Route Modification for Hill Street Apartments

Copper Mountain Transit would like to inform the community of an upcoming change to the bus route starting January 13, 2025. The routes traveling from Globe to Miami on both the A/Red and B/Blue lines will no longer stop at the Safeway grocery store in Globe. Instead, the new stop will be located at the intersection of Hill Street and Sutherland Street.

The opportunity to relocate the bus stop was appealing, as the new location is easier for the bus to access and exit, ultimately making it safer for both passengers and drivers. Please remember that the



bus operates on a fixed route with deviations. If you need to be picked up from the Safeway grocery store, you can call the office at 928-473-8222 between 6 AM and 6 PM to request a deviation within ¼ mile of the nearest bus stop, such as the train depot. You can also check the scheduled departure times, and the dispatcher will inform the driver to pick

you up.

Alternatively, you may request to be dropped off a quarter mile from the nearest bus stop at the Safeway grocery store.

The fee for any deviations in pick-up or drop-off locations is \$1 per person.

If you have questions or concerns, please call the Transit office at 928-473-8222 from 6 AM to 6 PM.

A student that is 9 years old may complete the Arizona Hunter Education Safety Course.

If a student turns 9 by the time they graduate, they may receive a Hunter Education card. The card will not become valid until their 10th birthday. The age that they may hunt big game has not changed, only the age that they can graduate the course. This will prevent the problem of a student turning 10 the day before the hunt and not being able to get into a class.

GLOBE, AZ - Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center (CVRMC) is excited to announce the future opening of its much-anticipated "Highway 60 Clinic," a walk-in clinic located near Cal Ranch and Walmart. This new facility is set to provide essential healthcare services to the community, offering a convenient option for those seeking immediate medical attention without the need for an appointment.

The journey to establish the Highway 60 Clinic has not been without challenges. The initial plans for the clinic encountered an unexpected delay when it was discovered that the proposed location fell within a designated floodway.

Determined to bring this vital service to the community, CVRMC worked with local and federal agencies to reassess the flood maps that impacted the clinic's location. Through extensive modeling, updated maps were drawn to better reflect the actual conditions of the area. CVRMC then submitted a request for a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), requesting an official change to the flood designation.

On July 29, FEMA issued a LOMR, paving the way for the new clinic. The new facility will offer extend hours to walk-in patients, providing a convenient, affordable option for healthcare services. While the specific timeline for construction and opening is still being finalized, the team is working diligently to bring the project to completion as swiftly as possible.

CVRMC is committed to keeping the community informed as progress continues. Updates on the clinic's development will be shared regularly, with a focus on ensuring that residents are aware of the new healthcare options that will soon

The opening of the Highway 60 Clinic represents a significant step forward in CVRMC's mission to provide comprehensive, accessible healthcare to the region. The medical center looks forward to welcoming patients to this new facility and continuing its tradition of high-quality care for the community.


Ruben F. Avalos

The Key to Controlling Your Anger

The key to controlling your anger is not taking charge of it like you would a child, or an employee, or a car. Once you lose your temper, you are no longer in control. Controlling your anger means you find a way to control when and why you get angry. Anger is not necessarily wrong, so being in control isn't the ability to suppress your anger but deciding what you should get angry about.

The key to controlling your anger is placing buffers in your mind and emotions that makes you very slow to anger. It is the quick temper that is most dangerous. It is the short fuse that gets us into trouble.

People who are slow to anger are in much more control of the result of their own anger. If it takes you a long time to get angry, you won't allow your anger to cause you to do something you'll

regret. You will be in control of when and why you get angry.

I've found this principle to be true biblically and practically. Here are a few verses from the Bible that you might find interesting: Proverbs 15:18, Proverbs 16:32, Proverbs 14:29, and James 1:19.

In short, your ability to put barriers and buffers in your life that slow your rise to anger is the key in controlling your anger. Anger is a natural part of our emotional makeup. Some things should cause us anger! But selfish anger leads to many of our problems. And it is this selfish anger that is so quick to surface.

Trying to drive a car at 100 mph down a windy mountain road is probably going to get you killed. But if you drive the same car much slower, you can take the appropriate action and make it down safely. Anger is much like that. The quick temper will drive us right off the emotional cliff.

- 1. Know yourself. Know what makes you angry. In your calm moments, analyze your anger critically and try to understand it better.
- 2. Prepare to be tested. I've often practiced my reaction to that which stimulates my anger before I face the actual trigger. You react as you have conditioned yourself to react. If you want to control your anger better, practice how you face what causes your anger.
- 3. Develop the aspect of your personality that is not easily offended. This is largely a mental condition. When you think you are being attacked, you react like you are under attack. Find ways to learn to overlook slight and offense. Your life will be so much more enjoyable.




