Chris Jones is the University of Arizona Extension Agent for Agriculture and Natural Resources Programs in Gila County. Over the past 25 years, he has taught gardening classes at the college

and led the Gila County Master Gardener program. He has also managed extension programs in water and watersheds (Master Watershed Stewards and Cobre Valley Watershed Partnership), forest health and tree care, noxious weed management, climate science education, and community wildfire mitigation (Arizona Fire Adapted Communities Network). Current programs include biochar awareness and arid land agroforestry, and Master Gardener activities, such as fruit tree grafting (Payson, Gisela) and stinknet rapid response (Globe-Miami). Chris earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Forestry

M-Hill Path Underway in Miami

The “M” has been a prominent landmark for more than 100 years. Resting above the town, it has signified strength, resilience, and perseverance in the copper mining town of Miami, Arizona, a small community that has had an effect globally with the copper it has mined and continues to mine today.

“The first phase of the project, to install a pedestrian pathway to the top of M-Hill, began last Saturday, March 23,” said Gilbert Madrid, who purchased the land when it was put up for sale in recent months. “Given the progress that we have made, our phase one target is complete and we are ready to move to the second phase.”

Madrid is a 1967 graduate of the old Miami High School, which stood proudly over Miami on the opposite hillside. “Our initial goal was to install a much-needed pathway to

accommodate the many people who participate in the annual ‘Good Friday - Stations of The Cross,’” he said.

In an event sponsored by Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Church, many faithful parishioners make the annual pilgrimage up “M-Hill” to the three crosses above the

“M.” Over the many years, the “M” has represented community pride for residents and Miami High alumni. The three crosses have been a source of spiritual restoration.

Through the hard work of Brennon Deatherage, contractor and equipment operator, and Ian Durnan, Deputy Grand Knight, along with several of his fellow Knights of Columbus members, the initial pathway was cut and was ready for the “Stations of the Cross,” held on Friday, March 29, just before Easter Sunday.

“Details and related schedules will be forthcoming with regard to Phase 2 and the post Easter 2024 work of the M-Hill pathway. Miami is an iconic place and we need to preserve its rich history,” Madrid concluded with a resolve to accomplish this goal.

Blood drive at Globe Elks Lodge April 5

Red Cross staff and Globe Elks Lodge volunteers' next blood drive is this Friday, April 5 – and donors are needed; please sign up today.

Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood.

The Elks Lodge, near Denny's, hosts the drive from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Walk-ins are accepted, but it's much better to call 800-RED-CROSS today to reserve one of the available appointments ahead of time and help fill the day's drive. This Friday's drive needs 'Power Red' donors in particular; six vacant appointments still

need to be filled. If you've never made a Power Red donation, consider this:

* Your donation counts double; you'll safely donate two units of red blood cells during one visit. Blood is drawn from one arm by a machine that separates and collects two units of red cells, then safely returns the remaining blood components, along with saline, back to you through the same arm - and just one needle jab is required.

* A typical Power Red donation takes approximately 30-45 minutes, a bit longer than a regular 'whole blood' donation.

* Power Red donors are limited to once every four months.

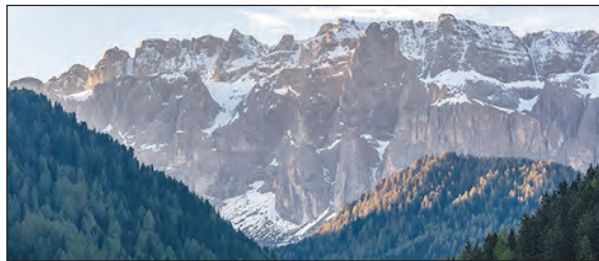

*God offers grace, not condemnation, to all who
acknowledge their mistakes and ask for help.*

Jesus' resurrection—the heart of the gospel—promises us resurrection as well. When He comes again, we will rise from physical death (1 Thessalonians 4:16). But the Lord promises more, which is described in the story of the Prodigal Son.

After taking his inheritance, the son assumed he could choose the life he wanted. Instead, he wasted everything—which is the definition of prodigal—and ended up with a life more like death. Penniless and alone, he at last “came to his senses” (Luke 15:17) and realized the full life he longed for was waiting back at home.

Great need motivated the young man to return home, but he didn't assume that a full life would be restored; he hoped only for a servant's existence. But the father, feeling that the son's return warranted gracious extravagance, said, “Bring out the best robe ... let's eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and has come to life again” (vv.

22-24).

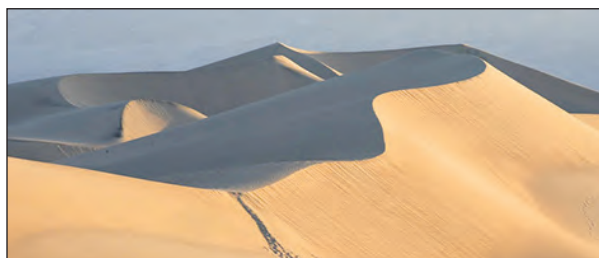
Whenever we have chosen the way of death and find ourselves in a spiritual “far country,” we can remember the prodigal's story. Like him, we can respond to the Spirit-given change of heart that draws us home. The Father's extravagant grace awaits all who return.

Raised from fear to faith

*If we will remember the love and power of our Savior,
no fear can paralyze us.*

Though they knew that the tomb was empty—though they'd heard Mary Magdalene's amazing story—the disciples were worried and wondering. Jesus had promised to rise again, true; but He had died, just as they'd seen many others die. They lost hope, perhaps assuming they, too, were as good as dead. Fear had gripped them and locked them away.

But Jesus had other plans. John noted that it was “the first day of the week” (20:19), and just as God's Word was there at the creation of all things (John 1:1), Jesus the Word was suddenly present for a new creation. “Peace,” He

said before showing them the wounds that won their salvation (20:19-20). Then, much like God breathing His Spirit into man at the beginning, Jesus breathed the life of the Spirit into His disciples, fulfilling the promise He would make to be with them always.

Jesus' resurrection meant a new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17), a new and abundant life in the Spirit, and

a renewed purpose. The disciples were sent out to “make disciples of all the nations” and teach people to live as Jesus commanded (Matthew 28:19-20).

The same promise and purpose are ours. If we will remember His promise of presence, no fears can lock out the Savior, and no threat of death can withstand His resurrection power.

Truthfully, life still is not a bowl of pitted cherries because he doesn't always use his hearing aids, but he's getting better.


