Animal Control warns parents, pet owners to beware of illegal leg-hold traps

Gila County Animal Care & Control issued a warning to parents and pet-owners Wednesday after investigating the second of two incidents where animals were caught in illegal leghold traps.

"On March 6 another innocent animal fell victim to an illegally set leg-hold trap near the Russell Road area," said Animal Care & Control Manager John Castaneda. "Local authorities are investigating and seeking [the] cooperation of the community. Help and cooperation from residents is vital in identifying and

putting an end to this illegal and harmful activity."

Castaneda urged anyone with information regarding individuals setting these traps to contact the Arizona Game and Fish Department at 602-942-3000 or Gila County Animal Care & Control at 928-402-8875.

The discovery of these illegal leg-hold traps prompted Wednesday's public advisory. Both traps were strategically placed in proximity to Russell Road, posing a serious threat to the local wildlife population. Gila County Animal Care & Control urged resi-

dents to take necessary precautions to safeguard pets and children.

Pet owners are strongly advised to keep their animals on a leash at all times, especially in areas around Russell Road. This precautionary measure aims to prevent pets from inadvertently stumbling upon these traps and becoming

ensnared, ensuring their safety while outdoors.

For families with small children who may engage in recreational activities in the vicinity, particularly in lots below the tailings, it is crucial to make them aware of the potential presence of these small but danger-

ous traps. Education on the risks associated with such traps is key to preventing any unfortunate incidents.

the community bands together to address this issue, we hope increased awareness and reporting will lead to the swift apprehension of those responsible for endangering local wildlife and domestic animals. The safety of both our wildlife and community members remains paramount, and united action is needed to ensure the well-being of all residents and creatures in the Russell Road area," said Castaneda.



ATTENTION VOTERS OF GILA COUNTY THE ARIZONA PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE ELECTION WILL BE HELD MARCH 19, 2024

<u>Who Can Vote?</u> The Presidential Preference Election is open only to electors registered in those parties which have chosen to participate. This year the Democratic Party and the Republican Parties have chosen to participate and, therefore, only voters registered as Democrats or Republicans will be able to vote in this election.

<u>Can I Vote in the Same Place I Always Do?</u> Yes. Additionally, precincts having fewer than 300 registered voters can be conducted as "all mail precincts". Therefore, you will receive a ballot in the mail.

<u>So How Do I Know Where To Vote or If I Will Receive a Ballot in the Mail?</u> Eligible voters will receive a sample ballot which will tell them where their polling place is located. Eligible voters located in an "All Mail Precinct" will receive a ballot in the mail.

Following is the 2024 Presidential Preference Election Polling Locations. For "all mail precincts", ballot replacement sites will be available in the precinct on election day from 12:00 pm to 7:00 pm to accommodate voters who need to pick-up and vote a replacement ballot or for voters to drop off ballots.



Carl Leroy Pierson, 66, of Globe, passed away of natural causes at Haven Health Nursing Home on March 6.

Carl was born in Phoenix, Arizona to John C. Pierson and Evelyn E. Kleiman. He spent much of his growing years at the Arizona Training Program in Randolph, Arizona, which was a state school for children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. He left the school sometime in his late teens or early adulthood and was placed in Globe on his own where he lived the remainder of his life.

When he was younger, he was known in Globe as a young man who would go through town with his bicycle and a boom box stereo. For many years, he actively participated in Special Olympics. He was particularly good at bowling and proudly showed his friends his many Special Olympic medals. In 1987, he was able to travel to South Bend, Indiana to participate in the Interna-

tional Special Olympics. He proudly wore a Notre Dame hat for several years after the trip.

In 1992, he joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and participated in church activities as much as he could for the remainder of his life. For many years, he would line up the hymnals at church every week after services and pick up discarded programs. He became a BYU fan and would often wear BYU sports gear. He was even able to attend a couple of BYU football games when the team was playing in Arizona.

Carl never had much, but he enjoyed using the resources he had trying to keep up with the latest technology. The boom box of his younger years was followed by multiple televisions, VCRs, DVD players, cell phones, tablets, and then smart phones. Each device in its time was very important to him.

Carl was a very social person who enjoyed being included and liked being with friends. He had a few jokes that he told over and over and over. At first his

jokes weren't that funny, but he repeated them so much that they became funny to his friends. Some of these jokes included his catch phrases, "that don't work," "cat tail on a hot dog bun," and "what if we use your head as a bowling ball."

Carl's health declined in his later years. He became dependent on a walker and had recently had surgery to replace both hips. He never really recovered from the second surgery. Toward the end of his life, he was grateful for the help he received from his providers at COPA Health in Globe, and throughout his life he valued the many service providers who helped him maintain his independence.

Carl's parents predeceased him. Carl is survived by his many friends, whom he considered to be family. His friends will hold a memorial service for him at 10 a.m. Saturday, March 16, 2024, at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on Ensign Drive in Globe just north of the Highway 60/70 interchange



Jesus is hospitable

Ask the Lord to help you see those who need your welcome today.

Even though Jesus had no home to call His own, the Gospel accounts reveal His ability to make others feel at home in His presence. Wherever the Lord went, He intentionally welcomed those with open hearts and "ears to hear"-including sinners and tax collectorsinto the household and family of God. Although Zacchaeus was a tax collector well known for extortion, Jesus countered his sin with generosity. In this way, the

Lord showed that true hospitality doesn't come from material resources, but from a heart that sees and serves others with God's love. "Hurry and come down, for today I must stay at your house," Jesus declared as He looked up at the tree where the man had climbed for a better view (Luke 19:5). Imagine Zacchaeus' surprise to find that Jesus sought him out, even though he was in an unlikely place. This is true for us, too; no

matter how small or unnoticed we may feel, God sees us and loves us. Jesus' hospitality prompted Zacchaeus' own display generous hospitality. When we show others that we see them and God sees them too. hearts and lives are transformed. Understanding and embracing God's hospitality toward usno matter how great our sin-enables us to extend that same hospitality to others as we invite them to join us at Jesus' table.

Jesus is patient

We live in a fast-paced society, where many of our whims and desires can be gratified instantaneously. It takes discipline to refrain from acting on impulses of the flesh and instead to wait for God's perfect timing. Without the help of the Holy Spirit, we can quickly become overeager and restless.

Consider the patience and restraint it took for Jesus to use His power in accordance with His Father's will—especially while someone close to Him suffered and died. On learning that Lazarus was sick, the Lord delayed for two days instead of rushing to His beloved friend's bedside. Why? Because Jesus

knew that God's plan of redemption was far bigger than the mere prevention of death through physical healing. God's plan for Lazarus, for Jesus, and for all who call on His name is resurrection from death and to eternal life.

When we witness suf-

fering and death in the world, it can be easy to lose heart. But Jesus' example in waiting on His Father's timing to resurrect Lazarus invites us to patiently bear all things. We aren't alone in our waiting or weeping; Jesus wept, too. As people of hope, we know how the story ends: He will wipe every tear from our eyes, and death will be no more (Revelation 21:4).


