

Tonto National Monument presents Heritage Days

Roosevelt. AZ - Celebrate Heritage Davs with Tonto National Monument in recognition of Arizona Archaeology and Heritage Awareness Month on March 4 and 5 from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. This event is free and open to the public. The Lower Cliff Dwelling will be open for self-guided hikes from 8 a.m. - 4 p.m., with rangers available to answer questions. Visitors will also have the opportunity to hike to the entrance of the Upper Cliff Dwelling from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. Please note

that no entrance will be allowed into the Upper Cliff Dwelling but rangers will be available to give programs about the site. Please plan to bring sturdy shoes, sunscreen, water and snacks. Parking will be extremely limited, especially for RVs and over-sized vehicles, so we encourage carpooling. An additional walk may be required to reach the visitor center when the main parking lot is full. Tonto National Monument protects two cliff dwellings built by the Salado people over

700 years ago. Established as a national monument in 1907 by President Teddy Roosevelt, the cliff dwellings were part of the early archaeological preservation movement in America. No camping is available at Tonto National Monument. The nearest available camping is at Windy Hill Campground in Tonto National Forest. 

Does this month of valentines, hearts and the bold color red have you wishing for a chance to do something loving for people you'll never meet? Your donation of a pint of blood can save up to three lives. The need for donors is so great during winter months that Vitalant staff and volunteers will spend a rare day in Miami, where Freeport-McMoRan hosts a blood drive Thursday, Feb. 23. The drive will run from 8 a.m. to noon, in the Copper Room of the Miami Operations Center at 4877 Cypress Way. Schedule your appointment conveniently online at vitalant.org (search by zip code 85501) or call 877-258-4825.

Vitalant supplies and donates blood to 62 hospitals in Arizona, and urges Globe-Miami donors to help offset a statewide critical blood shortage. How often can you give blood? Wait at least eight weeks (56 days) between dona-

tions of whole blood, or 16 weeks (112 days) between Power Red donations. Whole blood donors can donate up to six times each year. Healthy donors are welcome, regardless of vaccinated or unvaccinated status. Donors with Type O blood are especially needed because that universal type of blood is used to treat emergencies and trauma.

Gila County tax lien auction scheduled for today




Gila County will hold its 2023 tax lien sale on Wednesday, Feb. 22 at the Gila County Courthouse, 1400 E. Ash St., Globe. Doors open at 8 a.m. and bidders may register in person until 8:45 a.m. The auction will begin promptly at 9 a.m.

The sale takes about

three hours, which includes time to answer questions as well as for bidders to complete various forms. Each bidder is required to complete and sign a 2023 W-9 form prior to the sale and a bidder form, which can be found on the Treasurer's Office page of the county website, gilacountyaz.gov/government/treasurer. Click on "Tax Lien Information/ FAQ" on the lefthand side of the page. Bidders may also pre-register by returning the completed forms to Vise Palmer at vpalmer@ gilacountyaz.gov.

The complete list of tax liens is published on the



Treasurer's page of the county website, gilacountyaz.gov/government/treasurer, in Gila County's authorized publication and in the classified ad section www.ananews.com. With about 800 parcels, a higher number is listed this year as, normally, by the auction date there are about 500 to offer. Parcels on the block can be found across the county and run the gamut from \$15.14 to \$12,320, which is the highest tax lien on the list.

Please in mind that bidders bid on an interest rate-not on the amount of taxes on the property. The successful bidder becomes a silent lien holder, not the owner of the parcel and may not contact the owners or


go onto the property. Successful bidders for a tax lien will need to pay cash or a cashier's check at the time of the sale. Transactions are handled by the county Treasurer's Office. Successful bidders will need to pay a nonrefundable \$10 fee for each tax lien, as well as a \$10 nonrefundable taxpayer information fee and a nonrefundable \$30 recording fee on each certificate purchased. During this annual tax lien sale, Treasurer's Office staff will adhere to social distancing and health guidelines. Due to limited seating, serious bidders only please.



Some people think of salvation as a single point in time. And it's true that the moment trust is placed in Jesus, a person permanently becomes a member of God's family. But limiting the definition to that single faith decision gives an incomplete picture.

Salvation includes three parts: 1) justification—the moment our sins are forgiven and Christ's perfect righteousness is imputed to us; 2) sanctification—the process of becoming increasingly righteous in this life; and 3) glorification—the completion of the process, when we're made perfectly sinless at the resurrection.

It's a package deal. Those who are justified are being sanctified

and will be glorified (Romans 8:29-30). We can't claim we're saved if sanctification isn't happening in our lives. The degree of godliness and fruitfulness varies with each individual, but God has promised to complete the good work He began in our life (Philippians 1:6).

Jesus is our Master because He purchased us from sin with His blood. And Romans 10:9 says we must confess Him as Lord in order to be saved. The question is whether you're submitting to His process of sanctification. Has your life changed since you first professed Christ? Are you diligently cooperating with the Holy Spirit so that your life reflects Jesus' image?


