On Saturday, April 20 the Globe Downtown Association and the Copper Cities Players are presenting a 2-hour moon-lit evening adventure exploring Globe's past. This will be the 6th Evening Cemetery Tour, taking place in the oldest section of the 1876-founded cemetery. Meet characters throughout history with tales about their lives and their timely, or untimely, deaths. Meet some familiar historical names like: Al Seiber, leader of the Apache Scouts; or friends to the

end, Phin Clanton & Pete Wars fame; and learn about maybe not-so-familiar names like Irene Vickrey, of archaeology and Besh ba Gowah fame. See glimpses and hear a story or two of our military troops, from Buffalo Soldiers and the Confederacy to a tale from an Arizona Ranger's widow. View some happy & wild characters who lived life to its fullest, in addition to a solemn funeral in the distance. This tour is not a ghost tour, but rather a historical tour of the life and times of the people

who lived in the streets and neighborhoods that we navigate every day. Please consider exploring the histories and mysteries of Globe, Arizona with us. Your tour starts in Globe downtown at the 1916 Globe Train Depot. You will be shuttled to and from the cemetery from there. Shuttles will be launching continually from 6-8 p.m. and running until 10 p.m. This

amazing walking tour offers a unique opportunity to experience the eerie atmosphere of the cemetery after dark. Guests will safely move on the main path for this approximate 2-hour experience. Grab your friends & family, those comfortable shoes and your favorite flashlight, for a night you won't forget! The tour is \$25/person; children under 10 are free with a paid adult ticket. Tick-

Colonel Larry Perino to be honored in Globe/ Miami Fourth of July Celebration

Retired Army Col. Larry Perino, a distinguished military veteran with embedded roots in Globe, is returning home for a special Fourth of July celebration from July 3 to July 7, 2024. The City of Globe, the Globe High School Class of 1986, and the Globe High School Alumni Association proudly announce events honoring Perino's exceptional service and contributions to his country.

Perino, a native of Globe, graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point, NY, in 1990 and was commissioned as an infantry officer. His illustrious military career spans decades, during which he held key positions within multinational, joint, conventional, training, and special operations commands.

With operational assignments at all levels, from tactical to strategic, Perino's experiences range from infantry to special operations. Notably, he spent over seven years as a member of the 75th Ranger Regiment, serving overseas in Korea and deploying to Somalia in 1993 as part of Task Force Ranger in support of Operation Gothic Serpent, an

experience immortalized in the book/movie "Black Hawk Down." Perino displayed extraordinary bravery during that harrowing mission, earning him the prestigious Silver Star, the United States Armed Forces' third-highest military decoration for valor in combat, for his actions during that intense firefight that took the lives of 8 Rangers and left more than 70 wounded.

Throughout his career, Perino served in various command and staff assignments, including Operations Officer of a Stryker Infantry Battalion in Iraq, Special Operations Planner at U.S. Northern Command, 6th Ranger Training Battalion Commander, and Director of Force Management at ISAF Joint Command in Afghanistan.

Among his numerous awards and decorations are the Bronze Star with "V" device for Valor, Legion of Merit, Combat Infantryman's Badge (with Star), Master Parachutist Badge, Freefall Badge, and Ranger Tab. In 1993, he was honored with the General Douglas MacArthur Leadership Award.

Perino retired from active duty in January 2015 after nearly 25 years of

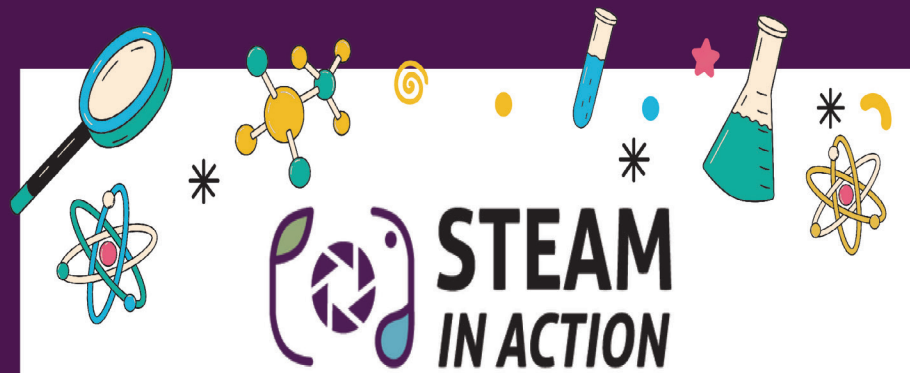
service and currently resides with his wife, Leslie, in Gulf Breeze, Florida.

The celebration in Globe will begin with Perino taking a cruise through the city, followed by a recognition ceremony at the CVCA Bandstand during the First Friday event on July 5 at 6 p.m. Mayor Al Gameros will officially proclaim July 5 as "Colonel Larry Perino Day" and present Perino with the key to the city. After the recognition ceremony, there will be a family and friends' get-together at Silver Tap 928, where everyone is welcome to attend and celebrate.

Events will also take place in Miami to celebrate this hometown hero.

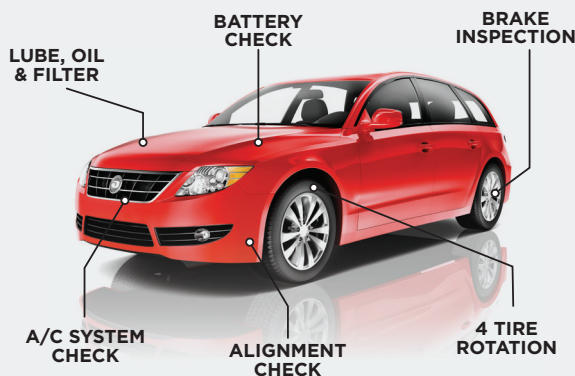

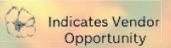

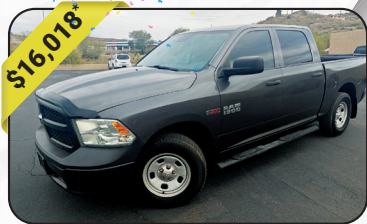

A brief history of Earth Day

Earth Day is celebrated each April and draws attention to a range of issues affecting the environment. Earth Day aims to raise awareness in the hope of inspiring change.

Earth Day is observed on April 22. According to National Geographic, the first Earth Day was celebrated in 1970. Wisconsin senator Gaylord Nelson was inspired to begin a national celebration uniting the environmental movement after witnessing environmental activism in the 1960s. With the help of Denis Hayes, a graduate student at Harvard University, Nelson organized the first Earth Day. Twenty million people participated in events across the United States and strengthened support for en-

vironmental legislation like the Clean Air Act and the Endangered Species Act.

Earth Day was expanded to a global initiative in 1990 under guidance from Hayes. Nearly 200 million participants in more than 140 countries now join together in the name of protecting the planet. Awareness continues to be raised each year regarding renewable energy and climate change.

One of the hallmarks of Earth Day celebrations is the planting of trees. Researchers estimate roughly 15 billion trees are cut down each year across the globe. By planting a tree every Earth Day, people can make a difference. Trees absorb carbon dioxide and release oxygen and bolster ecosystems for wildlife. Shade

trees can reduce reliance on fans and air conditioning systems.

The main message of Earth Day 2024 is the need to commit to ending reliance on plastics, says EarthDay.org. The goal is a 60 percent reduction in the production of all plastics by 2040. Plastics are bad for the environment; a growing body of research indicates they have an adverse effect on the major systems of the body, including immune, respiratory, digestive, and hormonal systems.

Everyone can do their part to promote the ideals behind Earth Day. For 54 years, millions of people have been advocating for change to benefit the planet and human and animal health, and that fight is ongoing.

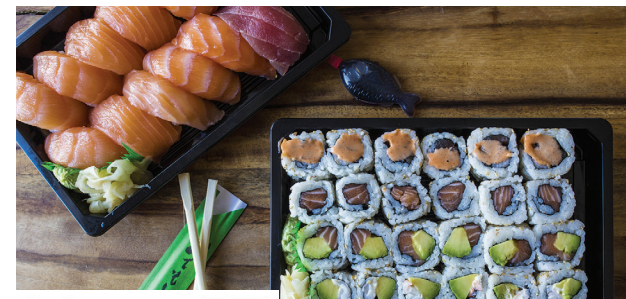
