




Lucille B. Gonzalez

You Don't Have to Be That Way!

Ever hear someone say, "That's just the way I am," in reference to a weakness or character flaw? It's one thing to say that about a personality quirk, such as me hating baked beans, but altogether different to say that about a character flaw or weakness!

We excuse our bad behavior by claiming we were born with such a weakness and implying there's nothing we can do about it. This is not true! We can all improve, and we can all grow. You don't have to be that way!

Typically, we are intentionally blind to our faults. We don't like to look at them, acknowledge them, or dwell on them. No one likes to think less of themselves. Instead, the typical person tries to justify the weakness or flaw in some way, such as saying, "That's just the way I am!" But such an attitude will only create problems in your relationships. It's one thing to have a flaw, but altogether different to pretend it doesn't matter. That frustrates those around you, and can lead to arguments, fights, and broken relationships.

The key to overcoming this is to listen to other people. We see other people's flaws a lot clearer than our own. Learning to listen to other people regarding your weaknesses is essential to growth. You can't afford to get angry, snide, or dismissive. There is great opportunity to grow if you can listen when others point out your flaws and weaknesses.

I pastor a church, and pastors have plenty of flaws. I'm no exception. Recently, several members (including my wife) pointed out a character flaw in me. Like everyone else, I resisted at first, but after three people pointed it out, I had to admit the problem.

I have a hard time being in the moment when my mind is racing with everything I have to do. When talking to someone, I am easily distracted, my eyes shift off to the side as impatient thoughts invade my mind. This appears I am being rude—and I am, not intentionally, but true.

I need to address this, so the first thing I did was admit to it and recognize that I needed to change. The mistake would be trying to justify it or be dismissive of it. The next thing I did, being a pastor, I announced to the church that I'm working on it and asked them to help me. This relieved members of the pressure of wondering if I was being intentionally rude and feeling like they couldn't point it out because of my position. I gave them permission, when my eyes get shifty, to simply say, "Pastor, I'm right here!" That will help me focus and give them my full attention.

Be willing to listen to others and they can help you grow into a better person.

GLOBE, AZ – Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center (CVRMC) is excited to announce the future opening of its much-anticipated "Highway 60 Clinic," a walk-in clinic located near Cal Ranch and Walmart. This new facility is set to provide essential healthcare services to the community, offering a convenient option for those seeking immediate medical attention without the need for an appointment.

The journey to establish the Highway 60 Clinic has not been without challenges. The initial plans for the clinic encountered an unexpected delay when it was discovered that the proposed location fell within a designated floodway.

Determined to bring this vital service to the community, CVRMC worked with local and federal agencies to reassess the flood maps that impacted the clinic's location. Through extensive modeling, updated maps were drawn to better reflect the actual conditions of the area. CVRMC then submitted a request for a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), requesting an official change to the flood designation.

On July 29, FEMA issued a LOMR, paving the way for the new clinic. The new facility will offer extend hours to walk-in patients, providing a convenient, affordable option for healthcare services. While the specific timeline for construction and opening is still being finalized, the team is working diligently to bring the project to completion as swiftly as possible.




