Rabies Confirmed in Bobcat Near Timber Campground

Gila County Animal Care & Control has confirmed that a bobcat near the Timber Campground has tested positive for the rabies virus. If you were in this area and may have come into contact with this animal, please contact Gila County Animal Care & Control immediately at (928) 425-5882.

In response to this confirmed case, Animal Care & Control Officers have increased surveillance in the area to monitor for any additional rabies cases or abnormal animal behavior. Residents and visitors are urged to take necessary precautions to protect themselves and their pets from rabies exposure.

How to Protect Yourself and Your Pets

The best way to safeguard against rabies is by ensuring that all pets are up to date on their rabies vaccinations. Additionally, residents and visitors should take extra precautions to avoid wildlife and unknown animals that may have been exposed to the virus.

Preventive Measures:

 Keep pets vaccinated against rabies and do not allow them to roam freely.

· Avoid contact with wild

• Teach children not to approach or touch wild or unfamiliar animals.


 If bitten or scratched by an animal, seek medical attention immediately and report the incident to Gila County Animal Care & Control.

Arizona Youth Partnership (AZYP) and the Copper Basin Coalition are working with the Substance Awareness Coalition Leaders of Arizona in a first-of-its-kind effort to save lives in Arizona. Youth are using vape products at alarming rates across the Nation. Most e-cigarette liquids contain high levels of nicotine, which can lead to higher rates of dependence, especially for teens and young adults. Vaping devices are also easily accessible among youth despite the legal age to buy any tobacco products, including vapes, is 21. Studies show that vaping can harm teen brain development and long-term mental health, lead to dependence, and damage the lungs.

Youth are also vaping cannabis products. Cannabis concentrates are highly potent and made by extracting THC - the chemical that produces the high feeling - from the cannabis plant. Similar chemicals found in liquid nicotine are found in these concentrates. Youth often mistakenly believe vaping concentrates is safer than smoking marijuana. However, studies have shown that concentrates include chemicals that are linked to long-term lung damage and mental health problems. As with tobacco products it is only legal to purchase, possess and use cannabis products if you are 21 years of age or older.



Are You Content with Your Life?

It seems there are very few people who are consistently content with life. It's more common to be up and down mentally and emotionally, depending on what our circumstances are. So, I want to ask you: How content are you? Are you consistently enjoying your life?

God loves us and has a good plan for our lives. Jeremiah 29:11 says His thoughts and plans for us are "for welfare and peace and not for evil, to give you hope in your final outcome" (AMPC). And John 10:10 says Jesus "came that they may have and enjoy life, and have it in abundance (to the full, till it overflows)" (AMPC).

It was such a revelation for me when I realized that God wants me to enjoy my life now, and not just barely get by, hanging on until I get to heaven. It was also a lifechanging revelation when I understood that my joy and contentment don't have to be based on my circumstances. In Christ, I can learn "how to be content (satisfied to the point where I am not disturbed or disquieted) in whatever state I am" (Philippians 4:11 AMPC).

Being content doesn't mean you never want change or to have anything else in your life. It means you can be satisfied to wait with a good attitude for whatever God chooses to do in your life. It means that even when you want something to happen, you still trust God enough to believe that if He doesn't give you what you want, He has your best interest at heart. And you'll find that what He gives you is better than what you thought you wanted to begin with.

The world is full of problems, and we all have times when things don't go the way we planned. It's so wonderful when we get to the point that we can be happy even when we don't get our way!

I've learned that since the world probably isn't going to change, then I need to change my approach to circumstances—my attitude and my expectations. And it was a great breakthrough for me when I discovered that God wants me to have great expectations of Him. He wants me to put all of my hope in Him and exercise my faith in Him to do great things in my life.

Ephesians 3:20 says that God's power that is working in us "is able to [carry out His purpose and] do superabundantly, far over and above all that we [dare] ask or think [infinitely beyond our highest prayers, desires, thoughts, hopes, or dreams]" (AMPC). I love these words: superabundantly, far over and above ALL that we dare to ask or think!

It's so important for us to put our expectations in the right place—in God. We serve an awesome God, and I want to encourage you to ask Him to do great things in you and through you.

What are you asking God to do for you? Do you believe He loves you unconditionally and He has great plans for you? Do you trust Him to take care of your needs and that everything He asks you to do is for your good?

We need to resist thinking that God can't do anything for us because of our weaknesses and faults. He isn't expecting us to be perfect; He wants us to have faith in Him.

God wants us to put all of our hope and all of our expectation in Him. He wants us to trust Him to do what's best for us in the way He chooses to do it. He wants us to give Him the credit for the good things He does in our lives.

Sometimes we are discontent and disappointed because we think we're expecting something from God but in reality, we're expecting someone else to give it to us. For example, we pray for a raise or promotion and if we don't get it, we become mad at our boss. Or we ask God to make our children behave better or help our spouse to be more sensitive and thoughtful. But when they don't do what we want, we get mad at them.

We need to look to God to provide what we need and what we want. This means we trust Him. no matter what other people do or what circumstances look like. It's not wrong to put realistic expectations in the people we have relationships with, but no one is perfect, and people will disappoint us sometimes. We can get rid of a lot of disappointment and discontentment by learning how to put our hope and expectation in God first and foremost.

God cares about everything about you and everything that concerns you. He wants to be good to you and He will never disappoint you. Give Him all of your heart and put all of your hope and expectation in Him. You can have true contentment and satisfaction in Christ!

I'm Looking for a Miracle!

If you're like me, you want to see God work in your life. You want to see a miracle! Sometimes, it is a life-anddeath matter, a problem so big that only God can intervene. In such times, you mentally sit on the edge of your seat, your stomach clenched and heart heavy with said and unsaid prayers, just hoping the next instant will bring the miracle you desperately seek.

Sometimes, it is a "small" matter, a hiccup in your life's journey, a mere speedbump on the road to your next destination. Yet, even then, you sometimes hope God will show up and prove that He sees you, that He knows your situation and sees your small problem. You are anxious to know that God does truly love you.

In the life-and-death struggle and in the small things, it still matters when God shows up for you. But the key, I think, is waiting on the Lord as Psalms 27:14 and so many other Scriptures command. 




