## Globe's "first exclusive" pharmacy

Today the Hitchcock Building, at 286 N. Broad St. in downtown Globe, houses offices including that of Monte Dei Globe, the rural development project which is planning Marigold Village in the city's northeast corridor.

This historic brick building, with a cast iron storefront by St. Louis architects Christopher & Simpson, is relatively new to the spot.

The man whose name it bears, Harley C. Hitchcock, arrived in Globe in 1879, after graduating from East Tennessee Wesleyan University. He came here to start his pharmacy career, and in 1880 the Arizona Silver Belt reported that his new store, in partnership with a man named Spence, was ready.

In their entry on Hitchcock, the Portrait and Biographical Record of Arizona (1901) said "This was the first exclusive drug enterprise in Globe, and the venture was inaugurated in an adobe house . . . a

frame building succeeded the adobe house, and later still, a modern structure became the home of the drug enterprise."

It was, the Record continued, "by far the most complete store in this part of Arizona." The stock for Hitchcock's pharmacy was packed on mules

and brought from Casa Grande.

Two months after the store's opening, the Silver Belt reported that Spence's interest was bought by Charles Fisk; the place was then named Hitchcock and Company. In addition to prescriptions, were "carefully which

compounded at all hours," Hitchcock and Company sold stationery, cigars, paints, toilet articles and liquors "for medicinal purposes."

Hitchcock was also quite active in the community (the Record dubbed him one of Globe's "most capable and large-hearted citi-

zens") and other business ventures. He helped build the Methodist Church and, according to the Record's entry, put on its first coat of paint. He served as Gila County Treasurer from 1894 to 1898 and was a charter member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows.

The Hitchcock Building's second story was used as a brothel and, starting in 1901, housed a medical office.

Hitchcock sold his business in 1905 and moved to California. The building

would continue as a pharmacy, the Palace Pharmacy, until 1928. For the next 30 years, it housed a ladies' shop known first as Bates Ladies Furnishings and then Gwyn's Ladies Shop. In the 1960s, Gila County Office Supply opened for business at 286 N. Broad St., and there it would stay for another 30 years. For a few years during that time, Globe Business College occupied the second story. Since then, the building has been home to an antique store and a bookstore.

Mike returned to Globe in 1966 and taught sixth grade, then Junior High Math at Globe Junior High School, where he also coached football, basketball, and baseball for over 20 years. Mike became Assistant Principal and Athletic Director at Globe High School and served in this capacity until his retirement in 1994. After retiring from the Globe School District, he became Principal and Acting Superintendent at Theodore Roosevelt School in 1997-1998. Some of Mike's fondest memories came from his years as a teacher and administrator in the Globe Schools. Mike feels returning to the Globe School system was right for him, and he hopes he did as much for the school district as it did for him, by impacting the students in a positive way. He credits his wife of over 60 years, JoAnn (Scates) Termain, as his greatest supporter.

GLOBE, AZ - Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center (CVRMC) is excited to announce the future opening of its much-anticipated "Highway 60 Clinic," a walk-in clinic located near Cal Ranch and Walmart. This new facility is set to provide essential healthcare services to the community, offering a convenient option for those seeking immediate medical attention without the need for an appointment.

The journey to establish the Highway 60 Clinic has not been without challenges. The initial plans for the clinic encountered an unexpected delay when it was discovered that the proposed location fell within a designated floodway.

Determined to bring this vital service to the community, CVRMC worked with local and federal agencies to reassess the flood maps that impacted the clinic's location. Through extensive modeling, updated maps were drawn to better reflect the actual conditions of the area. CVRMC then submitted a request for a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), requesting an official change to the flood designation.

On July 29, FEMA issued a LOMR, paving the way for the new clinic. The new facility will offer extend hours to walk-in patients, providing a convenient, affordable option for healthcare services. While the specific timeline for construction and opening is still being finalized, the team is working diligently to bring the project to completion as swiftly as



A recent Sunday was a bit crazy for me. It started out like any normal day. Like many of you, I woke up. The first thing that happened was a phone call saying a former church member of mine from Colorado had died unexpectedly on a hiking trail. Feeling a bit off-kilter. I attempted to get ready for church. Attempted. I had a long, drawn-out argument with my hair. Yeah, it was shaping up to be one of those days.

Went to church. Whew. Not a bad day so far. We sang. I preached and taught. Jesus was magnified. But sometimes the negative stuff doesn't leave you alone. On the way home, I noticed a low-pressure warning light for one of my tires. This meant I likely had a slow leak in a tire somewhere. I praved we'd be able to get home before it got too bad.

About a hundred yards from my house, circus lights came on behind me. For what? I couldn't imagine. After all, I was driving the speed limit like a good little pastor. Honest! If my son was driving, well, then those circus lights would

have made sense. Regardless, I pulled over, genuinely confused.

Carrying a huge grin the size of Texas, the officer waltzed on up and said, "Want to hear some exciting news?"

I wanted to say, "If I don't, can we go on our way?" But I didn't, more's the pity.

He said, "Your car registration has been expired for NINE months!"

Nine months! No way! I'm dutiful in this. I always pay two years at a time. We hadn't even had the car for that long. But apparently, I had only paid for a year only. So he gleefully wrote out a ticket, saying nine months was simply too long of a period for him to ignore.

With citation in hand, I drove the last hundred yards to my house, pulled in, and examined my tires, feeling put out and irritated. Sure enough, I had a screw in one of them, and I couldn't ignore it. I had to get it fixed. But that screw put up a fight and the patch didn't want to cooperate. My son grinned at my efforts, and my wife cheered me on from a distance (big help) as I tugged and pushed through a glaze of sweat pouring off my forehead in 110 degrees of heat.

No one feels like being cheered in those conditions.

I wanted to shoot my tire. tear up the citation, shave my head bald, give my son a good what-for, and ignore my wife or scream at the world in frustration. I didn't care which. You see, it's those little things that get me the most. I can handle the big things much easier, but it is the little things, the things that I don't even want to bring to God's attention because they are so small that add up to the point where I wanted to explode, run away, hide my head in the sand, or quit.

But I had to remind myself that anger accomplishes nothing and that we are instructed to cast all our care upon God (1 Peter 5:7). All, in this case, really does mean ALL. He wants us to give Him everything. Every irritant. Every fear. Every care. Every burden. Every trial. So yes, after I calmed down and brought it all to God, I was able to see things with clearer eyes and find peace. God really does want us to give Him even the little, irritating things. So how much more the large ones, eh?

Thank God we have a God who cares for us.

Effects of domestic violence are far-reaching not just for the partners involved but also for the children who may witness it. In Gila County, we have about 47 children who have entered care due to domestic violence in their home.

Witnessing violence by seeing, hearing or observing the aftermath can leave children feeling anxious, fearful and angry. Often these situations become so volatile children must be removed from their homes and put into the care of the state, exacerbating those feelings. Children coming from domestic violence situations need caring; consistent adults to listen to them and help navigate their feelings. When a child comes into the foster care system that adult can be the Court Appointed Special Advocate, or CASA.

However, we need your help to provide a volunteer for every child or sibling group in need from Gila County.

CASA volunteers are community members who dedicate their time to get to know a child placed in the foster care system. They visit the child, develop a relationship with them and research the reasons the child was brought into care.

CASA volunteers work as part of the court team to help identify the best solution for that child. Because a CASA volunteer typically focuses on one case at a time, they are often the most consistent person in the child's life while in care.

Domestic Violence Awareness Month in October is the perfect time to learn the warning signs of domestic abuse and find a way to help a survivor in your community. One opportunity to get involved is to become a child's CASA.

CASA of Gila County needs volunteers to meet the number of children who have entered foster care due to domestic violence.

Court Appointed Special Advocate volunteers must be 21 years of age or older, pass a thorough background check and complete 30 hours of free pre-service training, either in person or virtually. Advocates usually dedicate about 10-15 hours per month and are asked to stay with the child until the permanent resolution of the child's family's case.
