny Seraphine, Lee Loughnane, James Pankow and Robert Lamm; the group originally called itself The Big Thing, then Chicago Transit Authority.

In 1989, the Soviet Union announced that the last of its troops had left Afghanistan, after more than nine years of military intervention.

In 1992, a Milwaukee jury found that Jeffrey Dahmer was sane when he killed and mutilated 15 men and boys. (The decision meant that Dahmer, who had already pleaded guilty to the murders, would receive a mandatory life sentence for each count; Dahmer was beaten to death in prison in 1994.)

In 2003, millions of protesters around the world demonstrated against the prospect of a U.S. attack on Iraq.

In 2005, defrocked priest Paul Shanley was sentenced in Boston to 12 to 15 years in prison on child rape charges.

In 2020, the U.S. government said Americans who were on board a cruise ship under quarantine in Japan because of the coronavirus would be flown back home on a chartered flight, but that they would face another two-week quarantine; about 380 Americans were aboard the Diamond Princess.

Ten years ago: With a

blinding flash and a booming shock wave, a meteor blazed across Russia's western Siberian sky and exploded, injuring more than 1.000 people as it blasted out windows. Pressing his case in Chicago, the town that launched his political career, President Barack Obama called for the government to take an active. wide-ranging role in ensuring every American had a "ladder of opportunity" into the middle class.


Five years ago: The last of the bodies of the 17 victims of a school shooting in Florida were removed from the building after authorities analyzed the crime scene; 13 wounded survivors were still hospitalized. In response to the shooting. President Donald Trump, in an address to the nation, promised to "tackle the difficult issue of mental health," but avoided any mention of guns. Nikolas Cruz, the suspect in the shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School, was ordered held without bond at a brief court hearing. American Mikaela Shiffrin used a hard-charging final run to win the women's giant slalom at the Winter Olympics in South Korea.

One year ago: Russian President Vladimir Putin said he welcomed a security dialogue with the West as his military reported pulling back some of its troops near Ukraine. U.S. President Joe Biden said the U.S. had "not yet verified" Russia's claim and that an invasion still remained a distinct possibility. (Russia would invade Ukraine five days later.) The families of nine victims of the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting agreed to a \$73 million settlement of a lawsuit against the maker of the rifle used to kill 20 first graders and six educators in 2012.



Does this month of valentines, hearts and the bold color red have you wishing for a chance to do something loving for people you'll never meet? Your donation of a pint of blood can save up to three lives. The need for donors is so great during winter months that Vitalant staff and volunteers will spend a rare day in Miami, where Freeport-McMoRan hosts a blood drive Thursday, Feb. 23. Donors with Type O blood are especially needed because that universal type of blood is used to treat emergencies and trauma.


