Capstone's Pinto Valley Mine celebrates 50 years

In 2024 Capstone Copper's Pinto Valley Mine, west of Miami, is celebrating 50 years of operation. It began in July 1974, when the first division of the mine's concentrator built in 1972 - started up; the second division would start up Oct. 15, 1974. The mine was first developed, and operated at the time, by Cities Service Company. Its first ore truck, and first shovel and drill, arrived on-Valley Mine would be operated by Magma Copper Company and BHP Copper, from whom Capstone acquired it in 2013.

In 2007, nine years after operations were curtailed in 1998, the mine enjoyed a "restart" under BHP. The new facility employed about 600 people, 39% of them women. Mining resumed the third week of September 2007, and copper production of 70,000 metric tons a year was forecast.

Since its first recorded production, in 1975, Pinto Valley has produced more than four billion pounds of copper, including a half billion pounds of copper cathode. Today it is the only operating mill in the Globe-Miami mining district, and its concentrator produces 60,000 tons of ore a day.

The current operation site in 1972. Later the Pinto consists of an open-pit mine, the concentrator plant and a SX-EW plant. Pinto Valley is the district's second largest employer, contributing over \$270 million to Arizona's economy a year – "essentially the same as if we had a Super Bowl come to Globe-Miami," said Capstone Copper Senior Advisor of Communications & Community Relations Jamie Ramsey, a fourth-gen-

eration miner.

In November 2021 Pinto Valley received a new US Forest Service Mine Plan of Operations: the current life of mine plan runs until 2039.

"As the general manager of Capstone Copper Pinto Valley, I am proud to be a part of the rich history of the Pinto Valley Mine," said Lyndsay Potts, the mine's first female general manager. "Our workforce exemplifies dedication, skill, and a strong sense of camaraderie. Every day is a rewarding experience. I look forward to the future of Pinto Valley Mine."

"These are some of the hardest-working people," Ramsey said of the mine's workforce. "They've got a lot of drive." In 2023, employees started a golf tournament for local schools that raised \$56,000, and plan to do it again in 2024.

One of those workers. Linda Shirley, has been with Pinto Valley for 50 years. "I first came out here as a woman, as a secretary, that was the role model," she said in an interview with Capstone Copper intern Priscilla Mugwa. "I wore

dresses, I wore dressed flats that were steel-toed, and then moved up. That was the first year, and the second year I went into the mining part of it. Changed the mode of my attire, learned, and then I came into the supply department,

and I have been in the supply department ever since."

July 3, 2024

As part of their 50th anniversary celebration, Pinto Valley will hold an "open day" October 5, where community members can visit the mine and see it in operation.

Thomas N. Foster. 74. of Miami, Arizona, passed away June 19, 2024 at Haven Health Globe. He was born Jan. 18. 1950 in Oceanside. Orange County, California. to Thomas N. Foster Sr. and Ruth May Doty Foster. Tom attended Oceanside schools and graduated from Oceanside High School in 1968. In 1971, after attending community college, he moved to Tempe, where he attended Arizona State University.

He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Elementary Education and a minor in Art. He taught in the Prescott school district for a year or so before going to work for Sharlot Hall Museum. He accepted a job in cleaning the mining equipment out of the Harquahala Mine in western Arizona. He also did research for various groups and individuals, which took him all over the world, particularly Great Britain. His love of guns and ammunition resulted in his being an expert in historic armaments. Along the way, he met Karen and Ray Webb, and when they moved to Miami, Arizona, Tom eventually followed

them. He helped restore the locking mechanisms for the 1910 Jail in Globe. and made a ton of friends along the way. In 2010, he became the first executive director for the budding Bullion Plaza Cultural Center & Museum, and poured his heart and soul into its development. He was active in community groups such as the Globe-Miami Chamber of Commerce. Globe-Miami Community Concert Series, Municipal Property Corporation for the Town of Miami (president), Globe-Miami Habitat for Humanity and Cobre Valley Center for the Arts, and was appointed by the Arizona Governor to the Arizona Historical Societv (AHS) Governing Board. In 2016, he was presented with the Kip Culver Award by the Globe-Miami Cham-

ber of Commerce, and in 2021 the AHS presented him with the very prestigious Al Merito Award. In May of this year, he was presented with the May Citizen of the Month award from the Citizens for a Better Community. He was also active in the statewide Arizona Historical Society, joining as a public committee member in 2001, a board member in 2013, and in 2015, Arizona Governor Doug Ducey appointed him to the governing board.

Tom is survived by cousins Nancy Winetrout in Maine and Liz Nuskin in Ohio, by his adopted families, the Webbs and Kesslers of Miami, Az., and by many friends here and around the world who were family to him.

A candlelight vigil in his memory was held on Friday, June 28, at Bullion Plaza Cultural Center & Museum in Miami. A memorial service will be held at a later date.

When God Questions Us

In His kindness and mercy, God at times answers questions we didn't ask and reminds us who He is.

the Lord is ready to hear

Job likely never imagined that his questions for God might be turned around on him in a litany of questions from God. Beginning with Job 38:4, what the Lord asked revealed His power and sovereignty over creation and every area of human life. Though His answering from the whirlwind sounds intimidating, God's revelation was meant to strengthen Job's faith—as well as ours.

What can we learn about God's character through His questions? Although they are impossible to answer, the Lord's willingness to converse with His servant directly reveals deep love. It also indicates His longing for Job to understand that He's been working behind the scenes all along—even trusting His follower to faithfully endure suffering at Satan's hands.

By exploring God's rhe-

If God's people rest We will be blessed if we listen when God instructs us to stop striving and wait.

In the season of upheaval described in today's reading, God clearly specified how the people of Israel could be saved from their enemy. They were under threat from Assyria, and God said to wait on His ultimate deliverance instead of trying quick fixes like running to Egypt for protection. Repentance, rest, quietness, and trust were His gracious prescriptions for those awaiting restoration.

Tragically, the Israelites "would have none of it" (Isaiah 30:15 NIV). Some fled on horses only to meet with disaster—a stark reminder that relying on our own efforts can easily fail us. So how can we learn to accept God's invitation to trust and rest when we're tempted to take matters into our own hands?

This is our hope: No matter how bleak our circumstances seem, God

is our constant source of security—our "very ready help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1). It is our confidence in His character and constancy that enables us to experience peace, even when chaos surrounds us. We serve a gracious and just God who longs to pour out compassion and deliver us. Our choice to rest is a profound act of trust. Indeed. "blessed are all who wait for him" (Isa. 30:18 NIV).


