Amethyst, peridot, garnet and jasper: Free February geology events

Did you know February's birthstone is amethyst, and that these stunning crystalline gems are mined in the Four Peaks Mountains - a famous mountain range which you can see from right here in Globe-Miami? Azurite and amethyst, peridot, chrysocolla, malachite and turquoise - Gila County boasts a breathtaking variety of dazzling minerals and gems. October's birthstone, tourmaline, occurs in the Pinal Mountains. November's birthstone, topaz, is also found in Arizona and December's signature stone - turquoise - is locally famous due to deposits in Sleeping Beauty Mountain. Friday afternoons this month -Feb. 9, 16 and 23 – will bring the bling to Globe Public Library. From 2-4 p.m. on each of those days, youth ages 8-18 can participate in a free learn-

ing series through hands-on activities in exploring the field of rocks, minerals, gems and geology. Arranged by the University of Arizona Cooperative Extension and Gila County 4-H, each of these free Friday afternoon meetups will focus on different aspects of geology. Activities include drawing out iron in cereal, mining cupcakes, creating rock candy and more. Youth can register for this free event at https://4h.zsuite.org/external-eventregistration/25894.

Arizona is famous worldwide for our variety of rocks and minerals and Globe-Miami's Copper Corridor is a place where anyone from amateur rockhounds to professional geologists can create a career pursuing their passion!

"Now - back to February's birth-

stone," said Thuy Bishop, coordinator of this free event series. "Amethyst! What does amethyst symbolize, and why is it associated with February? This gemstone is linked to royalty thanks to its purple coloring; amethysts have been used to symbolize deep love, happiness, humility, sincerity, and wealth. Legend has it St. Valentine wore an amethyst ring carved with Cupid's portrait - which may be why amethyst is February's birthstone. Many claim these crystals have healing properties, impart positive energy and can bring clarity of the mind, relieving stress and anxiety - even headache and fatigue. 

What is the Arizona Presidential Preference Election?

Coming up March 19, the Presidential Preference Election (PPE) is an election in which members of political parties can choose who they would like to be their presidential nominee in the upcoming general election. The party's presidential nominee is officially determined at the party's national conven-

tion. To participate in the process, register to vote with a participating party, either Democrat or Republican. Only voters registered with a participating party can vote in the PPE. Feb. 20 is the last day to register for the PPE. Early voting starts, and early ballots are mailed out, on Feb. 21.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: FCC Announces the Affordable Connectivity Program May Possibly End

In 2021, Congress established the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) which offers eligible households a discount on their monthly internet bill. Congress appropriated \$14.2 billion for the ACP. However, these funds are approaching depletion and are currently projected to run out at the end of April 2024. As a result, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), which maintains the ACP, has begun taking steps to wind down the program.


How does the ACP wind-down affect my household's broadband service bill? Your household will continue to receive the ACP benefit throughout the wind-

down period so long as you stay enrolled in the program. If Congress does not appropriate additional funding to keep the program running beyond April 2024, when current funding is projected to run out, the wind-down steps will result in ending the ACP. After the ACP ends, your household will no longer receive a monthly discount on broadband service.

The FCC will provide more information on the status of the ACP in the coming weeks. When the FCC announces the status of the ACP, we will provide additional information so you may make an informed decision concerning your broadband service. If Congress decides to provide more funding for the ACP, the FCC will provide further guidance and instructions on how the ACP will proceed at that time.

Many mornings I look out the windows of the parlor and rave about the beauty of the scene before me. "Mud Pond" lies at the bottom of the valley. Created decades ago, it is the result of clear-cutting timber to use in processing iron ore. Above and beyond are rows of hills that provide as many as eight ranges when the fog separates them.

When the moon is full.

the light illuminates a scene different from that of the daylight. When hiking the Appalachian Trail that passes nearby, one finds the inherent beauty is displayed differently as the ambient light changes.

The Psalmist makes reference to this phenomenon in Psalm 119:105: "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." He continues in verse 124, "Deal with your servant according to your love and teach me your decrees": verse 129. "Your

statutes are wonderful; therefore I obey them"; verse 133, "Direct my footsteps according to your word: let no sin rule over me"; and verse 135, "Make your face shine upon your servant and teach me your decrees."

Spoken words can provide a pathway to one who cannot see. Having developed the fullest confidence in the leadership of the Lord, it seems only natural to rely on his guidance for all matters.

Gathering to celebrate God's goodness honors Him and blesses us.

When the Israelites entered the Promised Land after years of wandering in the desert, God issued a strange command: Feast.

Feasting and enjoying the bounty of the land were meant to tie the Israelites to different rhythms throughout the year - such as harvesting the first and last of the year's crops. Festivals were also a way of commemorating the mighty acts of God on the people's behalf, like the night of the Passover when God spared all who'd painted their doors with the blood of a lamb. Ultimately, these celebrations were an act of worship that reoriented God's people to right relationship with Him. God was their provider and sustainer, so they feasted with gratitude. He was their rescuer and redeemer, so they feasted in holy remembrance.

Today we can learn healthy spiritual habits from these observances prescribed by God for the ancient Israelites. When we pause to give thanks for our blessings, we worship God with our time and attention. When we gather to simply enjoy His good gifts, we remember that "every good thing given and every perfect gift is from above" (James 1:17) – not from our own striving.

When was the last time you paused to savor God's goodness, remember His faithfulness, and worship Him? Consider taking time to taste and see the goodness of God today.


