

GLOBE, AZ - Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center (CVRMC) is excited to announce the future opening of its much-anticipated "Highway 60 Clinic," a walk-in clinic located near Cal Ranch and Walmart. This new facility is set to provide essential healthcare services to the community, offering a convenient option for those seeking immediate medical attention without the need for an appointment.

The journey to establish the Highway 60 Clinic has not been without challenges. The initial plans for the clinic encountered an unexpected delay when it was discovered that the proposed location fell within a designated floodway.

Determined to bring this vital service to the community, CVRMC worked with local and federal agencies to reassess the flood maps that impacted the clinic's location. Through extensive modeling, updated maps were drawn to better reflect the actual conditions of the area. CVRMC then submitted a request for a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), requesting an official change to the flood designation.


On July 29, FEMA issued a LOMR, paving the way for the new clinic. The new facility will offer extend hours to walk-in patients, providing a convenient, affordable option for healthcare services. While the specific timeline for construction and opening is still being finalized, the team is working diligently to bring the project to completion as swiftly as possible.

CVRMC is committed to keeping the community informed as progress continues. Updates on the clinic's development will be shared regularly, with a focus on ensuring that residents are aware of the new healthcare options that will soon be available.

The opening of the Highway 60 Clinic represents a significant step forward in CVRMC's mission to provide comprehensive, accessible healthcare to the region. The medical center looks forward to welcoming patients to this new facility and continuing its tradition of high-quality care for the community.

Adding the Divine Ingredient into the Recipe of Life

Life is relationships, wouldn't vou agree? After all, everything is richer and more enjoyable when you can do it with someone. Vacations are always fuller when you go with someone. Accomplishments are always sweeter when someone is there to savor them with you. Failures are always less devastating when someone you love can help get you back on your feet.

If this is the case, then your relationships are the key to your earthly happiness, and every relationship is enhanced when you mix in the Divine Ingredient.

What Is the Divine Ingredient?

The Divine Ingredient is the mixing of God's divine nature into your heart, mind, and relationships. This connects you to God's divine power and then adds the euphoric taste of God's goodness into your life.

My wife is a wonderful cook, and she tells me that much of the taste or result of her cooking is dependent upon key ingredients being added. These ingredients then mix in thoroughly and are responsible for the won-

derful taste and aroma she is trying to produce. A recipe instructs a cook on when and how much of an ingredient to add. By themselves, these ingredients aren't so impressive. But when you mix in the right amounts in the right way with other ingredients, then presto! You have a wonderful meal.

This how we should treat the things of God. Unfortunately, too often we take individual ingredients, such as prayer or Bible reading, and we try to digest them separately instead of mixing them with the other aspects of our lives. Taken by themselves, I've always struggled to be consistent, and frankly, sometimes they don't taste so good by themselves. But, for example, when mixed into my relationship with my wife, it produces a wonderful taste and aroma that has only enhanced my marriage.

Mixing prayer with my love for my wife, for example, has helped my marriage in several ways. First, it gets me to think about her needs and not just my own. Second, I try to be more attentive to her perspective. If you are like me, you probably say things that are negative and possibly even hurtful—especially when I'm irritated.

But when I add prayer into my thinking, I am much more aware of what I say. It has helped our communication and made the home environment much more comfortable and enjoyable.

Add the Divine Ingredient into the Recipe of Your Life

Scripture tells us in 2 Peter 1 that we are to add to our faith. Specifically, he lists several ingredients that if added will make us bountiful and fruitful in our relationships and in the knowledge of Jesus Christ:

- Add virtue to your faith.
 Add knowledge to vir-
- tue.
- 3. Add self-control to knowledge.
- 4. Add patience to self-control.
- 5. Add godliness to patience.
- 6. Add brotherly kindness to godliness.

7. Add love to godliness.

When we mix these things into each of our relationships so that they affect our hearts and minds, we touch upon the divine nature of God Himself. This gives us access to His divine power and promises.

Your life is a recipe of relationships. When you add these Divine Ingredients into the mix, stir it around so that

Stuck...or Moving Forward with Hope?

Have you ever felt like you've been stuck in the same place for so long it seems like you are going around the same mountain over and over again? I have. For years I wasted a lot of time stuck in the same place-blaming others, feeling sorry for myself, complaining, and the list goes on... I was miserable until I discovered the truth about the life I could have through my relationship with Christ.

I was in my late 30s when my eyes were opened to truth in John 10:10 that I wasn't living the peaceful, joy-filled life Jesus died for me to have. The problem was I had a very negative mindset because of the abuse I had experienced throughout my childhood.

God showed me that it was holding me back and keeping me from dealing with areas of life that He wanted to heal and restore.

I was stuck in the mindset of, "My future is based on my past and my present." But God wanted me to have a hopeful attitude, expecting something good to happen to me.

The Bible says in Isaiah 43:18-19: "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland" (NIV).

Without a doubt, holding on to your past will keep you from looking forward to your future. And sometimes it may even feel like you are being pulled in two different directions because God is trying to pull you forward toward a new thing and you're holding on to something that's behind you.

The Israelites did not want to let go of their past either. They stayed in the wilderness for 40 years because they compared everything to their past. In fact, they complained to Moses that they wanted to go back to Egypt and return to a life of slavery because that's what they knew. But God wanted them to move forward to the Promised Land—a land flowing with milk and honey (Exodus 13:5). They just couldn't get past their past.

We need a vision—one that goes beyond what we've already seen and experienced—if we want to see change happen in our life. The apostle Paul says it

like this in Philippians 3:13, "...But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead...."

God has good things planned for us, no matter what has happened in our past. He is looking and longing for someone who's waiting for Him to be good to them. God wants to be good to you, but you have to be expecting Him to move in your life. I've gotten into a habit of regularly saying, "God is good, and something good is going to happen to me today!" I encourage you to do the same.

God can help you set your mind in the right direction. The Bible tells us to set our mind and keep it set on things above, not earthly things (Colossians 3:2).

My husband, Dave, is a great example of what it means to set your mind. Dave loves to play golf, so I asked him one day, "How's it going to be for you if you ever get to the point where you can't play golf?" He

said, "I've already thought about that and I've just made up my mind I can be happy anyway."

Setting our mind and keeping it set means we keep our focus on where we want to go, not on where we have been or even where we are right now. God wants us to have a vision for our life and trust Him to help us get there.

Remember, God has a good plan for you and He wants to see you live out that plan. But spending too much time looking back or thinking about what's happening in your life right now can keep you stuck, holding you back from experiencing all that He has for you. Your future has no room in it for the past.

So, don't get stuck in the past. Let go of what lies behind and press into the great future God has planned for you. I can promise you: God is with you. He wants to lead you, strengthen you, and help you every step of the way!

"Besh Ba Gowah Free Admission Day" including "Old Time Religion? The Salado Phenomenon in the US Southwest" presentation sponsored by the City of Globe and Old Pueblo Archaeology Center (Tucson) at Besh Ba Gowah Archaeological Park and Museum, 1324 S. Jesse Hayes Rd., Globe, Arizona

9 am-4:30 pm; food vendors 11 am-3 pm; presentation 1-2:30 pm. Free Admission.

The Besh Ba Gowah Archaeological Park and Mu-

seum will host a Free Public Admission Day in celebration of Arizona Archaeology and Heritage Awareness Month. Visitors may enjoy self-guided tours of the Archaeological Park and Museum at no cost. Food vendors will be available from 11 am-3 pm, and archaeologist Allen Dart (Old Pueblo Archaeology Center) will present "Old-Time Religion? The Salado Phenomenon in the US Southwest" at 1 pm.

Presentation description: The Besh Ba Gowah archaeological site preserved by the City of Globe

is a prime example of what archaeologists call the "Salado phenomenon." When first recognized by archaeologists in the early twentieth century, a constellation of peculiar cultural traits - including polychrome (three-colored) pottery. above-ground housing often enclosed in walled compounds, and monumental architecture - at Besh Ba Gowah and some other southwestern US archaeological sites was thought to be indicative of a distinct group of people: "the Salado." As more and more research was done and the widespread distribution of Salado material culture became apparent. interpretations of what the Salado phenomenon represents were debated. In this presentation archaeologist Allen Dart illustrates pottery and other cultural attributes of the so-called Salado culture, reviews some of the theories about the Salado, and discusses how Salado related to the Ancestral Pueblo, Mogollon, Hohokam, and Casas Grandes cultures of the "Greater Southwest" (the U.S. Southwest and Mexico's Northwest).




A reconstructed portion of the Besh Ba Gowah pueblo






