## Broad Street entrance reopens Saturday

The North Broad Street/US 60 entrance will reopen by 7 a.m., Saturday, Sept. 25.

Arizona Eastern Railroad will have a Bridge Crew working on the trestle at the North Broad Street/US 60 intersection to remove old hand rails, remove defective ties, and replace with new ties.

Traffic will be prohibited to enter/exit at the intersection during this time. To access Downtown Globe please use the following alternative entries/exits from US 60: Hackney Avenue, Mesquite Street, Cedar Street, Oak Street, Hill Street.

Please note, there will be no closure of the US 60 (Ash Street) during this time.

During this same period, the City of Globe will be completing the long awaited "Historic Downtown Globe" entrance project. Thank you to our dedicated partners: Arizona Eastern Railroad; Lois Monarrez (designer of original rendering from 1999!); Globe Downtown Association.

ty. We have had long walks, stubborn moments, lots of popsicles and memories. I will be sad to see him go to another family's table and close this chapter of my life but I am grateful I had this opportunity and hope to go out with a bang.

We have all had a wrench thrown in our path this year but that didn't stop us from showing and selling our livestock. The 2020 Gila County fair will be a virtual auction. I still would like to invite all supporters, buyers, families and the livestock community to join Maverick and I this year.

Our Gila County Fair could not be possible without our buyers. I would like to thank my family, Community, buyers and all other supporters for supporting me throughout my years of raising livestock. I hope that everyone will participate in the 2020 Gila County Virtual Livestock Auction.



## Voting Early, In-Person or Postal?

### Sign-Up by Oct. 5 Deadline

Want to avoid a visit to the polls and vote early, during October, before the Nov. 3 Presidential Election?

Yes, early voting is safe - whether you trust your ballot to the postal service, or drop it off in person at one of the secure election boxes in Globe, Payson and other locations throughout Gila County.

As of today, you have less than two weeks left to enroll as a Gila County voter in time to request an early (also known as 'absentee') ballot, if you're not already signed up -- that deadline is Oct. 5, before the election four weeks later. The good news? Registering to vote is easy and online here in Arizona, signup now at [www.servicearizona.com](http://www.servicearizona.com). If you want to verify for sure whether you're still registered, records are also online at [www.my.arizona.vote](http://www.my.arizona.vote).

On weekdays during business hours you can register in person at the Gila County Recorder's Offices in Globe or Payson. Questions about the process, or any confusion about your registration? Call Gila County Recorder Sadie Bingham and her helpful staff 928-402-8740. And in addition to various ways they engage voters and go the extra mile to answer questions and be available to assist, social media followers are invited to 'Like & Follow' for updates over the next eight weeks face-

book.com/gilacountyrecorder

Ballots are closely scrutinized by Gila County Election Director Eric Mariscal and his team; provisional ballots get an especially close look. Here again, voter errors caused just a few dozen to be rejected: 18 would-be voters proved ineligible, another 11 showed up at the wrong precinct; two voted for the wrong party. One scrawled an unreadable signature, another failed to sign the ballot.

Arizona: Key State in Nov. 3 Election

Repeated Grand Canyon State visits over the past few months by the President and Vice President affirm what political analysts say: Arizona is a key state in the 2020 election. Gila County Recorder Sadie Jo Bingham's courteous staff go the extra mile to make early voting convenient for rural voters - watch for their list of early voting sites throughout Gila County, and on the San Carlos and also White Mountain Apache lands.

The overwhelming majority of Gila County voters (69 percent, in fact) agree that its safe and secure to vote early, whether via US Postal Service or in person at the Gila County Recorder's Office, either in person during office hours, or dropped-off in secure election mailboxes stationed outside during October. If you aren't on the Perma-



nent Early Voter List, enroll today - signup conveniently and easily online at [arizona.vote](http://arizona.vote), a convenient and secure website administered by the Arizona Secretary of State's Office. Or request a signup form with a call to Gila County Recorder Sadie Jo Bingham and her staff in Globe 928-402-8740.

Top Five Reasons For Early Voting

#1. You'll receive reminders, and you're more likely to vote. Signing up

for the Permanent Early Voter list really helps those people who have the best intentions and mean to vote, but don't actually get to the polls -- whether that's due to illness or car trouble, a long day at work, unexpected travel because of a death in the family -- or so many other reasons that we just don't anticipate.

#2. Who wants to stand in line? Especially this year, with the precautions we're all taking to avoid coronavirus? Even our busiest Gila County polling places don't have delays or

waiting lines like what you've seen in news reports from densely populated places such as Maricopa County - but if you vote early or vote by mail, you avoid the polls on election day.

#3. Vote at your leisure. Ballots can be long, with complicated propositions, and many candidates to consider -- issues you may not have considered until you actually are looking at your ballot. Education funding initiatives, ballot amendments -- wouldn't you rather take time to read and consider these at your own home?

#4. You can still visit the polls in person if you suspect you might have a change of heart or mind -- even as abruptly as election

day. Signing up to receive your early ballot does not mean that you can't wait until election day to vote. You may still bring your vote-by-mail ballot to the precinct where they will officially accept it.

#5. You still have the option to drop-off your early ballot at the Recorder's Office (Globe or Payson) or on election day at a polling location.

## Gila County Sheriff's found property items

Owners of "Found", "Lost", or "Safekeeping" property should, if relevant, call the Gila County Sheriff's Office Property and Evidence Department at 928-402-8579 to schedule an appointment to pick up their property.

Proof of Ownership Required. For found property, bicycles, and stolen recovered property, there are five ways proof of ownership can be established. Claimant can verify serial number of the item, have a dated receipt of purchase of the item, have submitted a prior stolen/lost property report with a police agency for the item, have a prior

photograph with themselves and the item in it, or be able to articulate specific characteristics of the item. You must present a valid driver's license or state issued ID card when picking up the property.

## Supporting Gila County’s Veterans through services to promote health and prevent suicide

September is National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month – a time to share resources and stories that shed light on a stigmatized topic. Suicidal thoughts, much like mental health conditions, can affect anyone regardless of age, gender or background, but disproportionately impact the veteran community. In fact, 41 percent of Arizona veterans report thoughts of suicide, and one in three report a mental health condition related to depression, anxiety, or Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

In Gila County alone, veterans are nearly twice as likely than the general population to die by suicide. In an effort to prevent suicide and support veterans, their families and the community at large, the University of Arizona’s Center for Rural Health (AzCRH) partnered with the Arizona Coalition for Military Families (ACMF) to expand the Be Connected veteran support program in rural southern Arizona counties, including Gila.

Be Connected is a statewide initiative designed to reduce deaths by suicide in Arizona’s military and veteran population by strengthening access to support and resources for the more than 500,000 service members, veterans

and their families who call Arizona home. Both the Arizona Department of Veterans’ Services and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs are key partners and supporters of this program.

Partnering with healthcare facilities in the region, Be Connected provides resources and community training to help facilities better serve the veteran community. Additionally, the program includes a support line available to everyone seeking support and information.

Focused on suicide prevention using an upstream approach, Be Connected works with more than 400 partner organizations statewide to arm veterans and their families with tools and information to support their physical and mental health, as well as connect them to crisis intervention. This critical program is continuing to expand in Cochise, La Paz, Pinal, Gila, and Santa Cruz counties thanks to a grant from Blue Cross® Blue Shield® of Arizona’s (BCBSAZ) Mobilize AZ public health Initiative. Through Mobilize AZ, BCBSAZ is tackling the health conditions hitting Arizonans the hardest, including mental health, providing grants to organizations doing life-changing

work in their communities.

Protecting the health and well-being of Arizona families is especially important during the COVID-19 pandemic. The work of Be Connected must continue to support veterans in addressing mental health and thoughts of suicide. The program has adapted, providing online trainings to partners, and providing program materials to COVID-19 testing sites and other locations. These efforts provide the opportunity to bring new veterans into the ecosystem and allow for better care coordination crucial to suicide prevention. By embedding support deep in the community, the program can intervene earlier and more effectively to save lives.

# Az Game and Fish hosts free Educator Virtual Event

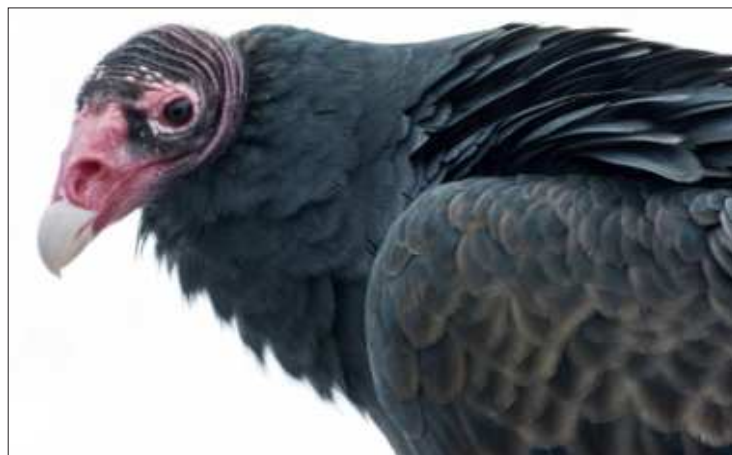
On Saturday, Sept. 26, the Arizona Game and Fish Department is hosting a unique, free event designed just for educators. "Bats, Buzzards and Biologists: A Virtual Event for Educators" consists of three distinct learning and networking sessions...all centered around two of our most misunderstood animals.

You can participate in one, two or all three sessions. All will be streamed online so you can participate from the comfort of your own home. Participants can earn professional development credits upon completion.

It all gets started at 9 a.m. with vultures, or buzzards as some people call them. In this session, titled Vulture Biologists

and Education, participants will have the opportunity to hear directly from 1-2 people who have worked with vultures. You will hear their stories and can ask them questions. We will end this session with a brief discussion of vulture-themed education resources that can be incorporated into your instruction.

This will be immediately followed by a virtual watch party of a live California condor release at approximately 11 a.m. The release itself is NOT exclusive to this workshop. It is available to the general public and will be



streamed on YouTube.

However, the virtual watch party is specific to educators, an opportunity to watch this first-of-its-kind event in the company of like-minded individuals.

It will be a relaxed environment to chat with fellow educators, perhaps bounce ideas off of each

other, to network, to extend our learning.

After a short break, we will switch our focus and look at bats. The 2 p.m. session, titled Bat Biologists and Education will be similar to our first session.

Participants will hear from 1-2 people who have worked with these flying

mammals. Get the inside scoop on what it is like and why they do it. As with the earlier session, we will wrap up with a look at bat related education resources.

The bat and vulture education sessions should each last approximately 1.5 hours. The watch party will run for about 2 hours. As mentioned, you can do as many of as few of the sessions as you wish. You will earn credit for the sessions you do attend. Participation is free. However, registration is required. To register, visit <https://bit.ly/BatsAnd-Buzzards>.

With economically efficient transportation options and strong stable partners, Arizona could supply wood fiber to Asian markets in an economically efficient and sustainable manner.

## How NOT to discover God's will for your life

"God, what is Your will for my life?" This is a question many people have asked in one way or another. If God would just give us a clear sign on how we are to move forward, then things would just be so much easier. So what should we do? Seek after a sign from God, right?

Perhaps you've heard the phrase "to lay out a fleece" when someone is trying to discern God's will. This idea comes from the historical narrative of Gideon's life during the time of the Judges. This era in Israel's history was very dark and from time to time God would raise up a judge (a political or military leader) to help the people through hardship. Gideon was one of these early leaders God called upon to aid His people.

However, Gideon was very uncertain of himself and unsure about God's will for his life. So before he took the call from God seriously, Gideon asked for physical signs from God in order to discover if this was truly God's will for him. Because of this story, many people today make it a practice to seek signs from God in order to discover His will. However, is this something we should do? Is this even the point of the passage?

Gideon's act of requesting a sign from God is actually a demonstration of his lack of faith in the power of God. It also points to his own personal insecurities. The text gives us clues to show both Gideon's insecurities and his unwarranted lack of faith in God's power to fulfill His promises.

Gideon recognized that he was not qualified to lead an army. "Please, Lord, how can I save Israel? Behold, my clan is the weakest in Manasseh, and I am the least in my father's house" (Judges 6:15). Even after being told that God would help him bring about victory, Gideon continued to show his pervasive fears. For instance, when God called Gideon to cut down his father's idols and make a sacrifice,



Gideon chose to do it at night because "he was too afraid of his family and the men of the town" (Judges 6:27). Gideon's insecurities clearly clouded much of his judgment and trust in God.

Secondly, Gideon's request for the signs of the fleece do indeed show his uncertainty of God's power. He grew up in a family, community, and time where worship of the one true God was confused and mingled with the false gods of the surrounding nations. The fact that his own family had an altar of Baal and an Asherah pole demonstrates the theological misconceptions that Gideon likely had in his mind. Old Testament scholar John Walton explains that at times in Israel's history, people held to "only a very tentative monotheism." Meaning, it is possible Gideon was afraid Yahweh was not strong enough to battle against the gods of the Midianites. How could Gideon be sure if Yahweh had this kind of power? Gideon decided to test God in order to see if He truly had the power to follow through with His promises.

An overview of this event shows that Gideon himself recognized that what he was doing was contrary to trusting in God. Gideon said to God before his second test, "Let not your anger burn against me" (6:39). Why? Because Gideon was doing something that must not be done, namely, not taking God at His word. He began these tests by saying, "If you will save Israel by my hand, as you have said..." (6:36). If God has told Gideon what He was going to do, then Gideon should have simply believed Him and not tried to test His veracity (cf. Deuteronomy 6:16).

The message we should learn from the events of Gideon's fleece are twofold: 1) We need to trust God's word, and 2) Our faith is not contingent on signs but on God's promises. As Gideon pleaded for a sign, the phrase that sticks out to me is, "as you have said" (Judges 6:36). God had already told Gideon he would triumph! Yet he questions the truthfulness of God's word! Did Gideon think God was simply not strong enough? Or perhaps, he thought God was lying. Whatever the reason, Gideon did not trust in the very words of God. Rather, Gideon should have recognized that when God

speaks, we must listen, believe, and obey. "Every word of God proves true; he is a shield to those who take refuge in him" (Proverbs 30:5).

We must remember that our faith is not about what we can see, but what God has done and how he has revealed Himself to us in His word. "For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified" (1 Corinthians 1:22). Our hope is in the promises of God, not in what we think we can do to get God to prove Himself to us. "Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience" (Romans 8:24-25, cf. 2 Corinthians 5:7).

With all of this in mind, I do not believe that it is proper for Christians to "lay out fleeces." Rather, we must believe that God is trustworthy, that His word is sufficient, and that His Spirit will guide us. Walton points out that the book of Judges, like other Biblical narratives, is not intended to give us a guide on how we should act or live, but simple records the events as they happened. He states: "We must conclude, therefore, that the judges were not intended to be spiritual role models." Just because Gideon put out a fleece before God does not mean that this should be the normative practice of God's people. Instead, God's people must reflect the kind of faith that is commended in Hebrews 11. "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1).

This FREE self-guided stroll through Historic Downtown Globe will direct you to highlighted window stops and introduce folks to some of Larry Dean Brown's private home art collection. Meet Larry's dogs, "Pabli to Picasso", "Vincent van Gogo" and "Sal Dali". See Larry's early works which include a detailed scratch-board, "Wild West Trio" rendering, and a larger-than-life "Three Little Pigs". Larry created a "Hidden Number" series and a variety of "Self Portraits" that will make you think...and smile! Larry's gourd sculptures, wood carvings, and glass work will also be featured! Reprints of Larry's work will be available for purchase and all

proceeds will go to Kim Brown, Larry's wife.

For over 40 years, Larry shared his knowledge and lifelong love of the arts by creating sculptures, paintings, and murals that have enhanced the Globe, Miami, and San Carlos communities. He taught Art within the Globe/Miami public-school systems and was the Art Director for a decade at Gila Community College. In 2019, he was appointed to the Globe Arts Advisory Commission. A group tasked with establishing a city collection of public art pieces. Larry's most notable public art piece is the copper "globe" that welcomes residents and visitors at the north end of town.

While most might be familiar with Larry's public works, not many have



seen his private collection. So, for the entire month of October, Broad Street will turn into a public gallery of Larry's artwork.
