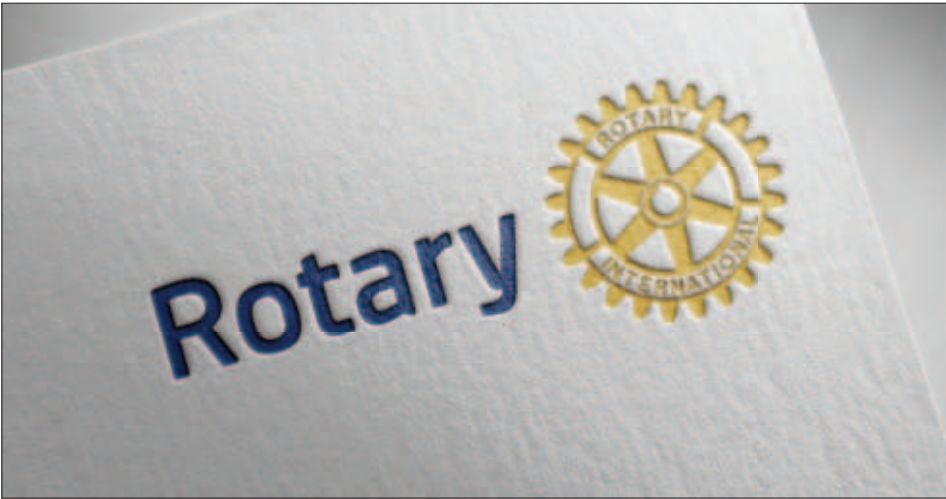

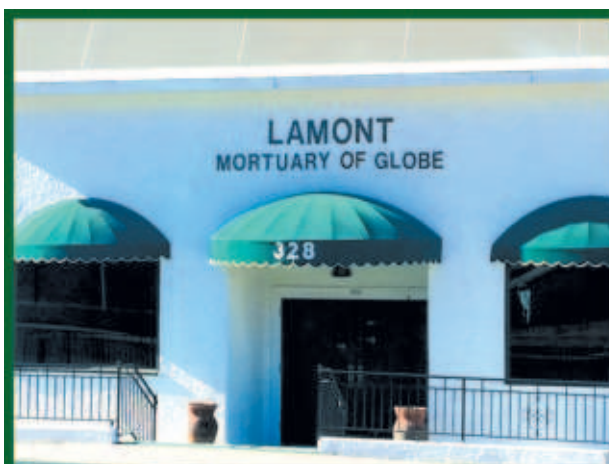

GLOBE ROTARY CELEBRATES 100 YEARS!

Early in 1922 word was received from Rotary International Headquarters in Evanston, Illinois that the Charter for a new Rotary Club had been approved. A group of businessmen and mining company executives had petitioned the Miami Rotary Club, asking them to sponsor a sister club in Globe. There were 21 individuals in the petitioning group who became the original Members of Globe Rotary which was chartered in April 1922.

Since that time membership has fluctuated from a low of 20 to as high as 55 when the economy was booming. Absorbing the motto of Rotary International, "Service Above Self," Globe Rotary has been very involved in the philanthropic activities of Globe. Utilizing numerous fundraising efforts, the Club has supported the Food Bank, the United Fund, Gila House, the Cobre Valley Youth Club and many projects in the Globe School District. It has also provided thousands of dollars of scholarship awards to Globe High graduates.

The City of Globe had longed to create

a community center on property they had been given near the local Indian ruins. A small tennis court had been constructed but the City had ambitious plans for ball fields, a community park and swimming pool. They asked the Globe Rotary to spearhead a community-wide fundraising effort to construct the picnic area and pool.

Stanley Gibson, with over 55 years in Globe Rotary and a member of the City Council at the time, led the effort. His wife, Janet, admits to "hating that pool – if Stanley wasn't working, doing something involving the City Council, he was doing something with that pool!" But the effort led to baseball, softball and soccer fields, a huge picnic area and, yes, a pool!

As a direct result the Besh-Ba-Gowah Archaeological Park and Museum also came to be – a terrific attraction that the City can offer out of town visitors.

Shortly after the Community Center became a reality, Stan again involved Globe Rotary in working with the City to acquire and develop Round Mountain Hiking Park.

Negotiations with the various landowners took years but Globe Rotary persisted with Stan's active involvement and the Round Mountain Park is a reality. The Club constructed the ramada at the summit and installed the flagpole, and helps the City by purchasing replacement flags annually. It has become the site, for the past 22 years, of the annual Sunrise Challenge, first as a 5K run, lately a 7K, sponsored by the City, assisted by the County, Pinal Mountain Elks and other business sponsors.

The Club has contributed extensively to Old Dominion Mine Park and its handicap-accessible playground, built a playground at Copper Rim Elementary School, provided and installed shelving at the Globe Community Food Bank, provides sponsorships to the G-M Community Concert Association, Old Dominion Days at the Gila County Historical Museum, has funded the GHS Robotics team and assisted Globe HS with their Christmas basketball tournament.

District 5500, of which Globe Rotary is

a part, sponsors a Rotary Youth Leadership Academy every January for the past 25+ years. Globe Rotary has been able to sponsor at least two high school students each year to this 3-day leadership training event. No one has returned to say they wished they hadn't gone. Everyone has returned enthused by all they have learned and the friends they have made.

Six years ago Globe Rotary Club decided to try a new fundraising event, and conceived 'Dominion Royale,' a casino-type event with play money, donated prizes, catered appetizers, a cash bar and a theme which always involves costumes - and dealers who are more than happy to share information on how to play their table. The event this year will take place at the Cobre Valley Center for the Arts on February 26 at 6 p.m. You can be assured of fun, a chance for great prizes and delicious treats!

WHAT'S IN A DICTIONARY?

Each year Cobre Valley third graders receive a brand-new dictionary from a partnership between Miami Copper Cities, Globe Rotary Clubs and Globe-Miami Elks Lodge. In 2022, the Clubs will partner with Freeport McMoRan to order the dictionaries and get them to the students. A building block to functional literacy and lifelong learning, the tradition of receiving a dictionary in third grade represents a student's progress as an independent reader. Collaboration across Rotary Clubs shows the unity in our community. During the school year Charles A. Bejarano, Copper Rim, School House Cooperative, St. Charles, Hayden, Tonto Basin, Young and Destiny Schools

enjoy visits from Rotary representatives. Prior to classroom deliveries, the Clubs place book-plate stickers, book marks, and ribbons in each dictionary destined for a third grader. We have spell check, isn't a dictionary obsolete? According to Oxford Dictionaries: "A spell-checker is fine if you want to check a word like 'Tyrannosaurus' or 'archaeologist,' but English has many confusable words and homonyms that a spell-checker cannot identify e.g. 'there', they're and 'their.' Only a dictionary can help with common grammar and punctuation problems too, for example, the correct use of 'it's' and 'its'." learning, fostering curiosity, and offering support in independent reading, a dictionary helps students understand new words and practice organization skills.

WHY ROTARY?
Children of all ages benefit from positive role models. This is especially true in language and literacy development. While

students are accustomed to their teachers mirroring classroom skills, their expectations are positively reinforced by Rotary members exhibiting the

same skills. According to scholars at the University of Nevada, Cooperative Extension: "Some children have many opportunities to develop oral language skills, gain knowledge of the forms and functions of written language, and practice their emerging literacy skills, while others lack these experiences." Community members supporting children's literacy and language development adds to students' positive experiences. **HOW CAN I HELP STRENGTHEN CHILDREN'S LITERACY?** Community members can contribute to strengthening children's literacy in our community in several

AT HOME

In addition to reading to children, literacy and its fundamental building blocks are strengthened at home in day-to-day activities.

From preparing meals together to doing puzzles and playing board games, families strengthen children's long-term capacity to read and use language well. According to AZ Reads even displaying your student's art or doing a craft project together strengthens family literacy.

IN THE CAR

Playing games in the car provides opportunities to strengthen visual motor skills and attention to detail. From I Spy to seeking license plates from out of state to reading street signs and billboards, adults and children alike become more aware of their surroundings. There have even been studies showing that teaching children to look for motorcycles and bicycles while riding in the car ensures they'll know to be mindful when they're old enough to drive!

AT THE STORE

Whether your child is learning colors and numbers in preschool or fractions and division in elementary school or nutri-

tion and personal finance in high school, the grocery store is abundant with fun learning opportunities. By engaging with their environment and being a part of the meal planning and preparation process, children gain a sense of satisfaction.

AROUND TOWN

Opportunities abound for learning around town. SUNRISE CHALLENGE 2022

The Sunrise Challenge began 22 years ago as a project of the Gila County Health Department, which asked Globe Rotary to co-sponsor, as Globe Rotary was instrumental in the development of the Round Mountain Hiking Park. In 2005, Gila County Health Department asked the Globe Rotary Club to be the primary sponsor of the event.

The 2022 Sunrise Challenge takes place on Saturday, June 4, 2022 as an element of National Trails’ Day and includes a 3.1-mile (5K) challenging cross-country run as well as a 2-mile (less strenuous) walk/hike.

Funds raised each year

support many of the charitable projects the Globe Rotary Club funds, such as :

- Cobre Valley Youth Club
- Gila House
- GHS Wrestling Team
- GHS Spiritline/Cheer
- Dictionaries for third graders
- Downtown beautification – new trash receptacles
- Leadership Camps for Teens – RYLA

Competitors in the 5K receive a commemorative T-shirt and the top three finishers in each age category receive medals.
