



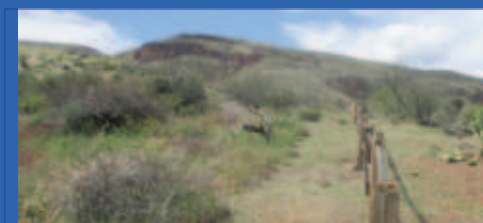

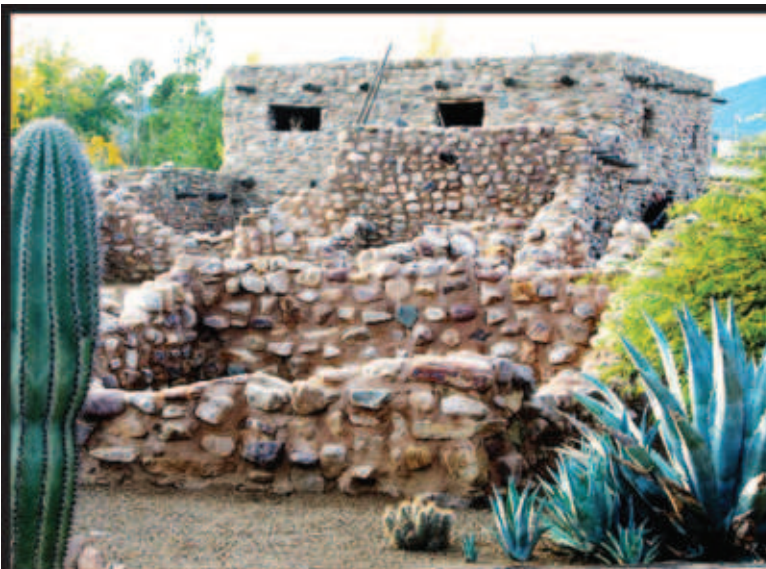

Indoor work? Outdoors? Ages 16 and up, apply for Gila County summer jobs

It's only a matter of weeks 'til school's out, so here's a question for high school and college students: Have you found a summer job? If not, would you like a chance to work with Gila County in the fields of IT, public health or community development, for one of our local libraries in Globe, Miami, Hayden or Tonto Basin, or for Public Works in one of these towns?

If you would, then apply by May 16 for temporary jobs over June-July, sponsored by the Gila County Board of Supervisors and local community partners. This innovative program matches local youth with

a range of jobs that pay \$12.80 per hour, working over the course of six weeks for Gila County Government, for the towns of Payson, Star Valley and Young, or for towns across southern Gila County.

Two years ago, Tyler scored a summer internship with Gila County's IT department - and created a two-minute video about the program. View it at youtu.be/XDd_D0FJOb, or just search YouTube for "Gila County Summer Youth Employment" to find the link. In previous years, other students have interned with the City of Globe's Economic Development Department,

the Town of Miami and other communities.

So if you're a student age 16 or older and need a summer job?

This is a great opportunity for high school juniors and seniors, those enrolled in the next college semester and young adults to explore local career avenues, acquire lifelong skills - and begin to build a network in their community. Lawrence Edward Engel Jr.

Sept 7, 1936 - April 22, 2022

Ed was born in Baltimore, Md., loved sports and was very proud when, at 16, he was given a school letter from Forest Park for his time as statistician. He kept a book from 1952, when he carefully recorded the baseball plays. He was an avid Baltimore Orioles fan and one of his life heroes was Jackie Robinson. Ed will be remembered for his sports stories.

He had a proficiency with numbers and was hired for a survey crew after high school, a job he enjoyed because it was outdoors, and he loved the math. He saved a book of records he recorded with details.

He joined the Army Reserves at Fort Bliss, where he was selected as a Distinguished Graduate of the U.S. National Guard. He told humorous tales of antics at what he called his "summer camp."

He married Lucy and they had children: David, Heather and, after they moved to Prescott, Az. in 1971, their son Michael.



Ed is survived by his three children, a niece in Ohio and his companion Lois Monarrez.

He held a variety of jobs but the occupation that gave him the greatest pleasure was being a CNA for hospice in Arizona. He worked for Heritage Health when he moved to Globe in the 1990s. Ed cared for people, and was gentle and kind.

Ed was conscientious about his health; he preferred organic foods, exercised, and loved to walk and to read. One of Ed's joys was square dancing, and he received several diplomas from classes he took. In 2004 he was visiting with Lee Ann Powers at the Better Life Center;

she introduced him to Lois. He loved to tell they met in the honey aisle, and after visiting for an hour or so ended up in circle prayer with other customers. The next day Ed asked Lois if she liked to square dance and they became partners in the Bustle and Boots Square Dance Club. They also learned a card game, "Five Crowns," and spent much of the following 18 years of their friendship playing hundreds of games and teaching others.

Ed, a spiritually oriented man, loved the Lord, studied the Bible, memorized scripture and prayed faithfully before meals. One of his most precious Christian attributes was his ability to forgive.

He was truly a good man and will be missed.

Funeral Services were held on April 30, 2022, at St. Paul's Methodist United Church in Globe, Az.

TRSD Residential Sewer Connection Update

Here is important news for home owners in Phase I of the Tri-City Regional Sanitary District (TRSD). The design of Phase I of the wastewater collection and treatment system is underway. The project engineer has developed the preliminary sewer-main alignment and has begun gathering data necessary to design the connection of existing residences to the sewer mains. The engineer now needs to (1) document the location of existing sewer connection at each residence, (2) locate the on-site cesspools or septic tanks at each residence, and (3) establish jointly with each home owner the best route of the lateral sewer line from the residence to the connection point (located on the boundary of the property) to the sewer main.

Now for the **BEST** news. The connections of existing residences to the sewer mains will not cost you, the property owners, anything. The connection service includes (1) connecting your house to the sewer main, (2) abandoning-in-place the existing on-site cesspools, septic tanks and associated piping, and (3) restoring the property affected by construction activities. The connection service will be provided **AT NO COST** to you, the home owner. Residential connection costs are part of the overall project cost and are paid through United States Department of Agriculture - Rural Development (USDA-RD) Colonia Grant Funding.

Phase I home owners will soon receive a letter package from TRSD seeking information for each residential parcel to aid in the design of the connection of existing homes to the sewer mains. TRSD is prepared to help the home owner gather this design information as needed. We look forward to your participation in this very necessary effort.

Historic Roosevelt Lake Cemetery gets a facelift

A much-needed facelift to the historic Roosevelt Cemetery is complete thanks in large part to two local volunteers who routinely support the Tonto Basin Ranger District.

The project originated in the spring when Debra Dettore began taking walks along Cemetery Trail, which leads to the cemetery.

Dettore noticed the poor conditions of cemetery grounds and grave sites covered in weeds and brush along with deteriorating crosses. She offered to donate materials, paint and labor to spruce up the cemetery grounds.

Fellow volunteer Dave Wilson joined the effort, priming and painting crosses and removing weeds and brush. They redefined the walkway by putting down new rocks.

Rocks scattered around graves were placed on top to signify the grave mound and new crosses were installed on all graves.

The Forestry Crew from the local Globe prison pitched in by digging and creating a much needed preventative fuels break around the perimeter of the cemetery.

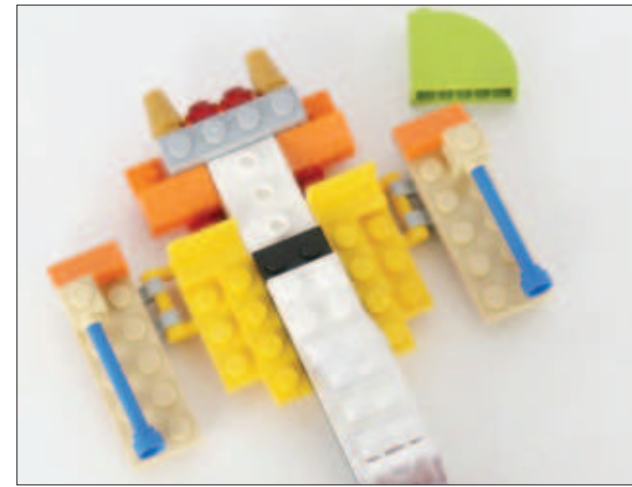

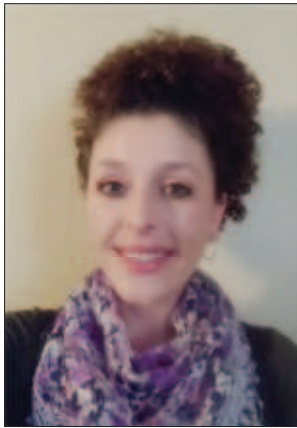
