Miami High to Retire Ken Vargas #20 Jersey Friday

Ken Vargas coached in Miami. Arizona - Home of the Mighty Vandals - a small copper mining town with a proud, heartfelt history.

It's rare to find someone who had the knowledge, and passion about their life's work. Born in his blood, or a product of his early environment, Coach Ken Vargas remained steadfast and determined to follow his dream of teaching and coaching. He influenced young boys' lives, taught them to rise above their circumstances, to be respectful, honest, and to reach for something greater than they believed possible - always with courage, accountability, determination and hard work.

As the son of a very successful basketball coach, Ken spent much of his early childhood years in the gym dreaming of the day he would wear a Miami Vandal jersey. In his youthful years and hours in the gym, he was already learning the craft of coaching; absorbing drills, offenses, defenses, proper free-throw technique, jump shots, and above all, discipline.

There were significant times in Ken's life that affirmed his place was to teach and coach. As a young father and husband. Ken graduated from Northern Arizona University in 1984 with a BA Degree in Accounting. The day before graduation, after his very last final, he said, "I don't want to be an Accountant. I want to be a teacher and I want to coach basketball." A dream he had since second grade. His desire to be a good monetary provider in his career choice was overcome by the fire inside him to teach and coach. A year and a half later Ken also graduated with degrees Elementary/Secondary Education with minors in Physical Education and Mathematics. He realized happiness in his profession was more important than money or material things.

He was offered several teaching positions throughout the state, but when Miami called to offer him a teaching and coaching position at Lee Kornegay Junior High, he accepted it with great honor and gratitude. He spent 17 years as a physical education and math teacher. Twelve of those years he was the student council sponsor. All

seventeen years he was the seventh-grade basketball coach, winning 14 region championships and providing coaches in the upper levels, players that were well trained in the basic fundamentals of the game.

Ken's coaching style was parallel to his classroom methods. He held his athletes accountable for their grades, being on time, good

sportsmanship, and respect for themselves and others on and off the court. He had an innate wisdom of when to challenge his athletes and when to reward. He didn't settle for anything less than their personal best and then dared them to reach further. Ken was a true leader, mentor, coach and teacher. Students wanted to be a part of what he offered from his



a classroom and basketball court, and that is discipline, accountability, accomplishment, pride, honor, loyalty, hard work, and most of all,

During his 17 years as head varsity basketball coach, Ken won several runners-up trophies for local tournaments,

These two Miami High graduates had 89 combined years of teaching and 71 years of coaching the Miami Vandal Basketball programs.

On Friday, January 10, Ken's Miami High School Basketball Jersey, #20, will be retired and will reside in the trophy case in Vargas Gymnasium.

GLOBE, AZ – Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center (CVRMC) is excited to announce the future opening of its much-anticipated "Highway 60 Clinic," a walk-in clinic located near Cal Ranch and Walmart. This new facility is set to provide essential healthcare services to the community, offering a convenient option for those seeking immediate medical attention without the need for an appointment.

The journey to establish the Highway 60 Clinic has not been without challenges. The initial plans for the clinic encountered an unexpected delay when it was discovered that the proposed location fell within a designated floodway.

On July 29, FEMA issued a LOMR, paving the way for the new clinic. The new facility will offer extend hours to walk-in patients, providing a convenient, affordable option for healthcare services. While the specific timeline for construction and opening is still being finalized, the team is working diligently to bring the project to completion as swiftly as possible.

CVRMC is committed to keeping the community informed as progress continues. Updates on the clinic's development will be shared regularly, with a focus on ensuring that residents are aware of the new healthcare options that will soon be available.

The opening of the Highway 60 Clinic represents a significant step forward in CVRMC's mission to provide comprehensive, accessible healthcare to the region. The medical center looks forward to welcoming patients to this new facility and continuing its tradition of high-quality care for the community.



Getting people to listen and talk to you is more of an art than of charisma. You don't have to be highly intelligent or possess a charismatic personality for people to want to hear what you have to say. With time and patience, you can master a few things that will ensure that people would be willing to hear vou out. Here are some tips and things to consider: FIRST, LEARN TO BE A **GOOD LISTENER**

People who are always talking and never listening will find that few people want to listen to them. One of the greatest keys to being heard is first learning to listen to others.

People normally pay attention to someone who rarely speaks. When they do speak, people want to know what they have to say (Proverbs 17:28).

If you never demonstrate any interest in what other people have to say, they won't be interested in what you have to say.

Talk less and listen more. When you do speak, it will be more moving and powerful.

RARELY TALK ABOUT PEO-

Gossip and slander are lousy ways to endear people to you. Most people understand that if you are willing to talk about someone else behind their back, then you are also just as likely to do the same to them.

A very wise man I once knew said this, "Weak minds talk about people, average minds talk about things, and great minds talk about ideas."

HAVE SUBSTANCE IN WHAT YOU SAY

You have substance in your conversation when you have first thought it out. Most people have no filter between their mind and their mouth, so whatever crosses the mind slides right out the mouth. Because there was no thought behind it, there was no consideration and there was no attention to consequences. Give some thought to what you intend to say.

Relevance is also another form of substance. When you talk about things that are immediately relevant to the person you are talking to, they will listen automatically.

TALK ABOUT THINGS THAT INTEREST BOTH PAR-TIFS

If your favorite subject is yourself, people will tire of listening to you. Choose topics of conversation that appeal to both of you. Don't allow the conversation to become one sided.

Remember to listen to what the other person has to say.

TALK ABOUT POSITIVE THINGS MORE THAN NEG-ATIVE THINGS

Be careful about always having something negative to say. People tire easily of being forced to hear all the bad things that are happening in your life.

I'll reveal a secret to you. When most people ask, "How are you doing?", they don't want a run down on every ailment, every negative event, every bad situation, and every problem you have. They are asking out of courtesy. People don't want to listen to a lot of negative talk.

Do you enjoy being around depressed or negative people? No one does. Don't be that person. Be upbeat and talk about positive things.



US 60, Schulze Ranch Road - Town of Miami DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation is completing drainage improvements on US 60 between Schulze Ranch Road and the town of Miami, mileposts 241-242, approximately three miles west of Miami, in Gila County. This project will construct permanent drainage and embankment repairs to the existing US 60 roadway and drainage features damaged by monsoon flooding related to the burn scars left from the Telegraph fire event. The work consists of existing culvert replacements and slope protection measures with shoulder rehabilitation. Guardrail and other related work will also be completed.

PROJECT ELEMENTS

- Permanent drainage repairs
- Embankment repairs
- Replace existing culverts
- Replace guardrails

PROJECT SCHEDULE

Construction is scheduled to begin in winter 2024 and is expected to take approximately six months to complete.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- A flagging operation will be utilized. Flaggers and a pilot car will assist drivers through the work zone. Drivers should be prepared to stop when approaching and traveling through the flagging operation.
- Delays of up to 15 minutes.
- Lane restrictions, vehicle width restrictions and speed reductions in the work zone are expected.
- Drivers should allow for extra time when traveling through the area.




