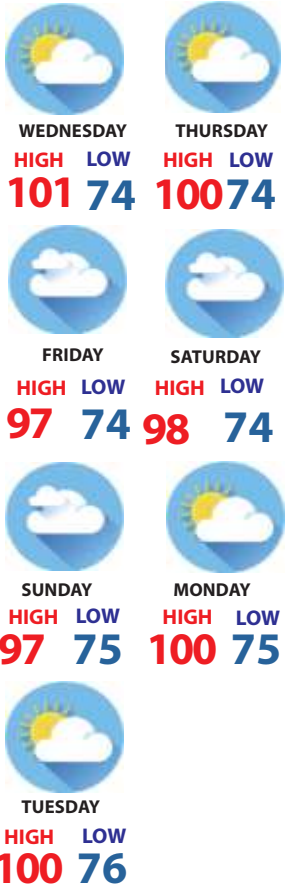

Murray has applied for the programs that have been launched to help "business owners" and has yet to receive any help other than the Economic Impact Payment that every other person has received.

APS has offered to help to cover some costs of electricity but that's it.

While they have been closed, they offered to stop the monthly membership payments for their patrons

## Grupo Mexico making copper at 85 cents

In releasing its second quarter 2020 financial results Group Mexico announced it has lowered its costs in producing copper ore down to 85 cents a pound. The Mexico City based company said "this is the lowest cash cost in the industry." And then Grupo went on the point out to its stockholders the company continued to maintain its position as having the world's largest copper reserves.

Consolidated sales for the second quarter were \$4,858 billion (US) which was 7.5 percent lower than the same period a year ago due to a 10.7 percent decrease in the price of copper and a 2.3 percent drop in Grupo's Transport Division.

Consolidated net income in the second quarter 2020 was \$561 million (US) which was a 27.9 percent increase over a year ago at this time.

In the Mining Division copper production during the quarter was 285,759 tons of copper, a decrease of 1 percent from the previous year. Gold production during this period was 12,201 ounces which was 13.6 percent higher from a year ago. Silver production was 3,904 thousand ounces, 27.5 percent higher than last year while production of Molybdenum

## City publishes intent to raise water and garbage rates

On Tuesday, Aug. 11 the Globe City Council moved forward with a notice of intent to increase water and wastewater rates and fees along with garbage and recycle rates and fees.

A motion approved by the council will allow for the publishing of a notice of intent to increase water and wastewater rates and fees on the City's website and in the local newspaper as required by the statute.

Back on June 9, 2020 the Council gave direction to move forward with a water and wastewater rate increase of 5 percent. The notice of intent must be posted 60 days prior to a public hearing on the proposed increase.

According to the city website, "During 2013, the Council requested an analysis of the water and waste water rates. The analysis was completed by Economist.com. The final report showed that the City was not collecting enough revenue in order to maintain or improve the water and waste water infrastructure."

In order for the City to pay for critical improvements now, they submitted an application to the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority (WIFA) for a loan to continue improvements to the water system. The WIFA Board approved a loan for \$5.5 million in 2014 only in the water and wastewater rates are increased. If these rate increases are not approved, then the water fund may not have

# Cancer and COVID-19

The COVID-19 outbreak of 2020 caught many people, particularly those in the western hemisphere, off guard. As the virus spread, the lives of hundreds of millions of people throughout North America and Europe changed dramatically and seemingly overnight, prompting many to wonder if they or their loved ones were going to get sick.

No one was thought to be immune to COVID-19, though many people were unfortunately believed to be more vulnerable to the disease than others. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, older adults and people with serious chronic medical conditions are at the greatest risk of getting sick from COVID-19.

The American Cancer Society notes that cancer patients, like groups with an elevated risk of getting sick from COVID-19, must do all they can to avoid being exposed to the virus. That's because the immune systems of cancer patients, particularly those in active chemotherapy and bone marrow transplant patients, can be severely weakened. In fact, in March 2020 officials with the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center warned that early data from China and Italy, two countries which experienced early and widespread outbreaks of the disease, indicated that cancer patients would be at increased risk of getting the virus.

Are all cancer patients at risk?

Dr. Steve Pergram, the medical director of infection prevention at Seattle Cancer Care Alliance, said that patients with blood malignancies are most at risk for COVID-19. Blood malignancies include non-Hodgkin lymphoma, chronic lymphocytic leukemia, acute myeloid leukemia, acute lymphoblastic leukemia, and multiple myeloma. While people with these forms of cancer may be most at risk of getting COVID-19, it's important to note that all cancer patients, including those who recently concluded treatment, are vulnerable. Those who concluded treatment should know that the aftereffects of treatment can linger long after treatment programs have ended, and those aftereffects may continue to compromise patients' immune systems.

What can cancer patients do to protect themselves from COVID-19?

Cancer patients should embrace the safety protocols recommended by the CDC, including social distancing measures and limiting direct contact with other people. Seniors in cancer treatment should take advantage of opportunities to limit their exposure to COVID-19, such as visiting grocery stores during seniors-only hours and opting to participate in digital religious services instead of in-person services. In addition, patients can work with their cancer care teams to devise ways to continue receiving treatment without elevating their risk of exposure to COVID-19.

Cancer patients also may need to adjust their expectations in regard to visits with their physicians. Dr. Len Lichtenfeld of the ACS noted that cancer patients may need to book virtual follow-up visits with their physicians or even delay preventative procedures aimed at reducing the likelihood of recurrence.

## *Census takers have started visiting nonresponding households in Arizona*

Census takers in Arizona are working to follow up with households that have not yet responded to the 2020 Census.

The current self-response rate in Arizona is 60 percent. The Census Bureau will need to visit the remaining addresses to collect responses in person.

Households can still respond now by completing and mailing back the paper questionnaire they received, by responding online at [2020census.gov](https://2020census.gov), or by phone at 844-330-2020. Households can also respond online or by phone in one of 13 languages and find assistance in many more. Those that respond will not need to be visited to obtain their census response.

## Protecting Health and Safety

The Census Bureau and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) are working together to protect the health and safety of the public and our employees. Participation in 2020 Census interviews should present a low risk of transmission of COVID-19.

Census takers are trained to rigorously and universally follow these CDC recommendations to mitigate the risk of transmission:

- Wearing face masks
- Maintaining social distance of 6 feet or more
- Practicing hand hygiene
- Not entering homes, and conducting interviews outside as much as possible or practical

Household members encountered by census staff are encouraged to maintain social distances during interviews and practice the CDC's other recommendations as much as possible.

## What Households Can Expect

Census takers are hired from local communities. All census takers speak English, and many are bilingual. If a census taker does not speak the household's language, the household may request a return visit from a census taker who does. Census takers will also have materials on hand to help identify the household's language.

If no one is home when the census taker visits, the census taker will leave a notice of their visit with information about how to respond online, by phone or by mail. People are encouraged to cooperate with census takers and ensure that everyone who was living in their household as of April 1, 2020, is counted.

## How to Identify Census Takers

Census takers can be easily identified by a

valid government ID badge with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date on the badge. To confirm a census taker's identity, the public may contact the Denver/Dallas Regional Census Center at 972-510-1800 to speak with a Census Bureau representative.

noted that numbers seem to be going down, but he backed the resolution “to keep them low.”

In the regular session, Josh Derhammer presented a visual survey of Miami streets with a view of planning and prioritizing their maintenance. The equipment needed consisted of a camera and an iPhone. A picture every 10 feet allowed engineers to rate every segment from 1 (great) to 5 (awful) depending on traffic and the segment’s condition. According to the presenters, the streets averaged out at 5.

Council members could see areas familiar to them, that they might want to treat differently. Councilman Reinman thought the study worth while as was the planning that the council ordered that let the second and third parts of

the sewage project go so smoothly.

According to Town Manager Heatherly, the coronavirus has really hit the town hard in the pocketbook partly because all the work done by prisoners from the county jail for 50 cents an hour had to be replaced by workers earning the minimum wage.

Heatherly presented different levels of property tax increase with a view to getting something towards expenses after his prior figure had failed in a previous meeting. His new bid of an 8.25 percent increase was opposed by Councilmen Black and Sosh. Black mentioned 4.6566 percent which the rest of the council could live with, although all agreed that more would have to be added later.

Another item referred to 4-way stop signs at the

corners of Sullivan and Inspiration streets. They had been put up two years before by another mayor, allegedly to control the speed of traffic as it approached the city park. Councilman Black and Reinman said that it was often run creating the risk of a collision. Councilman Reinman mentioned a near miss for himself, and indeed on Wednesday afternoon almost all cars approaching on Sullivan from either direction seemed to slow rather than to actually stop. One Miami resident may recognize his car in front of a Miami police car near the intersection as he was receiving a ticket.

Councilman Black moved that the signs on Sullivan be removed but the motion failed in a 3 to 3 tie.

if they wish, cutting back drastically.

Bills still come in and need to be paid. Utility companies are still expecting to get paid as if the business were still open and fully operational. It’s tough to keep paying bills with no money coming in, so savings are being used up by these business owners. For a business owner, they don’t have a 401K or retirement to fall back on when they reach that age, just savings.

Temporarily they set up an outdoor workout center to try and help keep the members who are in need of physical fitness, active. But with the Arizona Summer heat, there are few that can handle working out outside. Members pay to use the commercial equipment in a cooled gym for a reason.

On June 27, Governor Ducey issued Executive Order 2020-43 “Pausing of Arizona’s Reopening.” This paused the reopening of several specific industries with operations that are considered by public health to have a high-risk of spreading COVID-19, specifically gyms and fitness centers, bars and nightclubs, waterparks

and tubing, and movie theaters. It also limited indoor and outdoor gatherings to no more than 50 people. Since this pause, Arizona has seen a decline in its percent positivity, an increase in hospital capacity, and an improvement in other indicators. On July 23, that order was extended, with a review every two weeks. On Aug. 10, three benchmarks for phased reopening of industries were released. A decrease in cases, percent positivity, and Covid like illness, must be met for 14 days, with a 12-day reporting lag period to move from a higher transmission phase to a lower one.

Upon reopening, all industries must implement the safety protocols and guidelines prescribed by ADHS and must submit an attestation form stating they are in compliance. The attestation form shall be posted in a visible location in the facility.

These guidelines will push back open dates for many businesses for months. The small town businesses can’t survive that long without customers.

Globe Gym is a private business, which you

only have access to the equipment with a membership. It’s not open to the public for daily traffic, only the ones who want to be there go.

Murray is well aware of the consequences for opening his business and is willing to take a stand. What does taking a stand look like? He could be fined up to \$2500 and a 6 month jail time for each citation. The citations can be for each day that he stays open. Murray said “at this point, if the business is going to go down, it’s going down with a fight.”

Globe Gym has had sanitation and social distancing guidelines in place long before the COVID-19 pandemic. The gym is fully stocked with sanitation wipes, hand sanitizer and signage to educate people.

Murray wants to make sure it is open responsibly and is willing to take more measures if needed. His building is over 6,000 feet so there is plenty of room for social distancing and the 24 hours has helped spread out the capacity.

One member who stopped by said that his doctor recommends exercising to help stay heart healthy.

enough debt service covered to pay the loan back to WIFA.

The Council also approved publishing a notice of intent to increase the garbage and recycle rates and fees.

Back on July 28, the Council gave staff direction to move forward with a garbage and recycle rate increase of 8 percent.

The City of Globe is currently contracted with Right Away Disposal (RAD) for garbage and recycling services RAD increased their rates 2.9 percent on Jan. 1 2018 and another 2 percent on Jan. 1 2020. The Council has chose not to pass those rate increases on to the constituents of Globe but rather to absorb the cost through fees paid by RAD for administering the billing.

If these rate increases are not approved, the administration fees will diminish and the City will not be collecting enough funds to pay the contractor.

The notice of intent will be posted for 60 days prior to a public hearing when the City will ask for public comment on the proposed rate increases.

reached 7,825 tons an increase of 16.3 percent from this time a year ago

Grupo Mexico’s mining division consists of the ASARCO Mines in Arizona and other producing copper mines in Mexico and South America. It’s Transport Division consists of most of the railroads in the country of Mexico.

Capital Expenditures for the quarter were \$238 million. Total debt was \$6.258 billion. It was also reported by Grupo Mexico investment in growth projects have been lower than expected because of the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Even with an ongoing strike that hit ASARCO copper operations in Arizona and Texas in October 2018, and with the Hayden, Arizona Smelter Operations and firm’s copper refining plant remaining shut down the company continues to produce copper at lower costs from its other mining operations in Arizona. These are the Ray, Mission and Silver Bell mines.

Grupo Mexico states “Notwithstanding the strike actions by the unions in Arizona, ASARCO produced 63,342 thousand tons of copper during second quarter. The company has had a decrease in cost after by-products of 19.5 percent during the second quarter.”

## Stabbing in Punkin Center Lodge in Tonto Basin

On Aug. 16, Gila County Sheriff’s Office dispatch received a 911 call reporting a stabbing that occurred at the Punkin Center Lodge in Tonto Basin. Deputies were dispatched along with a request for assistance from the Payson Police Department and Arizona Department of Public Safety.

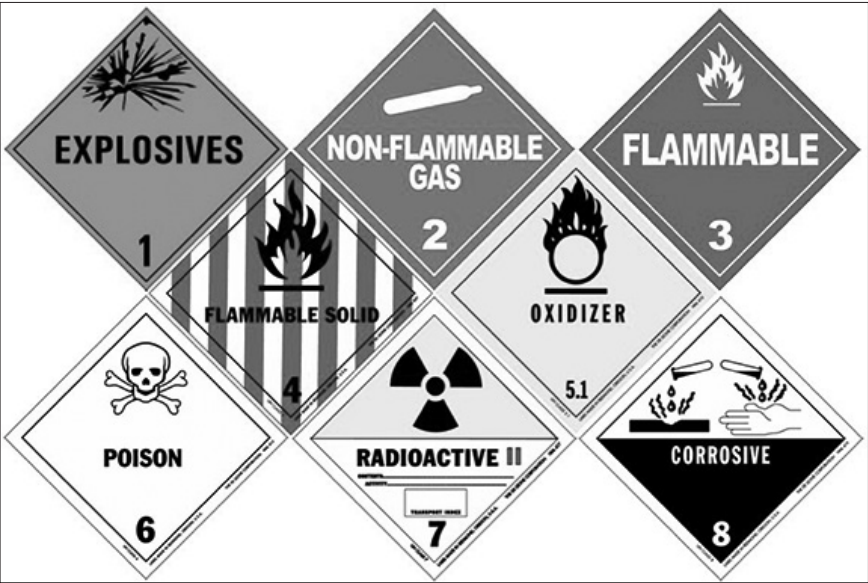

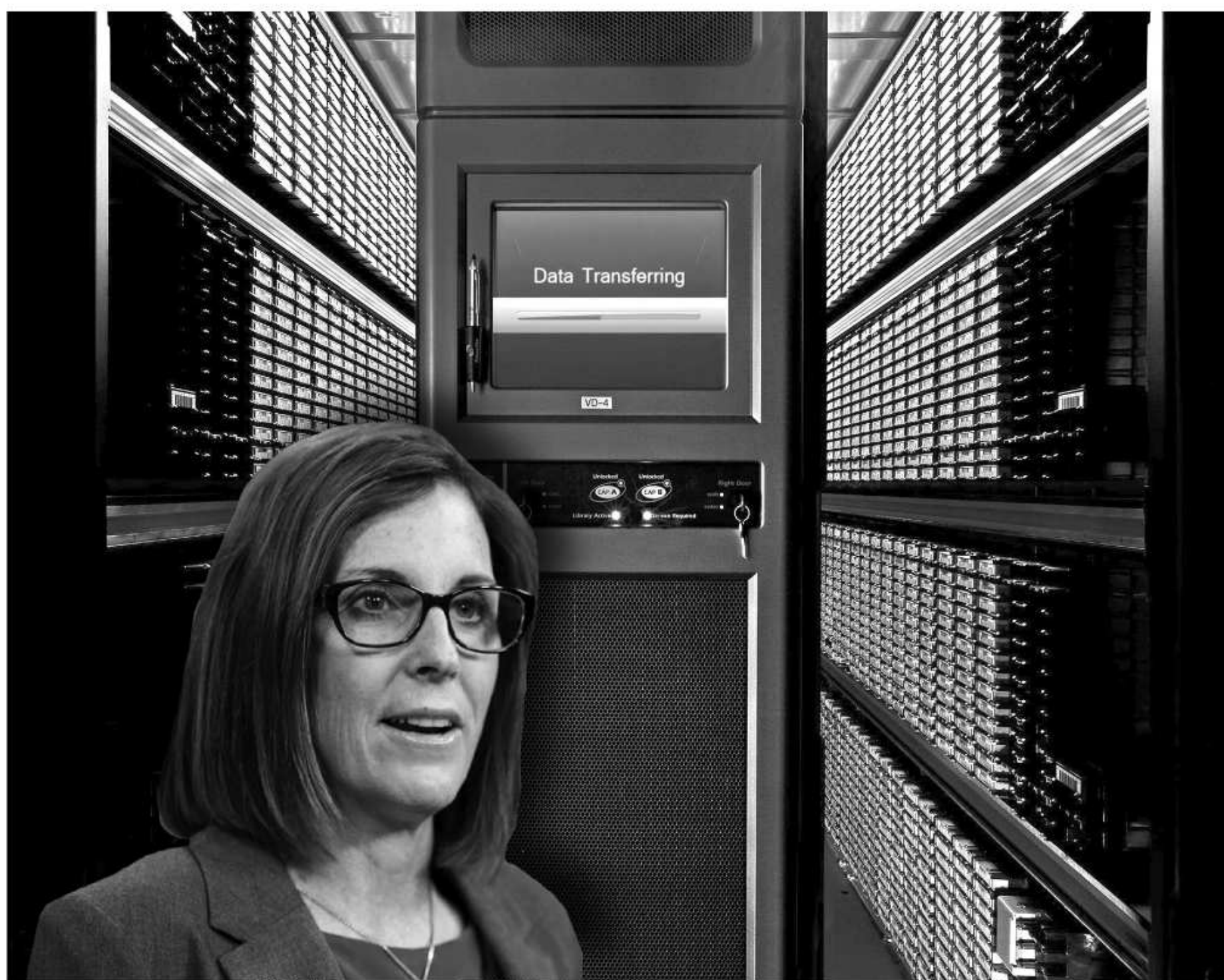

## Lavender Agritourism Bringing New Life To A Pioneer Farm

Have you visited the Pine Creek Canyon Lavender Farm in Pine, our northernmost community of Gila County? Join a virtual visit to this verdant patch of land where Pine Creek sustains lavender fields, which in turn yield herbs for aromatherapy and culinary uses, healing essential oils -- and a magnet for visitors. University of Arizona Gila County Cooperative Extension invites armchair tourists to learn more about ‘agritourism’ Aug. 20, Thursday, when Pine Creek Canyon Lavender Farm is the featured topic for the weekly Garden and Country Extension Webinar Series: once-a-week Zoom webinars of 60-minutes or less, featuring a variety of horticultural and natural resource topics relevant to life in Gila County.

Prior to the pandemic this was popular tourist destination, the Lavender Farm is temporarily closed to visitors -- but guests and shoppers are welcome online at [pinelavenderfarm.com](http://pinelavenderfarm.com) to browse and buy various items made from Royal Velvet, Provence, and Grosso lavender varieties grown on the farm.

Three Varietals  
Both Royal Velvet and Provence are considered culinary lavenders, world-renowned for their flavor and herbal qualities. Provence is generally used in savory dishes like chicken, pasta sauces, and anything in which you might use rosemary. Royal Velvet has a sweeter profile and is mostly used in confectioneries and baking. Grosso is not for cooking, but is, perhaps, the most aromatic lavender in the world, making it the perfect lavender for making essential oils, sachets, and bouquets.

A few of the specialized classes that have been offered here include separate sessions dedicated to lavender glazed cinnamon rolls, lavender spa products, lavender fudge and pecan turtles, lavender lemon morning cake, lavender limoncello and mixology, lavender focaccia and dipping sai, lavender honey sticky chicken, and lavender chicken tamales. Dating from the early 1880s and a family that farmed corn and cattle, the farm and associated water rights were bought in 2015. New owners asked, “What won’t Elk eat?” and came to the realization that lavender was the answer.

## San Carlos discusses reopening

The San Carlos Apache Reservation appears poised on the cusp of reopening. It all depends on how things look at the meeting on Monday, Aug. 17. According to the epidemiologist the increase of the latter part of July moderated in the first week of August but a 14 day downward trend had not been established.

Councilmen Sneezy and Antonio tried to open up religious services and traditional ceremonies at the meeting on the Aug. 10 but failed. It appeared that those gatherings were not specifically forbidden but a limit of 10 participants had been set which effectively prevented them from happening. The council voted against allowing more participants in the light of the outbreaks that had occurred from large religious and traditional gatherings in other places. Ray Moses from TERC was firmly against it. Goode and Key Cheney were as much against it as they had been against resuming the lucrative non-member hunts, but Ray Moses from TERC was directed to confer with religious leaders and visit their churches to see if they could provide adequate mitigation to more people to attend. Moses had talked to several traditional leaders, some of whom postponed dances and other ceremonies.

Gaming was trying to get Apache Sky open during the week of Aug. 17 at least since it was far from Apache Gold and was ready to go with the necessary remediation. The sticking point was Chief Benally's need to free up Police officers so that the casino could

have a sworn officer on the premises while the casino was open, which is legally required. Benally said that he would get with his people to try and work out a solution, which would be in the next week, which was the week, Apache sky would like to like to open. Matt Olin of the Gaming Enterprise said that this was important because Gaming had a loan out and opening Apache Sky would reassure its creditors that at least one Casino would have an income.

Several council members reported pressure from constituents on both sides of the issue, but they felt it their duty to hold to the CDC guidelines, although they reacted to TERC's flat denial of opening religious as being arbitrary.

In the Aug. 3 meeting the council had voted to walk away from the revenues that the nonmember hunts would bring in (around 2 million dollars). The casino's are both closed and many on the staff are still on paid administrative leave. Councilman Dr. John Bush brought forth the notion that the tribe could not continue on with shutdowns and revenue losses forever and that tribal members had been "trained" in CDC rules for over 6 months and could be, and would have to be trusted to follow them.

A lot depended on the Epidemiologist's report on Monday, Aug. 17.

In the morning, Dr. Dara was able to reassure tribal members that recovered Covid patients are not contagious and should not be treated like pariahs, which Tao Etpison had gotten word of.

## Firefighters fortified by San Carlos Café 'Meals with a Message'

When the Cassadore Springs Fire ignited on the San Carlos Apache Reservation, the Southwest Area Type 2 Incident Management Team 4 was ordered to manage the quickly growing wildfire. In addition to fighting the fire, one of the most important duties of the incident management team is to feed the hundreds of firefighters working on the front lines. On the Cassadore Springs Fire, a portion of these meals are being provided by the San Carlos Café, a local restaurant that has been family-owned and operated for over 12 years. Tasha Pemberton, a member of the San Carlos Apache Tribe, works at the well-loved café with her mother, Arlene Pemberton.

Since the Team arrived on Aug. 4, Tasha and her family have been supplying firefighters with delicious meals that have a personal touch – individual, colorful, handwritten notes on every meal box. Each morning, Tasha and her family wake up at 3 a.m. to start preparing breakfast for the hungry firefighters, who Tasha refers to as "undercover superheroes." In the afternoon, they do it all over again for dinner. At the peak of the fire, the restaurant staff were preparing 190 meals per day, with 190

unique messages personally written by Tasha.

Firefighters were surprised to receive these special notes from Tasha, with words of encouragement, praise, and heartfelt thanks for their hard work. Tasha's messages reminded firefighters that "you work too hard for it to go unnoticed, don't worry I see you!" and "you're a special person to us, we made this with love!"

Hard work is a staple in the daily life of a firefighter; however, many do not experience the uncommon kindness displayed in Tasha's messages. In one special note scribbled in bright pink marker, Tasha wrote "I hope nothing has you sad... You deserve all the good things life has to offer! You got this, even if you think you don't!" Many other messages reassured the firefighters that "no one could live without you" and "you're the best worker in the world!" Tasha's words resonated in the hearts of the weary firefighters, inspiring one anonymous firefighter to send their own message to Tasha.

# WORSHIP

## How God Rewards Our Suffering

I don't know anyone who gets excited about going through hardship, and yet it's unavoidable in everyone's life at some time or other. When trouble comes, a natural response is "Why is this happening?" or "I can't believe this is happening to ME!"

But the Bible tells us that hard times are actually good for us. James 1:2-3 (AMP) says, "Consider it nothing but joy... whenever you fall into various trials. Be assured that the testing of your faith [through experience] produces endurance [leading to spiritual maturity, and inner peace]."

These verses are saying that we can learn to go through hard times with joy and hope, knowing God will use them to make us better in the end.

Resist the Urge to Run

When things get tough, our initial reaction is to want to run from the pain and escape the situation, but what we need to do is take a firm stand in our faith and face it. Jesus promises us in

John 16:33 that if we will trust Him in the midst of the struggle, we can have peace and confidence that we will overcome it because He is on our side!

Now, we don't just overcome the problem, but in the process of going through it, God uses the very thing that is causing our pain to develop endurance, patience and perseverance in our soul. This is how we build our faith in God and grow up spiritually.

The Value of Patience and Endurance

The Greek Dictionary says patience is a fruit of the Spirit that grows only under trial. In fact, the word patience comes from the root word *hupone*, which means "to remain under."

Patience has to do with being steadfast, disciplined and committed—not running from difficult things, but sticking with them all the way through. It's about having a good attitude while you're waiting for your breakthrough or the fulfillment



of something you desire.

Patience has a lot to do with endurance. I've come up with my own definition of endurance: "to outlast the enemy." It reminds me not to give up when I'm weary because I never want to give in to the temptations Satan brings my way or let him win the battle.

We all get weary at times and wonder if we'll ever get our breakthrough when we've been fighting the same battles for a long time. But the ones who refuse to give up are the ones who will have a testimony in the end!

The Test of My Quality

In 1 Peter 4:12, we see that painful experiences test the quality of

our faith. When our quality is tested, we learn things about ourselves, because we don't really know what we would do in a tough situation until we're in it. God allows us to go through hard times to reveal what's in our hearts.

I remember a season in my life when I was praying for God to change me and make me more patient, sweet, merciful and loving. He answered my prayer at the grocery store.

I used to be very impatient when it was time to check out at the supermarket, and I somehow managed to pick the slow line every time. I can vividly remember one day when there was a new clerk being trained

and everything was taking longer than usual. I was frustrated, and I made sure they knew it! I sighed loudly and mumbled under my breath.

These times at the grocery store were tests meant to develop patience and endurance in my soul. Over time, as I continued to grow in my relationship with God, I began to pass these tests more often. I came to the point where I could wait in the slow line with a good attitude—without opening my mouth or making a sound.

The Reward Always Outweighs the Pain

My example of developing patience at the grocery store may seem trivial compared to the trial you're facing today.

But I want to encourage you to find comfort in the truth that God is with you and He knows exactly what you're going through. He loves you more than you know, and He has the answers you desperately need.

There have been many times when I've walked through devastating pain, and Galatians 6:9 has been an encouragement to me. It says, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up" (NIV).

And God promises in Romans 8:28 that if we will trust Him and keep doing what is right in each situation, He will work it all out for our good. He will take every moment of pain and use it to develop priceless fruit, such as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control in our soul (Galatians 5:22-23).

That's more than enough reason to keep going, one day at a time, and to never give up!

## Grieving

Grieving is a natural response to an unfamiliar occurrence. Most people do not encounter loss of a friend or family member on a regular basis. There are rare occasions when people pass at the same time and the grieving process is greater, not in intensity, but one now has to address each person.

Feelings are different. Do not feel shame or guilt if you miss one person more than the other. You are just being normal. The interaction

you had with a co-worker will be different from your child who has been the focus of attention for many years.

The feelings of grief have been defined by various authors, but some have settled on five stages: Denial, Anger, Depression, Bargaining, and Acceptance. They do now always come in that order and the timing is different in each case. Your thoughts jump back and forth from one to another. That's normal, don't add worry to what's already on your plate.

When experiencing

grief, try to stay on your regular schedule, eating, sleeping, walking, working and visiting with friends. You may find support from unexpected sources. When my son first passed away as an infant, friends whom I never expected of having been through what I was going through came forward and shared their stories. I found comfort in knowing I was not alone.

The Apostle Paul said it so well in 1 Thessalonians 4:13, "...you may not grieve as others who have no hope." God is still your friend.

## Love Money? Don't!

One day a military official named Naaman, who had leprosy, went to the prophet Elisha for healing. After he was healed, he tried and tried to give Elisha a gift, but Elisha refused to receive anything. Elisha's servant Gehazi, thinking that Elisha should have taken something, ran after Naaman, stopped him on his journey, and lied to him. Gehazi told Naaman that two "guests" had stopped in suddenly, so Elisha now needed some money and two changes of clothes. Naaman immediately sent the money and clothes back with Gehazi, who hid them as soon as he got home. When Elisha asked him where he'd been, Gehazi lied again, saying, "Nowhere."

But Elisha knew better and said that because of Gehazi's greed, Naaman's leprosy would now latch on to Gehazi and all his descendants (see 2 Kings 5:27). Gehazi's choice not only affected him, it affected the generations who came after him. I wonder how many times in his life Gehazi looked at his leprous spots and thought with regret about the man he could have been.

Gehazi allowed the love of money to keep him from reaching his destiny. In a similar way, how many people today lose their relationships with their families because of greed? This happens more than we'd like to admit. Working extra hard for a season of time is admirable, and it can be wise in certain situations. But working frantically for decades on end out of an obsessive lust for more and more things is wrong, and always leads to trouble in the end. Take time to spend with those closest to you, and enjoy every moment God has given you.
