

CASA of Gila County welcomes three new Court Appointed Special Advocates for Gila County children

In April 2024, CASA of Gila County welcomed three new Court Appointed Special Advocates dedicated to serving the Gila County youth who are placed in foster care settings. Two volunteers will serve out of the northern area of Gila County and one volunteer will serve out of the southern area of the county.

Court Appointed Special Advocates act as best interest advocates for local youth while the child resides in foster care. They do not serve as the child's placement; they serve as the child's voice!

After a thorough background screening process and pre-service training, volunteers are appointed to

a child or sibling group from Gila County. As the child's advocate, the volunteer serves to ensure the child has the necessary services and a voice in their future.

"When children are

thrust into difficult circumstances, they must rely on many adults who are strangers to them, to work hard and make the best decisions for them," said CASA Tammie Grenier.

"I have a heart for kids, and I want to be part of a team that is dedicated to making these kids' lives better, and that's why I became a CASA."

The CASA of Gila County program continues to have an elevated need for additional volunteers. In the first quarter of 2024, the program was only able to serve 26% of the children in need of an advocate.

The program encourages community members to apply today. There is no specific degree or experience needed to become a CASA volunteer. Volunteers must be 21 years of age or older and pass a thorough screening process. All training for the position is

Our online reading tracking platform has changed to Beanstack. Let one of our staff help you



Lyle Thompson

Lyle Dean Thompson was called home to his wife on Monday, April 8, 2024. He was 90 years old.

Lyle was born to Loretta and Ervin Thompson on Aug. 16, 1933, in Onawa, Iowa. Lyle's incredible work ethic and love of mechanics started as early as 10, helping at his neighbor's repair garage in Onawa. After their father passed away, young 11-year-old Lyle, along with his older brother Jay, started working on nearby farms for 50 cents an hour to help their mother. Five short years later, Lyle joined the Army at Camp McCoy, Wisconsin. He was only 16 but lied about his age to enlist and was sent to Europe



where he would run lines to the forward observers' posts, and a 2nd Lieutenant would take over, calling the shots in.

After leaving the service, Lyle utilized his G.I. Bill to attend Gila Junior College (now EAC), where he studied auto mechanics while working at an auto shop. His teachers praised him for how well he was able to explain things to other students, and that led him to change his career path to become a teacher. He attended ASC-Flagstaff (now NAU). He worked nights at a sawmill, took classes during the days, and met the love of his life, Mina Thompson. They married in 1955 in a small LDS Church across from campus and by 1956 each held B.A. degrees and they welcomed their first child, Lon. Lyle's first job started in 1957 as an auto mechanics teacher in Globe. Lyle quickly became the favorite shop teacher and a father figure to many students. They welcomed their second boy, Dean, third boy, Bart, and their youngest and only girl, Lori. Lyle and Mina purchased their home by the Polar Ice Plant on Jess Hayes

Road in 1966, then in 1972

purchased the Polar Ice Plant and successfully ran it with their three sons for 10 years. Early each morning, he'd take 300-pound blocks of ice over, cut them into 100-pound blocks and drop them off at fourteen locations all before heading to teach. In 1968, Lyle returned to Flagstaff to get his Master's in Guidance Counseling. He worked at the sawmill again, running the night shift.

Lyle taught for 38 years, retiring in 1989 at the age of 60, but went back to substitute teach for three more vears.

"I woke up every morning wanting to go to work," he said. He only missed a day and a half in all those years. He told kids, "Get a job you like. You might not make as much money, but you'll live longer and be happier."

Lyle lived an amazing life with fond memories with his many friends and family and enjoyed hunting, fishing, and cheering on his grandchildren and great-grandchildren. enjoyed his morning walks with his dogs. Mr. Thompson, as many in the community know him, will be truly missed. He was able to shape the minds of many students and those lessons plus so much more wisdom also passed on to his children and grandchildren.

Lyle and Mina celebrated their 67th wedding anniversary in 2022. What an amazing and full life they lived together. They are cherished by their children, grandchildren and

speak forgiveness and love. A believer's character, while imperfect, should reflect Christ's righteousness.

Make our life count (v. 10). God cares deeply about what's done in obedience to Him. Jesus spoke about the importance of bearing much fruit, which is possible only when we stay connected with Him (John 15:5).

Experience God's power (Col. 1:11). Through the Holy Spirit's presence, we have all we need in order to do our Father's will.

Remain committed and grateful (v. 12). God answers in His perfect timing. In the meantime, we should be steadfast in prayer and thankful for everything He's already done.

Whenever we pray these verses, our petitions are in accordance with God's will. And 1 John 5:14-15 tells us our Father responds affirmatively to prayers that align with His purposes.






