

Winkelman Bridge

It was about a week before Christmas, in 1916, that a new bridge over the Gila River opened in the town of Winkelman. That 108-year-old bridge, now a

The Winkelman Bridge, crossing the river about a half mile south of State Route 177, traces its beginnings to 1915, when the Pinal County Board of Su-

The Gila River flows beneath one of the historic Winkelman Bridge's Luten arches,

pervisors set aside \$52,000 for its construction. With the town's location on the border of Gila and Pinal Counties, Gila County agreed to pay half the cost.

Assistant State Engineer T.M. Nichols advised using multiple-span concrete arches to build the bridge, and the project would use an arch design patented in 1900. Commonly known as the Luten arch, it was designed and patented by a Midwestern bridge builder named Daniel Luten.

Born in Michigan in 1869, Luten was an architectural and sanitary engineering instructor at Purdue University before starting his bridge company, the Luten Bridge Company. Thirteen bridges using his multiplespan arch design have been identified in Arizona, and five are located in the town of Miami. The earliest of these, the Keystone Avenue Bridge, was built two years after the Winkelman Bridge, in 1918.

A Kansas firm, the Topeka Bridge & Iron Company, was awarded the Winkelman Bridge construction contract in the fall of 1915. The design of the 419-foot structure included longspan reinforced concrete arches and was founded on timber piles.

The Arizona Copper Camp, a Ray, Arizona newspaper, reported the bridge's completion in its Dec. 16, 1916 edition: "The new bridge over the Gila river at Wilkelman [sic] is now open to traffic, having been thrown open early this week. The bridge has been practically completed for a week or two, but owing to

the fact that the guard rails had not been finished, but few vehicles were allowed to cross.

"The bridge was built in the face of all kinds of

discouraging mishaps," the Copper Camp added. "No sooner was work well under way the first time, when a flood swept away the piers, and made it necessary to start the work over again."

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1988, the Winkelman Bridge was reduced to carrying only local traffic with the construction of State Route 177. It was restored by the Town of Winkelman with replicas of its original guardrails – a project that took 10 years to finish, from 1989 to 1999. The restoration was funded through an Arizona Department of Transportation grant. The bridge was rededicated in 2016, when the Town celebrated the structure's centennial. Today it stands as a place

where one can step back into the past, admire a distinctive work of vintage architecture, and stop for a while to watch the river flow by beneath.
