Sometimes God chooses to intersect with our lives in unexpected ways.

I remember a time when I faced a difficult decision. The timing and circumstances all seemed wrong—choosing to pursue the opportunity made no sense at all. I simply wanted to turn it down but knew I needed to pray first. I spent time with the Lord, and He gave me a clear vision. I accepted that seemingly illogical, ill-timed offer, and God blessed my obedience.

As Christians, we expect the Holy Spirit to direct us through prayer and Scripture.

But at times He chooses to intervene more directly in our life, as He did with me that day. Since God first walked with Adam and Eve in the garden of Eden, He's been communicating with people in different ways. Moses saw a burning bush (Ex. 3:2), Samuel heard a voice at night (1 Samuel 3:1-14), and Joshua received specific—and unusual—instructions for defeating Jericho (Joshua 5:13-15; Joshua 6:5). Saul of Tarsus was called into ministry (Acts 9:1-31), whereas others

were warned of danger through dreams (Matthew 2:12-13). Each was clearly a divine encounter—and when the Lord visits someone, He comes for a purpose.

God's personal calls are rare and unexpected. We cannot get Him to come; He simply makes His presence known in a believer's life when He chooses. So whether He communicates with you through His Word or by a visit someday, maintain an open heart and willing spirit.

Bible clubs are back at Maranatha






Yolanda Jimenez and Teresa (Teddy) Lott.

CASA of Arizona Volunteer Academy coming to Payson

Now is the time to volunteer with our vouth living in foster care. The CASA of Gila County Program is excited to announce that the Court Appointed Special Advocate Program of Arizona is hosting the required CASA volunteer training academy in Payson August 25-27. For those interested in serving as a CASA volunteer for children from Gila County, we highly encourage you to apply before July 31, 2022 in order to attend this event. Lodging will be provided for those who do not live in the Payson area. If you cannot attend this

event, there are several alternative training dates and locations throughout the year.

"We are seeing an increase in the number of children who are being placed in out-of-home care settings," said Coordinator Emily Nader. "We anticipate that when children return to school, we will see an increase in the number of children coming into care and our need for additional volunteers will continue to grow."

CASA volunteers provide support and advocacy for children who are in licensed foster homes, group homes or the care of relatives. Volunteers receive in-depth training and ongoing support from their local program as well as from the National CASA/ GAL Association. Across the nation, CASA Pre-Service Volunteer Training serves as the foundation by which every volunteer learns the principles of best interest advocacy. The curriculum has just recently been revised to highlight the shared values and build the skills, selfawareness and points of view necessary for volunteers to be most effective.


No special background

or education is required to become a CASA volunteer, a caring and generous group that represents a wide range of cultures, professions, and educational and ethnic backgrounds. Once accepted into the program, volunteers receive all necessary training. CASA volunteers must be at least 21 years

old and willing to complete necessary background checks, provide references and participate in an interview. While serving as a child's CASA volunteer, you will receive ongoing support and assistance from a local CASA coordinator.

Rabies, bordatella, microchipping? Mobile pet clinic Sundays Aug. 7, 21

Gila County Animal Care & Control reminds dog owners that an up-to-date rabies vaccine is required for your dog to be licensed - and that annual license is required by law. A license is essential to prove ownership if your stray dog ends up at the shelter. Are your pets microchipped? If they aren't, be aware that only 22 percent of lost dogs without a microchip get

reunited with the anxious owners who love them, and that number drops to just two percent for stray cats. Low-cost vaccines, preventive care, microchipping as low as \$15 and even nail trimming are all available when the PetVet mobile clinic revisits the Tractor Supply store in Claypool two Sundays each month from 2:30-4 p.m. Upcoming dates are Aug. 7 and 21,

and Sept. 4 and 18. No appointments are needed. If you have questions about specific veterinary services or want to verify available services, call PetVet Mobile Clinic staff at 800-427-7973 or visit petvet. vippetcare.com/servicespricing. Check for \$15 vaccination discount coupons online, too. Keep your dogs and cats protected and up to date on vaccines essen-

tial to guard against rabies, feline leukemia, bordatella and distemper. Did you know there's even a snakebite vaccine that can help dogs survive being bitten by a rattler? Pre-treatment with the snakebite vaccine also reduces your pet's pain and suffering - and the overall cost of treatment if bitten.

EAC Gila Pueblo offers fall HVAC-R classes

GLOBE — For anyone seeking to find work in a trade, this fall the Gila Pueblo Campus of Eastern Arizona College offers a good option with its HVAC-R (Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning and Refrigeration) certificate program. In this course, students learn not only how to repair heaters and air conditioners, but also how to install them.

Students get to practice diagnosing problems on a simulator that reproduces residential HVAC-R units. Three classes, half of the six needed for a certificate, are being offered this fall —

Basic Refrigeration, Basic Electrical, and Motors and Controls. They will be held Monday and Tuesday evenings from 5 to 9 p.m. The remaining three classes will be held in the spring. In Basic Refrigeration, students learn how refrigerant gases work. Basic Electrical teaches the basics of wiring and electrical as it applies to air conditioning and refrigeration, as well as how to draw schematics. Finally, in Motors and Controls, students learn how

those devices function, how to repair them and what protects them from overheating. Not only can the course help students go on to careers in HVAC-R, it can also help anyone who just wants to learn how to repair their own air conditioners.

As well as hands-on work, the program offers printed study materials and instructional videos to help students learn the trade. Students who complete the program also earn an

Environmental Protection Agency certification, which is required in order to work in the industry. To further prepare students for a career, the program offers three other third-party certification exams. "Right now in Arizona there are over 3,470 job openings," said HVAC-R instructor George Rocha, an experienced general contractor who has been teaching at EAC for over 15 years. He said that, depending on location, starting pay ranged from \$16 to \$18 per hour. "Within your first year, you can get into the \$20-25 range.

'Critical Blood Shortage': Red Cross needs donors Aug. 12

Last week's blood drive was abruptly cancelled due to reasons beyond the Red Cross' control. If you were unable to donate, please sign up now for the next date, August 12. Healthy donors are urgently needed for our community's next blood drive at the Globe Elks Lodge on Maple Street near Denny's that Friday. Call 1-800-RED-CROSS to reserve one of the appointments,

or pick your choice of times and schedule yourself conveniently online at redcrossblood.org. All healthy donors are welcome. Giving blood is safe; facemasks are required, as well as pre-arranged appointments in order to help Red Cross staff and Elks Lodge volunteers schedule the most efficient drive day possible. A critical blood shortage continues; Arizona fell 4,000 donations short during the

winter months. Type-O blood is especially needed. Type-O is often used in trauma situations, especially Type-O negative, which can be transfused with any blood type.

Appointments are also available for 'Power Red' donations, which allow you to safely donate two units of red blood cells during one donation. Blood is drawn from one arm by a machine that separates and collects two units

of red cells, then safely returns the remaining blood components, along with some saline, back to you through the same arm - and just one needle jab is required. A Power Red donation takes approximately 30 minutes longer than a whole blood donation, so plan on about 35-45 minutes in the chair and you're limited to donating approximately once every four months. New donors are welcome, and urgently needed. How often can you give blood? According to the Red Cross, "Wait at least eight weeks (56 days) between donations of whole blood, or 16 weeks (112 days) between Power Red donations. 


