

GLOBE, AZ – Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center (CVRMC) is excited to announce the future opening of its much-anticipated "Highway 60 Clinic," a walk-in clinic located near Cal Ranch and Walmart. This new facility is set to provide essential healthcare services to the community, offering a convenient option for those seeking immediate medical attention without the need for an appointment.

The journey to establish the Highway 60 Clinic has not been without challenges. The initial plans for the clinic encountered an unexpected delay when it was discovered that the proposed location fell within a designated floodway.

Determined to bring this vital service to the community, CVRMC worked with local and federal agencies to reassess the flood maps that impacted the clinic's location. Through extensive modeling, updated maps were drawn to better reflect the actual conditions of the area. CVRMC then submitted a request for a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), requesting an official change to the flood designation.

On July 29, FEMA issued a LOMR, paving the way for the new clinic. The new facility will offer extend hours to walk-in patients, providing a convenient, affordable option for healthcare services. While the specific timeline for construction and opening is still being finalized, the team is working diligently to bring the project to completion as swiftly as possible.

CVRMC is committed to keeping the community informed as progress continues. Updates on the clinic's development will be shared regularly, with a focus on ensuring that residents are aware of the new healthcare options that will soon be available.

The opening of the Highway 60 Clinic represents a significant step forward in CVRMC's mission to provide comprehensive, accessible healthcare to the region. The medical center looks forward to welcoming patients to this new facility and continuing its tradition of high-quality care for the community.

Our beloved Father Ramon R. Baeza, passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his loved ones on January 17, 2025, at 3:50pm at the age of 95 and 11 months. He was born in Marfa, Texas on February 20, 1929, to Adolfo & Jacinta Baeza the youngest of 7 siblings.

He grew up in Shafter, Texas whereas a child he met the future love of his life, our mother Analda. Luckily for our dad, Analda was the niece of his eldest brother Jose's wife Manuela, and she would visit frequently the small town of Shafter, to help her aunt with their growing family.

Ramon learned early on, the valuable lessons of hard work, resilience, & grit, growing up through the "Great Depression" and then through "WWII" he would have to cut school from time to time to work with his family in the cotton fields.

He suffered loss at an early age when his close in age brother and partner in boyhood adventures Juan died of an ear infection and one of his eldest brothers Adolfito was killed in action oversees during WWII.

Our Dad showed great courage in trying to enlist in the military, but he was too young and despite his efforts his parents would not sign the waiver for him to join. Thank you, Momma Jacinta and Papa Adolfo! Ramon moved with his

family to Marfa, Texas for a few years then to Miami, AZ where his older brothers found work in the copper mining industry.

He then married the love of his life Analda Hernandez on December 23, 1948 in civil ceremony in Los Angeles, CA. where her Father lived at the time, then on December 28, 1948 they married through the church at Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament in Miami, AZ.

Our Dad was hired on with Inspiration Consolidating Copper Company and together with his bride they took a small one bedroom house and made it a home on Miami Ave also known as Mexican Canyon.

Together with love, commitment, & prayer they started a family in 1950 with the birth of their first-born Sylvia Ann, then Raymon in 1952, Robert Lee in 1958 and Melinda Marie in 1966. Like additions to their family there were additions to their home room by room. our mom the architect, our father the builder. Family and friends would pitch in and do what they do best, help make each other's dreams come true.

At the age of 62 in 1991 he retired from Miami Consolidated Copper Company of over 40 years. We have fond memories of our Dad coming home with a treat in his lunch box every now and then. Thank you, Dad, for being such a steadfast provider for us, we always had what we needed & more.

Ramon loved to sing and play the guitar; he sang in the choir at church for several years and was a proud member of the Fr. J.O. Barrette Knights of Columbus Council 1882 in Miami. If you think back, you can probably remember buying a tootsie roll from our dad in front of Safeway during their annual tootsie roll drive to help raise funds for persons with disabilities.

Ramon's greatest joy was being a husband, father, grand-father, great-grandfather and also brother, nephew, uncle, great uncle and friend. Our dad loved his family and would always make time for visiting, watching our games, being present for the birth of his grandchildren, or simply sitting watching a Spanish novela with his wife of 74 years.

He was very handy with auto-mechanics. building tables and chairs for outside furniture, there wasn't much he could not do he was like one of his favorite shows, MacGyver. He was even the family barber, with frequent visits from his brothers for a cut & conversation. He loved to go bowling and was even in a league with a team of his closest friends. Our dad at a young age loved to dance and

more specifically he loved to dance the Jitter Bug, as he got older you would still find him on the dance floor with a line of nieces, daughters, and grand-daughters waiting for their turn to cut a rug with our Daddy-O, Tio, Grandpa!

We thank you so much for all that you have done for us over the years, you were the kindest, most genuine person that demanded respect but also gave respect. To be around you Dad was to feel loved, protected, and happy just a few of many of your greatest gifts you gave us.

You were that person that would take two hours to get a gallon of milk from the store because everyone you knew would stop to shake your hand and you would smile your smile and just start talking there in the middle of the aisle.

We are going to miss you so much, but it gives us peace in our hearts to know you are with mom and all your family and friends like the Marfa Clan and others you held dear. We can't thank God enough for the blessing of having you as our Dad!

thing family members often experience.

These are not simple ingredients that can be taken for granted. If even one of these ingredients is missing from either side, problems arise. More missing or weak ingredients result in larger issues within the relationship.

Attraction in a Healthy Relationship

All relationships typically start with attraction, which can be synonymous with "like." This attraction can lead to the development of mutual interests and comfort in a relationship. Married couples, friends, or family members who do not maintain their attraction might face challenges in their relationships.

Signs that attraction may be a problem in your relationship include disinterest in being around the other person, irritation at

minor actions, and feeling more comfortable when they are not present. To rekindle attraction, find new hobbies or shared experiences to rediscover common interests.

Love in a Healthy Relationship

Love is often demonstrated by personal sacrifice and action rather than just emotion. It stems from who you are rather than the actions of the other person. Genuine love involves willingness to make sacrifices and engage with the other person's problems.

Signs that love may be a problem in your relationship include reluctance to make sacrifices, lack of involvement in their issues, and feeling burdened by their problems. Interestingly, people who do not like each other but do love each other may find their relationship strongest during challenging times.

Trust in a Healthy Relationship

Trust must be earned and is crucial for a healthy relationship. It develops over time and is necessary for stability.
