IMPORTANT NOTICE: FCC Announces the Affordable Connectivity Program May Possibly End

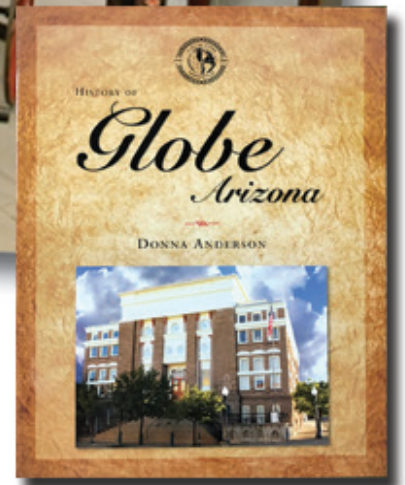
In 2021, Congress established the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) which offers eligible households a discount on their monthly internet bill. Congress appropriated \$14.2 billion for the ACP. However, these funds are approaching depletion and are currently projected to run out at the end of April 2024. As a result, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), which maintains the ACP, has begun taking steps to wind down the program.

How does the ACP wind-down affect my household's broadband service bill?

Your household will continue to receive the ACP benefit throughout the wind-down period so long as you stay enrolled in the program. If Congress does not appropriate additional funding to keep the program running beyond April 2024, when current funding is projected to run out, the wind-down steps will result in ending the ACP. After the ACP ends, your household will no longer receive a monthly discount on broadband service.

The FCC will provide more information on the status of the ACP in the coming weeks. When the FCC announces the status of the ACP, we will provide additional information so you may make an informed decision concerning your broadband service. If Congress decides to provide more funding for the ACP, the FCC will provide further guidance and instructions on how the ACP will proceed at that time.

Globe, Az., with a reception immediately following at the Elks Lodge.

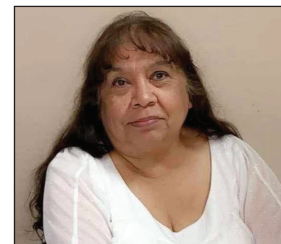

“Not a shadow can rise, not a cloud in the skies, but His smile quickly drives it away, not a doubt or a fear, not a sigh or a tear can abide while we trust and obey.” John H. Sammis is believed to

have written this hymn more than one hundred years ago.

Two qualities held strongly by those who would be leaders are “Trust” and “Obey.”

Proverbs 3:5-6 adds to this theme with, “Trust in the Lord with all your heart, And lean not on

your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths.”

When we are not certain of our own belief, we can be certain of our faith in the Lord. Time and time again, He has proven to be trustworthy.

How comforters are created

God never wastes anything—He often calls us to use our pain to minister to others.

Job asked a challenging question during his time of suffering: “Shall we actually accept good from God but not accept adversity?” (Job 2:10). Even hardship has a place in the Lord’s plan.

We can find great solace in Paul’s words about our loving God, who “comforts us in all our affliction so that we will be able to comfort those who are in any affliction” (2 Cor. 1:4). Think about the kind of people you seek out when

you feel hurt. You want someone who has felt your pain, right? A person who’s walked the path we find ourselves on can understand our suffering and provide wise counsel. According to the apostle, passing through a “valley experience” prepares us to be a blessing and encouragement to those who must go through something similar later. What’s required is that we accept the adversity He has placed in our way and

choose to learn from the situation.

God is the Lord of our life, and He has the right to use us as comforters and encouragers to those in our sphere of influence. As His servants, we must be willing to receive whatever training is necessary to complete His will, including times when it hurts. Even in suffering, we can trust that He loves us and has a plan and purpose for our life.

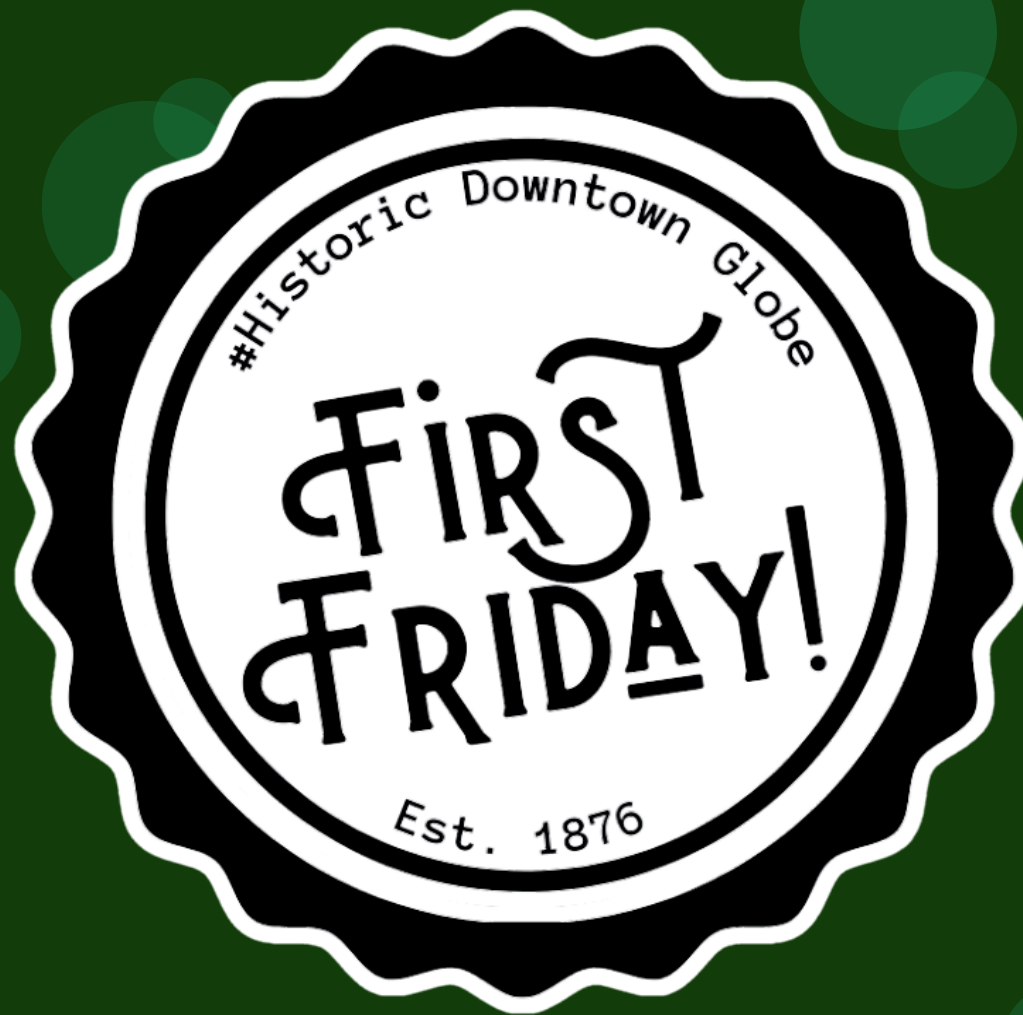
