Bullion Plaza School building 100th anniversary celebration March 23

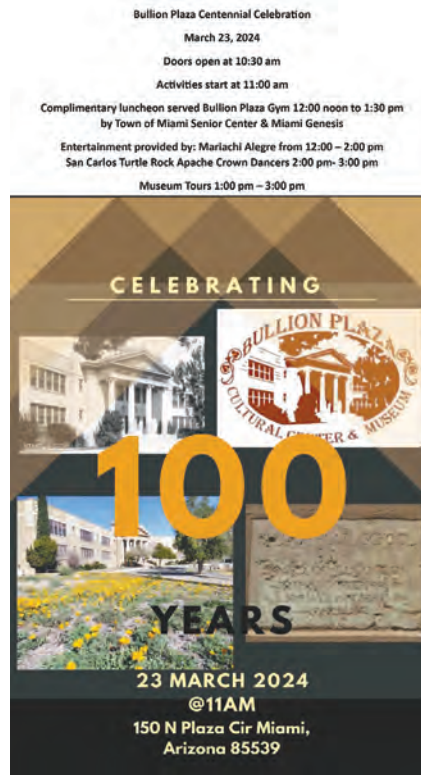
Celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Bullion Plaza School building on Saturday, March 23, starting at 11 a.m. with an opening ceremony. Doors will open at 10:30 a.m.

Live entertainment from 12 to 3 p.m. will include Mariachi Alegre and the San Carlos Apache Turtle Rock Crown dancers.

Refreshments will be available in the Bullion Plaza gym, next door to the museum, provided by the Miami

Senior Center and Miami Genesis.

Bullion Plaza School was built in 1923, designed by the prominent architect Henry C. Trost, who also designed many local buildings, including the Divine Grace Presbyterian Church, Inspiration School, Buena Vista School, and many buildings in Globe and throughout Arizona. The school opened its doors for students on March 17, 1924.

In his free time, Al enjoyed working on projects around the house

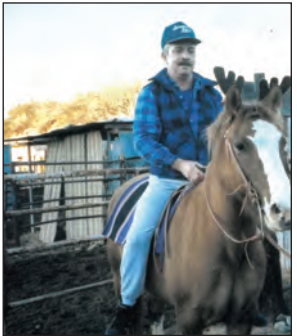
and yard, reading, playing cards, playing pool, and watching old Westerns, especially those featuring John Wayne.

One of the more specialized jobs, this one requires a master's degree in library and information science, or equivalent from an American Library Association accredited program--and two years' worth of directly related experience (or equivalent combination of education, training and experience).

"Top items on the task list are to oversee electronic library resources across all eight libraries that comprise the district," said Elaine Votruba, Director of the Gila County Library District. "Managing our website (gclclaz.org) and the Integrated Library System are also key - and our new hire will also be a liaison between Gila County IT and all library staff including outreach projects within the community. An ideal candidate for this job should also be enthused about electronic resources - digital books, databases, library software programs - all these wonderful tools that are available to library staff and the public."

Maintaining and updating the Library District's website and social media account (facebook.com/GCLCLAZ) are also part of the job.

Gila County Vehicle Auction March 29 - April 7

Wish you owned a Ford Mustang, BMW or a Jeep Wrangler? How about a Polaris ATV, 2019 Ford Fiesta, 'Towable Conex'--or even a kitchen trailer?

The Gila County Board of Supervisors approved auction of vehicles March 29 - April 7; most of the vehicles became county property after being seized as evidence; others were abandoned.

The week before the auction begins on March 29, photos may be viewed at publicsurplus.com. Vehicles are stored on a gated lot; registered bidders may arrange to inspect vehicles in person between March 20 - 29.

Bidders will be required to pre-pay an auction deposit--refundable, after payment clears, or if no items are bought.

Specialty items include an 8-by-20 towable Conex, a 500-gal water trailer, and a 'Kitchen trailer.'

Upon completion of the auction (April 7), the awardee will make the required payment and then be issued a receipt.

Winners will contact Sgt. Highstreet to make pickup arrangements for the auction vehicle; at the pre-arranged

pickup time and location, Sgt. Highstreet will verify payment and issue a title for the vehicle.

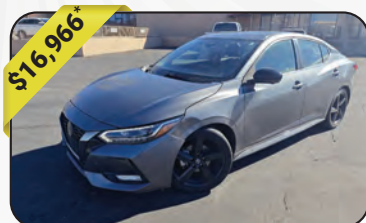

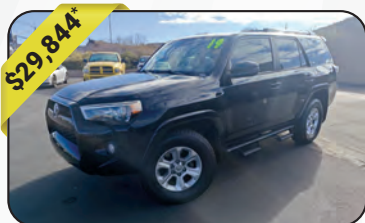

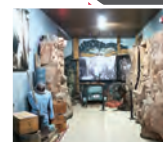
