



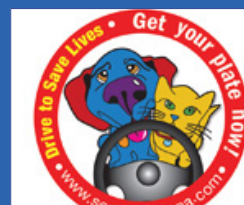

## Gila County's Self-Serve Sandbag Station fills 1,000 bags

Gila County Supervisor Tim R. Humphrey, Emergency Manager Carl Melford and a small team of county staff and volunteers filled 1,000 sandbags on July 9, that were provided free to residents of Tonto Basin, Punkin Center and Jakes Corner preparing for the aftermath of the recent Bush Fire. Gila County Health & Emergency Management set up the self-serve sandbag station the previous week, providing sand, bags, and a reminder to "bring your own shovel." Supplies will remain there for homeowners and local residents to self-serve sandbags and create erosion control berms to deal with flooding that's expected when summer rains hit upper elevation hillsides that were reduced to ash by the Bush Fire.

Local residents applauded the effort, commenting: "Thank you Gila County, this is why we love being a part of the Tonto / Gila County community. . . good job guys."

## AZ Pet Plates: \$7500 For Local Spay/Neuter Surgery

How can you help prevent unwanted litters of puppies and kittens? Upgrade your license plates to an AZ Pet Plate, with whimsical art by painter Ron Burns – and with \$17 of your \$25 fee funding no-cost and low-cost spay and neuter services for dogs and cats. Arizona Department of Transportation keeps just \$8 of that total. The colorful license plates truly help, and right here in our own communities: Gila County Animal Care and Control recently

announced a \$7,500 grant specifically for Gila County residents to spay and neuter their pets. The grant reduces the price “by about half” for pet owners, who still need to pay their share: \$80 for dogs to be spayed or neutered, or \$50 for a cat.

### How To Apply

To be eligible for help paying for spay or neuter surgery, owners must reside in Gila County and dogs and cats must be up-to-date on current rabies vaccination -- signed by a licensed veterinarian – and dogs must also be up-to-date with the required Gila County dog license. If your pets aren't already licensed, have a credit card ready and accomplish that conveniently online at [licensepet.com/gila](http://licensepet.com/gila), or have a credit card ready and call 928-425-5882 during weekday business hours. Join a community of nearly 3,000 pet lovers who help reconnect stray pets with anxious owners at [facebook.com/GilaCountyAnimalCare](http://facebook.com/GilaCountyAnimalCare), where you can also contact helpful staff, see cute photos, and read useful pet care posts. Animal Care and Control staff estimate this grant can help pay for surgeries for about 100 pets. Vouchers and surgeries remain available on a first-come, first-served basis until the grant funds run out. Applicants must be approved in advance, and all surgeries are done by the professional team at Samaritan Veterinary Center in Globe. Arrangements are made through Gila County Animal Care and Control –



so no additional fees will be charged at the vet's office when you bring your pet for scheduled surgery. A few additional restrictions apply: dogs or cats that are pregnant, lactating or in heat are not eligible. Questions? Call Gila County Animal Care and Control staff at 928-425-5882.

The Miss Indian Arizona Association will be crowning a new Miss from the current Miss Indian Arizona Court to carry on the title for 2020-2021. The 2021 – 2022 Miss Indian Arizona Scholarship Program will be held on Oct. 9, 2021 at the Chandler Center for the Arts.

The decision was made to help maintain the safety of all those who attend and are involved with the Program. ## Leftover hunt permit-tags available for deer, turkey, youth-only javelina

### Paper applications now being accepted by mail

Arizona hunters will have an opportunity to receive a hunt permit-tag for select 2020 deer, fall turkey and fall youth-only javelina hunts.

There are 287 leftover hunt permit-tags available for general deer hunts, with most of those hunts being for antlered white-tailed deer only in Game Management Units (GMUs) in the southeastern portion of the state.

There also are leftover hunt permit-tags for muzzleloader deer (221), youth-only muzzleloader deer (1), turkey (119) and youth-only javelina (46) hunts.

For a complete list of leftover hunt permit-tags, as well as a printable paper application, visit <https://www.azgfd.com/Hunting/Draw/>. Paper applications also can be found at more than 200 license dealers statewide (call in advance for availability).

The Arizona Game and Fish Department will accept paper applications for leftover hunt permit-tags — by mail only — beginning July 20. All completed paper applications must be addressed to: Arizona Game and Fish Department, Attn.: Draw/First Come, 5000 W. Carefree Highway, Phoenix, AZ

85086. There is no "mini" draw. Allow 10 to 15 business days to receive a hunt permit-tag by mail.

Any remaining leftover hunt permit-tags will go on sale on a "first come, first served" basis beginning July 27. To ensure public health and safety protocols are observed, customers will be required to first contact customer service at 602-942-3000 between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

# Stubbs running for Sheriff

He was preceded in death by his parents Katherine and Bert Hopkins Sr. and his son Mark L. Hopkins.

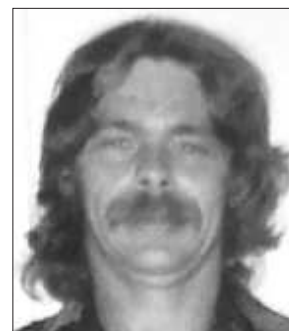

# Arizona Department of Corrections extends visitation suspension

The Arizona Department of Corrections, Rehabilitation and Reentry will be further extending the suspension of legal and non-legal visitation at all Arizona prison complexes, through Aug. 13, 2020. We will then continue to re-evaluate on a month by month basis thereafter.

Video visitation will continue for those inmates who have visitation privileges. Inmates are eligible for one 15-minute video visit per week in order to allow as many inmates as possible to participate. No fees are associated with the video visitations.

Existing ADCRR policies for phone calls and written letters also remain in effect. During this period, Century-

Link will also continue to provide inmates with two additional 15-minute phone calls per week, free of charge.

Our priority remains ensuring the health and safety of inmates as well as all ADCRR employees and on-site third

party partners. We continue our efforts to maintain CDC guidelines and will re-evaluate the suspension in August.

ADCRR continues to post daily statewide COVID-19 statistics on its website at <https://corrections.az.gov/>.

## Agree With Me Or Lose It All!

“Another one bites the dust...” Although I hold no authority to make the call, I have decided to unilaterally make this classic Queen tune the official theme song of the current cultural gods. Why? Because this is the choice warning for those who do not move with the ever changing tide: “Believe like us or you will lose everything!”

A number of years back, this warning was primarily for those who held to a completely different worldview. Christian bakers and florists who believed that their religious convictions did not allow them to participate in same sex unions were targeted as bigots and regarded as unfit for modern culture. However, in recent years this vitriol has not been reserved solely for those who hold religious ideologies or for those on the so-called right side of the political aisle, but for any who would dare question the accepted cultural zeitgeist. In other words, the progressive cultural gods will welcome nothing but total, utter, and unquestioning allegiance. And be warned, they eat their own!

Too many examples of what has been deemed, “cancel culture” exist to go through each of them. From Roseanne Barr losing the reboot of her popular show because of a tweet, to author J.K. Rowling being lambasted by the media and other celebrities for sharing her opinion on the transgender issue. Both of these women are in no way the poster children for political conservatism, so what happened? They offended the ever-changing doctrine of progressive thought. I am in no way defending these or other people who have come up against the “cancel culture”, but I would like to make some observations about the worldview from which these ideas spring.

Please understand, this article is not intended to be political. Rather my aim is to analyze why this happens. My interest in the subject, as I think should be yours, is not necessarily how this affects the election cycle, but how this affects life in general in a pluralistic society, a society of people from many different backgrounds, traditions, and beliefs.

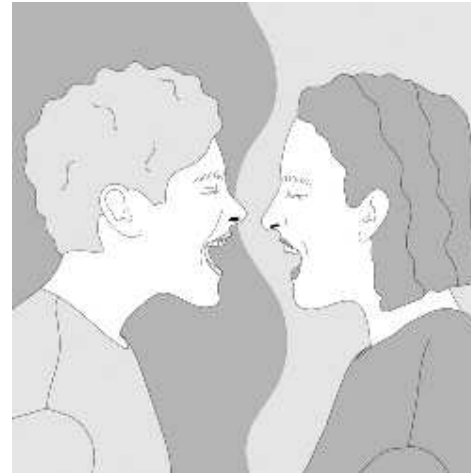
Recently, I started reading through Augustine’s book City of God with other local pastors. I have been blown

away by how applicable this ancient book is to our own day and age. Augustine is writing in response to the outcry that was taking place because of the sack of Rome in 410 AD. As refugees flee Rome into Hippo, the north African city where Augustine serves as a pastor, he is confronted with many questions about how and why this could happen. City of God is Augustine’s response. Throughout these pages he wrestles with the differences of belief among those who worship the gods of the Romans and those who are followers of Christ.

One particular quotation from Augustine jumps right off the page. Discussing the moral decline of the Rome, Augustine highlights the Roman response to anyone who dared to disagree with the accepted ideas of happiness and pleasure promoted in the popular culture. He writes, “If such happiness is distasteful to any, let him be branded as a public enemy; and if any attempt to modify or put an end to it let him be silenced, banished, put an end to. Let these be reckoned the true gods, who procure for the people this condition of things, and preserve it when once possessed.” Amazing! Do you understand what this means? Cancel culture is nothing new! So even in the early 400’s, (over 1600 years ago!) the cultural elites declared “Agree with me or lose it all!”

This doesn’t surprise me, however, because the Bible tells me that all ideas are old, simply repackaged for modern hearers. “What has been is what will be, and what has been done is what will be done, and there is nothing new under the sun” (Ecclesiastes 1:9). So these, so-called, progressive ideas are not progressive in the slightest. Rather, they are simply old ideas dusted off for a new generation.

You see, it seems we’ve lost the ability to have any form of a civil discourse. It seems that we are no longer able to “agree to disagree”. Even those who were once esteemed as being “progressive” in years past are no longer “progressive” enough. If you don’t keep up with the newest ideologies, you will be left in the dust and the progressive police will come for you and your careers. Not only



is this destructive to critical thought, it is unhealthy for a nation that once proclaimed to believe in the fundamental right of free speech.

Now let’s be real. I want you to believe like I do. That is, I would love for all of my readers to have and develop a biblical worldview. It would be disingenuous for me to act as if I am somehow neutral when it comes to beliefs. I am not. However, I don’t want you to believe like me by force, by threat, or by fear

of losing your livelihood. Instead, I would like to have the opportunity to share with you my beliefs and to explain why I think a biblical worldview is the correct way to view reality. I don’t want to “cancel” you, I want to talk with you.

The Apostle Paul writes, “Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God” (2 Corinthians 5:20). This is the plea of the Christian. I desire that you would be reconciled, that is, that you would be made right with God through the sacrifice of Christ upon the cross. I implore you, entreat you, even beg you to believe this, but I do not force you. You cannot force belief upon a person anymore than you can force someone to love you.

So while I will leave the results up to God, I will continue to share and proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ. I will continue to have conversations with people who disagree with me, seeking to understand why they believe what they do and explaining why I believe as I do. This is what healthy dialogue looks like in civilized society. Therefore, whatever the progressive cultural gods tell you, it’s ok to encounter ideas and beliefs different than your own. It’s ok to have conversations about contentious topics in a polite manner. In other words, let’s talk and let’s keep talking.
