Miami ceremony dedicates first in series of mining-themed murals

One winner of the 2024 Copper Corridor Youth Art Competition for artists under 30, together with an experienced muralist, has brought a vibrant new outdoor mural to Miami. It was the first link in a project to bring a series of mining-themed murals, based on the works of other contest winners, to the Corridor - and a dedication ceremony last Wednesday saluted the pair's achievement, along with the contributions of

other partners.

Artist Eli Webb, 29, of Miami, was among the winners in the competition, sponsored by Love Where You Live, a Globebased nonprofit organization on a mission of "turning livable spaces into lovable places." Webb worked with muralist Jason Begay to create Miami's newest piece of outdoor art, which adorns the Farm Bureau Financial Services building on Live Oak

In addition, said Thea Wilshire of Love Where You Live, the organization has plans for a mural in Superior.

Free design/laser class for adults

Sign up ASAP for this one, if vou're an adult enthused to learn a few basics of graphic design – and to leave the class carrying your unique design laser-etched onto a tumbler that will be yours to keep! The Saturday, May 25 class is free but limited to 10 adult enrollees. Instructor David Flores will demonstrate graphic design using Inkscape, followed by a chance for each learner to see their own finished design precisely etched by an OMTech 80-watt laser. Saturday's free class is offered by University of Arizona Cooperative Extension Gila County. where Flores "is our mobile maker guru" according to staff, and has been coaching High Desert Middle Schoolers on how to use 3-D printers and the OMTech laser.

"Laser cutters are awesome shop: please plan to be there tools and the Extension Office is a place where you can lasercut cool projects," said Flores.

for all of it. Laser cutters are great for cutting wood, acrylic, paper, fabric, and some other materials (it cannot cut metal). During class we will cover why some materials are not safe because of toxic fumes, and safety related to the various systems as well as fires that can occur inside the laser cutter. No experience necessary. Ages 18 and up. Those under 18 can be trained on the laser but would still require a trained 4-H leader to supervise the use."

Interesting facts related to Memorial Day

Memorial Day is celebrated annually on the last Monday of May across the United States. The proximity of Memorial Day to the summer solstice has led many to view the weekend preceding the holiday as the unofficial kickoff to summer. However, Memorial Day is about more than backyard barbecues and weekend getaways.

Memorial Day honors service members who died while serving in the United States military. Though Memorial Day traces its origins to the years following the American Civil War in the mid-nineteenth century, it did not become an official federal holiday until 1971. That's one of just many interesting facts about Memorial Day that are worth noting as the United States prepares to commemorate the sacri-

• Memorial Day began as something of a grass roots movement. According to History.com, by the late 1860s individuals in ton, South Carolina. That commemoration occurred less than a month after the Confederate forces surrendered in 1865. Despite that, History.com notes that in 1966 the federal government declared Wa-



towns across the war-ravaged United States began holding springtime tributes to soldiers who lost their lives during the American Civil War.

• Among the more notable postwar commemorations was one organized by former slaves in Charles-

terloo, New York, the birthplace of Memorial Day.

• Postwar commemorations also were organized by northern veterans of the Civil War. General John A. Logan, who led an organization of Union veterans, called for a nationwide day of remembrance in

May 1868. General Logan referred to the holiday as Declaration Day and chose May 30 because it was not the anniversary of any specific battle and therefore unlikely to be viewed by some as controversial.

- Early commemorations of Decoration Day, which gradually came to be known as Memorial Day, initially honored only those soldiers who died during the American Civil War. However, that changed over time as American servicemen fought in various wars, including both World Wars, the Vietnam War, the Korean War, and other conflicts.
- The red poppy has become a symbol of Memorial Day. That red poppy can be traced to a poem by Canadian John McCrae, who served as a Lieutenant Colonel in World War I. "In Flan-

ders Field" notes the red poppies that grew in fields where countless soldiers had been buried in modernday Belgium. The poem was published in 1915, three years before the war ended. Sadly, McCrae himself was a casualty of the war, succumbing to pneumonia in

the service.

Memorial Day honors service personnel who lost their lives while serving in the U.S. military. The holiday's inspiration and lengthy history merits consideration as the nation prepares to commemorate countless soldiers' sacrifices once more.

Webb telescope uncovers merger of two massive black holes from early universe

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — The Webb Space Telescope has discovered the earliest known merger of black holes.

These two gigantic black holes and their galaxies consolidated just 740 million years after the universeforming Big Bang. It's the most distant detection ever made of merging black holes, scientists reported Thursday.

One black hole is 50 million times more massive than our sun. The other is thought to be similar in size, but is buried in dense gas, which makes it harder to measure.

Until now, astronomers weren't sure how supermassive black holes got so

big

The latest findings, published in the Monthly Notices of the Royal Astronomical Society, suggest mergers are how black holes can grow so rapidly — "even at cosmic dawn," said lead author Hannah Ubler of the University of Cambridge.

"Massive black holes have been shaping the evolution of galaxies from the very beginning," Ubler said in a statement.

Launched in 2021 as the eventual successor to NASA's Hubble Space Telescope, Webb is the biggest and most powerful observatory ever sent into space. A joint U.S.-European project, the infrared observatory surveys the universe from a location 1 million miles (1.6 million kilometers) from Earth.


OBITUARY



May is National Foster Care Awareness Month

PHOENIX - May is recognized as National Foster Care Awareness Month, and CASA of Arizona and the Foster Care Review Board (FCRB) are seeking volunteers statewide to advocate for children in foster care. These children deserve a voice, and Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASAs) and FCRB members serve as their voice in court.

When a child or siblings can no longer safely stay in their homes they are removed and placed into foster care. Currently in Arizona, there are approximately 8,800 children in foster care.

CASA of Arizona and the FCRB train volunteers to help these children navigate what is often an unfamiliar environment, new people in their life and/or a new school. These volunteers are highly trained and passionate about making a difference in and advocating for the children.


"I stand in awe of the passion and commitment each of our volunteers exhibits as they advocate for the child(ren) they serve. The circumstances that bring children into foster care are heart- breaking for everyone, especially the child(ren). Volunteers fill a void, meet a need, and provide a stable, caring voice for a child when everything else around them seems upside down," explains Charlie Gray, CASA State Program Manager.

A CASA volunteer will get to know the child and every aspect involved in the dependency case, and then advocate for the best interest of the child to the judge. That information aids the judge in determining the best course of action for the child, while reunification remains the goal.

FCRB members volunteer to serve on a 5-member panel that meets online one weekday per month to review the cases of children in foster care. The Board reviews case materials and interviews parties associated with the child's case and collectively submits recommendations to the judge based on the best interest of the child.

Each of Arizona's 15 counties is seeking CASA and FCRB volunteers to meet the needs of children. Anyone 21 years of age or older, who can pass a thorough background check and complete training, is encouraged to apply.


make (Matthew 19:29).




